Grant funds are available from the Federal Victim Assistance of Crime Act (VOCA) Victim Assistance grant program for the funding period of October 1, 2022, through September 30, 2023, to eligible applicants. The purpose of this grant program is to fund public agencies, American Indian tribe/organizations, nonprofit, community, and faith-based organizations, including underserved and culturally specific populations providing direct assistance to crime victims. For the purpose of these grant program guidelines, direct services are defined as those efforts that (1) respond to the emotional and physical needs of crime victims; (2) assist primary and secondary victims of crime to stabilize their lives after a victimization; (3) assist victims to understand and participate in the criminal justice system; and (4) provide victims of crime with a measure of safety such as boarding up broken windows and replacing or repairing locks. A crime victim is a person who has suffered physical, sexual, fi-

within the boundaries of GMD No. 4. The plan for the proposed renewal of the GMD No. 4 LEMA was previously submitted to the chief engineer by GMD No. 4 and was found to be acceptable for further consideration.

Therefore, the chief engineer has scheduled a public hearing to determine whether the GMD No. 4 LEMA should be renewed as proposed by GMD No. 4. The hearing will be held at 10:00 a.m. July 27, 2022, at the City Limits Convention Center, 2227 S. Range Ave., Colby, KS, and will continue as long as is necessary for a full disclosure of relevant facts. If a full disclosure of relevant facts cannot be achieved July 27, 2022, the hearing will continue at a future date that allows adequate notice to be given as required by K.S.A. 82a-1041. The chief engineer has also scheduled a prehearing conference to take place prior to the hearing. The prehearing conference will be held virtually via Zoom at 10:00 a.m. July 11, 2022. Members of the public who wish to attend the prehearing conference must pre-register at <https://kansasag.zoom.us/meeting/register/tZYqduCrrDwvGtGREj7Qtv8tdf9R7UXRznh7>.

At the hearing, the chief engineer will serve as the hearing officer and, in determining whether the GMD No. 4 LEMA should be renewed as proposed, will consider the evidence contained in the record for previous GMD No. 4 LEMA proceedings as well as any new evidence provided. This hearing will be conducted pursuant to K.A.R. 5-19-3 and K.A.R. 5-19-5 and, pursuant to K.A.R. 5-19-3(h), will consolidate the initial and subsequent LEMA hearings referenced in K.S.A. 82a-1041. Accordingly, the hearing will consider the effectiveness of the current GMD No. 4 LEMA plan's corrective control provisions in meeting that plan's stated goals and determine whether one or more of the circumstances set forth in K.S.A. 82a-1036(a) through (d) continue to exist within the LEMA boundary, whether the public interest requires that one or more corrective control provisions be adopted to address those circumstances, and whether the geographic boundaries of the LEMA are reasonable. The chief engineer will also consider the corrective control provisions contained in the plan for the proposed LEMA, the likelihood that that plan will achieve its stated goals, and any other matters deemed necessary by the chief engineer.

Anyone may submit written or oral comments to be included in the hearing record. Oral comments will be accepted only in-person at the public hearing. Written comments may be submitted at the public hearing or sent to the GMD No. 4 LEMA, c/o Ronda Hutton, 1320 Research Park Dr., Manhattan, KS 66502; faxed to 785-564-6777; or emailed to ronda.hutton@ks.gov. Written comments will be accepted if delivered on or before Tuesday August 10, 2022. After that date, the chief engineer will close the hearing record and will consider the evidence presented and the requirements set forth in K.S.A. 82a-1041 to determine whether the GMD No. 4 LEMA should be renewed as proposed.

Anticipated Consultant Scope

The KDOT anticipates the following to be included in the consultant’s scope: Transportation Management Plan (TMP) management services during all phases and stages of construction operations necessary to complete this project. The TMP has already been developed since this project has been deemed a significant project. The TMP documents mobility and safety metrics to be measured and recorded throughout construction. Additionally, it includes information on what traffic control scenarios were considered and the anticipated impacts on the work zones and surrounding areas. The TMP’s ultimate goal is to create a safer work zone and understand construction’s impacts to safety and mobility on the surrounding roadway network. The TMP (linked below) includes specific goals for this project.

The TMP Management Services During Construction manager/team must be capable of performing in-field reviews/measurements of traffic queues, travel times, and signal operations as well as performing desktop peak hour daily reviews/measurements of traffic queues, travel times, and safety performance measures. The key metrics to be measured are outlined in the document “Transportation Management Plan, Gold Phase 2B”, dated June 2022 which is available here at <https://bit.ly/KDOT-TMP-GoldPh2B>. This document is referred to herein as both “Gold Project TMP” and “TMP”.

KDOT draws specific attention to the following sections of the TMP:

- Section 5: TMP Activity During Construction (pages 36-38) This section provides guidance on types of data collection, frequency of data of collection, and definitions.
- Attachment A – Mobility Goals and definition of Event for key areas
- Attachment B – Safety Goals.

There are three key categories of activities which the TMP Management Services During Construction consultant shall be responsible for executing: data collection; documentation; and communication (via meetings, memos, and reports). KDOT’s expectations for each are described below:

Data Collection

- In addition to measurement requirements noted in the TMP, field and desktop measurements and observations shall be collected during all Initial Periods during a single nighttime period.
- Desktop (including mobility, safety, and incident clearance) and field measurements shall be collected in accordance with the measurement collection scenarios as outlined in the TMP in Section 5 (pages 36-38).
- Field measurements shall be collected for all corridors identified within the “Location” column found in Attachment A (starting on page 47) of the Gold Project TMP. Additional corridors may be identified during scope negotiation.
- Field measurements shall include but are not limited to travel times, queue lengths, and number of signal cycles to clear an intersection during the peak period and shall be documented with photos/videos.
- Desktop measurements and observations shall be either screen captures or video recordings collected in 15-minute intervals during the peak hour. These measurements can be accomplished utilizing a tool such as Google Maps Traffic, WICHway cameras, other mapping/traffic software/website, contractor provided ITS equipment (if available), or other third-party ITS equipment as provided by the TMP Manager Team.
- Incident clearance times information shall be gathered from WICHway by the TMP Manager.
- Safety data measurements shall include coordination by the TMP Manager with WICHway and/or Highway Patrol and/or local law enforcement. This ensures the safety data analysis includes crashes on the construction routes and detours.
- For the safety measurements, severe and fatal crashes shall be reviewed within 48 hours of receiving the crash report. This review shall include a memo summarizing the crash, how the crash was influenced by the project and any recommendations to minimize future crashes.

Documentation

- Field review information, photo logs and/or video logs shall be kept and stored for submission to KDOT upon request. The field reviews and logs shall include the collector’s name, location, direction, date, time, weather, and vehicle type.

(continued)

- For desktop review information, screenshots or videos of traffic conditions, the collector's name, data source, date, time, weather, and location shall be included. This information shall be stored for submission to KDOT upon request.
- For review of safety data, a log of crash types, severity, date, and location of crashes shall be kept and stored for submission to KDOT upon request and to facilitate ongoing trend analysis.
- For review of incident management clearance times, a log of date, time, and time to clear shall be kept and stored for submission to KDOT upon request and to facilitate ongoing trends analysis.

Communication (Meetings, Memos, and Reports)

- Meetings between the TMP Manager and the Construction Team shall be conducted on a weekly basis to facilitate maintaining safe and mobile work zones. These meetings shall include TMP Manager reports on safety, mobility, and incident management goals and trends.
- Memos shall be submitted at a frequency determined by the measurement collection scenario as outlined in Section 5.
- At a minimum, memos shall include information on the data collected, any observations that are critical to maintaining safety and satisfactory mobility, recommendations, and mitigation alternatives analysis. They shall also include consistently reported metrics for safety, mobility, and incident management to enable quick identification of trends.
- The final lessons learned report shall detail all phases, the "Events" that occurred, trends in mobility and safety, recommendations on what worked well, and improvements that could be made on future projects. The report shall also contain a full area, as previously studied in Section 4.3 of the TMP, safety review for the duration of construction.

Permanent Administrative Regulation

Article 21.—HUMAN TRAFFICKING

16-21-1. Specifications for anti-human trafficking notices. (a) The notice required by K.S.A. 75-759, and amendments thereto, shall contain the written information and the graphic in the Kansas attorney general’s document titled “anti-human trafficking notice requirements for K.A.R. 16-21-1,” dated January 31, 2022 and hereby adopted by reference.

(b) Each notice shall be at least 8.5” x 11” and shall be legible. Each notice that becomes illegible shall be replaced immediately.

(c) A notice that meets the requirements of this regulation may be obtained by contacting the office of the Kansas attorney general or may be reproduced from the web site of the office of the Kansas attorney general. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2021 Supp. 75-759; effective July 8, 2022.)

Permanent Administrative Regulations

Article 28b.—INDEPENDENT PRACTICE OF MIDWIFERY

100-28b-3. Approved course of study in nurse-midwifery. The course of study in nurse-midwifery approved by the board to obtain authorization to engage in the independent practice of midwifery shall meet the standards established for advance practice registered nurses certified in nurse midwifery pursuant to the Kansas nurse practice act, and amendments thereto. (Authorized by K.S.A. 65-28b07; implementing K.S.A. 65-28b03; effective July 8, 2022.)

100-28b-6. Fees. (a) The following fees shall be collected by the board:

- (1) Application for license \$ 100.00
- (2) Annual renewal of license:

 - (A) Paper renewal \$ 75.00
 - (B) On-line renewal \$ 50.00

- (3) Late renewal:

 - (A) Paper renewal \$ 50.00
 - (B) On-line renewal \$ 25.00

- (4) Certified copy of license \$ 20.00
- (5) Verified copy of license \$ 20.00

(b) If a licensee’s initial license is issued six or fewer months before the deadline for the licensee to renew the license, the first annual renewal fee shall be \$25.00 if the licensee renews on-line. (Authorized by K.S.A. 65-28b07; implementing K.S.A. 65-28b03, 65-28b04, and 65-28b05; effective July 8, 2022.)

100-28b-14. Patient records. (a) Each licensee shall maintain an adequate health care record for each patient for whom the licensee performs a professional service.

(b) Each health care record shall meet the following requirements:

- (1) Contain only those terms and abbreviations that are or should be comprehensible to similar licensees;
- (2) document adequate identification of the patient;
- (3) document all professional services provided or recommended and the date on which each professional service was provided or recommended;
- (4) document all clinically pertinent information concerning the patient’s condition;
- (5) document all identifiable risk assessments performed on the patient;
- (6) document all examinations, vital signs, and tests obtained, performed, or ordered, and the findings and results of each;
- (7) document all medications prescribed, dispensed, or administered, the time each medication was prescribed, dispensed, or administered, and the dose and route of each medication;
- (8) document the patient’s response to all professional services performed or recommended;
- (9) document all instruction and education provided to the patient related to the childbearing process;
- (10) document the date and time of the onset of labor;

(11) document the course of labor, including all examinations and pertinent findings;

(12) document the date and exact time of birth, the presenting part of the newborn's body, the newborn's sex, and the newborn's Apgar scores;

(13) document the time of expulsion and the condition of the placenta;

(14) document the condition of the patient and newborn, including any complications and action taken;

(15) contain the results of all postpartum and newborn examinations;

(16) document all professional services provided to the newborn, including prescribed medications and the time, type, and dose of eye prophylaxis;

(17) contain documentation of all consultation and collaboration with a physician concerning the patient;

(18) contain documentation of each referral, transfer, and transport to a medical care facility, including the reasons for each referral, transfer, or transport to a medical care facility;

(19) contain all written instructions given to the patient regarding postpartum care, family planning, care of the newborn, arrangements for metabolic testing, immunizations, and follow-up pediatric care; and

(20) contain all pertinent health care records received from other health care providers.

(c) Each entry in the health care record shall meet the following requirements:

(1) Be legible; and

(2) be authenticated by the person making the entry. Each authentication in the health care record for an entry documenting professional services provided by an individual licensed to engage in the independent practice of midwifery shall include the letters "CNM-I" after the licensee's name.

(d) For the purposes of the independent practice of midwifery act and this regulation, an electronic patient record shall be deemed a written patient record if both of the following conditions are met:

(1) Each entry in the electronic record is authenticated by the licensee.

(2) No entry in the electronic record can be altered after authentication. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 65-28b07; effective July 8, 2022.)

100-28b-20. Maintenance and storage of health care records. (a) Each licensee shall maintain the health care record for pregnancy, delivery, postpartum, and newborn care for at least 25 years from the date the licensee provided the professional service recorded.

(b) Each licensee shall maintain the health care record for family planning services and the treatment of sexually transmitted infections for at least 10 years from the date the licensee provided the professional service recorded.

(c) Any licensee may designate an entity, another licensee, or a health care facility to maintain a health care record if the licensee requires the designee to store the record in a manner that maintains confidentiality and allows lawful access.

(d) Health care records may be stored by an electronic data system, microfilm, or similar photographic means. Any licensee may destroy original paper records if the electronically stored health care record can be reproduced without alteration from the original.

(e) Each electronically stored health care record shall identify any existing original documents or information not included in the electronically stored health care record.

(f) Each licensee who terminates practice in Kansas shall, within 30 days of the termination, provide the following information to the board:

(1) The location where the licensee's health care records are stored;

(2) if the licensee designates an agent to maintain the health care records, the agent's name, telephone number, and mailing address; and

(3) the date on which the health care records are scheduled to be destroyed, according to this regulation. (Authorized by K.S.A. 65-28b07; implementing K.S.A. 65-28b07; effective July 8, 2022.)
