## Notice of Hearing

Pursuant to K.S.A. 82a-1041, the Western Kansas Groundwater Management District No. 1 (GMD No. 1) has requested the designation of the Four County Local Enhanced Management Area (Four County LEMA) in a designated area in Greeley, Lane, Scott, and Wallace counties within the boundaries of GMD No. 1. The plan for the proposed designation of the Four County LEMA was previously submitted to the chief engineer by GMD No. 1 and was found to be acceptable for further consideration. An initial public hearing in this matter was held October 17, 2022, and December 21, 2022, the chief engineer issued an order finding that the evidence presented at the initial public hearing satisfied the relevant criteria set forth in K.S.A. 82a-1041 and ordered that a second hearing to consider the designation of the Four County LEMA would be held. The initial order is available at http://www.agriculture.ks.gov/FourCountyLEMA.

Since the chief engineer found at the initial hearing that the Four County LEMA plan satisfied the relevant criteria set forth in K.S.A. 82a-1041, the chief engineer has scheduled a second public hearing pursuant to K.S.A. 82a-1041. The hearing will be held at 10:00 a.m. (CST) February 2, 2023, at the Western Kansas Child Advocacy Center, 212 E. 5th St., Scott City, Kansas. The hearing will continue as long as is necessary for a full disclosure of relevant facts. If a full disclosure of relevant facts cannot be achieved on February 2, 2023, the hearing will continue at a future date that allows adequate notice to be given as required by K.S.A. 82a-1041.

The chief engineer has also scheduled a prehearing conference to take place prior to the hearing. The prehearing conference will be held virtually via Zoom at 10:00 a.m. (CST) January 18, 2023. Members of the public who wish to attend the prehearing conference must pre-register at http://www.agriculture.ks.gov/FourCountyLEMA and can also be obtained by contacting Ronda Hutton at 785564-6715 or ronda.hutton@ks.gov. At the hearing, the chief engineer will serve as the hearing officer. The hearing will be conducted pursuant to K.S.A. 82a-1041 and K.A.R. 5-19-3 and will determine whether the proposed LEMA should be designated and if the corrective controls proposed in the LEMA Management Plan shall be accepted, rejected, or if modifications to the plan should be proposed.

Anyone may submit written or oral comments to be included in the hearing record. Oral comments will be accepted only from in-person attendees at the hearing location in Scott City, Kansas. Written comments may be submitted at the public hearing or may be mailed to the Four County LEMA, c/o Ronda Hutton, 1320 Research Park Dr., Manhattan, KS 66502; faxed to 785-564-6777; or emailed to ronda.hutton@ks.gov. Written comments may be submitted until February 9, 2023 and must be postmarked by that date. After that date, the chief engineer will close the record of the initial hearing and will issue an order accepting the proposed LEMA plan, rejecting the proposed plan, or returning the plan to GMD No. 1 and giving GMD No. 1 the opportunity to modify and resubmit the plan.

The Livestock Competition Arena for the Animal Science Department features an arena with seating for 3,000. It also includes covered stock pens, bucking chutes, roping boxes, circulation alleys with access to all the pens and the arena. Offices, a meeting room, event storage, restrooms with showers, and a security/first aid room with direct access to the ambulance parking and other support spaces. Notice is hereby given of the commencement of negotiations for construction management at-risk services for University of Kansas' 11th and Mississippi Project.

The corner of 11th and Mississippi is becoming the north gateway to the University of Kansas (KU) with direct access to the new Jayhawk Welcome Center, the Kansas Memorial Union, Dyche Hall, Spencer Museum of Art, and David Booth Kansas Memorial Stadium. As the north gateway to campus, the University wants to develop a multi-purpose venue with year-round use, which may incorporate conference or entertainment capabilities, retail, dining, hospitality, health care services, or other facilities that support economic development and the University's academic mission. Each May the venue will be host one of the most important moments in a Jayhawk's journey, walking down Campanile hill for graduation and on seven Saturdays during the fall be the home of Kansas Football. Further definition and direction on what will be incorporated into the multi-purpose event center will be provided after an economic impact study is completed in January 2023.

For KU fans who have experienced a football game at Memorial Stadium and walked around Campanile Hill, this campus setting is memorable and nostalgic. The new venue will be designed to drive economic development, provide services that help to recruit and retain students and make KU, and the KU experience even greater. To be considered for this project, consultants should have extensive experience working with multi-purpose 24/7/365 venues, power 5 football facilities, the city of Lawrence and Lawrence Planning. The project has a construction cost estimate of \$251,250,000.

The proposed action is to reissue an existing pretreatment permit for an existing facility. This facility can process metal parts for various clients. This includes phosphating steel parts to prepare them for paint, using a three-stage washer. (Outfall 001A) A new automated zinc plating operation will also be utilized to treat steel and a new automated anodizing operation will be used to process aluminum parts. Spent wastewater from the new regulated processes will be treated by a new DMP treatment system to reduce and remove heavy metals, before discharge. If necessary, wastes from the three-stage washer can also be treated by the new treatment system, if needed. ## Notice of 2022 Update to Guidelines for Evaluating Proposed Governmental Actions to Identify Potential Takings of Private Property

The Private Property Protection Act, K.S.A. 77-701 *et seq.*, requires the Attorney General to compile and annually update guidelines<sup>1</sup> to be used by state agencies in determining whether proposed government actions may constitute a taking of private property. These guidelines are to be based on cases decided by the United States Supreme Court and the Kansas Supreme Court.<sup>2</sup> Government action is defined as legislation, regulations or directives, or agency guidelines and procedures for the issuing of licenses or permits.<sup>3</sup> The Act expressly excludes other types of activity, such as the formal exercise of eminent domain.<sup>4</sup>

Under the criteria of the Act, there are no cases to include in the 2022 update to the Attorney General's Guidelines. $^{5}$
