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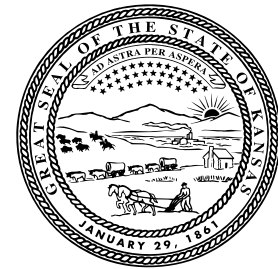

#### Location and Scope of Work

The rehabilitation project is located directly east of the Sac and Fox Truck Stop. Rehabilitation consists of replacement of 142 feet of 12" PS Pipe, new drainage diaphragm, etc. Landowners are the Sac and Fox Nation of Missouri in Kansas and Nebraska.

Notice is hereby given that the Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE) is soliciting comments regarding a proposed air quality construction permit. Transcontinental Robbie, Inc. has applied for an air quality construction permit in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-300. **Background and Scope of Projects**

With this single solicitation, KDOT is requesting consulting services for construction inspections on the projects listed in Table 1. This table provides summary information for each project. 2. Ranking of proposals is expected to occur on or around June 12, 2024. Negotiations with the most highly ranked firm are expected to begin on or around June 25, 2024. An executed agreement is anticipated shortly thereafter.
3. Anticipated scope starts dates and working days or anticipated calendar completion dates are shown in the table. All dates are subject to change.

**Instructions for Proposal**

1. No cost or pricing information shall be submitted with the proposal. Proposals including cost or pricing information will be considered non-responsive and withdrawn from further consideration.
2. The consultant’s proposal must not exceed the page limit laid out in Table 2 below (including any cover letter, index, etc.). All pages shall be standard letter size (8.5” x 11”). Any page larger than standard letter size will be counted as two or more pages depending on size.

  - a. Each team is limited to a single, one-page cover letter.
  - b. Consultants may indicate interest in any and all projects, indicate preference (s) for up to three projects, and shall both indicate interest and preferences on the “April 2024 Construction Inspections Interest & Preference Form” is provided on the Bid Express page to complete and upload. Also, consultants are to use the bottom

of that form to indicate any capacity limitations that need to be taken into account when making selections.
