The Kansas Department of Health and Environment, Division of Health Care Finance (KDHE-DHCF), is amending the Kansas Medicaid State Plan to discontinue the OneCare Kansas (OCK) program as a covered service effective January 1, 2025.

The six core OCK services will remain available to current members until December 31, 2024. Affected members will have the option to transition to alternative care coordination models within KanCare. All physical and behavioral health care services will continue under the KanCare program.

KDHE-DHCF will submit five State Plan Amendments (SPAs) to the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS). The first SPA will be for Medicaid members with a serious mental illness (SMI). The second SPA will be for Medicaid members with asthma and who are at risk for developing another chronic health condition. The third SPA will remove OneCare Kansas services from Mandatory Managed Care, Attachment 3.1-F. The fourth and fifth SPAs will remove Health Homes (OneCare Kansas) from the Working Healthy Alternative Benefit Plan (ABP) and the STEPS Alternative Benefit Plan (ABP).

For the Working Healthy ABP SPA and the STEPS ABP SPA, the State assures that, as outlined in 42 CFR §440.345, EPSDT services will continue to be available to all eligible ABP beneficiaries and that the state will comply with the provisions of section 5006(e) of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009.

The proposed effective date for these five SPAs is January 1, 2025.

Notice of Water Quality Certification

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE) has drafted a water quality certification per Section 401 of the Clean Water Act (CWA) as requested by the United States Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) Environmental Resources Section. A Power Point presentation containing a summary of the activities for the Tuttle Creek Reservoir Water Injection Dredging Demonstration Project can be found at https://usace.contentdm. oclc.org/utils/getfile/collection/p16021coll7/id/25655.

The objective is to investigate the feasibility and potential positive and negative environmental outcomes from injecting water into the basin of the lake to restore storage. The USACE would calculate flow regimes of the lake to meter out sediment into the Big Blue River and ultimately the Kanas River. Willow Lake below the dam may also be impacted. Pre-project water quality, basin and biological condition data have been collected from in-lake, lake inlets, and downstream into both rivers. An adaptive management plan has also been developed to address extreme weather conditions or other circumstances that may jeopardize the integrity of the demonstration including environmental impacts.

- (d) Any emergency medical responder or emergency medical technician applicant who is tested in psychomotor skills and who fails may retest a maximum of three times.
- (e) Each emergency medical responder, emergency medical technician, advanced emergency medical technician, and paramedic applicant shall be required to successfully complete all applicable examinations no later than 24 months after the last date of that individual's initial course of instruction. Each emergency medical responder and emergency medical technician applicant shall be required to successfully complete both the cognitive examination and the prescribed psychomotor skills examination within a 12-month period.
- (f) Any psychomotor skills examination for certification may be modified by the board as a pilot project to evaluate proposed changes to the psychomotor skills examination. For emergency medical responder and emergency medical technician, the candidate shall schedule the examination with a sponsoring organization of an approved examination site. Article 15.—CERTIFICATION

- (3) documentation from another state or jurisdiction verifying one of the following:
- (A) That the applicant is currently licensed or certified for the level of certification sought and is in good standing; or
- (B) that the applicant was previously licensed or certified for the level of certification being sought and was in good standing at the time of expiration of that credential;
- (4) documentation from another state or jurisdiction verifying that the applicant has successfully completed coursework that is substantially equivalent to the curriculum prescribed by the board for the level of certification sought, in accordance with subsection (b);
- (5) documentation from another state or jurisdiction verifying that the applicant has successfully completed an examination prescribed by the board for the level of certification sought, in accordance with subsection (b); and
- (6) a fingerprint card and criminal history record check fee of \$60 for the board to successfully perform a state and national criminal history record check.
- (b) Any applicant may validate successful completion of coursework in another state or jurisdiction that is substantially equivalent to the curriculum prescribed by the board for the level of certification sought by submitting one of the following:
- (1) Documentation that the applicant is currently registered with the national registry of emergency medical technicians at the level for which certification is sought; or
- (2) documentation that the applicant has successfully completed the following within four years before the date of application:
- (A) The national registry of emergency medical technicians' cognitive assessment or examination for the level of certification being sought; and
- (B) the psychomotor skills assessment or examination prescribed by the board for the level of certification being sought.
- (c) Information obtained from the state and national criminal history record check may be used to verify the identity of each applicant and to assist in determining the qualifications and fitness of the applicant seeking issuance of an EMS provider certificate.
- (d) The results from each applicant's criminal history record check shall be received by the board before the issuance of Kansas certification. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2023 Supp. 65-6111 and K.S.A. 2023 Supp. 65-6129; effective May 15, 2009; amended Sept.

- **109-15-3.** EMS provider certification. (a) Any individual who successfully completed an approved initial course of instruction may apply for Kansas EMS provider certification.
- (b) An application for certification shall not be considered complete unless all requested information has been provided and the applicable application for certification fee, as specified in K.A.R. 109-7-1, has been submitted.
- (c) Each applicant shall have 15 days to correct all identified deficiencies and submit a complete application. If the applicant fails to correct the deficiencies and submit a complete application within 15 days, the application may be considered by the board as withdrawn. All fees shall be nonrefundable.
- (d) Each applicant shall be at least 17 years of age and meet the following requirements before the date of application:
- (1) Have successfully completed an approved initial course of instruction at the level of certification being sought and within the previous 24 months;
- (2) have passed both the cognitive and psychomotor examinations for the level of certification being sought after the date of the last class of the approved initial course of instruction completed and as specified in K.A.R. 109-8-1;
- (3) if the level of certification being sought is AEMT, currently hold EMS provider certification as an EMT;
- (4) if the level of certification being sought is paramedic, currently hold EMS provider certification as an EMT or AEMT; and
- (5) if the applicant has not previously held an EMS provider certificate in Kansas, have submitted a fingerprint card and criminal history record check fee of \$60 for the board to successfully perform a state and national criminal history record check.
- (e) Information obtained from the state and national criminal history record check may be used to verify the identity of each applicant and to assist in determining the qualifications and fitness of the applicant seeking issuance of an EMS provider certificate.
- (f) The results from each applicant's criminal history record check shall be received by the board before the issuance of an initial EMS provider certificate. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2023 Supp. 65-6111 and K.S.A. 2023 Supp. 65-6129; effective Dec. 31, 2021; amended Nov. 1, 2024.)

Article 17.—SPONSORING ORGANIZATIONS

- **109-17-4.** Sponsoring organization; continuing education. (a) Any sponsoring organization may provide prior-approved continuing education as a long-term provider or a single-program provider through in-person instruction or distance learning, or a combination of both.
- (b) Each sponsoring organization providing priorapproved continuing education shall submit a training report through the online license management system within 30 days of the last date of class.
 - (c) The training report shall include the following:
 - (1) The date or dates, title, and location of the class;
 - (2) a list of all qualified instructors used in the class;
- (3) the name and certification number of each attendee; and
- (4) the amount of continuing education awarded to each attendee.
- (d) Each sponsoring organization shall maintain the following course records for each prior-approved continuing education class for at least three years from the last date of class:
 - (1) Course educational objectives;
 - (2) completed course attendance sheet;
- (3) a completed copy of each student's evaluation of the class and each instructor; and
 - (4) a copy of the submitted training report.
- (e) Each completed course attendance sheet shall have the name and signature of each attendee of the priorapproved continuing education class.
- (f) Each sponsoring organization providing priorapproved continuing education as a long-term provider shall develop and maintain a long-term continuing education program management plan.
- (g) Each sponsoring organization shall provide any continuing education documentation requested by the executive director within 30 days of the request.
- (h) Violation of any provision of this regulation may subject the sponsoring organization to a civil fine and may result in a suspension of sponsoring organization approval.
