Interested parties are invited to submit a proposal to complete the scope of the Kansas Heritage Railroad Preservation Project in Abilene, Kansas. The Abilene and Smoky Valley Railroad is a 501(c)3 non-profit Kansas based association since 1992. The property has been designated as the Kansas Heritage Railroad by K.S.A. 73-4401.

Scope of Work

Abilene and Smoky Valley Railroad requests completion of all aspects needed to complete the following work over approximately 5.7 miles of existing track, originally 1887 CRI&P track, between Abilene and Enterprise Kansas. The scope is defined further as follows:

- Mobilize all equipment, materials, and personnel needed to site.
- Replace approximately 1,000 crossties.
- Perform rail maintenance of mismatched joints, grinding and repairing separations.
- Perform joint maintenance as necessary with comp or relay bars and replace and/or tighten all loose track bolts.
- Install new ballast to provide an adequate base for maintaining or exceeding FRA Class-1.
- Machine tamp, skim lift, and surface tracks removing all cross-level and joint dips.
- Perform turnout rehabilitation on five switches including weld and face points, adjust switches for proper throw and lubricate, and furnish/install switch ties between all switches.
- Clean up track area according to the description under "Other Responsibilities" in this document.

All pre-existing rail, ties, OTM, or other materials that are removed must be disposed of according to all local, state, and federal regulations.

Minimum Requirements

1. Roadway Worker Protection.
2. Comply with all Abilene and Smoky Valley Railroad requirements.
3. Contractors shall comply with all parts of 49 CFR Part 214 and 219 regarding FRA Roadway Worker Safety at all times. Workers and equipment shall remain clear of the track unless they have gained Roadway Worker Protection from a qualified person.
4. Contractor, contractor employees, agents, and/or subcontractors must be enrolled and comply with the FRA 219 approved drug testing program.
5. Subcontracted work will need to be approved prior to any work starting.

Work Windows

Time is of the essence. Impact to current railroad operations must be kept to a minimum. When work must take place that causes an active track to be taken out of service for the purposes of performing work that pertains to the project, the contractor must pre-arrange a defined work window with the General Manager of the Abilene and Smoky Valley Railroad. Generally scheduled operating days from mid-May through September are Thursday, Friday, Saturday, and Sunday. Abilene and Smoky Valley Railroad is part of a Rails-to-Trails trail and the trail will need to be blocked during work activities.

Standards

All standards referenced by the project plans, scope of work, and specifications, as well as applicable AREMA standards must be upheld during all phases of the project. Use existing rail.

Submittals

The following documents shall be submitted at the time listed by the contractor as part of the project:

1. Schedule of Work: Submitted with proposal.
2. Certificate of Insurance: Submitted prior to construction.
3. Safety Plan: Submitted prior to construction.
4. Proof of Roadway Worker Training: Submitted prior to construction.

Other Responsibilities

1. Permits – The contractor is responsible for all federal, state, and local permits for the work.
2. Utilities – Contractor is responsible for locating and protecting site utilities.
3. Site Clean-up – Contractor is responsible for proper site disposal of materials in accordance with local, state and federal laws. The contractor is responsible for site restoration. Old ties will be allowed to be stored on site in a pile away from track.
4. Right-of-Way Access – Contractor is responsible for obtaining proper right of way entry prior to Abilene and Smoky Valley Railroad property and

Senate Bill No. 2

AN ACT concerning elections; relating to question submitted elections on the issuance of bonds by a school district; validating the election results for the bond issuance question submitted by the board of education of USD 200, Greeley county; relating to publication requirements; providing for publication on the website of the county election office if such office has a website; amending K.S.A. 2024 Supp. 10-120 and repealing the existing section.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

New Section 1. The result of the election held on May 21, 2024, on the question submitted by the board of education of unified school district no. 200, Greeley county, for the purpose of authorizing the issuance of general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed \$4,600,000 to pay the costs to: (a) Construct, furnish, equip and acquire improvements, additions and renovations to the school district's elementary and junior/senior high school facility, including safety and security improvements, playground improvements, locker room additions and renovations, a gymnasium addition and improvements to comply with the Americans with disabilities act; (b) construct, furnish, equip and acquire other necessary renovations and improvements to school district facilities; (c) make all other necessary improvements appurtenant thereto; and (d) pay the costs of issuance and interest on the bonds during construction of the project is hereby declared valid, and the board of education may issue such general obligation bonds as otherwise provided by law in an amount not to exceed \$4,600,000 for the purposes specified herein.

Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2024 Supp. 10-120 is hereby amended to read as follows: 10-120. (a) Whenever an election is required for the issuance of bonds for any purpose by any municipality other than an irrigation district or where a different procedure for giving notice of the election is specifically provided by law, upon compliance with the legal requirements necessary and precedent to the call for the election, the proper municipal officers shall call an election. The election shall be held within 60 days after compliance with the necessary requirements, or within 90 days, should the longer period include the date of a general election.

(b) Notice of the election shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation in the municipality once each week for two consecutive weeks *and on the website of the county election office of any county where the election is to be conducted if such county election office has a website.* The first publication shall be not less than 21 days prior to the election. ~~Notice of the election shall also be published on the website of the county election office of any county where the election is to be conducted. Such notice shall be published not less than 21 days prior to the election and~~ *If published on the website of the county election office, such publication shall remain on the website until the day after the election.* The notice shall set forth the time and place of holding the election and the purpose for which the bonds are to be issued and shall be signed by the county election

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officer. The election shall be held at the usual place of holding elections and shall be conducted by the officers or persons provided by law for holding elections in the municipality.

Sec. 3. K.S.A. 2024 Supp. 10-120 is hereby repealed.

Sec. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the Kansas register.
