**Bills Introduced February 25-March 3:**

SB 857, by Committee on Federal and State Affairs: an act concerning the waterworks board in Leavenworth, Kansas; amending K.S.A. 13-2414 and repealing the existing section.

SB 858, by Committee on Federal and State Affairs: An act concerning the corrections ombudsman board; relating to subpoena and other powers for the board and the ombudsman of corrections; providing for confidentiality of certain information.

SB 859, by Committee on Federal and State Affairs: An act concerning state moneys; relating to the definition of certain terms; amending K.S.A. 1981 Supp. 75-4201 and repealing the existing section.

SB 860, by Committee on Ways and Means: An act concerning the pooled money investment board; placing the budgeting, purchasing and related management functions, and personnel thereof under the state treasurer; amending K.S.A. 1981 Supp. 75-4222 and repealing the existing section.

SB 861, by Committee on Ways and Means: An act concerning the pooled money investment board; relating to repurchase agreements with state banks, national banks and trust companies located and doing business in Kansas.

HB 3123, by Committee on Ways and Means: An act relating to banks and banking; concerning detached auxiliary banking services facilities; amending K.S.A. 1981 Supp. 9-1111 and repealing the existing section.

HB 3124, by Committee on Ways and Means: An act concerning the payment of the cost of tuition and other educational training expenses of certain personnel of state agencies; relating to rules and regulations prescribing limitations and procedures therefor; amending K.S.A. 75-5519 and repealing the existing section.

HB 3125, by Committee on Ways and Means: An act concerning setoff against debtors of the state of amounts owed; relating to hearings, amending K.S.A. 1981 Supp. 75-6207 and repealing the existing section.

HB 3126, by Committee on Ways and Means: An act relating to insurance companies; increasing the mill levy for maintaining the department of the state fire marshal; amending K.S.A. 75-1508 and repealing the existing section.

SCR 1655, by Committee on Ways and Means: A concurrent resolution concerning the state librarian; concerning distribution of money for the blind and physically handicapped program; modifying K.A.R. 54-3-3 and rejecting Kansas administrative regulation 54-3-3 as adopted by the state librarian and filed with the revisor of statutes on December 31, 1981.

HCR 5055, by Joint Committee on Administrative Rules and Regulations: A concurrent resolution concerning fees charged by the board of cosmetology; rejecting Kansas administrative regulations 69-11-1, as adopted by the board of cosmetology and filed with the revisor of statutes on December 17, 1981.

## ATTORNEY GENERAL

## OPINION NO. 82-48

Cities, First Class—Waterworks Department—Waterworks Board In Cities Having Military Reservation Adjacent Thereto. Robert D. Beall, Leavenworth City Attorney, Leavenworth, February 25, 1982.

There is no legal basis for the city of Leavenworth to operate a waterworks department, or elect a waterworks board, under the provisions of K.S.A. 13-2414 to 13-2428. The city may operate its water department under K.S.A. 13-2401 to 13-2412, or exercise its power of home rule to provide substitute and additional provisions relating to the operation of a waterworks department. ## OPINION NO. 82-49

**Cities of the Third Class—Mayor-Council Form of Government—Mayor Acting as Dog Catcher.** Wayne C. Riggs, Mayor, McCune, February 25, 1982.

The mayor of a city of the third-class having the mayor-council form of government is not precluded by statute or by the common-law doctrine of incompatibility of offices from also performing the functions of a dog catcher, when such duties are vested in him by city ordinance and do not result in any additional compensation being paid to him. Cited herein: K.S.A. 15-301, 15-1402, 15-1407, 15-1502. JSS.

## OPINION NO. 82-50

**Public Health—Solid and Hazardous Waste—Condemnation of Property For Storing Radioactive Waste.** LeRoy F. Fry, State Representative, Topeka, February 25, 1982.

The provisions of K.S.A. 1981 Supp. 65-3449(b) cannot be construed as an implied delegation of the power of eminent domain to any state board or agency.

If the Kansas Legislature were to enact legislation authorizing condemnation proceedings to acquire real property for use as a radioactive waste storage facility, and declaring condemnation of property for such use to be a "public use," the condemnation of property under such an enactment would probably be upheld by the courts of this state. However, any specific "taking" of property, thereunder, would be open to judicial review for the purpose of considering public use, fraud, bad faith, or abuse of discretion. ## OPINION NO. 82-51

**Schools—Boards of Education—Lease of School Buildings By Religious and Other Organizations.** Senator Paul "Bud" Burke, Ninth District, Topeka, February 26, 1982.

If a board of education permits school buildings of the district to be leased by numerous non school related groups and organizations when those buildings are not in use for school purposes, the board has created a forum generally open for use by such groups and organizations. Having created this open forum, the board cannot exclude a group or organization on the basis of the religious content of the group's intended speech. Such an exclusion is not justified as maintaining separation of church and state under the Establishment Clause of the First Amendment to the United States Constitution. Cited herein: K.S.A. 72-8212, U.S. Const., Amend. I. RJB.

## OPINION NO. 82-52

**Schools—School Buildings—Use for Religious Purposes.** Mr. Gary Fisher, Superintendent, Unified School District No. 211, Norton, February 26, 1982.

Public school buildings may not be used for optional student assemblies which include prayer, and reading and study of the Bible, and which are held immediately prior to the start of instruction at the school. Cited herein: U.S. Const., Amends. I, XIV. RJB.

## OPINION NO. 82-53

**State Departments; Public Officers, Employees—State Library, Services—Kansas Register.** William R. Kaufman, State Board of Regents, Topeka, February 26, 1982.

The Secretary of State, pursuant to K.S.A. 75-2567(b), must provide the Kansas Register to each complete depository library free of charge. Cited herein: K.S.A. 1981 Supp. 75-430, 75-433, K.S.A. 75-2565, 75-2566, 75-2567.

## OPINION NO. 82-54

**Roads and Bridges—Bridges; General Provisions—Multiple Tax Levys for Bridges.** Philip E. Winter, Assistant County Attorney, Emporia, February 26, 1982.

The taxes authorized by K.S.A. 68-1103 and K.S.A. 68-1135 are separate and distinct and may be levied simultaneously so long as the provisions of K.S.A. 79-5001 *et seq.*, are followed. Cited herein: K.S.A. 68-1103, 68-1135, K.S.A. 1981 Supp. 79-1947, K.S.A. 79-5001, 79-5011. BJS.

## OPINION NO. 82-55

**Uniform Commercial Code—Secured Transactions—Information on Documents on File; Certification Required.** Margaret Anderson, Register of Deeds, Russell, February 26, 1982.

Pursuant to K.S.A. 1981 Supp. 84-9-407(2), the register of deeds shall, upon written request, issue a certificate stating whether any presently effective financing statements or assignments are on file which name a particular debtor. Such certificates must be in the usual form for such documents (*i.e.* signed by the register of deeds or a deputy), and may be issued only after the statutorily-established fee has been tendered. Cited herein: K.S.A. 84-9-401, 84-9-407. JSS.

## OPINION NO. 82-56

**Insurance—Agents—Requirement To Furnish Evidence of Successful Completion of Minimum Educational Courses.** The Honorable Larry F. Turnquist, The Honorable Rex B. Hoy, State Representatives, Topeka, March 1, 1982.

The requirements imposed by K.S.A. 40-240a *et seq.* are minimum educational requirements, and the exemption from compliance with said requirements, set forth in K.S.A. 40-240e, is not, on its face, arbitrary, capricious or unreasonable. Cited herein: K.S.A. 40-240a, 40-240b, 40-240c, and 40-240e. TRH.

**HOUSE BILL No. 2738**

AN ACT making and concerning appropriations for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1982, for the university of Kansas medical center, Kansas state penitentiary, board of state fair managers, state park and resources authority, Kansas soldiers' home, adjutant general, department of corrections, legislature, Wichita state university and insurance department; authorizing certain transfers, imposing certain restrictions and limitations, and directing or authorizing certain receipts and disbursements and acts incidental to the foregoing.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:*

Section 1. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 1982, appropriations are hereby made, restrictions and limitations are hereby imposed, and transfers, receipts, disbursements and acts incidental to the foregoing are hereby directed or authorized as provided in this act.

(a) Expenditures may be made by the above agency during the fiscal year ending June 30, 1982, from the legislative expense (including official hospitality) account of the state general fund for publication in the Kansas register of notices of legislative meetings and agendas, descriptions of bills, resolutions and other matters being considered by the legislature or either house thereof, descriptions of actions of the legislature or either house or any committee thereof, and any other information pertaining to the legislature.

WICHITA STATE UNIVERSITY

(a) There is appropriated for the above agency from the Kansas educational building fund the following:

Physical education and student services complex and associated play fields . . . . . \$349,000

Provided, That expenditures may be made from this account for a capital improvement project for planning, demolition and reconstruction of the handball courts: Provided further, That the above agency is hereby authorized to negotiate and enter into contracts for such project: And provided further, That such project shall not be subject to the competitive bid requirements of K.S.A. 1981 Supp. 75-3739 to 75-3741, inclusive: And provided further, That such project shall not be subject to the provisions of K.S.A. 1981 Supp. 75-5404 requiring the convening of a negotiating committee.

Bonds maturing in the years 1983 to 1989, inclusive, shall mature without option of prior payment. Bonds maturing in the years 1990 to 1993, inclusive, shall be subject to call for prior payment in inverse numerical order on any interest payment date on 30 days prior notice published in the Kansas Register at a premium of 2.5% (\$125.00 per \$5,000.00 bond) plus interest accrued to the date fixed for payment.

Interest on all of said Bonds will be payable beginning March 1, 1983, and semi-annually thereafter on September 1 and March 1 in each year until the principal sum is paid. Both principal of and interest on said Bonds will be payable in lawful money of the United States of America at the office of the State Treasurer in the City of Topeka, Kansas.

Bids involving the use of extra or supplemental coupons will not be considered. Bids for less than the entire issue of Bonds will not be considered.

Bids shall be submitted on the "Official Bid Form" furnished by the City and should be addressed to Anna Marie Webb, City Clerk, plainly marked "Bond Bid". All bids must state the total interest cost of the bid, the premium, if any, the net interest cost of the bid, and the average annual interest rate, all certified by the bidder to be correct; and the City will be entitled to rely on the certificate of correctness of the bidder. The check of the successful bidder will be cashed and the proceeds thereof will be held as security for the performance of his contract to purchase the Bonds. In the event that the successful bidder shall fail to carry out its contract of purchase, the amount of said deposit shall be retained by the City as liquidated damages. The Bonds, duly printed, executed and registered, will be furnished and paid for by said City of Moscow, Kansas, and the Bonds will be sold subject to the legal opinion of Messrs. Curfman, Harris & Weigand, Wichita, Kansas, whose unqualified approving opinion will be furnished and paid for by the City. The purchaser will be furnished with a complete transcript of proceedings evidencing the authorization and issuance of the Bonds, and the usual closing proofs which will include a certificate that there is no litigation pending or threatened at the time of delivery of the Bonds affecting their validity. Delivery of the Bonds will be made to the successful bidder on or before April 29, 1982, at any bank in the Cities of Topeka, or Wichita, Kansas, or Kansas City, Missouri, at the expense of the City. Delivery elsewhere will be made at the purchaser's expense.
