MODIFICATION OF STATE CETA FY 83 PLAN

This is to notify all interested parties that the Kansas Balance of State Comprehensive Employment and Training Plan for Fiscal Year 1983 will be modified to reflect the increased allocation authorized by the Continuing Resolution which was passed by Congress and signed by the President.

The State of Kansas will receive a total of \$9,488,268 for employment and training programs in Fiscal Year 1983—October 1, 1982 through September 30, 1983. Titles IIBC, IVA and VII will be consolidated into one program to provide Classroom Training, On-the-Job Training, and/or Work Experience to economically disadvantaged youth and adults, aged 16 and over.

The Summer Youth Employment Program, Title IVC, will begin June 6, 1983 to provide summer employment and career development opportunities to economically disadvantaged youth, aged 14-21.

Expenditures are planned as follows:
