NOTICE OF HEARING **ON PROPOSED TEMPORARY** ADMINISTRATIVE REGULATIONS

Notice is given that a public hearing will be held at 8:30 A.M. on December 13, 1982 in the conference room of the Department of Corrections, 3rd Floor, 535 Kansas Avenue, Topeka, Kansas 66603.

The regulations are:

K.A.R. 44-12-304(c). The reporting requirement in paragraph (c) is deleted as being nearly impossible to comply with without seriously inhibiting the discipline process in prison. A field audit can accomplish the same result.

K.A.R. 44-13-404(g). The investigation requirement is changed. As it now exists it is impossible to comply with and is unnecessary and unproductive. Upon clarification of the true meaning of The American Correctional Association Standard, the rule must be modified and reflect reality and the current ACA interpretation. Failure to do so will inhibit the inmate discipline process. The investigation proposed to be required is to ascertain reliability of facts before bringing the discipline charge.

The fiscal impact is zero.

TEMPORARY ADMINISTRATIVE REGULATIONS (Approved by the State Rules and Regulations Board November 10, 1982. Will expire May 1, 1983.)

Article 1—Agricultural Chemicals

4-1-17. Registration fee. The annual registration fee for each agricultural chemical registered shall be \$15.00. This regulation shall be effective for all agricultural chemicals registered in registration periods occurring from and after December 31, 1982. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2-2205 and K.S.A. 2-2204 as amended by Chapter 4 of the 1982 Session Laws; implementing K.S.A. 2-2204 as amended by Chapter 4 of the 1982 Session Laws; effective T-83-35, Nov. 10, 1982.)

Article 4—Commercial Fertilizer

4-4-2. Inspection fee. The inspection fee for commercial fertilizers shall be \$.25 per ton of 2,000 pounds. This regulation shall apply to fertilizer sold on and after December 31, 1982. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2-1205 as amended by Chapter 4 of the 1982 Session Laws; implementing K.S.A. 2-1205 as amended by Chapter 4 of the 1982 Session Laws; effective T-83-35, Nov. 10, 1982.)

Article 18—Annual Registration Fee for Livestock Remedy

4-18-1. Registration fee. The annual registration fee for each livestock remedy registered shall be \$10.00. This regulation shall be effective for all livestock remedies registered in registration periods occurring from and after December 31, 1982. (Authorized by K.S.A. 47-504 as amended by Chapter 4 of the 1982 Session Laws; implementing K.S.A. 47-504 as amended by Chapter 4 of the 1982 Session Laws; effective T-83-35, Nov. 10, 1982.)

Article 19—Registration Fee for Soil Amendment

4-19-1. Registration fee. The registration fee for each soil amendment shall be \$50.00 for each product registered. This regulation shall apply to products registered in registration periods commencing on and after January 1, 1983. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2-2811 and 1981 Supp. 2-2805 as amended by Chapter 4 of the 1982 Session Laws; implementing K.S.A. 1981 Supp. 2-2805 as amended by Chapter 4 of the 1982 Session Laws; effective T-83-35, Nov. 10, 1982.)

Article 13—Pesticides

4-13-20. Pesticide business license fees. The application fee for a pesticide business license or for the renewal of a pesticide business license shall be \$75.00 for each category in which the applicant applies for a pesticide business license or renewal of that license. An additional fee of \$10.00 for each uncertified individual employed by the applicant to apply pesticides shall also be paid. This regulation shall apply to all pesticide business licenses, or renewals thereof, that will be effective for calendar years commencing after December 31, 1982, regardless of when the application is received by the agency. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1981 Supp. 2-2467a and K.S.A. 1981 Supp. 2-2440 as amended by Section 8 of Chapter 4 of the 1982 Session Laws; implementing K.S.A. 1981 Supp. 2-2440 as amended by Section 8 of Chapter 4 of the 1982 Session Laws; effective T-83-36, Nov. 10, 1982.)

4-13-21. Government agency registration fee. The application fee for a government agency registration shall be \$35.00. This regulation shall affect all government agency registrations, or renewals thereof, effective for calendar years commencing from and after December 31, 1982, regardless of when the application is received by the agency. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1981 Supp. 2-2467a and Chapter 4 of the 1982 Session Laws; implementing K.S.A. 1981 Supp. 2-2440 as amended by Chapter 4 of the 1982 Session Laws;

effective T-83-36, Nov. 10, 1982.)

4-13-22. Application fee for commercial applicator's certificate. The application fee for a commercial applicator's certificate shall be \$35.00 for each category in which the applicant applies. This regulation shall apply to all commercial applicator certificates, or renewals thereof, that will be effective for calendar years commencing after December 31, 1982, regardless of when the application is received by the agency. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1981 Supp. 2-2467a and K.S.A. 1981 Supp. 2-2441a as amended by Chapter 4 of the 1982 Session Laws; implementing K.S.A. 1981 Supp. 2-2441a as amended by Chapter 4 of the 1982 Session Laws; effective T-83-36, Nov. 10, 1982.)

4-13-23. Examination fees. The examination fee for a commercial applicator's certificate shall be \$25.00 for each category in which the applicant is to be examined. The same fee shall apply if the applicant seeks reexamination. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1981 Supp. 2-2467a and K.S.A. 1981 Supp. 2-2443a as amended by Chapter 4 of the 1982 Session Laws; implementing K.S.A. 1981 Supp. 2-2443a as amended by Chapter 4 of the 1982 Session Laws; effective T-83-36, Nov. 10, 1982.)

4-13-24. Certified private applicator certificate fee. The certified private applicator's certificate fee shall be \$10.00. This regulation shall apply to certified private applicator's certificates that will be effective for calendar years from and after December 31, 1982, regardless of when the application is received by the agency. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1981 Supp. 2-2467a and K.S.A. 1981 Supp. 2-2445a as amended by Chapter 4 of the 1982 Session Laws; implementing K.S.A. 1981 Supp. 2-2445a as amended by Chapter 4 of the 1982 Session Laws; effective T-83-36, Nov. 10, 1982.)

Article 14—Fees

4-14-1. Inspection fee. Fees charged for the inspection of honeybees for disease detection and control are established at the rate of \$20.00 per hour for the time actually required to make the inspection plus the mileage expenses incurred by the inspector in traveling to and from the inspection site. Mileage expenses shall be governed by the mileage allowance rate prescribed by rules and regulations adopted pursuant to K.S.A. 1981 Supp. 75-3203a or amendments thereof. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2-424 and 2-413 as amended by Chapter 4 of the 1982 Session Laws; implementing K.S.A. 2-413 as amended by Chapter 4 of the 1982 Session Laws; effective, T-83-37, Nov. 10, 1982.)

4-14-2. Transportation fee. The application fee for a permit to import honeybees or used beekeeping equipment into the state shall be \$.15 per colony of bees to be imported or \$5.00 per application, whichever is greater. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2-424 and 2-415 as amended by Chapter 4 of the 1982 Session Laws; implementing K.S.A. 2-415 as amended by Chapter 4 of the 1982 Session Laws; effective, T-83-37, Nov. 10,

1982.)

4-14-3. Registration fee. The fee for registration of a beekeeper's apiary shall be \$.15 for each colony of bees in the apiary to be registered. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2-424 and 2-422a as amended by Chapter 4 of the 1982 Session Laws; implementing K.S.A. 2-422a as amended by Chapter 4 of the 1982 Session Laws; effective, T-83-37, Nov. 10, 1982.)

OPINION NO. 82-239

Crimes and Punishments—Code; Crimes Against Property—Tampering With a Traffic Signal. Michael Johnston, State Senator, Fourteenth District, Parsons; Fred A. Kerr, State Senator, Thirty-third District, Pratt, November 8, 1982.

Although K.S.A. 21-3725 and 21-3726 prohibit all persons from manipulating or tampering with railroad traffic signal devices, railroad personnel are excused from complying with said statutes when they are required to manipulate such devices to conduct operational tests in accordance with federal regulations. OPINION NO. 82-240

Roads and Bridges—Minimum Maintenance Roads—River Crossing; Title of Land Held by State. Terry R. Fuller, Edwards County Attorney, Kinsley, November 8, 1982.

Title to the bed and channel of any navigable river is held by the State of Kansas. In that the Arkansas River is legally declared to be a navigable river, title to the bed, even if dry, remains with the state, and its use by a county for road purposes would be subject to the approval of the state. In the absence of such approval, county equipment should not be used to maintain the crossing. Additionally, while a county may designate the county road leading to the crossing as a minimum maintenance road, pursuant to K.S.A. 1981 Supp. 68-5,102, an easement from the state would be required before the crossing itself could be so posted. OPINION NO. 82-241

Public Health—Examination and Registration of Pharmacists—Public Health Departments and Private, Not-For-Profit Family Planning Clinics; Distribution and Control of Prescription Medications. Robert E. Davis, Attorney, Kansas State Board of Pharmacy, Kansas City, November 8, 1982.

The State Board of Pharmacy is not authorized, under the provisions of K.S.A. 65-1648 (as amended by L. 1982, ch. 262, § 5) or any other statute, to adopt a regulation which provides, expressly or by implication, that the issuance of standing orders is outside the authorized course of professional practice of a physician. However, the State Board of Healing Arts has jurisdiction to investigate complaints against practitioners who allegedly issue standing orders in contravention of standards of competent medical practice.

A public health department or private not-for-profit family planning clinic may not distribute any drug to a patient where such distribution would violate any provision of the Uniform Controlled Substances Act, K.S.A. 65-4101 et seq.

A designated registered nurse, in charge of distributing drugs at a public health department or private

not-for-profit family planning clinic (when a pharmacist is not on the premises), may supply the entire quantity of drugs necessary for treatment of a patient, if completion of the course of treatment ordered by the supervising practitioner entails supplying such a quantity of drugs. Cited herein: K.S.A. 65-1626 (as amended by L. 1982, ch. 182, § 138), 65-1648 (as amended by L. 1982, ch. 262, § 5), 65-4101, 65-4123 (as amended by L. 1982, ch. 269, § 7). TRH

OPINION NO. 82-242

Townships and Township Officers—Miscellaneous Provisions—First and Second Class Cities Excluded From Townships. Michael F. Willcott, Lansing City Attorney, Leavenworth, November 8, 1982.

Pursuant to K.S.A. 80-1404, no city of the second class shall be included within the corporate limits of any township. Said statutory provision, which serves as a limitation on township boundaries, may not be made inapplicable to any township or city through the exercise of city home rule powers.

Although statutory provisions prescribe procedures for the sale of real or personal property used in the operation of a township water system, any such property may not be disposed of absent adequate consideration. Cited herein: K.S.A. 12-2901, 80-109, 80-1404, 80-1545; Kan. Const., Art. 12, § 5. TRH

OPINION NO. 82-243

Taxation—Redemption of Real Estate—Interest to be Charged on Offer to Redeem. Annabel A. Miller, Reno County Treasurer, Hutchinson, November 15, 1982.

If a person desires to totally redeem property bid off by the county, the amount of interest owed by the person must be calculated under the provisions of K.S.A. 1981 Supp. 79-2004. If, however, a person desires merely to make a partial redemption of property, the interest due is at the rate specified in K.S.A. 1981 Supp. 79-2968(b) and the amount thereof must be calculated pursuant to K.S.A. 1981 Supp. 79-2401a. Cited herein: K.S.A. 1981 Supp. 79-2401a, 79-2968. RJB

OPINION NO. 82-244

Counties and County Officers—Economic Development Programs—Use of Funds Schools—Vocational Education—Sources of Revenues for Capital Outlay Fund. John C. Herman, Ellis County Attorney, Hays, November 15, 1982.

K.S.A. 72-4440 et seq. provide no authority for a transfer of moneys raised pursuant to the Economic Development Programs tax levy established according to K.S.A. 19-4101 et seq. to the vocational education capital outlay fund. Cited herein: K.S.A. 19-4101, 19-4102, 72-4423, 72-4440, 72-4441, 72-4442, 72-4443. RVE

OPINION NO. 82-245

Counties and County Officers—Ambulance Service— Obligations of County Providing County-wide Ambu-

lance Service. Michael D. Pepoon, Esq., Counsel, Miami County Board of County Commissioners, Paola, November 15, 1982.

K.S.A. 19-261 authorizes a county to provide ambulance service at public expense within such county, except in areas where adequate ambulance service is

already being provided.

The geograhical area served by any ambulance service need not follow the boundaries of any particular taxing district. However, absent an effective interlocal agreement executed pursuant to K.S.A. 12-2001 et seq., there is no apparent authority for a taxing district to provide ambulance service beyond its boundaries.

The board of county commissioners is responsible for determining whether a county-financed ambulance service will serve any particular area of the county. If an entire county receives adequate ambulance service from the county-financed ambulance service, the county is precluded from reimbursing any taxing district that provides a duplicate service.

An effective interlocal agreement entered into pursuant to K.S.A. 12-2901 et seq. would serve to minimize and/or indemnify Miami County's civil liability exposure arising from the operation of an ambulance service pursuant to contract. Cited herein: K.S.A. 12-2901, 19-261. RVE

Laws, Journals and Public Information—Kansas Public Records Law—Public Access to Salary of County Hospital Administrator. David Belling, Miami County Attorney, Paola, November 15, 1982.

Amounts paid as salary to an administrator of a county hospital operating pursuant to K.S.A. 19-1801 et seq., are subject to public access pursuant to K.S.A. 45-201 et seq. Cited herein: K.S.A. 10-801, 10-804, 10-805, 10-806, K.S.A. 1981 Supp. 12-105a, 12-105b, K.S.A. 19-1801, 19-1804, 45-201. BJS
