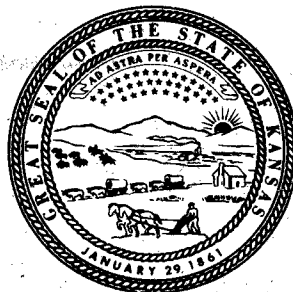

ON PROPOSED TEMPORARY
ADMINISTRATIVE REGULATIONS**

The Secretary of State will hold a public hearing on proposed temporary administrative regulations on January 5, 1983, at 10:00 a.m. in Room 529-South of the Capitol, Topeka, Kansas.

The regulation proposed for adoption as a temporary regulation is K.A.R. 7-29-1 which sets forth the maximum prices allowed for the printing of election ballots pursuant to K.S.A. 25-604. The proposed regulation would set the rates at the same levels as were established by the regulation currently in effect. The prior temporary regulation, K.A.R. 7-29-1, will be revoked.

Copies of the proposed regulations and the fiscal impact statement can be obtained from the Secretary of State, State Capitol, Topeka, Kansas 66612. The Secretary of State will accept oral and written testimony prior to or at the time of the public hearing for consideration in making changes to the proposed regulation prior to adoption.

OPINION NO. 82-252

Taxation—Property Exempt From Taxation—Determination of Exempt Status. Philip W. Martin, Director, Property Valuation Division, Department of Revenue, Topeka, December 2, 1982.

Due to the provisions of K.S.A. 1981 Supp. 79-213, the State Board of Tax Appeals is the appropriate agency to determine which property is exempt from property taxation. Cited herein: K.S.A. 1981 Supp. 79-213, L. 1982, ch. 390, §§ 3, 4. RJB

OPINION NO. 82-253

Corporations—Cemetery Corporations—Permanent Maintenance Fund; Permissible Uses of Income Produced Therefrom. Senator Ronald R. Hein, Twentieth District, Topeka, December 2, 1982.

Pursuant to K.S.A. 17-1311, a cemetery corporation is required to deposit a portion (15%) of the purchase price of each burial lot in a trust fund, income from which is to be used solely for the permanent maintenance of the cemetery. "Maintenance" includes those expenditures which relate to the physical upkeep of the cemetery grounds; a fact made explicit by the legislature in an amendment to the statute in 1978. However, a determination whether a specific item of expenditure is maintenance-related is a question of fact which may only be determined by a court. OPINION NO. 82-254

Constitution of the State of Kansas—Judicial—Supreme Court Nominating Commission; Open Meetings Act. Senator Paul Feleciano, Jr., Twenty-Eighth District, Wichita, December 3, 1982.

The Supreme Court Nominating Commission may conduct its meeting in full public view; however, the legislature is without authority to require that meetings of the Commission be open or closed. Nor may the legislature require the Commission to meet in a particular place. Cited herein: K.S.A. 20-123, 20-2901, 75-4317, K.S.A. 1981 Supp. 75-4319, Kan. Const., Art. 1, § 3, Art. 3, §§ 5, 6. BJS

OPINION NO. 82-255

Roads and Bridges—Roads; General Provisions—Vacation Without Viewing. Joseph P. O'Sullivan, Reno County Public Works Department, Hutchinson, December 3, 1982.

K.S.A. 68-102 is not uniformly applicable to all counties. Therefore, pursuant to home rule powers specified by K.S.A. 19-101b, a board of county commissioners may enact a charter resolution that obviates the requirement of K.S.A. 68-102 to view county roads proposed to be vacated. OPINION NO. 82-256

State Departments; Public Officers, Employees—Open Meetings Act—Bodies Subject Thereto. Representative John L. Myers, One Hundred-Second District, Hutchinson, December 7, 1982.

The Kansas Cosmosphere and Discovery Center, Inc., is a private non-profit corporation receiving public funds, but which is not a legislative or administrative body or agency of the state or its political and taxing subdivisions. As a result of its essentially private nature, the Center is not subject to the Kansas Open Meetings Act, even though it may receive some public funds. OPINION NO. 82-257

Kansas Constitution—Finance and Taxation—Internal Improvements

Cities and Municipalities—Port Authorities—Constitutional Limitations on State's Participation in Acquisition of Railroad Properties. John B. Kemp, Secretary of Transportation, Topeka, December 8, 1982.

Article 11, Section 9 of the Kansas Constitution contains a general prohibition against the state becoming a party to a work of internal improvement, but it also provides several exceptions to such proscription. One such exception, found in clause (3), authorizes the state to contribute state funds to an internal improvement project under certain conditions and limitations. Among these are the requirements that: (1) The federal government must be a participant in the project; (2) federal funds must be provided therefor; and (3) such federal funds must be made available for expenditure or distribution by the state.

Therefore, even though federal funds may be provided for a particular work of internal improvement, if such funds are not made available for expenditure or distribution by the state, the state is not authorized by clause (3) of Section 9 to contribute state funds or otherwise become a party to such internal improvement project. Thus, if the state desires to provide financial assistance to the Mid States Port Authority regarding its purchase of certain properties of the Rock Island Railroad, it is a necessary condition precedent that the federal government also provide funds for such purpose, which funds must be made available to the state for expenditure or distribution. OPINION NO. 82-258

Cities and Municipalities—Ordinances of Cities—Signing or Veto of Ordinances in Council Cities, Exceptions. I. H. McMahan, Osawatimie Mayor, Osawatimie, December 9, 1982.

Where a resolution adopted by a city council is, in substance and effect, an ordinance, the name given to the action is immaterial, and does not restrict the mayoral veto power prescribed by K.S.A. 12-3003. Regardless of whether a mayoral veto is or is not exercised, where the city governing body does not sub-

stantially comply with the statutory prerequisites for adoption of an ordinance (under circumstances where the action must be taken by adoption of an ordinance), as set forth in K.S.A. 12-3001 *et seq.*, the action of the governing body is void.

An "appropriation ordinance," as said term is used in K.S.A. 12-3003, is an ordinance whereby the city governing body sets apart city funds and authorizes the expenditure thereof for specific purposes. Cited herein: K.S.A. 12-3001, 12-3003, Kan. Const. Art. 2, § 16. TRH

OPINION NO. 82-259

Cities and Municipalities—Planning and Zoning—Plats, Submission for Approval or Disapproval. Donald R. Hoffman, Attorney for Topeka-Shawnee County Metropolitan Planning Commission, Topeka, December 9, 1982.

Where a plat has been approved by a city planning commission and recorded in the office of the register of deeds, and errors are later discovered which have no relation to conformity of the plat with subdivision regulations, the power to approve such corrections may be delegated (by the commission) to a planning director. Cited herein: K.S.A. 12-705b (as amended by L. 1982, ch. 67, § 1). TRH

OPINION NO. 82-260

Taxation—Property Subject to Taxation—Golf Carts. Taxation—Listing of Property—Golf Carts Stored on Leased Premises. Samuel E. Schuetz, Brown County Attorney, Hiawatha, December 9, 1982.

Golf carts used for recreational purposes, including those which are privately-owned and non-income producing, are subject to property taxation. This class of tangible personal property is not exempt from taxation.

A person or corporation, which merely leases storage area to another, is not required, under K.S.A. 79-303, to list for taxation the personal property of the lessee which is stored in the leased area, if the lessor does have control, possession or custody of the stored items. Cited herein: K.S.A. 79-101, 79-201c, K.S.A. 1981 Supp. 79-213, K.S.A. 79-303, Kan. Const., Art. 11, § 1. RJB

OPINION NO. 82-261

Roads and Bridges—Roads—Setting Aside Portions of Road and Bridge or Street Funds. N.W. Bransom, Mayor, Coldwater, December 9, 1982.

K.S.A. 68-141g authorizes certain municipalities to annually transfer a specified amount of money from a "road, bridge or street fund" to a "special road, bridge or street building machinery, equipment and bridge building fund." Said statute does not authorize a transfer of money from the general fund of a city to a "special machinery fund." Cited herein: K.S.A. 68-141g. TRH
