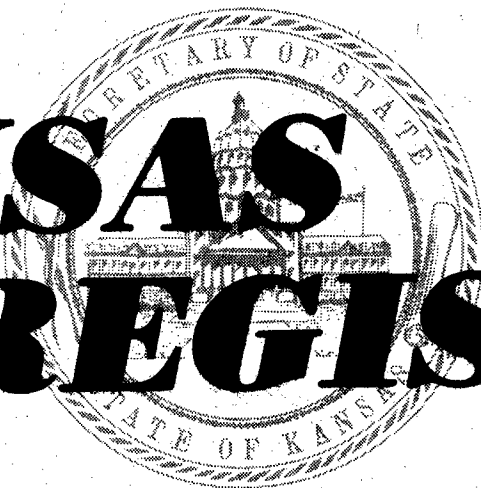

ATTORNEY GENERAL**OPINION NO. 82-265**

Taxation—Miscellaneous Provisions—Budget Law; Adoption of a Budget; Amount of Ad Valorem Taxes to be Levied Restricted by Published Proposed Budget. Stephen Jones, Counsel, Unified School District No. 421, Lyndon, December 15, 1982.

The provisions of K.S.A. 1981 Supp. 79-2930(c) prohibit the governing body of any taxing subdivision or district from certifying an amount of ad valorem taxes to be levied for any fund of the taxing subdivision or district which exceeds the amount of ad valorem taxes to be levied for such fund as shown in the proposed budget of the taxing subdivision or district as originally published pursuant to K.S.A. 1981 Supp. 79-2929.

If the levy to be made for a fund violates the restriction of K.S.A. 1981 Supp. 79-2930(c), and the county clerk fails to discover such violation, the budget of the taxing subdivision or district is unlawful and taxes are extended upon the tax rolls which result in taxpayers being charged unjust taxes. In such a situation, the governing body of the taxing subdivision or district should adopt and certify to the county clerk a budget which meets the restrictions of K.S.A. 1981 Supp. 79-2930(c). Moreover, where this situation occurs as a result of an error, the board of county commissioners may correct the error by ordering an abatement of the excessive taxes or, if taxes have already been paid, a refund of the excessive taxes. Further, in such a situation, it is the duty and responsibility of the county clerk to determine the proper amount of taxes that should have been extended upon the tax rolls and the amount of excessive taxes charged to each taxpayer. Thereafter, it is the duty of the county treasurer to comply with the order issued by the board of county commissioners pursuant to K.S.A. 79-1701a, as amended, to correct the situation. OPINION NO. 82-266

State Departments; Public Officers, Employees—Open Meetings Act—Hazardous Waste Disposal Facility Approval Board, Joseph Harkins, Secretary of Health and Environment, Topeka, December 22, 1982.

The Kansas Open Meetings Act, K.S.A. 75-4317 *et seq.*, applies to meetings of the Hazardous Waste Disposal Facility Approval Board created pursuant to K.S.A. 1981 Supp. 75-3432. The Board is not exempt from the Act by the terms of K.S.A. 1981 Supp. 75-4318 when considering those matters outlined in K.S.A. 1981 Supp. 65-3434(g), since the Board does not perform a quasi-judicial function during such deliberations. Finally, prearranged staff briefings of Board members, where two (2) or more members are present, are subject to the KOMA.
