ATTORNEY GENERAL

OPINION NO. 82-267

Cities and Municipalities—Home Rule Powers—Charter Ordinances. Michael F. Willcott, Lansing City Attorney, Leavenworth, December 28, 1982.

A city of the second class (operating under the mayor-council form of government) may, in the manner prescribed by the city home rule amendment, adopt a charter ordinance which exempts the city from all or part of any enactment, codified within Chapter 14 of Kansas Statutes Annotated, which applies to it. Additionally, such a charter ordinance may contain substitute and additional provisions, which provisions are taken from statutes which are applicable to cities of the third class operating under the mayor-council form of government. OPINION NO. 82-268

Procedure, Civil—Liens for Labor and Material—Public Works Bond. Mr. Philip W. Hardman, Attorney, Osborne Housing Authority, Osborne, December 28, 1982.

Mechanics liens of materialmen and laborers may attach to public property where public officials fail to secure a bond for the benefit of the state of Kansas, as is required by K.S.A. 1981 Supp. 60-1111.

Where public officials neglect to obtain and file a public works bond prior to commencement of a project, such a bond may be obtained after work on the project has been completed, and in the amount of the balance of the contract price remaining unpaid. However, a public works bond may not be filed to secure only a specific number of disputed claims. Cited herein: K.S.A. 60-1110, K.S.A. 1981 Supp. 60-1111. TRH

OPINION NO. 82-269

Intoxicating Liquors and Beverages—Cereal Malt Beverages—Suspension or Revocation of Retailer's License. David W. Andreas, Assistant City Attorney, Winfield, December 28, 1982.

Under K.S.A. 41-2708(j), it is grounds for the suspension or revocation of a cereal malt beverage retailer's license for a licensee to employ a person who has been convicted of driving while under the influence of intoxicating liquor, pursuant to K.S.A. 1981 Supp. 8-1567 (as amended by L. 1982, ch. 144, § 5). OPINION NO. 82-270

Taxation—Property Valuation, Equalization and Assessment—Powers and Duties of County Appraisers.

Counties and County Officers—County Appraiser—Removal from Office. John W. Conard, Hamilton County Appraiser, Syracuse, December 28, 1982.

Each county appraiser, in establishing values for various types of personal property, is required by law to conform to the values for such property as shown in the personal property appraisal guides prescribed or furnished by the Director of Property Valuation. A county appraiser may deviate from the values shown in such guides on an individual piece of property only for just cause shown and in a manner consistent with achieving fair market value.

Fair market value is not the amount of money for which an item of property likely could be sold at an auction or forced sale. Instead, it is the amount of money that a well informed buyer would be justified in paying and a well informed seller would be justified in accepting for property in an open and competitive market, assuming neither buyer nor seller was acting under compulsion.

Under the provisions of K.S.A. 19-431, the Director of Property Valuation, after following certain requirements, may enter an order suspending or terminating an appraiser from office. Cited herein: K.S.A. 19-431, 79-501, L. 1982, ch. 391, §§ 2, 3. RJB

OPINION NO. 82-271

State Departments; Public Officers, Employers—Private Investigative or Security Operations—Law Enforcement Officers Ineligible for License. Jerry Harper, Douglas County District Attorney, Lawrence, December 28, 1982.

A firefighter does not fall within the definition of a law enforcement officer in K.S.A. 21-3110(10). Hence, a firefighter is not a law enforcement officer for purposes of K.S.A. 1981 Supp. 75-7b02(c) and is not ineligible to become a licensed private detective. Article 18.—SPECIAL FUEL TAX

92-18-5. Unlicensed special fuel user; records; inspection; preservation. (a) Each special fuel user issued a permit pursuant to section 2 of chapter 415 of the 1982 Kansas Session Laws shall prepare and maintain those records that are necessary to determine the amount of special fuel tax for which the permittee is liable. The records shall be maintained for a period of three years after the year to which they pertain and shall be available for inspection as provided by K.S.A. 79-3480 and section 2 of chapter 415 of the 1982 Kansas Session Laws.

(b) The records maintaind by the permittee shall indicate, for each location where special fuel is dispensed into motor vehicles, the following information:

(1) The inventory of non-taxable special fuel on hand

at the beginning of each calendar year;

(2) the inventory of special fuel on which special fuel tax has been paid on hand at the beginning of each calendar year:

(3) the amount of special fuel used for taxable pur-

poses

(4) the amount of special fuel used for non-taxable purposes;

(5) the amount of non-taxable special fuel pur-

chased;

(6) the amount of special fuel purchased for which the special fuel tax has been paid; and

(7) the odometer readings for motor vehicles owned by the permittee at the beginning and end of the

calendar year.

- 92-18-6. Unlicensed special fuel user; annual report. Each special fuel user issued a permit pursuant to section 2 of chapter 415 of the 1982 Kansas Session Laws shall make a report to the director of taxation on or before January 25 of each year, commencing in 1984, for the last preceding calendar year. The report shall set forth the information required to be maintained by subsection (b) of K.A.R. 92-18-5 and any

other information required by the director. The report shall be made on a form furnished by the director. (Authorized by K.S.A. 79-3483, L. 1982, ch. 415, sec. 1; implementing L. 1982, ch. 415, sec. 1 and 2; effective T-83-48, Dec. 22, 1982.)

Article 21.—LOCAL RETAILERS' SALES TAX

92-21-20. Bracket systems for adding and collecting state and local taxes. Article 46.—UNDERGROUND INJECTION CONTROL REGULATIONS

28-46-2. Definitions. (a) 40 CFR Part 122:3; 40 CFR Part 124:21 and 40 CFR Part 146.3, as in effect on October 1, 1982, are adopted by reference.

(b) "Fracture pressure" means that wellhead pressure which may cause vertical or horizontal fracturing of rock along a well bore.

(c) "Injection well" means a well designed for the purpose of the subsurface emplacement of fluids.

(d) "Injection well facility" means all land, structures, appurtenances or improvements on which one or more injection wells are located, and that are within the same well field or project.

(e) "Major facility" means a facility capable of producing hazardous waste identified or listed by the

secretary under K.A.R. 28-31-3.

(f) "Major permit" means a permit for the underground injection of wastes produced by or stored on a major facility.

(g) "Maximum allowable injection pressure" means the maximum wellhead pressure not to be exceeded as a permit condition, as opposed to fracture pressure.

(h) "Secretary" means the secretary of the Kansas department of health and environment or duly authorized designee. (Authorized by, and implementing, K.S.A. 65-171d; effective May 1, 1982; amended T-83-49, Dec. 22, 1982.)

(b) The secretary shall notify the permittee 30 days in advance that a mechanical integrity test must be performed; or a permittee may notify the secretary that a voluntary mechanical integrity test will be performed

at least 14 days in advance of the test.

(c) When the secretary believes that, due to an apparent downhole problem, the continued use of an injection well constitutes a threat to human health or to waters of the state, the permittee shall be required to cease injection operations immediately and to conduct a mechanical integrity test. Injection operations shall not be resumed until such a test is conducted.

(d) The secretary shall provide for a qualified state inspector to witness at least 25 percent of the mechan-

ical integrity tests performed.

- (e) The permittee shall submit results of all mechanical integrity tests to the secretary, in writing, within 30 days after conducting the test. (Authorized by, and implementing, K.S.A. 65-171d; effective May 1, 1982; amended T-83-49, Dec. 22, 1982.)

- 28-46-41. Sharing of information. 40 CFR Part 123.10, as in effect on October 1, 1982, is adopted by reference. (Authorized by K.S.A. 65-171d; implementing K.S.A. 65-170g; effective May 1, 1982; amended T-83-49, Dec. 22, 1982.)
- Article 47.—USE OF OIL AND GAS FIELD SALT WATER IN ROAD CON-STRUCTION AND MAINTENANCE PROJECTS.
- 28-47-1. Scope. This article regulates the spreading of salt water, originating from the production of oil (continued)

and gas, in road construction and maintenance projects. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1981 Supp. 55-904, as amended by L. 1982, ch. 229, sec. 1; effective T-83-50, Dec. 22, 1982.)

28-47-2. Definitions. (a) "Person" means any state, county, township or municipal governing body, and any individual, firm, corporation, partnership, or other association of persons.

(b) "Road" means any highway, county road, township road, or oil or gas company lease road, or any private road under jurisdiction of the applicant.

(c) "Road construction" means any activity connected with developing a subgrade or base during the

construction of a road or segment of road.

(d) "Road maintenance" means any activity related to stabilization of the surface of any publicly traveled road or segment of road after construction activities have ceased.

- (e) "Lease road" means any formally maintained access road to wells, tank batteries and petroleum and oil field and salt water storage facilities areas under control and operation of a company actively engaged in the production, storage or transportation of oil, gas or disposal of salt water. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1981 Supp. 55-904, as amended by L. 1982, ch. 229, sec. 1; effective T-83-50, Dec. 22, 1982.)
- 28-47-3. Request for the use of salt water in road construction or maintenance. Any person desiring to use salt water, brought to the surface during the production of oil and gas, for purposes of road maintenance or road construction shall submit a request for the approval of such activity to the department of health and environment. The request shall be submitted 10 days prior to the time work is to begin and shall be accompanied by a plan meeting the requirements of K.A.R. 28-47-4. The request for approval may be submitted to the appropriate district office of the department. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1981 Supp. 55-904, as amended by L. 1982, ch. 229, sec. 1; effective T-83-50, Dec. 22, 1982.)
- 28-47-4. Plan for use of salt water. A plan shall be submitted to the department prior to using salt water for road maintenance or road construction. The department shall, in writing, approve, deny or require any modification the department deems necessary in order to assure that the maintenance or construction operation will not cause surface or subsurface water pollution or soil pollution. A plan shall not be required for individual lease road maintenance projects which are limited to stabilizing lease roads. Each plan shall include at least the following: (a) A map outlining the roads included in the maintenance or construction project;

(b) a description of the method to be used in salt

water spreading or incorporation;

(c) the amount of salt water estimated to be used per mile or fraction of a mile;

(d) the frequency of salt water use for each route

described in (a);

(e) security methods to be used by the applicant to prevent unauthorized spraying, dumping, or discharge of salt water; (f) a copy of any local or county regulation which also affects the applicant's activities; and

(g) the name of each authorized salt water hauler. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1981 Supp. 55-904, as amended by L. 1982, ch. 229, sec. 1; effective T-83-50, Dec. 22, 1982.)

28-47-5. Notification to department. Any authorized person spreading salt water in connection with road construction or maintenance shall notify the department, in writing, when any of the following situations arise: (a) The person ceases to use salt water in maintaining any or all of the roads designated on the plan submitted in fulfilling requirements set forth in K.A.R. 28-47-4(a);

(b) the person desires to amend the plan submitted under K.A.R. 28-47-4(a) to include additional roads not

covered in the original plan;

(c) the person desires to use a salt water hauler other

than the one designated in the original plan;

(d) upon completion of any designated phase of road construction during which the use of salt water was approved:

(e) upon discovery that an illegal act of salt water dumping, spraying, or discharge has occurred on or adjacent to the road or road right-of-way covered under

the plan; or

- (f) when an accidental discharge of salt water occurs during road construction or road maintenance operations. In such a case, the applicant or contractor shall provide the appropriate district office of the department of health and environment with a written report of the incident. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1981 Supp. 55-904, as amended by L. 1982, ch. 229, sec. 1; effective T-83-50, Dec. 22, 1982.)
- 28-47-6. Discontinuance of salt water spreading. The secretary may order the discontinuance of salt water spreading if:

(a) A violation of the provisions of K.A.R. 28-47-5

occurs; or

(b) the potential exists for water pollution, due to conditions which were not apparent at the time the request to spread salt water was made. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1981 Supp. 55-904, as amended by L. 1982, ch. 229, sec. 1; effective T-83-50, Dec. 22, 1982.)

28-47-7. Waiver of specific requirements. The secretary may grant an exception to a requirement provided in these regulations if a person desiring a waiver can show good cause for the granting of such an exception, and the person presents an alternative to the requirements which will insure that the objectives of these regulations will be achieved. Requests for an exception shall be made, in writing, to the secretary. The secretary shall grant or deny the request within 15 days from the receipt of the request and shall notify the person requesting the exception, in writing, of the decision. If the request is denied, the secretary shall specify in the notice the reasons for the denial of the request.
