Ch. 92, Art. 11—Withholding and Estimated Tax—92-11-4 is amended to modify the withholding tax formula to take into account the provisions of 1983 Senate Bill 436 disallowing the deduction of a portion of federal income tax liability in computing the Kansas income tax in certain instances.

Ch. 92, Art. 51—Titles and Registration—92-51-34 is a new regulation extending the date for issuance of new license plates pursuant to 1983 Senate Bill 307.

ATTORNEY GENERAL**OPINION NO. 83-83**

Automobiles and Other Vehicles—Drivers Licenses—Restricted Drivers Licenses; School Attendance. Max E. Scribner, Chief of Police, Caldwell, May 25, 1983.

K.S.A. 8-237 permits the holder of a restricted drivers license between the age of 14 and 16 to operate a motor vehicle on days while school is in session over the most direct and accessible route between the licensee's residence and school of enrollment for the purpose of school attendance.

The term "school attendance" has a narrower meaning than "school activities;" therefore, the holder of a restricted license is not permitted by this statute to operate a motor vehicle for transportation to mere school activities. OPINION NO. 83-84

Banks and Banking—Banking Code—Insolvency Defined. John A. O'Leary, Jr., Bank Commissioner, Topeka, May 25, 1983.

As provided by K.S.A. 9-1902, the State Bank Commissioner may deem a bank to be insolvent when, among other things, the actual cash market value of the bank's assets is insufficient to pay the liabilities of its creditors. For the purposes of this statute, the term "assets" refers to the bank's capital account, bond and securities accounts, and other liquid items, but does not include furniture, equipment, buildings or real estate. OPINION NO. 83-85

Intoxicating Liquors and Beverages—Licensing and Regulation of Clubs—Club Licenses; Premises Licensed; Zoning Compliance. Senator August Bogina, Jr., Tenth District, Lenexa, May 25, 1983.

The construction of a church within 200 feet of a class A private club has no effect upon the issuance of an annual license to the club. Cited herein: K.S.A. 41-101, 41-102, 41-710, 41-2601, 41-2608, Substitute for 1983 House Bill No. 2551. TRH

Interest on the Bonds will first be payable on March 1, 1984, and thereafter semiannually on the first days of September and March in each year until the Bonds are fully paid. Both the principal of and interest on the Bonds will be payable to bearer at the Office of the State Treasurer in the City of Topeka, Kansas.

Proposals will be received on the Bonds bearing such rate or rates of interest, not exceeding five (5) different interest rates, as may be specified by the bidder. The repetition of a rate will not constitute one of said maximum number of rates. The same rate shall apply to all Bonds of the same maturity. Each interest rate specified shall be in an even multiple of one-eighth ($\frac{1}{8}$ th) or one-twentieth ($\frac{1}{20}$ th) of one percent (1%). The difference between the highest and lowest coupon rates specified in any bid shall not exceed two percent (2%). No interest rate shall exceed the maximum amount authorized by Kansas law; said amount to be the "20 Bond Index" of tax exempt municipal bonds published in the *Weekly Bond Buyer* in New York, New York on the Monday next preceding the day on which the bonds are sold (May 23, 1983), plus 2%, and no bid of less than par and accrued interest will be considered. Bids involving the use of extra or supplemental coupons will not be considered. Bids for less than the entire issue of Bonds will not be considered.

Bids shall be submitted on the OFFICIAL BID FORM furnished by the County, and shall be addressed to BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, COUNTY COURTHOUSE, EL DORADO, KANSAS 67042, ATTENTION: ELDON PHILLIPS, CHAIRMAN, and shall be plainly marked BOND BID. All bids must state the total interest cost of the bid, the premium, if any, the net interest cost of the bid, and the average annual interest rate, all certified by the bidder to be correct; and the County will be entitled to rely on the certificate of correctness of the bidder. Each bid must be accompanied by a certified or cashier's check equal to two percent (2%) of the total amount of the bid, and shall be payable to TREASURER, COUNTY OF BUTLER, STATE OF KANSAS. In the event a bidder whose bid is accepted shall fail to carry out his Contract of Purchase, said deposit shall be retained by the County as liquidated damages. The checks of unsuccessful bidders will be returned promptly.

The Bonds, duly printed, executed and registered, will be furnished and paid for by the County. The Bonds will be sold subject to the unqualified approving opinion of GAAR & BELL, Bond Counsel, Wichita, Kansas, whose opinion will be paid for by the

County. The purchaser will be furnished with a complete Transcript of Proceedings evidencing the authorization and issuance of the Bonds; and the usual closing proofs, which will include a Certificate that there is no litigation pending or threatened at the time of delivery of the Bonds affecting their validity. Payment for the Bonds shall be made in immediately available funds. Delivery of the Bonds will be made to the successful bidder on or before JUNE 30, 1983, at any bank in the STATE OF KANSAS or KANSAS CITY, MISSOURI, at the expense of the County. Delivery elsewhere will be made at the expense of the purchaser.

It is anticipated that CUSIP identification numbers will be printed on the Bonds; but neither the failure to print such numbers on any Bond nor any error with respect thereto shall constitute cause for a failure by the successful bidder to accept delivery of and pay for the Bonds in accordance with the terms of its Contract and this Notice of Bond Sale. All expenses in connection with the printing of CUSIP numbers on the Bonds shall be paid for by the County.

The Bonds will constitute general obligations of the City, payable as to both principal and interest from the collection of special assessments which have been levied on benefited property; but if not so paid, then said principal and interest will be payable from ad valorem taxes which may be levied without limitation as to rate or amount upon all of the taxable tangible property within the territorial limits of the City. The Bonds are being issued for the purpose of paying the costs of the elimination of the existing Sewer Treatment Plant and connecting the sewer system in County Sewer District No. 5 to the sanitary sewer system of the City of El Dorado, Kansas to serve the territory contained in County Sewer District No. 5, Butler County, Kansas.

The sealed bids for the Bonds shall be opened publicly and only at the time and place specified in this Notice; and the Bonds will be sold to the best bidder. The County reserves the right to reject any and/or all of the bids, and to waive any irregularities. Unless all bids are rejected, the Bonds will be awarded to the bidder whose proposal results in the lowest net interest cost to the County; and the net interest cost will be determined by deducting the amount of any premium paid from the aggregate amount of interest upon all of the Bonds from their date until their respective maturities.

The Equalized Assessed Tangible Valuation for Computation of Bonded Debt Limitations for the County of Butler, State of Kansas, for the year 1982, is \$209,480,888.00.

For the fiscal years ending June 30, 1983, June 30, 1984, and June 30, 1985, appropriations are hereby made, restrictions and limitations are hereby imposed, and transfers, fees, receipts, disbursements, capital improvement projects and acts incidental to the foregoing are hereby directed or authorized as provided in this act.

The proposed regulation is as follows:

28-17-6. Fees for copies and searches. Subject to the restrictions of K.S.A. 65-2418, 65-2422 and K.S.A. 65-2423, and any amendments to those statutes, the state registrar shall furnish certified copies of certificates or parts of certificates upon request by an authorized applicant and payment of the required fee. For making and certifying such copies, the state registrar shall receive a fee of ~~\$4.00~~ \$6.00 for the first copy and \$3.00 for each additional copy of the same record requested at the same time. For any search of the files and records when no certified copy is made, the state registrar shall be entitled to collect from the applicant a fee of \$4.00 for each five year period for which a search is requested, or for each fractional part of that period of years. The state registrar shall also be entitled to collect a fee of \$4.00 for any search of the files necessary for preparing an amendment to a standard certificate already on file, due to a change in name of an adopted person or of a person whose name has been legally changed.

For non-certified copies of certificates or parts of certificates requested for statistical research purposes, the state registrar shall determine the fee on the basis of costs for providing those services and prescribe the manner in which those costs are to be paid.
