CORRECTIONS OMBUDSMAN BOARD**NOTICE OF HEARING
ON PROPOSED TEMPORARY
AND PERMANENT
ADMINISTRATIVE REGULATIONS**

The Corrections Ombudsman Board will conduct a public hearing on July 29, 1983, at 9:30 a.m., at 503 Kansas Avenue, Room 537 in Topeka.

The purpose of the hearing is to receive comments regarding the Board's proposed adoption of temporary and permanent administrative regulation 43-1-1.

The text of the proposed regulation is as follows:

43-1-1. Administering oaths. (a) The ombudsman or designated ombudsman associates may take sworn statements from a person, if that person is likely to have information deemed by the ombudsman or designated ombudsman associates to be relevant to any matter under inquiry, and if that person is or has been at any time:

(1) Within any premises under the control of the secretary of corrections;

(2) Committed to the custody of the secretary of corrections; or

(3) Employed by or under contract with the secretary of corrections.

(b) Whenever possible, oaths shall be administered at a time and location convenient to the person making the statement.

(c) Under no circumstances shall anyone be compelled to submit a sworn statement. (Authorized by and implementing section 3, 1983 HB 2184.)

It has been determined there is no fiscal impact.

Certificate of Need Applications from Southwest Medical Center for the renovation and expansion of facility, and Morton County Hospital for the construction of a 60-bed intermediate care facility and expansion of the hospital were filed on June 27, 1983, by the Kansas Department of Health and Environment for initiation of the 90 day review cycle. These applications will be available for public examination at the Office of Health Planning, Forbes Field, Topeka, Kansas.

On June 27, 1983, the Kansas Department of Health and Environment filed Certificate of Need applications for the following facilities: St. Joseph Medical Center, Wichita, to replace CT scanner; and Northview Developmental Services, Inc., Newton, to establish a 15-bed intermediate care facility for the mentally retarded. These applications will be available for public examination at the Health Systems Agency of Southeast Kansas, Inc., 355 North Waco, Wichita, Kansas, and the Kansas Department of Health and Environment, Topeka.

Certificate of Need Applications from Mt. Carmel Medical Center, Pittsburg, Kansas, for the expansion and remodeling of the hospital and the purchase of major medical equipment, and from St. Francis Regional Medical Center, Wichita, Kansas, for renovation and construction of medical nursing units have been reviewed and approved by the Kansas Department of Health and Environment. These Certificates of Need shall become effective on July 27, 1983, unless appealed to the District Courts of Crawford County and Sedgwick County, respectively. These Certificates of Need shall be valid for one year.

Banks and Banking—Banking Code; Deposit of Public Moneys—Security for Deposit of Public Funds. Rodney H. Symmonds, Lyon County Attorney, Emporia, June 29, 1983.

Federal Home Loan Mortgage Corporation Participation Certificates qualify as security for deposit of public moneys. Cited herein: K.S.A. 9-1402, as amended by 1983 House Bill No. 2439, and further amended by 1983 Substitute for Senate Bill No. 265, 12 U.S.C.A. §§ 1451, 1452, 1454, 1455. MWB

OPINION NO. 83-97

Corporations—Savings and Loan Code—Associations Subject to Code; Savings Banks. Representative Harold P. Dyck, Ninety-Ninth District, Hesston, June 29, 1983.

The Garn-St. Germain Depository Institutions Act, Public Law 97-320, amends the *Homeowner's Loan Act of 1933* [12 U.S.C. 1464(i)] to allow federally-chartered savings and loan associations to convert to federally-chartered savings banks. Such savings banks are subject to the rules and regulations of the Federal Home Loan Bank Board, which allow regulated financial institutions to have intra-state branches with some restrictions. Accordingly, a federally-chartered savings bank may have branches in this state without being in violation of K.S.A. 9-1111, which is a part of the State Banking Code and so is inapplicable to savings banks chartered by the FHLBB. State Departments; Public Officers, Employees—Public Officers and Employees—Conflict of Interests. Representative Michael J. Peterson, Thirty-Third District, Kansas City, June 29, 1983.

A county commissioner is not precluded from holding office because his spouse owns the official county newspaper. However, the commissioner must file the required statement disclosing his financial interest in the newspaper pursuant to K.S.A. 75-4301 *et seq.*, and may not make or participate in the making of contracts with such newspaper. OPINION NO. 83-99

Cities and Municipalities—General Provisions—Local-Option Gross Earnings Tax. Larry Lister, Dover Township Trustee, Topeka, June 29, 1983.

Any election which was otherwise conducted in accordance with the provisions of subsection (e) of K.S.A. 12-1,101, as amended by section 1(e) of 1983 House Bill No. 2023, but which was held on April 5, 1983, and was declared valid by the legislature in that subsection of law. As the election in Dover Township, Shawnee County, on the proposition set-forth in K.S.A. 12-1,101(e), as amended, is conceded to have been conducted in accordance with the provisions of that subsection of law, said election is valid pursuant to legislative declaration. OPINION NO. 83-100

Banks and Banking—Banking Code; Powers—Branch Banking Prohibition; Interstate Contract for Use of Remote Service Units. John O'Leary, Jr., State Bank Commissioner, Topeka, June 29, 1983.

K.S.A. 9-1111(f) provides that any state bank or national banking association located in Kansas may operate remote service units, by means of which banking transactions may take place. Such facilities may be located anywhere within the state, including at the place of business specified in the bank's certificate of authority. Any state bank or national banking association located in Kansas may enter into agreements with any other banks having their principal place of business in this state for the joint operation of such facilities. In the absence of statutory authority, however, Kansas banks may not enter into such contracts with state or national banks located in other states. Cited herein: K.S.A. 9-1111, K.S.A. 1982 Supp. 17-5565, 12 U.S.C. § 36. JSS

OFFICE OF THE GOVERNOR**EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 83-63****ESTABLISHING THE GOVERNOR'S
TASK FORCE ON
PRE-SCHOOL HANDICAPPED CHILDREN**

WHEREAS, approximately 2,100 children born in Kansas each year will manifest some type of handicapping condition during their pre-school years; and

WHEREAS, the State of Kansas has committed resources to assist local school districts in the provision of special education programs for exceptional children for more than three decades; and

WHEREAS, Kansas taxpayers commit a substantial amount of funds each year to provide appropriate education for exceptional children; and

WHEREAS, a growing body of educational and psychological research demonstrates cost-effectiveness of early childhood education programs for the handicapped through a reduced need for school age special education programs and institutionalization, and increased productivity of these handicapped citizens; and

WHEREAS, twenty-eight school districts and cooperatives are currently providing early educational services to handicapped children within their jurisdictions; and

WHEREAS, nearly two-thirds of the pre-school handicapped children in Kansas have no access to education and other support services which could assist them in alleviating and overcoming the effects of their handicapping conditions; and

WHEREAS, families of pre-school handicapped children are often given little guidance or support in meeting the extraordinary responsibilities of raising such children at home; and

WHEREAS, a number of state agencies presently share responsibilities for planning, regulating and funding the providing of services to pre-school handicapped children and families in Kansas.

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the authority vested in me as Governor and chief executive of the

State of Kansas, I hereby establish the Governor's Task Force on Pre-School Handicapped Children, who shall be appointed by the Governor. The Governor shall designate one of the members as Chairperson. The Task Force shall meet on call of the Chairperson. The Task Force shall be charged with making recommendations to the Governor regarding:

- (1) What is the nature of the population of young handicapped children and their families in Kansas as to number, distribution, type of disability, and extent of needs?
- (2) What is the present scope and quality of existing services available to young handicapped children and their families in Kansas?
- (3) What, if any, changes should be made in Kansas public policy in response to the growing body of research studies on the effectiveness of pre-school programs for handicapped children?
- (4) What specific barriers impede the development of appropriate services to meet the needs of young handicapped children in Kansas?
- (5) What should be the role of the State and of local governments for the planning, financing and delivery of any additional services needed to assist families in improving the quality of life for their young handicapped children?

Members of the Task Force shall serve with no compensation at the pleasure of the Governor. Staff support shall be provided by the Department of Health and Environment, the Department of Social and Rehabilitation Services, Universities under the jurisdiction of the State Board of Regents, and such other agencies as may be designated by the Governor. Expenses of the Task Force may be paid for by the individual organizations employing the members of the Task Force; or may be paid for by the Department of Health and Environment, the Department of Social and Rehabilitation Services, Universities under the jurisdiction of the State Board of Regents, or other agencies as may be designated by the Governor, only upon vouchers approved by the head of the particular State agency or designee and the Governor or his designee.

The Task Force shall compile and present to the Governor its Study, Report and Recommendations not later than December 1, 1983.

From and after March 1, 1984, the Governor's Task Force on Pre-School Handicapped Children created and established by this Executive Order is hereby abolished; and the force and effect of this Executive Order is thereafter rescinded.

This document shall be filed with the Secretary of State as Executive Order No. 83-63 and shall become effective immediately.

**\$1,170,000.00 Internal Improvement Bonds

CITY OF HAYS, KANSAS**

Sealed bids will be received by the Governing Body of the City of Hays, Kansas, at the Office of the City Clerk, City Hall, 1507 Main, P.O. Box 490, Hays, Kansas 67601, until 7:30 p.m., C.D.S.T. on Thursday, July 14, 1983, for the sale of \$1,170,000.00 Internal Improvement Bonds, Series P, at not less than par and accrued interest, at which time and place bids will be publicly opened. All bonds will constitute general obligations of the City of Hays, Kansas, payable from

unlimited ad valorem taxes, and not subject to call for prior payment. All of said bonds will be certificated or uncertificated bonds, or a combination thereof, at the option of the successful purchaser, each in the denomination of \$5,000.

Said series will consist of 234 bonds, dated July 1, 1983, and will mature serially as follows:

\$115,000.00—September 1, 1984 to 1989, inclusive

\$120,000.00—September 1, 1990 to 1993, inclusive

Interest on said bonds will be payable March 1, 1984, and thereafter semi-annually on September 1 and March 1 in each year. Both principal of and interest on said bonds will be payable at the Office of the State Treasurer, Topeka, Kansas. The State Treasurer is also designated as the transfer agent of said bonds. The fees of the transfer agent in regard to transferring and registering said bonds will be paid by the City.

Proposals will be received on bonds bearing such rate or rates of interest as may be specified by the bidders. Each interest rate shall be a multiple of one-eighth or one-twentieth of one percent. No interest rate shall exceed the maximum permitted by the laws of the State of Kansas. No bid of less than par and accrued interest will be considered. Not more than five rates of interest shall be specified and the same rate shall apply to all bonds of the same maturity. The difference between the highest and the lowest interest rates specified in any bid shall not exceed two percent (2%).

Each bid shall state the total interest cost to the City during the life of the bond issue; the premium, if any; the net interest cost to the City; and the average annual net interest rate; all certified by the bidder to be correct. The award of the bonds shall be made on the basis of the lowest net interest cost to the City, which shall be determined by subtracting the amount of the premium, if any, from the total interest cost to the City and shall be stated as a dollar amount in the bid. The City shall be entitled to rely on such dollar amount as stated in the bid as the basis for determining the lowest net interest cost.

It is anticipated that CUSIP identification numbers will be printed on certificated bonds and assigned to uncertificated bonds, but neither the failure to print such numbers on or assign such numbers to any bond, nor any error with respect thereto, shall constitute cause for a failure by the successful bidder to accept delivery of and pay for the bonds in accordance with the terms of its Contract and this Notice of Bond Sale. All expenses in connection with the printing of CUSIP numbers on, or the assigning of CUSIP numbers to, the bonds shall be paid for by the City.

Such sealed bids shall be opened publicly and only at the time and place specified in this notice and will be sold to the best bidder or bidders; however, the City reserves the right to waive errors in the bid and any or all bids may be rejected.

Purchasers shall submit their bids in writing, sealed, and marked "Bond Bid." Each bid shall be accompanied by a certified or cashier's check equal to two percent of the total amount of the bid. No interest will be paid on the deposit of the successful bidder. In

case any purchaser, whose bid is accepted, shall fail to carry out his contract, said deposit shall be paid to the City as liquidated damages. The checks of the unsuccessful bidders will be returned promptly.

Said bonds will be printed by the purchaser, and at his own expense. Said bonds will be sold subject to the legal opinion of Fred W. Rausch, Jr., Topeka, Kansas, whose unqualified approving opinion will be furnished to the successful bidder, and will be printed on the reverse of each bond, if so desired. The cost of this legal opinion shall be at the expense of the City of Hays, Kansas. The successful bidder will be furnished with said opinion together with a certified transcript of proceedings evidencing the authorization and issuance of said bonds and the usual closing proofs which will include a certificate that there is no litigation pending or, to the knowledge of the signers thereof, threatened at the time of delivery of the bonds, affecting the validity thereof. The purchaser will not be required to pay the expense of legal services rendered to the City in the issuance of said bonds.

Said P. bonds are being issued for the purpose of paying the cost of construction of storm sewers and street improvements in the City of Hays, Kansas. The bonds will be delivered to the purchaser on or before September 1, 1983. Delivery of said bonds will be made in Topeka, Kansas; Wichita, Kansas; Kansas City, Missouri, or Hays, Kansas, at the expense of the City and at the option of the purchaser. Delivery elsewhere will be made at the purchaser's expense.

The assessed valuation of all tangible taxable property situated within the City for the year 1982 is \$43,080,703.00. Such valuation is used in determining debt limitations. The General Obligation Bonded Indebtedness of the City of Hays, Kansas, as of January 1, 1983, was \$5,699,000.00, with \$887,000.00 to be paid in 1983. Water and Sewer General Obligation Bonds in the amount of \$1,330,000.00 have been issued in 1983. The City also had outstanding \$4,455,000.00 Water and Sewer Revenue Bonds as of January 1, 1983, of which \$5,000.00 has been paid in 1983.

NOTICE OF HEARING ON PROPOSED PERMANENT ADMINISTRATIVE REGULATIONS

A public hearing to consider the proposed adoption of permanent administrative regulations will be held by the board on Saturday, July 30, 1983, at 11:00 a.m., in the Basement Auditorium of the State Office Building at 10th and Topeka Avenue in Topeka.

Persons in attendance may present their views and arguments orally or in writing. All persons will be given a reasonable opportunity to be heard.

It has been determined that the proposed regulations will have no fiscal impact on the agency.

The administrative regulations proposed to be adopted are as follows:

Article 1.—APPLICATION FOR LICENSE

67-1-5. Applications. (a) All applications shall be signed by the applicant ~~and notarized~~. In the case of a temporary license, the sponsor's statement shall ~~also be notarized~~ signed by the sponsor.

(b) A sponsor is defined as a trained person who holds a valid license or certificate of endorsement issued under K.S.A. 74-5812 or K.S.A. 74-5814.

(c) All applications to the board shall state the name and location of the office or place of business where the hearing aid dispenser's license will be regularly displayed. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-5806(i); effective May 1, 1982; amended May 1, 1984).

67-1-7. Change of information. When the name or address of the licensee's business is changed, notice of this change shall be ~~filed with~~ mailed to the executive officer within ~~five (5)~~ 10 days of the change. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-5806(i); effective May 1, 1982; amended May 1, 1984).

Article 2.—EXAMINATIONS

67-2-4. Examinations. (a) ~~Examinations shall be given by the board and~~ Applicants shall be required to take an examination which includes both a written and practical demonstration of technical proficiency. The passing score shall be ~~seventy-five (75)~~ percent.

(b) The applicant shall be notified by letter by the board of the date, time, and location of the examination. The applicant shall be notified by letter of the examination results within ~~thirty (30)~~ days from the date of examination.

(c) ~~The examination shall be reviewed by the board at least once every two (2) years to keep it current with the accepted knowledge of hearing aid audiology.~~ (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-5806; implementing K.S.A. 74-5806, K.S.A. 74-5812(a); effective May 1, 1982; amended May 1, 1984).

Article 4.—EDUCATIONAL REQUIREMENTS

67-4-6. Notice of to licensees of educational course offers. The executive officer shall notify Current and temporary license holders licensees shall be notified at least thirty (30) days before the date the board offers the educational courses are to be offered by the board. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-5806; implementing K.S.A. 74-5821; effective May 1, 1982; amended May 1, 1984).

67-4-7. Educational requirement duties of executive officer. Educational requirements; duties of executive officer; national organizations; acceptance. (a) The executive officer shall rate those who are in attendance at educational courses offered by the board and shall issue each person a written certificate stating the number of credit hours that the licensee each person has successfully completed. These certificates shall be presented to the board annually at least thirty (30) days before July 1, and the executive officer shall issue a signed certificate to each person stating the number of credit hours successfully completed. The executive officer shall give to the board written evidence of the educational requirements which each person has completed.

(b) Any licensee completing the educational requirements through the National Hearing Aid Association or the National Manufacturer's Symposium shall obtain a signed certificate from the instructor of each course stating the course title and the number of credit hours. The licensee shall present the certificates to the executive officer of the board within 60 days after attending the alternative courses.

(c) The board shall examine each certificate and advise the licensee of the number of credit hours the board will accept toward the two days of educational requirements set forth in K.S.A. 74-5821. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-5806; implementing K.S.A. 5821; effective May 1, 1982; amended May 1, 1984).

67-4-8. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-5806; implementing K.S.A. 74-5821; effective May 1, 1982; revoked May 1, 1984).

67-4-9. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-5806; implementing K.S.A. 74-5821; effective May 1, 1982; revoked May 1, 1984).

(d) Representing that the services or advice of a person licensed to practice medicine will be used or made available in the selection, fitting, adjustment, maintenance, or repair of hearing aids when that is not true;

(e) Permitting another person to use his or her the licensee's license or certificate;

(f) Defaming competitors by:

(1) Falsely imputing to them dishonorable conduct, inability to perform contracts, questionable credit standing, or other misrepresentation; or

(2) To disparage the products of competitors in any respect, their business methods, selling prices, values, credit terms, policies, fitting, or services;

(g) Displaying competitive products in his or her display window, place of business, or advertising in a manner which is false or disparaging;

(h) Using, in the licensee's advertising, the name, model name, or trade-mark of a particular manufacturer of hearing aids in a manner that implies a relationship with the manufacturer which does not exist;

(i) Using a trade name, corporate name, trademark or other trade designation which has the tendency of misleading or deceiving purchasers or prospective purchasers as to the name, nature, or origin of a product or of materials used therein;

(j) Obtaining information concerning the business of a competitor by bribing an employee or agent of the competitor or by false or misleading statements or representations;

(k) (f) Directly or indirectly giving, or offering to give, money or anything of substantial value to a practitioner of the hearing arts or to a person who is licensed by the Kansas Board of Hearing Arts board of hearing arts to refer patients or clients as an inducement to influence them or have them influence others for the purpose of inducing that practitioner to refer patients or clients to purchase or contract to purchase products sold or offered for sale by a hearing aid dispenser, or to influence persons to refrain from dealing in the hearing aids or accessories of competitors the licensee;

(l) (g) Gross incompetence or negligence in fitting, dispensing and servicing hearing aids in a grossly incompetent or negligent manner;

(m) (h) Failure Failing to return monies within 20 days after an aid has been returned in good condition and pursuant to contract; on a trial or rental contract.

(n) Using the term "hearing" in advertisements, letterheads, business cards, or upon the premises without including the term "hearing aid" in a conspicuous place; and

(o) Advertising or promoting the licensee's business without including the name and address of that business in the advertisement.

(b) An identification card shall be issued to each licensee and it shall list the address of the licensee's office. This card shall be kept in the possession of the licensee and, upon the request of a customer, or board member, or law officer, the licensee shall permit the identification card to be inspected. Article 9.—SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION PROCEEDINGS

67-9-5. Proceedings. If a hearing is requested the holder shall be given fifteen (15) days notice to prepare for hearing. The board shall mail to the licensee a notice of the charges against the licensee and shall set forth the time and place of the hearing. The licensee shall have 20 days from the date of the notice in which to prepare for hearing. The licensee, upon request, shall be given the opportunity to produce testimony in the licensee's favor and to confront any witness against the licensee.
