OPINION NO. 83-101

Public Utilities—Powers of the State Corporation Commission—Intrastate Rail Regulation. Brian Moline, State Corporation Commission, Topeka, June 28, 1983.

Where Section 214 of the *Staggers Rail Act of 1980* (49 U.S.C. § 11501), explicitly providing for the regulation of intrastate rail rates by the Interstate Commerce Commission, is in conflict with Kansas statutes providing for the regulation of intrastate rail rates by the State Corporation Commission, federal law must prevail, pursuant to the Supremacy Clause of the United States Constitution, Art. VI. Cited herein: K.S.A. 66-117, 66-170, 49 U.S.C. § 10101, 49 U.S.C. § 10501, 49 U.S.C. § 10701, 49 U.S.C. § 10706, 49 U.S.C. § 10707, 49 U.S.C. § 10712, 49 U.S.C. § 10762, 49 U.S.C. § 11501, and U.S. Constitution, Art. VI. CMA

OPINION NO. 83-102

Automobiles and Other Vehicles—Serious Traffic Offenses—Driving While Under Influence of Alcohol; Certification of Community-based Alcohol and Drug Safety Action Programs.

Public Health—Alcoholism and Intoxication Treatment—Licensure of Treatment Facilities. Charles V. Hamm, General Counsel, Department of Social and Rehabilitation Services, Topeka, June 30, 1983.

Pursuant to K.S.A. 8-1008, as amended by 1983 Substitute for House Bill No. 2132, community-based alcohol and drug safety action programs are authorized to perform a variety of services relating to persons who have been arrested for the offense of driving while under the influence of alcohol. Included in such services are evaluations of persons being considered for diversion or who have been convicted but not yet sentenced. Certification of the programs which are authorized to so act in each judicial district is determined by the administrative judge of the district or, in the event such judge declines to do so, by the Secretary of the Department of Social and Rehabilitation Services. Such certification is for the limited purpose of providing the services specified by K.S.A. 8-1008, as amended, and does not act as a substitute for licensure under K.S.A. 65-4001 *et seq.* and 65-4601 *et seq.* In that diagnostic services are included within the definition of treatment contained in the latter acts, a community-based alcohol and drug safety action program must be licensed under such acts before it may offer such services under K.S.A. 8-1008, as amended. OPINION NO. 83-103

Crimes and Punishments—Code; Sentencing—

Probation; Incarceration in County Jail. David Belling, Miami County Attorney, Paola, July 5, 1983.

Kansas law grants broad discretion to the district court to determine conditions of probation in criminal cases. Probation conditioned upon incarceration in the county jail is not unreasonable as a matter of law or beyond the power of the district court. Cited herein: K.S.A. 21-4601, 21-4602, 21-4610. BJS

OPINION NO. 83-104

Taxation—Listing Property for Taxation—Listing and Return of Livestock; Listing of Cattle Held in Feedlots. S. Philip Stover, Gove County Attorney, Quinter, July 5, 1983.

K.S.A. 1982 Supp. 79-307b does not *require* a feedlot owner or operator to collect and remit property taxes on cattle owned by others and held in the feedlot for final feeding.

The payment of taxes under K.S.A. 1982 Supp. 79-307b has no effect on the listing and return of livestock for purposes of taxation under K.S.A. 79-307a. Cited herein: K.S.A. 79-301, 79-303, 79-307a, K.S.A. 1982 Supp. 79-307b, 79-2004a. RJB

OPINION NO. 83-105

Federal Job Training Partnership Act—State Education Coordination and Grants—Agency to Which Federal Funds Made Available. Lawrence Foth, Executive Director, Advisory Council for Vocational Education, Topeka, July 5, 1983.

If one or more cooperative agreements are entered into by those parties specified in 29 U.S.C.A. § 1533(a)(1), then sums available for those purposes specified in section 1533 are to be provided by the Governor to the state education agency responsible for education and training. In Kansas, this agency is the State Board of Education. Thus, if one or more cooperative agreements are made, the federal moneys provided the state under 29 U.S.C.A. § 1533 must be made available to the State Board of Education. Those moneys may not be made available directly to service delivery areas. The State Board, of course, must use the moneys received for the purposes, and subject to the requirements, prescribed in section 1533. DELIVERY OF THE BONDS

The fees of the Bond Registrar for registration and transfer of the Bonds shall be paid by the City.

INTEREST RATE

Proposals will be received on the Bonds bearing such rate or rates of interest, not exceeding Five (5) different interest rates, as may be specified by the bidder. The repetition of a rate will not constitute one of said maximum number of rates. The same rate shall apply to all Bonds of the same maturity. Each interest rate specified shall be in an even multiple of one-eighth (1/8th) or one-twentieth (1/20th) of one percent

(1%). The difference between the highest and the lowest coupon rates specified in any bid shall not exceed two and one-half percent (2 1/2%). No interest rate shall exceed the maximum interest rate allowed by Kansas law; said rate being the "20 Bond Index" of tax exempt municipal bonds published by the *Weekly Bond Buyer* in New York, New York on the Monday next preceding the day on which the bonds are sold (July 18, 1983), plus 2%, and no bid of less than par and accrued interest will be considered. In the event a bidder whose bid is accepted shall fail to carry out his Contract of Purchase, said deposit shall be retained by the City as liquidated damages. The checks of unsuccessful bidders will be returned promptly.

AWARD OF BIDS

The sealed bids for the Bonds shall be opened publicly and only at the time and place specified in this Notice; and the Bonds will be sold to the best bidder. The City reserves the right to reject any and/or all of the bids, and to waive any irregularities. Unless all bids are rejected, the Bonds will be awarded to the bidder whose proposal results in the lowest net interest cost to the City; and the net interest cost will be determined by deducting the amount of any premium paid from the aggregate amount of interest upon all of the Bonds from their date until their respective maturities.

DELIVERY OF THE BONDS

The Bonds, duly printed, executed and registered, will be furnished and paid for by the City; and the Bonds will be sold subject to the unqualified approving opinion of GAAR & BELL, Bond Counsel, of Wichita, Kansas. THE NUMBER, DENOMINATION OF BONDS, AND NAMES OF REGISTERED OWNERS SHALL BE SUBMITTED IN WRITING BY THE SUCCESSFUL BIDDER TO THE CITY NOT LATER THAN JULY 27, 1983. The purchaser will be furnished with a complete Transcript of Proceedings evidencing the authorization and issuance of the Bonds; and the usual closing proofs, which will include a Certificate that there is no litigation pending or threatened at the time of delivery of the Bonds affecting their validity. Payment for the Bonds shall be made in immediately available funds. Delivery of the

Bonds will be made to the successful bidder on or before AUGUST 31, 1983, at any bank in the STATE OF KANSAS or KANSAS CITY, MISSOURI, at the expense of the City. Delivery elsewhere will be made at the expense of the purchaser.

LEGAL OPINION

Bids shall be conditioned upon the unqualified approving opinion of Gaar & Bell, Bond Counsel, Wichita, Kansas, a copy of which opinion will be printed on the reverse side of each bond and a manually signed original will be furnished without expense to the purchaser of the bonds at the delivery thereof. The cost of this legal opinion and the expense of printing the bonds and legal opinion will be paid by the City. Said legal opinion will state in part substantially that the Bonds will constitute general obligations of the City, payable as to both principal and interest from ad valorem taxes which may be levied without limitation as to rate or amount upon all of the taxable tangible property within the territorial limits of the City; and that, under existing law, the interest on said bonds is exempt from present Federal income taxation and the bonds are exempt from intangible personal property taxes levied by Kansas cities, counties and townships.

PURPOSE OF ISSUE

The Bonds are being issued for the purpose of drilling a new water well and appurtenances thereto, and constructing a transmission line from said water well to the City's Waterworks System.
