A public hearing will be held on Monday, November 14, 1983, commencing at 1:30 p.m. in the Auditorium of the Topeka-Shawnee County Health Department, 1615 West 8th, Topeka, Kansas, to consider the adoption of proposed temporary and permanent rules and regulations of the Department of Health and Environment (K.A.R. 28-31-1 through 28-31-4, 28-31-6, and 28-31-8 through 28-31-10).

All interested parties may submit written comments at any time prior to the hearing by addressing them to the Secretary, Kansas Department of Health and Environment, Forbes Field, Topeka, Kansas 66620. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity at the hearing to present their views, orally, in regard to the adoption of the proposed regulations. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request each participant to limit oral presentation to not more than five (5) minutes.

The proposed regulations adopt by reference the Federal Hazardous Waste Management Regulations as in effect September 1, 1983, and revise monitoring fees for hazardous waste transporters, generators, treatment, storage, and disposal facilities. BOARD OF TAX APPEALS

**SUMMARIZED ORDERS OF
STATE-WIDE IMPACT**

Docket No. 2411-82-DT

Compensating Use Tax—interpretation of the “isolated or occasional sale” exemption provisions of K.S.A. 79-3606(1). In re appeal of the Kansas City Southern Railway Company, dated October 12, 1983.

The lease herein involved is not a series of monthly contracts, but rather one contract that allows the lessee to make installment payments on the total amount due over the life of the lease. The Board concludes the lease transaction is, therefore, a single transaction. As an isolated transaction the Board does not find the appellant to be engaged in business in Kansas as a retailer—for the purpose of leasing property. The exemption provision for an isolated or occasional sale is found to apply. The assessment should not have been imposed, and a refund is ordered.

Assessment and valuation—applicability of valuation guides established by the Director of Property Valuation for the State of Kansas. In re tax protest of Brittain Machine, Inc., *et al.*, dated October 12, 1983.

The Miscellaneous Personal Property Valuation Guide is established by the Director for use by county appraisers. It may be deviated from, upon a showing of an under/over assessment, if accomplished prior to the authority of the county commissioners sitting as the County Board of Equalization yearly adjournment date. A change to the valuation guide, based upon local market conditions, is not the correction of a clerical error. It is a valuation or assessment change. It is not within the authority of the county commissioners to consider such changes as clerical errors, which may be addressed pursuant to K.S.A. 79-1701a. If someone had incorrectly transposed a trending factor, economic life, or mathematical computation that would have been a clerical error within the meaning “extension of value or taxes whereby a taxpayer is charged with unjust taxes,” as contained within K.S.A. 79-1701(b).

A public hearing will be held on Tuesday, November 22, 1983, at 1:00 p.m. in the Conference Room of the Kansas Department of Corrections, on the 5th Floor of the Jayhawk Tower Building, 700 Jackson, Topeka, Kansas 66603, to consider the adoption of proposed temporary and permanent regulations of the Kansas Department of Corrections.

All interested parties may submit written comments at any time prior to the hearing by addressing them to the Secretary of Corrections, Attention Bernard J. Dunn, Legal Counsel, 5th Floor, Jayhawk Tower Building, 700 Jackson, Topeka, Kansas 66603. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity at the hearing to present their views, orally, in regard to the adoption of the proposed regulations. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request each participant to limit oral presentation to not more than five minutes.

Following the hearing on November 22, 1983, all written and oral comments submitted by interested parties will be considered by the Secretary of Corrections as the basis for making changes to these proposed regulations.

Summaries of the regulations follow. Copies of the regulations and the fiscal impact statement may be obtained by writing: Department of Corrections, 5th Floor, Jayhawk Towers, 700 Jackson, Topeka, Kansas 66603, Attention: Bernard J. Dunn.

The following is a brief summary of the proposed regulations:

PERMANENT REGULATIONS:

K.A.R. 44-1-103 relating to public or educational visits and tours at prisons clarifying use as part of a crime prevention or aversion program.

K.A.R. 44-4-101 through 44-4-109 relating to training for correctional officers. These regulations are to clarify and specify certain matters relating to the curriculum required for certification of the correctional officer in the State of Kansas.

K.A.R. 44-5-102 through 44-5-106, 44-5-108, 44-5-110, 44-5-112, 44-5-113 and 44-5-114. These regulations relate to the management of inmates and their property within the correctional setting. They are required in order to clarify the methods and means by which the correctional institutions and their employees will manage the security and control relating to inmates and the disposition of their property.

K.A.R. 44-6-101 through 44-6-145 relating to the computation of sentences, good time credits, parole eligibility, conditional release, minimum and net maximum sentences. These regulations are necessary to implement the statutory provisions for all inmates currently in the prison system. These regulations implement the laws applicable to such inmates for each and every statutory change which has occurred since

1969 when such change controls the service of sentence time in prison, the earning of good time credit or the granting of parole.

K.A.R. 44-7-102, 44-7-106, 44-7-107, and 44-7-108 relating to various programs for inmates within the correctional setting. These regulations are necessary to clarify programs relating to recreation, incentive pay, volunteer services and private non-prison employment.

K.A.R. 44-8-102 and 44-8-114 relating to participation in work release programs clarifying the rules and eligibility requirements for work release participation.

K.A.R. 44-9-103 and 44-9-104 relating to parole supervision. These regulations are necessary to clarify the rules relating to imposition of conditions, assessment or risk, and levels of supervision.

K.A.R. 44-11-111, 44-11-114, 44-11-117, 44-11-118, 44-11-125 and 44-11-128 relating to community corrections act. These regulations are necessary to clarify certain matters relating to community corrections budgeting, services, and chargebacks for juveniles.

K.A.R. 44-12-304, 44-12-306, 44-12-314, 44-12-316, 44-12-326, 44-12-601, 44-12-1101, 44-12-1201, 44-12-1301, 44-12-1302, 44-12-1303, 44-12-1304 and 44-12-1307 relating to inmate disciplinary code. These regulations are necessary to refine the disciplinary code relating to certain offenses and to modify the classification of the penalties for certain offenses and to further define characteristics of oral reprimand.

K.A.R. 44-13-101 through 44-13-115, 44-13-201, 44-13-301 through 44-13-305, 44-13-401 through 44-13-408, 44-13-501, 44-13-503, 44-13-504, 44-13-508, 44-13-509, 44-13-601 through 44-13-610, 44-13-701, 44-13-702, 44-13-704 and 44-13-707. These relate to the inmate disciplinary procedure. These regulations are necessary to further refine and clarify several matters relating to the inmate disciplinary procedure, to increase its efficiency and its fairness, and to attempt compliance with the American Correctional Association standards for disciplinary procedures in prisons.

K.A.R. 44-14-101, 44-14-102, 44-14-302 through 44-14-305, 44-14-310 through 44-14-316 relating to administrative segregation of inmates in the prison setting. These regulations are necessary to upgrade the standards applied to the administrative segregation housing and process, to increase the involvement of the inmate and to attempt to comply with the American Correctional Association standards on administrative segregation procedures.

K.A.R. 44-15-101 through 44-15-106 and 44-15-202 relating to inmate and parolee grievance procedure. These regulations are necessary to expand the inmate grievance procedure to include parolees, to increase its effectiveness, efficiency and fairness, to come into closer compliance with the U.S. Civil Rights of Institutionalized Persons Act, and to attempt compliance with the American Correctional Association standards on inmate grievances.

K.A.R. 44-16-102 through 44-16-105, 44-16-107 and 44-16-108 relating to lost or damaged property claims for inmates.

TEMPORARY REGULATIONS:

K.A.R. 44-6-101 through 44-6-145 relating to the computation of sentences, good time credits, parole eligibility, conditional release, minimum and net maximum sentences. These regulations are necessary to implement the statutory provisions for all inmates currently in the prison system. These regulations implement the laws applicable to such inmates for each and every statutory change which has occurred since 1969 when such change controls the service of sentence time in prison, the earning of good time credit or the granting of parole. It is necessary to issue these regulations as temporary regulations since it is necessary to inform the various officials throughout the State of Kansas in the criminal justice system on matters relating to the interpretation of sentencing and parole laws as they relate to the Department of Corrections and its inmates.

K.A.R. 44-12-326. This regulation is within the disciplinary code for inmates in the prison system and relates to sexual activity. This prohibits sexual intercourse and is necessary to provide the necessary foundation for discipline within the correctional institution as they are currently constituted.
