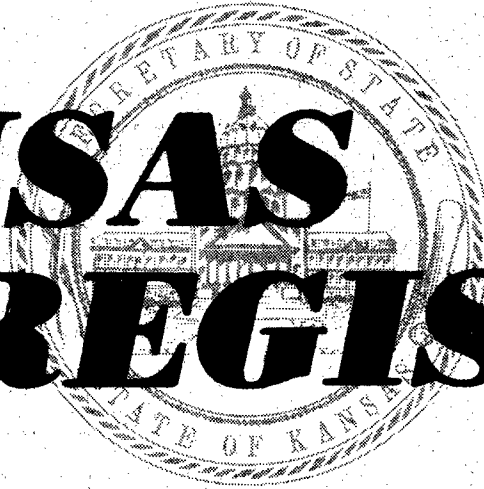

SOCIAL AND REHABILITATION SERVICES

TEMPORARY ADMINISTRATIVE REGULATIONS

(Approved by the State Rules and Regulations Board November 2, 1983. Will expire May 1, 1984.)

Article 4.—PUBLIC ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

30-4-121. Special allowances for funeral and cemetery expenses. Funeral and cemetery expenses shall be allowed under this section for persons who meet the eligibility requirements set forth below. For a non-recipient, an application, pursuant to this section, shall be signed by any person who has knowledge of the deceased person's resources or by the area manager, and shall be filed within six months from the date of death. (a) Treatment of resources.

(1) When a decedent was not living with a surviving legal dependent at the time of death, the total estate of the decedent shall be considered as available. The estate shall not be allowed any exemptions.

(2) When a decedent was living with a surviving legal dependent at the time of death, the eligibility of the decedent's assistance family group for assistance based upon need (100% without pro rata) and property limitations shall be determined for the calendar month in which the decedent died. Only the income and property (excluding a home) of the decedent and any person who was legally responsible for the decedent shall be considered. Income in excess of budgetary requirements and property in excess of allowable limitations shall be considered as available in determining eligibility and payment.

(3) Cash contributions or partial payment of funeral and cemetery expenses by relatives or friends shall be considered as available.

(4) Death benefits from SSA, VA, railroad retirement, or other burial insurance policy shall be considered as available.

(b) Included services.

(1) Funeral expenses shall include all expenses connected with preparation of the body, purchase of a casket, purchase of the necessary clothing, transportation of the body within the trade area, purchase of an outside container, if required, and the employment of personnel for the burial ceremony.

(2) Cemetery expenses shall include all expenses connected with the interment of the body in a cemetery, including opening and closing the grave, the purchase of a cemetery lot, and the purchase of an outside container, if required. Cremation expenses may be substituted in lieu of this.

(c) Maximum allowances.

(1) Funeral expenses shall not exceed the following allowances:

Size of casket	Allowance
Oversize casket	\$600.00
Casket, 5' and over	\$550.00
Casket, 4' to 4'6"	\$450.00
Casket, 3' to 3'6"	\$350.00

Casket, 2' to 2'6"	\$250.00
Casket for infant, 2'	\$150.00

Transportation costs outside of the trade area which are necessary and reasonable may be allowed as long as the total for the funeral expense, including transportation, does not exceed \$600.00. In addition, if an outside container is required, \$150.00 shall be allowed to meet this expense.

(2) Cemetery expenses shall not exceed \$150.00. In addition, if an outside container is required, \$150.00 shall be allowed to meet this expense. Whenever a cemetery lot has been purchased or acquired for a recipient of assistance, either before or after the recipient's death, and the cemetery lot was purchased or acquired with public funds, the cemetery expense shall not include the portion of the expense allocated to a cemetery lot.

(d) Payments. The payment for funeral and cemetery expenses shall be determined by subtracting available resources from the cost of the funeral and cemetery expenses which shall not exceed the above established allowances. The agency shall not participate in the payment of funeral or cemetery expenses if the costs exceed the applicable maximum allowances.
