NOTICE OF COMMENCEMENT OF NEGOTIATIONS FOR ENGINEERING SERVICES

Notice is hereby given of the commencement of negotiations for engineering services for Variable Air Volume Retrofit of the HVAC system of Wescoe Hall at the University of Kansas, Lawrence, Kansas.

This building has a gross area of approximately 179,000 square feet and contains general classrooms and faculty offices. The existing HVAC system consists of six (6) dual duct constant volume air handling units. Chilled water is provided by a central water chilling plant and steam for heating from a central heating plant.

The intent of this project is to convert the six existing dual duct constant volume air handling units to dual duct variable air volume A-H Units, which will require replacing approximately 200 existing mixing boxes with VAV boxes or converting the existing mixing boxes to variable volume boxes. Conversion will include consideration of various types of variable volume control systems and temperature controls systems which will interface with a future central Energy Management System.

The State Building Advisory Commission will nominate firms for the above project at their January meeting. Nominated firms will be interviewed by an engineering negotiating committee at a later date.

Engineers or engineering firms must be permitted by law to practice and be on file with the Division of Architectural Services to be eligible. Federal Jurisdiction—Surplus Property of Federal Agencies—Airport Authorities; Quorum.

State Departments; Public Officers, Employees— Open Meetings Law—Quorum Change of Metropolitan Topeka Airport Authority. Frank M. Rice, Metropolitan Topeka Airport Authority, Topeka, November 28, 1983.

The City of Emporia, Kansas will receive sealed bids at the OFFICE OF THE CITY CLERK, CITY HALL, 522 MECHANIC, EMPORIA, KANSAS, until 4:00 o'clock P.M., C.S.T., on

WEDNESDAY, DECEMBER 21, 1983 for the purchase of One Million Seventeen Thousand Thirty-Four Dollars and Forty-Five Cents (\$1,017,034.45) par value General Obligation Bonds (the "Bonds") of the City, at which time and place such bids will be publicly opened. No oral or auction bids will be considered.

The Series 1983-A Bonds initially issued will be dated as of December 1, 1983 and shall mature on December 1 in each of the years and in the amounts set forth below. Such Bonds shall consist of fully registered certificated Bonds, each in the denomination of \$5,000.00 or integral multiples thereof, except one Bond in the denomination of \$7,034.45, not exceeding the principal amount of Bonds maturing in each year. Interest will be payable semiannually, commencing June 1, 1984, and each December 1 and June 1 thereafter. The principal of, and premium, if any, on the Bonds shall be payable in lawful money of the United States of America, at the principal office of the Treasurer of the State of Kansas, (the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar) to the registered owners thereof upon presentation of the Bonds for payment and cancellation. Interest on the Bonds shall be payable in lawful money of the United States of America, by check or draft of the Paying Agent to the registered owners appearing on the books maintained by the Bond Registrar as of the preceding May 15 and November 15 (the Record Dates). The fees of the Bond Registrar for registration and transfer of the Bonds shall be paid by the City.

Proposals will be received on the Bonds bearing such rate or rates of interest, not exceeding eight (8) different interest rates, as may be specified by the bidder. The repetition of a rate will not constitute one of said maximum number of rates. The same rate shall apply to all Bonds of the same maturity. Each interest rate specified shall be in an even multiple of oneeighth (1/8th) or one-twentieth (1/20th) of one percent (1%). The difference between the highest and lowest rates specified in any bid shall not exceed two percent (2%). No interest rate shall exceed the maximum interest rate allowed by Kansas law; said rate being two percent (2%) above the "Bond Buyer's 20 Bond Index," published in the Weekly Bond Buyer on Monday, December 19, 1983, and no bid of less than par and accrued interest will be considered. Bids for less than the entire issue of Bonds will not be considered.

Bids shall be submitted on the OFFICIAL BID FORM furnished by the City, and shall be addressed to the City at 522 Mechanic, Emporia, Kansas 66801, and shall be plainly marked BOND BID. All bids must state the total interest cost of the bid, the premium, if any, the net interest cost of the bid, and the average annual interest rate, all certified by the bidder to be correct; and the City will be entitled to rely on the certificate of correctness of the bidder. Each bid must be accompanied by a certified or cashier's check equal to two percent (2%) of the total amount of the bid, and shall be payable to the City of Emporia, Kansas. In the event a bidder whose bid is accepted shall fail to carry out his Contract of Purchase, said deposit shall be retained by the City as liquidated damages. The checks of unsuccessful bidders will be returned promptly.

The Bonds, duly printed, executed and registered, will be furnished and paid for by the City; and the Bonds will be sold subject to the unqualified approving opinion of NICHOLS AND WOLFE CHARTERED, Bond Counsel of Topeka, Kansas, whose opinion will be paid for by the City.

The number, denomination of Bonds and names of the initial registered owners shall be submitted in writing by the successful bidder to the Bond Registrar not later than January 21, 1984.

The purchaser will be furnished with a complete Transcript of Proceedings evidencing authorization and issuance of the Bonds; and the usual closing proofs, which will include a Certificate that there is no

litigation pending or threatened at the time of delivery of the Bonds affecting their validity. Payment for the Bonds shall be made in immediately available funds. Delivery of the Bonds will be made to the successful bidder on or before February 21, 1984 at any bank in the STATE OF KANSAS or KANSAS CITY, MISSOURI, at the expense of the City. Delivery elsewhere will be made at the expense of the purchaser.

The Bonds will constitute General Obligations of the City, payable as to both principal and interest from the collection of special assessments which have been levied on benefited property; but if not so paid, then said principal and interest will be payable from ad valorem taxes which may be levied without limitation as to rate or amount upon all of the taxable, tangible property within the territorial limits of the City. The Series 1983-A Bonds are being issued for the purpose of making certain internal improvements in the City.

The sealed bids for the Bonds shall be opened publicly and only at the time and place specified in this Notice. The City reserves the right to reject any and/or all of the bids, and to waive any irregularities. Unless all bids are rejected, the Bonds will be awarded to the bidder whose proposal results in the lowest net interest cost to the City; and the net interest cost will be determined by deducting any amount of any premium paid from the aggregate amount of interest upon all of the Bonds from their date until their respective maturities.

The City of Ulysses, Kansas will receive sealed bids at the OFFICE OF THE CITY CLERK, CITY HALL, 114 WEST GRANT, ULYSSES, KANSAS, until 7:30 o'clock P.M., C.S.T., on

WEDNESDAY, DECEMBER 21, 1983 for the purchase of Seven Hundred Forty-Eight Thousand Eight Hundred Ninety-Nine Dollars (\$748,899) par value General Obligation Sewer Improvement Bonds (the "Bonds") of the City, at which time and place such bids will be publicly opened. No oral or auction bids will be considered.

The Series 1983-A Bonds initially issued will be dated as of December 1, 1983, and shall mature on September 1 in each of the years and in the amounts set forth below. Such Bonds shall consist of fully registered certificated Bonds, each in the denomination of \$5,000.00 or integral multiples thereof excepting Bond No. R-1 in the denomination of \$3,899, not exceeding the principal amount of Bonds maturing in each year. Interest will be payable semiannually, commencing March 1, 1985, and each September 1 and March 1 thereafter. The principal of, and premium, if any, on the Bonds shall be payable in lawful money of the United States of America, at the principal office of the Treasurer of the State of Kansas. (the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar) to the registered owners thereof upon presentation of the Bonds for payment and cancellation. Interest on the Bonds shall be payable in lawful money of the United States of America, by check or draft of the Paying Agent to the registered owners appearing on the books maintained by the Bond Registrar as of the preceding February 15 and August 15 (the Record Dates). The fees of the Bond Registrar for registration and transfer of the Bonds shall be paid by the City.

Proposals will be received on the Bonds bearing such rate or rates of interest, not exceeding eight (8) different interest rates, as may be specified by the bidder. The repetition of a rate will not constitute one of said maximum number of rates. The same rate shall apply to all Bonds of the same maturity. Each interest rate specified shall be in an even multiple of oneeighth (1/8th) or one-twentieth (1/20th) of one percent (1%). The difference between the highest and lowest coupon rates specified in any bid shall not exceed two percent (2%). No interest rate shall exceed the maximum interest rate allowed by Kansas law; said rate being two percent (2%) above the "Bond Buyer's 20 Bond Index," published in the Weekly Bond Buyer on Monday, December 19, 1983, and no bid of less than par and accrued interest will be considered. Bids for less than the entire issue of Bonds will not be considered.

Bids shall be submitted on the OFFICIAL BID FORM furnished by the City, and shall be addressed to the CITY OF ULYSSES, KANSAS, CITY HALL, 114 WEST GRANT, ULYSSES, KANSAS 67880, and shall be plainly marked BOND BID. All bids must state the total interest cost of the bid, the premium, if any, the net interest cost of the bid, and the average annual interest rate, all certified by the bidder to be correct; and the City will be entitled to rely on the certificate of correctness of the bidder. Each bid must be accompanied by a certified or cashier's check equal to two percent (2%) of the total amount of the bid, and shall be payable to the CITY OF ULYSSES, KANSAS. In the event a bidder whose bid is accepted shall fail to carry out his Contract of Purchase, said deposit shall be retained by the City as liquidated damages. The checks of unsuccessful bidders will be returned promptly.

The Bonds, duly printed, executed and registered, will be furnished and paid for by the City; and the Bonds will be sold subject to the unqualified approving opinion of NICHOLS AND WOLFE CHARTERED, Bond Counsel of Topeka, Kansas, whose opinion will be paid for by the City.

The number, denomination of Bonds and names of the initial registered owners shall be submitted in writing by the successful bidder to the Bond Registrar

not later than January 3, 1984.

The purchaser will be furnished with a complete Transcript of Proceedings evidencing authorization and issuance of the Bonds; and the usual closing proofs, which will include a Certificate that there is no litigation pending or threatened at the time of delivery of the Bonds affecting their validity. Payment for the Bonds shall be made in immediately available funds. Delivery of the Bonds will be made to the successful bidder on or before January 16, 1984, at any bank in the STATE OF KANSAS or KANSAS CITY, MISSOURI, at the expense of the City. Delivery elsewhere will be made at the expense of the purchaser.

The Bonds will constitute General Obligations of the City, payable as to both principal and interest from the collection of special assessments which have been levied on benefited property and from ad valorem taxes levied without limitation as to rate or amount upon all of the taxable, tangible property within the territorial limits of the City. The Series 1983-A Bonds are being issued for the purpose of making certain sanitary sewer system improvements in the City.

The sealed bids for the Bonds shall be opened publicly and only at the time and place specified in this Notice. The City reserves the right to reject any and/or all of the bids, and to waive any irregularities. Unless all bids are rejected, the Bonds will be awarded to the bidder whose proposal results in the lowest net interest cost to the City; and the net interest cost will be determined by deducting any amount of any premium paid from the aggregate amount of interest upon all of the Bonds from their date until their respective maturities.

Assessed valuation figures of the City of Ulysses,

Kansas, for the year 1983, are as follows:

CUSIP identification numbers will be printed on the Bonds. All expenses incurred in connection with the printing of CUSIP numbers on the Bonds and the expenses of the CUSIP Service Bureau for the assignment of said numbers shall be paid for by the City.

The total general obligation bonded indebtedness of the City of Ulysses, Kansas, at the date hereof, including this proposed issue of Bonds in the amount of \$748,899, is in the amount of \$2,398,899. The City of Ulysses, Kansas has Temporary Notes outstanding in the total amount of \$700,000 which will be redeemed and paid from the proceeds of this proposed issue of Bonds.

Sealed bids will be received by the Board of County Commissioners of Johnson County, Kansas (the "County"), in the Commissioners' Hearing Room, Johnson County Courthouse, Kansas Avenue and Santa Fe Street, Olathe, Kansas 66061, until 10:30 o'clock A.M., C.S.T., on

Thursday, December 15, 1983 at which time said bids will be publicly opened for the purchase of four issues of Sewer Bonds, Series 1983B, of the County, aggregating the principal amount of \$772,000 (the "Bonds").

All of the Bonds will be issued as fully registered Bonds dated January 1, 1984, and will be in the denomination of \$1,000 or \$5,000 each. The Bonds will mature in the principal amounts on September I in each year as follows:

Interest on the Bonds will be payable semiannually on March 1 and September 1 in each year commencing March 1, 1985. Both principal of and interest on the Bonds will be payable in lawful money of the United States of America at the Office of the State Treasurer in the City of Topeka, Kansas (the "Paying Agent" and "Bond Registrar"), to the registered owners thereof whose names are on the registration books of the Bond Registrar as of the 15th day of the month preceding each interest payment date. The Bonds will be registered pursuant to a plan of registration approved by the County and the Attorney General of the State of Kansas, and, at the option of the successful purchaser, the Bonds may be registered as fully registered certificated Bonds and/or uncertificated Bonds.

The County will pay the fees of the Bond Registrar for registration and transfer of the Bonds and will also pay for printing a reasonable supply of registered Bond blanks. Any additional costs or fees that might be incurred in the secondary market, other than fees of the Bond Registrar, will be the responsibility of the bondholders.

The type and denominations of the Bonds and the

names, addresses and social security or taxpayer identification numbers of the registered owners shall be submitted in writing by the successful bidder to the County by January 4, 1984.

The Bonds maturing in the year 1997 and thereafter may, at the option of the County, be called for redemption and payment prior to maturity as a whole or in part in inverse numerical order on September 1, 1996, or on any interest payment date thereafter at the principal amount of the Bonds so called for redemption, together with accrued interest thereon to date of redemption.

All of the Bonds will constitute general obligations of Johnson County, Kansas payable as to both principal and interest from special assessments levied against property benefited in the County and, if not so paid, from ad valorem taxes which may be levied without limitation as to rate or amount on all the taxable tangible property within the County.

Bids will be received on the aggregate amount of Bonds bearing such rate or rates of interest as may be specified by the bidders subject to the following conditions: The same rate shall apply to all Bonds maturing in the same year. Not more than five different rates shall be specified, the repetition of a rate not being considered a different rate. Each interest rate specified shall be a multiple of 1/8 or 1/20 of 1%. No rate shall exceed the "20 Bond Index" of tax exempt municipal bonds published by the Weekly Bond Buyer, in New York, New York on December 12, 1983, plus 2%. The difference between the highest rate specified and the lowest rate specified in any bid shall not exceed 2%. No bid providing for supplemental coupons will be considered.

No bid of less than the aggregate principal amount of the Bonds plus accrued interest thereon to the date of their delivery will be considered. Each bid shall specify the total interest cost to the County during the life of the Bonds on the basis of such bid, the premium, if any, offered by the bidder, the net interest cost to the County on the basis of such bid, and the average annual net interest rate on the basis of such bid. The best interest cost shall be determined by subtracting the amount of the premium, if any, from the total interest cost. The County shall be entitled to rely on the stated net interest cost in awarding the Bonds. If there is any discrepancy between the net interest cost and the average annual net interest rate, the specified net interest cost shall govern and the coupon rates specified in the bid shall be adjusted accordingly.

The Bonds are being issued pursuant to the authority of Chapter 99 of the Kansas 1983 Session Laws, and all acts amendatory thereof and supplemental thereto, for the purpose of providing funds to pay the cost of sewer improvements in certain sewer districts in the County.

The County will pay for printing and registering the Bonds and will deliver the same properly executed and registered to the successful bidder on or before February 1, 1984, at such bank or trust company lo-

cated in the United States as may be specified by the successful bidder. The Bonds will be sold subject to the final approving opinion of GAAR & BELL, Overland Park, Kansas, Bond Counsel, which will be furnished and paid for by the County and will be printed on the Bonds. The successful bidder will be furnished with a certified transcript of the proceedings evidencing the authorization and issuance of the Bonds and the usual closing proofs, which will include a certificate that there is no litigation pending or threatened at the time of delivery of the Bonds affecting their validity.

At the request of the successful bidder, CUSIP identification numbers will be printed on the Bonds, but neither the failure to print such number on any of the Bonds nor any error with respect thereto shall constitute cause for a failure or refusal by the successful bidder thereof to accept delivery of and pay for the Bonds in accordance with the terms of its bid and this Notice of Bond Sale. All expenses in relation to the printing of CUSIP numbers on the Bonds shall be paid for by the County.

Payment for the Bonds shall be made in Federal Reserve or equivalent funds, to be immediately available on the day of delivery of the Bonds to the suc-

cessful bidder.

Each bid shall be accompanied by a good faith deposit in the form of a cashier's or certified check in the amount of \$15,440 made payable to the order of the Treasurer of Johnson County, Kansas. Such check will be held by the County pending payment for and delivery of the Bonds to the successful bidder. In the event a bidder whose bid is accepted shall fail to carry out its contract of purchase, the amount of said deposit shall be retained by the County as liquidated damages. No interest will be paid on the deposit made by the successful bidder.

All bids must be submitted on forms which may be obtained from the undersigned. No additions or alterations in such forms shall be made, and any erasures may cause rejection of any bid. The County reserves the right to waive irregularities and to reject any or all

The adjusted equalized assessed valuation of all tangible taxable property in Johnson County, Kansas, according to the assessment as of August 25, 1983, is \$1,179,194,648. The total outstanding bonded indebtedness of Johnson County, Kansas, as of this date, including the Bonds of the County herein offered for sale, is \$59,950,050. In addition, the County has outstanding, as of this date \$25,594,200 of temporary notes, of which \$751,000 will be retired from the proceeds of the Bonds and paid assessments. The corresponding amount of indebtedness of said County as of January 1, 1984, the date of the Bonds herein offered for sale, is projected to remain substantially the same.

The outstanding general obligation Bonds of Johnson County, Kansas, are rated "Aa" by Moody's Investors Service, Inc., and said County has applied for a rating on the Bonds herein offered for sale.
