NOTICE REGARDING SMALL CITIES COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT PROGRAM

The Department of Economic Development has received a 107 Technical Assistance Grant in the amount of \$101,000 from the Department of Housing and Urban Development. The grant will enable Kansas to develop the capacity to administer the Small Cities Community Development Block Grant program in FY 84.

Governor John Carlin notified the Department of Housing and Urban Development of Kansas' intention to join the more than 40 states which administer the non-entitlement Small Cities Community Development Block Grant program. It is expected that grant applications for the estimated \$17.5 million available to Kansas in federal fiscal year 1984 will be received in the spring of 1984 and funding awards will be made in time for late summer construction.

The Kansas Department of Economic Development (KDED) will administer the program in conjunction with its current community assistance program and will provide additional technical assistance in the block grant program.

Nineteen Kansans serve on the Small Cities Community Development Block Grant Implementation Task Force appointed by Secretary Charles J. Schwartz, KDED, to provide public participation in design of the CDBG program. OF NEGOTIATIONS
FOR CONSTRUCTION SERVICES**

The State of Kansas Department of Corrections will seek a supplemental appropriation from the 1984 Session of the Legislature to fund construction for renovation of existing facilities at Winfield and Topeka State Hospitals to serve as pre-release centers. To facilitate early occupancy the Department has requested legislative authorization to waive the competitive bidding process and negotiate construction contracts.

The Department intends to negotiate one contract for the construction work at Winfield, estimated to cost approximately \$600,000, and one contract at Topeka, estimated to cost approximately \$500,000. The general contractor for each project would provide the mechanical and electrical subcontractors under his single contract. It is also the intent of the Department to have the selected contractors and their subcontractors participate in the final development of plans and specifications by providing counsel and advice relative to construction methods and materials. Such consultation will be without compensation and no construction contracts will be negotiated until funding is made available either by transfer or appropriation. In the event funding is not available or the competitive bidding process is not waived, no construction contract will be entered and no payment shall be made for any consultation or other services provided.

It is currently scheduled that plans and specifications will be complete by February 1, 1984, and that actual construction will begin no later than February 13, 1984. *Construction work must be completed for building occupancy by June 15, 1984.*

Therefore, the Department is soliciting expressions of interest from general contractors who have the ability to expedite and complete the projects within the time frame outlined above and who meet the following qualifications:

1. The firm and its subcontractors must have been in the contracting business for a minimum of five years.
2. The firm and its subcontractors must have successfully completed previous work for the State of Kansas.
3. The firm and its subcontractors must show evidence of prior experience on major renovation projects.
4. The firm must be able to provide all required insurance, performance and payment bond and Public Works Bond.
5. The firm and its subcontractors must be located in the area where the work is to be performed.

General contractors interested in providing the required construction services for either project should respond in writing indicating their qualifications, compliance to the above criteria and proposed mechanical and electrical subcontractors. Such response should be addressed to Mr. John B. Hipp, Division of Architectural Services, 625 Polk Street, Topeka, Kansas 66603, no later than January 6, 1984.

All interested parties may submit written comments at any time prior to the hearing by addressing them to the Executive Secretary, Abstracters' Board of Examiners, 112 East Bramley, Jetmore, Kansas 67854. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity at the hearing to present their views, orally, in regard to the adoption of the proposed regulations. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request each participant to limit oral presentation to not more than five (5) minutes.

Following the meeting on January 11, 1983, all written and oral comments submitted by interested parties will be considered by the Executive Secretary as the basis for making changes to these proposed regulations.

K.A.R. 85-3-2 relates to abstracters' bonds which must be on file with county clerk in the county where licensed.

K.A.R. 85-4-1 relates to fees charged for licenses.

K.A.R. 85-6-1 relates to amount of insurance an abstracter must have before being issued a license.

K.A.R. 85-7-1 relates to examination fee charged for taking abstracters' examination.

**LAW ENFORCEMENT TRAINING
 COMMISSION**

TEMPORARY ADMINISTRATIVE REGULATIONS

(Approved by the State Rules and Regulations Board
 November 22, 1983. Will expire May 1, 1984.)

**Article 1.—PEACE OFFICERS STANDARDS
 AND TRAINING**

106-1-1. Definitions. As used in these rules and regulations, unless the context clearly requires otherwise, the following words and phrases shall have the meaning ascribed to them in this section:

(a) "Commission" means the Kansas law enforcement training commission created by K.S.A. 74-5606 and amendments thereto.

(b) "Hearing board" means a hearing panel comprised of three members of the commission appointed by the chairman.

(c) "Certification" means that a person has been certified to perform the function of law enforcement by the commission.

(d) "Certified law enforcement officer" means:

(1) Those law enforcement officers, as defined in K.S.A. 74-5602(e), who were employed by a law enforcement agency prior to July 1, 1969, and who therefore are certified under K.S.A. 74-5607a;

(2) Those law enforcement officers, as defined in K.S.A. 75-5602(e), who have successfully completed a certified basic training course in the state of Kansas after July 1, 1969;

(3) Those law enforcement officers, as defined in K.S.A. 74-5602(e), who have been certified under reciprocity agreements with other states; and

(4) Railroad policemen who were appointed pursuant to K.S.A. 66-524. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1983 Supp. 74-5616; effective, T-84-31, Nov. 22, 1983.)

106-1-2. Grounds for suspension, revocation or denial of certification. The commission may suspend, revoke or deny the certification of any police or law enforcement officer issued under the Kansas law enforcement training act, K.S.A. 74-5601 *et seq.*, if that police or law enforcement officer fails to meet the requirements of that act or if that officer met the requirements by falsifying documents or failing to disclose information required for certification. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1983 Supp. 74-5616; effective, T-84-31, Nov. 22, 1983.)

106-1-3. Investigation and hearings on charges. (a) Upon the verified complaint in writing of any person setting forth facts which, if proven, would constitute grounds for denial, suspension or revocation of certification, as herein set forth, the commission shall investigate the actions of any officer holding or claiming to hold a certification. The commission may also initiate such an action upon its own motion. The commission shall, before denying, suspending or revoking any certification, give written notice of any charges made to the applicant or holder of such certification at least 10 days prior to the date set for hearing. The commission shall afford such person an opportunity to be heard in person or by counsel in reference to the charges. The written notice may be served by personal delivery to the accused person, or by mailing the notice by registered or certified mail.

(b) At the time and place fixed in the notice designated by the commission, the hearing board shall hear the charges and shall afford both the accused person and the complainant ample opportunity to present any statements, testimony, evidence and argument as may be pertinent to the charges or to any defense thereto. One member of the hearing board shall be designated

as chairman. The chairman may continue the hearing from time to time. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1983 Supp. 74-5616; effective, T-84-31, Nov. 22, 1983.)

106-1-4. Rules of evidence. The rules of evidence set forth in K.S.A. 60-401 *et seq.* shall be applied by the chairman of the hearing board. However, the technical rules of evidence may be relaxed or suspended when, in the opinion of the chairman, non-application of the technical rules would aid in ascertaining the facts and best serve the interests of the parties concerned. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1983 Supp. 74-5616; effective, T-84-31, Nov. 22, 1983.)

106-1-5. Record of proceedings. The commission shall preserve a record of all proceedings at any hearing before it. The notice of hearing, complaint and all other documents in the nature of pleadings and written motions filed in the proceedings, the transcript or recording of testimony, the decision of the hearing board and the orders of the commission shall be the record of such proceedings. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1983 Supp. 74-5616; effective, T-84-31, Nov. 22, 1983.)

106-1-6. Hearing board decision and review. The hearing board shall render its decision within 10 days of the conclusion of the hearing and shall send the written decision to the parties involved by registered or certified mail or by personal service. Any party may, within 10 days of the board's decision, request that the commission review the decision of the board. Such a review shall be completed by the commission within 30 days after the request, and shall be made by review of the record. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1983 Supp. 74-5616; effective, T-84-31, Nov. 22, 1983.)

106-1-7. Voluntary revocation and waiver of hearing. Any certified law enforcement officer who is the subject of an investigation or pending action involving possible revocation, suspension or denial of certification, may consent, in writing, to voluntary revocation and waiver of hearing. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1983 Supp. 74-5616; effective, T-84-31, Nov. 22, 1983.)

106-1-8. Reinstatement of certification. Any person whose certification has been revoked may only be reinstated upon written application and by the unanimous consent of the commission. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1983 Supp. 74-5616; effective, T-84-31, Nov. 22, 1983.)
