REQUEST FOR BIDS FOR AN OIL AND GAS LEASE

You are hereby notified that the Secretary of Social and Rehabilitation Services is offering the following described property located in the County of Stafford, State of Kansas, for an oil and gas lease pursuant to the provisions of K.A.R. 30-27-1 through K.A.R. 30-27-5, which regulations are made a part of this offer:

The Southwest Quarter (SW ¼) of Section 24, Township 22 South, Range 13 West. The above contains 160 acres, more or less.

The successful bidder shall be required to pay the costs of this publication before execution of the awarded lease.

The lease will be executed on a standard Kansas lease form with necessary modifications to comply with K.A.R. 30-27-1 through K.A.R. 30-27-5, and shall be for a period not to exceed three (3) years and so long thereafter as oil and gas is being produced therefrom in paying quantities.

The successful bidder shall file an indemnity bond in the amount of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) before the execution of the lease, which bond shall remain in effect for six (6) months after the term of the lease and for six (6) months after the plugging of any well.

The lessee shall erect a fence at least eight (8) feet high around any drilling or production devices within one thousand three hundred twenty (1,320) feet of any areas normally used by Winfield State Hospital and Training Center patients. Bids will be considered on the basis of a cash bonus, annual delay rental, and the amount of royalty to be paid, which shall not be less than twelve and one-half percent (121/2%) of the gross proceeds at the prevailing market rate.

OPINION NO. 84-42

Counties and County Officers—Register of Deeds—Custody and Recordation of Documents; Computerization of Records. Lyndus A. Henry, County Counselor, Olathe, May 30, 1984.

K.S.A. 19-1204 requires a Register of Deeds to maintain certain handwritten record books. Although K.S.A. 58-2224 provides that certain other forms of record keeping will satisfy this requirement, it does not authorize the exclusive use of computerized recording. Thus, while a Register of Deeds may use a computer to aid in the recording functions of the office, he or she must also maintain the books required by K.S.A. 19-1204 until the Legislature specifically allows computerized record keeping to be substituted for the handwritten records. OPINION NO. 84-43

Cities and Municipalities—Municipal Courts—Traffic Violations; Failure to Appear. Thomas E. Osborn, Prosecutor for the Municipal Court of Bonner Springs, Kansas City, Kansas, May 30, 1984.

A person who is stopped for a violation of a municipal traffic ordinance may be issued a complaint and notice to appear pursuant to K.S.A. 12-4205. The notice to appear, which is signed by the person who is detained, constitutes a promise to attend a specified municipal court hearing, and may be enforced through the issuance of a warrant if no appearance is made.

K.S.A. 12-4306 provides that such a warrant may be enforced by any law enforcement officer in the state through the collection of a cash appearance bond. However, unlike a similar provision in the Uniform Act Regulating Traffic (K.S.A. 8-2110), K.S.A. 12-4306 contains no provision that a person's non-appearance also subjects him or her to driver's license suspension proceedings. Accordingly, a municipal court is required to notify the division of motor vehicles of its

OPINION NO. 84-44

Automobiles and Other Vehicles—Driving Under Influence of Alcohol or Drugs—Elements of Offense. E. Edward Johnson, City Attorney, Topeka, May 31, 1984.

K.S.A. 1983 Supp. 8-1567, as amended by 1984 Senate Bill No. 490, provides [at subsection (a)] that no person shall operate a vehicle within this state while under the influence of alcohol. While it is necessary to show that a defendant was "under the influence of alcohol" in order to prove a violation, this phrase means that the defendant's mental or physical function was impaired to the extent that he or she was incapable of safely driving a vehicle. Such incapability may be presumed if it is shown that there was .10% or more by weight of alcohol in the defendant's blood, and need not be accompanied by any showing that the actual operation of the vehicle was erratic or that the driver failed to exercise due care. Laws, Journals and Public Information—Open Records Act—Lists of Names Derived from Public Record.

Personal and Real Property—Real Estate Brokers and Salesmen—Educational Requirements. J. Paul Flower, Director, Kansas Real Estate Commission, May 30, 1984.

Section 5(a)(3) of 1984 Senate Bill No. 654 authorizes the Kansas Real Estate Commission to provide the names of persons licensed under the Real Estate Brokers and Salesmen Act to organizations and institutions authorized to provide educational courses and materials to such licensees under K.S.A. 58-3046a(d). Such lists may be sold or given to the authorized organizations for the sole purpose of providing the persons listed with information relating to the availability of educational materials or courses offered by such organizations. Cited herein: 1984 House Bill No. 654; K.S.A. 58-3046a. MFC

MONDAY, JUNE 18, 1984 for \$323,535.02 par value INTERNAL IMPROVE-MENT BONDS of the City, at which time and place such bids will be publicly opened. No oral or auction bids will be considered.

The Series A, 1984 Bonds will be dated as of July 1, 1984, and shall mature on September 1 in each of the years and in the amounts set forth below. Such Bonds shall consist of fully registered certificated bonds, each in the denomination of \$5,000.00 or integral multiples thereof, except number one in the denomination of \$3,535.02, not exceeding the principal amount of Bonds maturing in each year. Interest will be payable semiannually, commencing March 1, 1985, and each March 1 and September 1 thereafter. The principal of, and premium, if any, on the Bonds shall be payable in lawful money of the United States of America, at the principal office of the Treasurer of the State of Kansas (the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar) to the registered owners thereof upon presentation of the Bonds for payment and cancellation. Redemption

Bonds maturing September 1, 1990, and thereafter, are subject to call for redemption and payment prior to their respective maturities at the option of the City on and/or after September 1, 1989, in whole at any time or in part in inverse order of maturity, and by lot within maturities, on any interest payment date, at the redemption price of 102%, plus accrued interest to the

redemption date. Notice of any call for redemption will be mailed to the registered owners of such Bonds to be redeemed at the address shown on the registration books maintained by the Bond Registrar not less than 30 days prior to the date fixed for such redemption and payment. Interest on the Bonds so called for redemption and payment will cease to accrue after the redemption date, provided notice has been given and funds are then available to pay the full redemption price thereof.

Interest Rate

Proposals will be received on the Bonds bearing such rate or rates of interest as may be specified by the bidder. No more than five changes in rates shall be used. A repeat of a rate will not constitute a change. The same rate shall apply to all Bonds of the same maturity. Each interest rate specified shall be in an even multiple of one-eighth (1/8th) or one-twentieth (1/20th) of one percent (1%). The difference between the highest and lowest coupon rates specified in any bid shall not exceed four percent (4%). No interest rate shall exceed the maximum interest rate allowed by Kansas law; said rate being the "20 Bond Index" of tax exempt municipal bonds published by the Weekly Bond Buyer in New York, New York on the Monday next preceding the day on which the Bonds are sold (June 11, 1984), plus 2%, and no bid of less than par and accrued interest will be considered. Bid Form and Good Faith Deposit

Award of Bids

The City reserves the right to reject any and/or all of the bids, and to waive any irregularities. Unless all bids are rejected, the Bonds will be awarded to the bidder whose proposal results in the lowest net interest cost to the City; and the net interest cost will be determined by deducting the amount of any premium paid from the aggregate amount of interest upon all of the Bonds from their date until their respective maturities.
