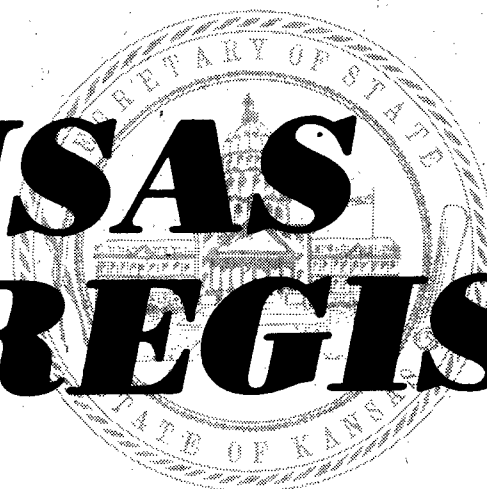

## OPINION NO. 84-55

**Cities and Municipalities—Miscellaneous Provisions—City and County Service Programs for the Elderly. Representative Norman E. Justice, Thirty-Fourth District, Kansas City, June 22, 1984.**

Pursuant to K.S.A. 12-1680, Kansas cities or counties may levy a tax to support service programs for the elderly. Within the limitations of the statute, the board of county commissioners or the governing body of a city may allocate the funds in any manner which they deem appropriate. ## OPINION NO. 84-56

**Agriculture—County Extension Council—Liability Under Tort Claims Act.**

**Agriculture—County Extension Council—Extension Agent; Other Employees; Status Under Tort Claims and Workmen's Compensation Acts. William R. Kauffman, General Counsel for the Kansas Board of Regents, Topeka, June 22, 1984.**

For the purposes of the Kansas Tort Claims Act, K.S.A. 75-6101 *et seq.*, county extension councils are municipalities, with an existence separate from that of the county in which they are located and organized. Liability for the actions of an individual county agent is shared between the state and the extension council of the county. Council members themselves, as well as persons employed by the council (such as secretaries and janitors) and volunteers are considered to be employees of the council, which has sole liability for their acts.

For the purposes of the Kansas Workmen's Compensation Act, K.S.A. 44-501 *et seq.*, county extension agents are employed dually by the county extension council and the director of extension at Kansas State University. Council members, secretaries and janitors are employees of the council, as are volunteers in the event the council files an election to extend coverage to them. ## OPINION NO. 84-57

**Crimes and Punishments—Kansas Criminal Code—Classification of Crimes and Penalties; Effect of Legislation Providing for Reduction of Sentences. Charles E. Simmons, Chief Legal Counsel for the Kansas Department of Corrections, Topeka, June 22, 1984.**

1984 Senate Bill No. 858 reduces the sentences which may lawfully be imposed upon persons convicted of Class D or E felonies which are not included in articles 34, 35 or 36 of chapter 21 of the Kansas Statutes Annotated. An attempt to commit a felony contained in these three articles is defined as a distinct criminal act by article 33 of the same chapter. Thus, the exclusion of these three articles from the provisions of the bill does not extend to attempts to commit such crimes.

Under the terms of this bill, the sentencing court must review the sentence of a person convicted of a non-excluded D or E felony and, at the discretion of the court, reduce the minimum term of imprisonment to the new limits in K.S.A. 1983 Supp. 21-4501, as amended. Such a review and possible reduction is also required for persons who were sentenced for the included felonies within the time frame established by the bill, but who were placed on probation and who remain subject to possible imprisonment should the conditions of their probation be violated. ## OPINION NO. 84-58

**Corporations—Trust Companies—Change of Location; Capitalization Requirements. Eugene C. Hegerly, Bank Commissioner for the State of Kansas, Topeka, June 26, 1984.**

Pursuant to K.S.A. 17-2025, the provisions of K.S.A. 17-2021 *et seq.*, do not apply to trust companies which were organized and doing business in Kansas prior to the effective date of the act (June 29, 1957). However, a trust company which transfers its place of business from one city to another must comply with the requirements of K.S.A. 17-2021, which establish capitalization limits based on the size of the city. This section by its specific wording applies to *any* trust company which makes a change of location, and so is an exception to the general rule established by K.S.A. 17-2025. ## KANSAS FACTS

### VOTER QUALIFICATIONS AND REGISTRATION

A Kansas voter must be:

- \* A United States citizen;
- \* At least 18 years of age;
- \* A resident of Kansas and the voting area; and
- \* Registered to vote.

#### Voter registration:

1. Registration is required for all voters in Kansas.
2. Qualified persons may register at the office of their county election officer or at other places designated by that officer.
3. Citizens may register by mail by contacting their county election officer by letter or telephone to request an application.
4. Registration closes 20 days prior to any election, and re-opens the day after the election.
5. A voter *must re-register* if:
  - a. Voter changes place of residence. (This includes moving from one unit to another in the same apartment building.)
  - b. Voter changes name.
6. A voter should contact the county election officer to determine if it is necessary to re-register whenever a voter fails to vote in any November general election.

#### Party affiliation:

1. Voters may declare their party affiliations at the time of registration or may sign a declaration at the voting place the first time they vote in a primary election; or a voter may choose not to be affiliated with any political party.

2. A voter may file a declaration changing party affiliation with the county election officer at any time voter registration is open.

District Attorneys (in 3rd, 7th, 10th, 18th and 29th Judicial Districts)—4 year terms.

#### Local Officers

County officers: clerk; treasurer; register of deeds; attorney; sheriff; surveyor (in certain counties); commissioners (in most of the 105 counties, commissioners for districts 2 and 3 are to be elected in 1984)—4 year terms.  
Township officers: trustee; clerk; treasurer—4 year terms.

### SPECIAL PRESIDENTIAL BALLOT FOR NEW RESIDENTS

A person who moves to Kansas a short time before a Presidential election and does not register to vote in this state before registration closes may vote a special ballot for President and Vice President *only*. To be eligible, such voter *must*:

- 1) Be a citizen of the United States and a qualified elector of the state of previous residency;
- 2) Be a resident of Kansas for 30 days before the election; and
- 3) Make application to their county election officer not earlier than 25 days before the election, and not later than noon on the day before the election.

(continued)

## AT THE POLLS

### Voting Hours:

The polls are open from 7:00 a.m. until 7:00 p.m. unless different hours are set and publicly announced by the county election officer. The polls must be open at least 12 continuous hours, not close before 7:00 p.m., and close no later than 8:00 p.m.

### Paper Ballots:

When paper ballots are used, the voter will be given the official ballots and should then proceed to the voting booth to mark them. The voter must not place any marks on a ballot which would in any way identify it.

If a ballot is torn, soiled, defaced or erroneously marked, it may be refolded and returned to the election officer. A second set of ballots will be provided, but no more than three sets of ballots may be obtained.

A voter may be limited to five minutes in the voting booth if other voters are waiting to use it.

### Voting Machines:

If voting machines are used, a small model of the machine must be available at each polling place to demonstrate to voters how to use the machines.

Each voter is limited to three minutes in the voting machine booth.

### Write-in Voting:

Write-in votes are allowed only if a blank line is provided under the specific office. A name must be written clearly and a proper cross or check mark placed in the box at the right. Voting machines also provide spaces for write-in votes, where allowed.

### Assistance in Voting:

A voter may request assistance if unable to vote unassisted by reason of:

1. Physical disability;
2. Visual handicap;
3. Lack of proficiency in reading the English language; or
4. Sixty-five or more years of age.

### Challenges:

A person offering to vote may be challenged as unqualified on any of the following grounds:

1. Not a citizen of the United States.
2. Not 18 years of age.
3. Not a resident of the precinct.
4. Not registered to vote.
5. If a former resident, such person has moved before 30 days prior to the election.
6. At primary election: not a member of the political party announced by the voter.

A challenged voter must be allowed to vote a "Challenged" ballot, which must be sealed and held by poll officials pending a determination, as provided by law, of the voter's qualifications to vote.

### Persons who move within 30 days of an election:

If a registered voter changes his or her name, or moves within the precinct, during the 30 days immediately preceding an election, the voter may sign an affidavit at the polling place and vote in that election. A voter who moves to another precinct in Kansas during the 30 days just prior to an election may vote in

his or her former precinct in person or by absentee ballot. In either case, re-registration is required before the next election.

### Poll Agents:

Authorized poll agents are permitted to be present as observers at original, intermediate and final canvasses of elections and at polling places.

## SPECIAL PROVISIONS FOR VOTING

### Absentee Voting:

Registered voters who will be absent from their home counties on election day, or any voter who is prevented by religious belief or practice from going to the polls on election day, may apply for an absentee ballot by one of two procedures:

#### 1. The voter may:

- (a) File an affidavit with the county election officer for an absentee ballot; or
- (b) Have an elector living in the same county file an affidavit in his or her behalf.

An absentee ballot will be mailed to the address designated; the ballot must be voted in secrecy and returned to the county election officer of the home county by the time the polls close on election day.

2. An absent voter may go to the office of his or her home county election officer from the Tuesday noon preceding the election until Monday noon preceding the election, make application and vote in the office.

### Sick, Physically Disabled or Illiterate Voters:

Special voting procedures are available for any voter having a permanent or temporary illness or disability which would make it difficult or impossible for that voter to vote at a polling place.

1. All registration and voting procedures may be handled by mail.

2. A sick, disabled or illiterate voter may make application for a ballot prior to the election, but no later than noon on election day; or such voter may have application made on his or her behalf by another.

3. Sick, physically disabled or illiterate voters who are unable to mark or transmit an absentee ballot may receive assistance from another person. The person rendering assistance must sign an affidavit and return both the affidavit and the absentee ballot to the county election officer by the time the polls close election day.

4. Registered voters having permanent physical disabilities or illnesses are permitted to automatically receive absentee ballots before every election. Applications for this special permanent absentee ballot status are available from local county election officers.

5. If an elderly or disabled voter is able to go to the voting place but finds it inaccessible by reason of stairs or steps, such voter may request that his or her ballot be brought to the entrance of the polling place.

### Federal Service absentee voting:

Persons qualified to vote under Federal Service voting provisions are:

- a. Members of the armed forces and their spouses and dependents.
- b. Members of the Merchant Marine and their spouses and dependents.

(continued)

c. Citizens of the United States temporarily residing outside the territorial limits of the United States and their spouses and dependents residing with or accompanying them.

Such persons are not required to be registered to vote. However, such persons must be eligible to register in Kansas.

Postcard applications (Standard Form 76) must be mailed to the home county election officer or home state secretary of state. (If postcard application is not available at military installation, the voter should contact the Secretary of State for an application.)

Ballots will be mailed by the county election officer, and the marked ballots must be returned to that office by the time the polls close on election day.

All Federal Service ballot material is transmitted air mail free of charge (except items mailed by other than U.S. Mail).

Federal Service absentee ballots shall be issued to qualified applicants for the following elections:

- 1. Any primary or general election held in his or her district or precinct.
- 2. All candidates (other than precinct committee-

men and committeewomen) for whom the voter would otherwise be qualified to vote.

3. Proposed amendments to the Kansas Constitution.

4. Any other statewide proposition or question.

NOTE: Those persons entitled to vote the Federal Service absentee ballot and who have been discharged or have terminated employment too late to register in their home precinct will be allowed to sign an affidavit in the office of the county election officer which will permit them to vote at the next ensuing election. A voter's home county election officer should be consulted for details.

**VOTER INFORMATION**

For further information in regard to election procedures, contact your county election officer or the Secretary of State. In 101 Kansas counties, the election officer is the County Clerk; in Johnson, Sedgwick, Shawnee and Wyandotte counties it is the Election Commissioner. Each may be contacted at the county seat.

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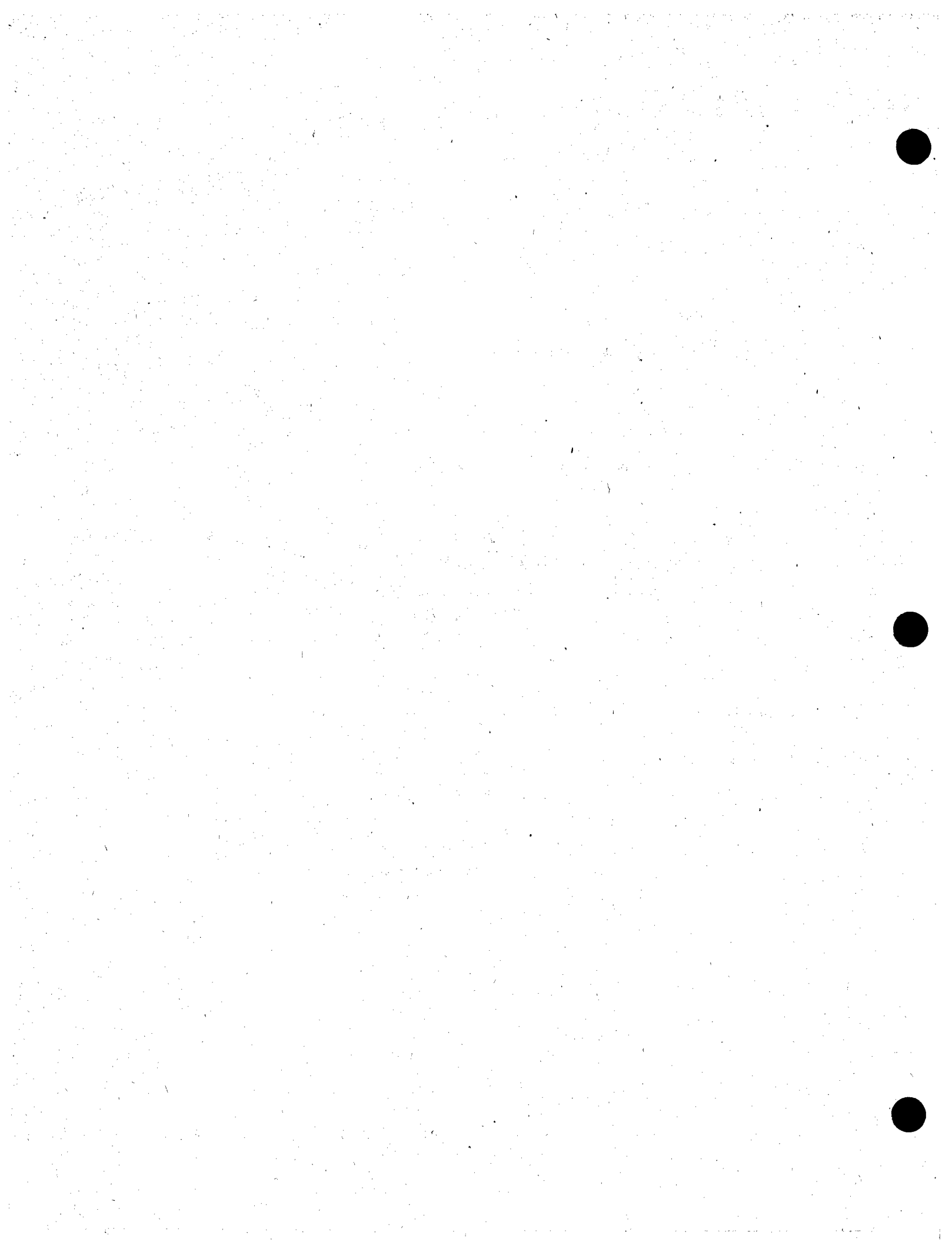
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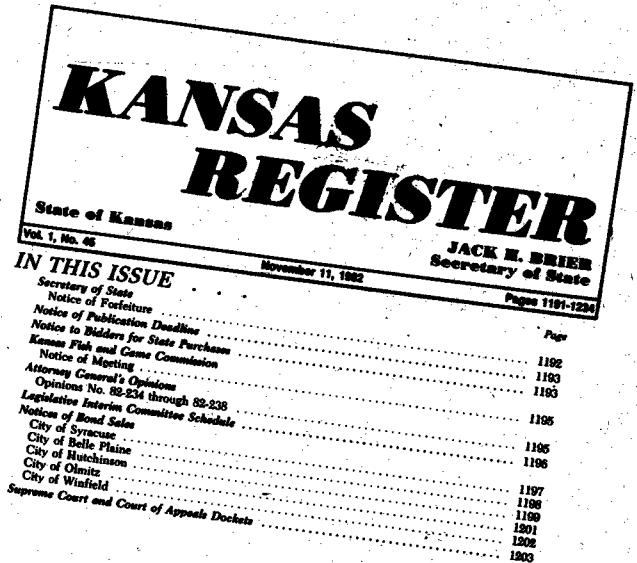
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
