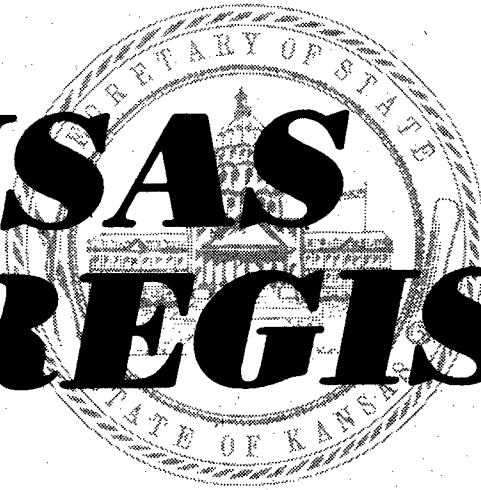

OPINION NO. 84-59

Waters and Watercourses—Groundwater Management Districts—Director Serving as State Legislator; No Incompatibility. Van Smith, Attorney for the Southwest Kansas Groundwater Management District (No. 3), Garden City, June 28, 1984.

A director of a groundwater management district organized pursuant to K.S.A. 82a-1020 *et seq.*, may simultaneously hold a position as a state legislator without violating either Kansas statutes or the common law doctrine of incompatibility of offices. OPINION NO. 84-60

Cities and Municipalities—General Provisions—Adoption or Abandonment of Forms of City Government. John R. Eland, Hoxie City Attorney, Hoxie, June 29, 1984.

No state statute prescribes a procedure whereby a city of the third class may change from the commission form of government to the mayor-council form of government. However, the governing body of such a city may, by ordinance adopted pursuant to home rule powers, prescribe that the city shall revert to the mayor-council form of government on the date of the next city election, and provide for the election of a mayor and five council members at that election. OPINION NO. 84-61

Cities and Municipalities—Planning and Zoning—Planned Unit Development in Cities and Counties. John Dekker, Director of Law, City of Wichita, Wichita, June 29, 1984.

In the absence of a charter ordinance providing otherwise, a city which had not adopted a planned unit development ordinance prior to the enactment of K.S.A. 12-725 *et seq.* may exercise the powers enumerated in the aforesaid statutes only upon complying with the requirements and controls prescribed therein. However, the Wichita Community Unit Plan Ordinance, which was adopted prior to the enactment of K.S.A. 12-725 *et seq.*, is a valid exercise of the city's general zoning powers prescribed by K.S.A. 12-707 *et seq.*, and does not conflict with the provisions of K.S.A. 12-725 *et seq.* Cited herein: K.S.A. 12-707, 12-708, 12-725. State Boards, Commissions and Authorities—Law Enforcement Training Center—Definition of Full-time and Part-time Officers. Ann Victoria Thomas, General Counsel for the University of Kansas, Lawrence, June 29, 1984.

Parking service officers at the University of Kansas who engage in traffic control as part of their duties are contained within the definition of police officer or law enforcement officer found at K.S.A. 1983 Supp. 74-5602(e), and so are covered by the training provisions of the Law Enforcement Training Center Act, K.S.A. 1983 Supp. 74-5601 *et seq.* If such officers are employed by the University for 1,000 or more hours per year, they are full-time employees for the purposes of the act, despite performing traffic control as only a small part of their duties, and therefore must comply with the instructional requirements of the act for full-time employees. OPINION NO. 84-63

Intoxicating Liquors and Beverages—Cereal Malt Beverages—Issuance of Retailer's Licenses—Effect of Township Board Recommendations. Wendell J. Barker, Franklin County Attorney, Ottawa, June 29, 1984.

K.S.A. 41-2702(b) authorizes township boards to receive notice of all applications for licenses to sell cereal malt beverages at retail within their respective townships and to submit *advisory* recommendations to the board of county commissioners. K.S.A. 41-2702(f) further provides that a board of county commissioners, when presented with an application for a license to sell cereal malt beverages at retail in original and unopened containers for off-premise consumption, *must* issue the license if the applicant meets the qualifications enumerated in the applicable statutes. Under the provisions of K.S.A. 41-2703(a), however, the board of county commissioners retains the discretion to grant or deny a cereal malt beverage license for any other form of retail sale. Cited herein: K.S.A. 41-2702, 41-2703. RH

Counties and County Officers—Clerk of District Court—Board of Trustees of County Law Library. Keith R. Henry, Esq., Chairman of the Board of Trustees of the Geary County Law Library, Junction City, June 29, 1984.

District magistrate judges are not members of the board of trustees of a county law library established pursuant to K.S.A. 19-1315. The only judges who are members of such board are district judges. Cited herein: K.S.A. 19-1314, 19-1315, 19-1320, 20-301a. MFC
