Cities and Municipalities—Miscellaneous Provisions—City and County Service for Programs for the Elderly; Tax Levy, Use of Proceeds. Dale J. Paulsen, Attorney for Board of Stafford District Hospital No. 4, St. John, November 5, 1984.

A city or county may levy a tax to support a service program for the elderly under the provisions of K.S.A. 12-1680. That statute does not, however, authorize a hospital district to levy such a tax. Cited herein: K.S.A. 10-101, 12-1680. TRH


