Opinion No. 85-53

Counties and County Officers—County Buildings—Civic Centers in Certain Counties. Representative Marvin Smith, 50th District, Topeka, May 17, 1985.

K.S.A. 1984 Supp. 19-15,140 authorizes the Shawnee County Commissioners to issue general obligation bonds of the county to carry out the authority granted in K.S.A. 1984 Supp. 19-15,139. The latter statute permits the county commissioners to acquire, by purchase or otherwise, civic and other multi-use public facilities. The board is authorized to do all things "incidental or necessary" to the establishment of such facilities. Such language, along with similar language in the ballot proposition by which the voters approved the issuance of the bonds, is sufficiently broad to cover expenditures for the purchase of property which is "incidental and necessary" to the establishment of the civic or multi-use public facility. Cited herein: K.S.A. 19-15,114; K.S.A. 1984 Supp. 19-15,139; 19-15,140. MFC

Fences—Legal Enclosures—Legal and Sufficient Fences. Gerald Woolwine, Clark County Attorney, Ashland, May 17, 1985.

Place of Payment and Bond Registration

The principal of and interest on the Bonds will be payable in lawful money of the United States of America by check or draft of the Treasurer of the State of Kansas, Topeka, Kansas (the "Paying Agent" and "Bond Registrar"), to the registered owners thereof

whose names are on the registration books of the Bond Registrar as of the 15th day of the month preceding each interest payment date. The Bonds will be registered pursuant to a plan of registration approved by the City and the Attorney General of the State of Kansas. The Bonds may be registered as fully registered certificated bonds or uncertificated (book entry) bonds at the option of each registered owner.

The City will pay for the fees of the Bond Registrar for registration and transfer of the Bonds and will also pay for printing a reasonable supply of registered bond blanks. Any additional costs or fees that might be incurred in the secondary market, other than fees of the Bond Registrar, will be the responsibility of the bondholders.

The type and denominations of the Bonds and the names, addresses and social security or taxpayer identification numbers of the registered owners shall be submitted in writing by the successful bidder to the City and Bond Registrar at least two weeks prior to the closing date.

Conditions of Bids

Proposals will be received on the Bonds bearing such rate or rates of interest as may be specified by the bidders, subject to the following conditions: The same rate shall apply to all Bonds of the same maturity. Each interest rate specified shall be a multiple of 1/8 or 1/20 of 1%. No interest rate shall exceed a rate equal to the 20 bond index of tax exempt municipal bonds published by *Credit Markets*, (formerly *The Weekly Bond Buyer*) in New York, New York, on the Monday next preceding the day on which the Bonds are sold, plus 2%. The difference between the highest rate specified and the lowest rate specified shall not exceed 2 1/2%. No rate specified shall be lower than any rate specified for an earlier maturity of the Bonds. If the City shall elect to call any Bonds for redemption and payment prior to the maturity thereof, the City shall give written notice of its intention to call and pay the Bonds on a specified date, the same being described by number and maturity, said notice to be mailed by United States registered or certified mail addressed to the registered owners of the Bonds, to the State Treasurer of Kansas, and to the manager or managers of the underwriting account making the successful bid, each of said notices to be mailed not less than 30 days prior to the date fixed for redemption. If any bond be called for redemption and payment as aforesaid, all interest on such bond shall cease from and after the date for which such call is made, provided funds are available for its payment at the price hereinbefore specified.

Conditions of Bids

Proposals will be received on the Bonds bearing such rate or rates of interest as may be specified by the bidders, subject to the following conditions: The same rate shall apply to all Bonds of the same maturity. Each interest rate specified shall be a multiple of 1/8 or 1/20 of 1%. No interest rate shall exceed a rate equal to the 20 bond index of tax exempt municipal bonds published by *Credit Markets*, in New York, New York, on the Monday next preceding the day on which the Bonds are sold, plus 2%. No rate specified shall be lower than any rate specified for an earlier maturity of the Bonds. No bid of less than the par value of the Bonds and accrued interest thereon to the date of delivery will be considered and no supplemental interest payments will be authorized. Each bid shall specify the total interest cost to the City during the life of the Bonds on the basis of such bid, the premium, if any, offered by the bidder, and the net interest cost to the City on the basis of such bid.

Basis of Award

The award of the Bonds will be made on the basis of the lowest net interest cost to the City, which will be determined by subtracting the amount of the premium bid, if any, from the total interest cost to the City. If there is any discrepancy between the net interest cost and the average annual net interest rate specified, the specified net interest cost shall govern and the interest rates specified in the bid shall be adjusted accordingly. If two or more proper bids providing for identical amounts for the lowest net interest cost are received, the governing body shall determine which bid, if any, shall be accepted, and its determination shall be final. The City reserves the right to reject all bids and to waive any irregularities in a submitted bid.

Authority, Purpose and Security

The Bonds are being issued pursuant to K.S.A. 12-6a01 to 12-6a17, inclusive, and K.S.A. 12-1736 to 12-1739, inclusive, all as amended, for the purpose of paying the cost of constructing certain waterworks, sewer, storm drainage and street improvements, a fire station and a health department facility in the City. The Bonds and the interest thereon will constitute general obligations of the City, payable in part from special assessments levied upon the property benefited by the construction of said improvements and, if not so paid, from ad valorem taxes which may be levied without limitation as to rate or amount upon all the taxable tangible property, real and personal, within the territorial limits of the City, with the balance payable from ad valorem taxes which may be levied without limitation as to rate or amount upon all the taxable tangible property, real and personal, within the territorial limits of the City.

Legal Opinion

The Bonds will be sold subject to the legal opinion of GAAR & BELL, Overland Park, Kansas, Bond Counsel, whose approving legal opinion as to the validity of the Bonds will be furnished and paid for by the City, printed on the Bonds and delivered to the successful bidder as and when the Bonds are delivered. Said opinion will also state that in the opinion of

Bond Counsel, under existing laws and regulations, the interest on the Bonds is exempt from federal income taxation.

Delivery and Payment

The City will pay for printing the Bonds and will deliver the same properly prepared, executed and registered without cost to the successful bidder on or before July 19, 1985, at such bank or trust company in the contiguous United States of America as may be specified by the successful bidder. The successful bidder will also be furnished with a certified transcript of the proceedings evidencing the authorization and issuance of the Bonds and the usual closing proofs which will include a certificate that there is no litigation pending or threatened at the time of delivery of the Bonds affecting their validity. Payment for the Bonds shall be made in federal reserve funds, immediately subject to use by the City.

Good Faith Deposit

Each bid shall be accompanied by a cashier's or certified check drawn on a bank located in the United States of America in the amount of \$64,960 payable to the order of the City to secure the City from any loss resulting from the failure of the successful bidder to comply with the terms of its bid. No interest will be paid upon the successful bidder's good faith check. Said check shall be returned to the bidder if its bid is not accepted. If a bid is accepted, said check will be held by the City until the bidder shall have complied with all of the terms and conditions of this notice, at which time the check will be returned to the successful bidder or paid to its order at the option of the City. If a bid is accepted but the City shall fail to deliver the Bonds to the bidder in accordance with the terms and conditions of this notice, said check will be returned to the bidder. If a bid is accepted but the bidder defaults in the performance of any of the terms and conditions of this notice, the proceeds of such check will be retained by the City as and for liquidated damages.

CUSIP Numbers

It is anticipated that CUSIP identification numbers will be printed on certificated bonds or assigned to uncertificated bonds, but neither the failure to print such number on or assign such number to any bond nor any error with respect thereto shall constitute cause for failure or refusal by the purchaser thereof to accept delivery of and pay for the Bonds in accordance with the terms of the purchase contract. All expenses in relation to the assignment and printing of CUSIP numbers on the Bonds will be paid by the City.

Bond Ratings

The City has applied to Standard & Poor's Corporation and Moody's Investors Service, Inc. for ratings on the Bonds. It is expected that ratings will be available to prospective bidders on or before the date of the sale.

Standard Forms

All bids must be made on the forms which may be procured from the City Clerk or the Financial Advisor. No additions or alterations in such forms shall be

made and any erasures may cause rejection of any bid. The City reserves the right to waive irregularities and to reject any or all bids.

Submission of Bids

Bids must be submitted in sealed envelopes addressed to the undersigned City Clerk, and marked "Proposal for the Purchase of General Obligation Bonds." Bids may be submitted by mail or delivered in person to the undersigned at City Hall and must be received by the undersigned prior to 4:00 o'clock p.m., Central Daylight Time, on Tuesday, June 4, 1985.

Official Statement

The City has prepared a Preliminary Official Statement dated June 4, 1985, copies of which may be obtained from the City Clerk or from the Financial Advisor. Upon the sale of the Bonds, the City will adopt the final Official Statement and will furnish the successful bidder with a reasonable number of copies thereof without additional cost upon request. Additional copies may be ordered by the successful bidder at its expense.

Assessed Valuation and Indebtedness

The total assessed valuation of the taxable tangible property within the City for the year 1984 was \$91,255,335. The total general obligation bonded indebtedness of the City as of the date of the Bonds, including the Bonds being sold, is \$15,134,000. The City also has temporary notes in the principal amount of \$13,122,000 outstanding as of the date of the Bonds of which \$2,865,000 will be retired out of proceeds of the Bonds and other available funds.
