ATTORNEY GENERAL

Opinion No. 85-104

Intoxicating Liquors and Beverages—Cereal Malt Beverages—Standards of Conduct; Prohibition on Consumption by Persons Under Age. Rod Ludwig, Mitchell County Attorney, Beloit, August 22, 1985.

A holder of a cereal malt beverage license may partition his building in such a way that the area in which cereal malt beverages are sold is permanently divided from another area in which dances are held. Depending upon the description of the premises in the license application, the county commission may issue a cereal malt beverage license for either the entire building or only the partitioned area in which sales occur. In either event, the licensee is responsible for seeing that persons under the legal age do not consume, purchase or possess cereal malt beverages in or about the place of business, which includes the area partitioned off for dancing. Laws, Journals and Public Information—Records Open to Public—Access of Individual to Records Bearing His or Her Name. Clint Acheson, Representative, Fifty-Second District, Topeka, August 26, 1985.

A person has no absolute right to inspect every record bearing his or her name or social security number which is maintained by a public agency, nor

does a parent, solely by virtue of his or her parentage, have an absolute right to inspect records and reports maintained by the Department of Social and Rehabilitation Services concerning abuse or neglect of his or her child. Counties and County Officers—Hospitals and Related Facilities—County Hospitals; Powers of Hospital Board. Selby S. Soward, Attorney for the Northwest Kansas Regional Medical Center, Goodland, August 27, 1985.

K.S.A. 1984 Supp. 19-4601 *et seq.* establishes procedures whereby a county commission may create a board of trustees to oversee the management and control of the county hospital. While the board is subject to resolutions of the county commission [K.S.A. 1984 Supp. 19-4610(a)], such control is no greater than that possessed by the commission over any other county office, and extends to matters of county-wide concern such as civil service. Decisions concerning specific matters in the hospital, as well as procedural questions such as by-laws, are vested in the board of trustees by statute, and cannot be preempted by the county commission. K.A.R. 28-16-89, 28-16-94, 28-16-95, and 28-16-97 are existing regulations establishing procedures, administrative functions and regulatory requirements for the Kansas Pretreatment Program. The regulations are authorized by and will be implementing K.S.A. 65-171d, effective May 1, 1986. The amendments update references to 40 CFR Part 136 which was published October 26, 1984 and subsequently amended January 4, 1985 (see 49 FR 43234 and 50 FR 690), and references to the "director." Pursuant to a recommendation made by the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules and Regulations all references made to the "director" have been changed to "secretary," meaning the Secretary of the Kansas Department of Health and Environment.

DISADVANTAGED AND FEMALE-OWNED
BUSINESSES UTILIZATION PROGRAM
POLICY STATEMENT

It shall be the policy of the Kansas Department of Transportation that disadvantaged businesses (DB) and female-owned business enterprises (WBE), as defined in 49 CFR Part 23, shall have the maximum opportunity to participate in the performance of K.D.O.T. contracts that are financed in whole or in part with federal funds. In this regard, K.D.O.T. is committed to provide all necessary and reasonable steps in accordance with 49 CFR Part 23 to ensure that such businesses will be utilized to the maximum extent feasible.

To administer this program, a K.D.O.T. DB/MBE liaison officer shall be designated who will be responsible for developing, managing and implementing the DB/WBE Program on a day-to-day basis. The objectives of the DB/WBE Program will be to meet, if not exceed, established goals for the utilization of DB/WBE in the K.D.O.T. Program. Separate goals shall be set for DB/WBE. Such goals shall be contract goals and overall goals.

Contract goals shall be established on a monthly basis for specific contracts having practical and feasible DB/WBE subcontracting possibilities.

Overall goals shall be established on an annual basis and will be determined upon consideration of the following factors:

- A. Projection of the number and types of contracts to be awarded and a projection of the number and type of DB/WBE likely to be available to compete for contracts over the period during which the goals will be in effect.
- B. Past results of K.D.O.T.'s efforts to contract with DB/WBE and the reasons for the high or low level of those results.
