**NOTICE OF HEARING
ON PROPOSED
ADMINISTRATIVE REGULATIONS**

The Kansas State Grain Inspection Department will conduct a public hearing regarding adoption of amended K.A.R. 25-4-1, adopted as a temporary regulation effective July 26, 1987, and K.A.R. 25-4-4, adopted as a temporary regulation effective July 1, 1987. The hearing will begin at 9 a.m. Tuesday, November 17, in the conference room of the Kansas State Grain Inspection Department, 700 Jackson, Suite 800, Topeka, regarding adoption of K.A.R. 25-4-1 and K.A.R. 25-4-4, permanent regulations to become effective May 1, 1988.

K.A.R. 25-4-1 is being proposed as a permanent regulation to raise inspection fees for service provided to the grain industry and the farmer producers that utilize the department's services in order to continue the department's service for the welfare of the general public.

K.A.R. 25-4-4 proposes a permanent increase in licensing fees and functional units due to legislation passed under Senate Bill 303.

These two regulations do not have a significant economic impact on the general public, but are necessary to balance the budget for the agency in order to continue as the regulator serving the industry and the general public.

All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the director of the Kansas State Grain Inspection Department, P.O. Box 1918, Topeka 66601. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to orally present their views on the proposed regulations during the hearing.

**NOTICE OF HEARING
ON PROPOSED
ADMINISTRATIVE REGULATIONS**

A public hearing will be conducted at 1 p.m. Tuesday, November 24, in the hearing room of the Board of Tax Appeals, tenth floor, Docking State Office Building, Topeka, to consider the adoption of proposed permanent rules and regulations of the State Board of Tax Appeals.

All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the chairperson of the State Board of Tax Appeals, 10th Floor, Docking State Office Building, Topeka 66612. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity at the hearing to orally present their views in regard to the adoption of the proposed regulations. Depending upon the number of persons present, each participant may be required to observe a time limitation on oral presentation.

Following the hearing, all written and oral comments submitted by interested parties will be considered by the board as the basis for making any changes to the proposed regulations.

Copies of the regulations and the fiscal impact statement may be obtained by writing the Board of Tax Appeals. A summary of the proposed rules and regulations follows:

K.A.R. 94-2-3 is clarified to require counsel duly licensed and admitted to practice before the Supreme Court of another state so long as associated with local counsel and local counsel signs the pleadings.

K.A.R. 94-2-6 has been amended so that any questions of law may be reserved by the board and may be ruled on at the pre-trial conference. Also, changes were made that a ruling on requests for assistance may be made at the time of the pre-trial conference or taken under advisement, if the board deems it necessary.

K.A.R. 94-2-9 incorporates changes regarding subpoenas. If the witness resides in another county they shall receive notice within five working days prior to the hearing date. If the subpoena is filed later than the prescribed time, it shall not be accepted, unless by agreement of the parties and approval of the board.

K.A.R. 94-2-11 states that when filing a motion for rehearing, three days are added from when the board's order is served upon a party by mail. If the motion is not granted within 30 days the motion is presumed denied.

There is no fiscal impact with regard to the changes in K.A.R. 94-2-1 to 94-2-12, 94-3-1 and 94-3-2.

K.A.R. 94-2-4, 94-2-5, 94-2-7, 94-2-8, 94-2-10, 94-2-12, 94-3-1 and 94-3-2 were modified slightly to improve sentence structure and punctuation. The meaning remains the same.

COMMISSION ON WILDLIFE AND PARKS

NOTICE OF HEARING ON PROPOSED ADMINISTRATIVE REGULATIONS

A public hearing will be held at 7 p.m. Tuesday, November 17, in the B and C Rooms of the Howard Johnson Motor Lodge, 3839 S.W. Topeka Blvd., Topeka, to consider the adoption of permanent and exempt regulations of the Kansas Department of Wildlife and Parks.

All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the chairman of the Kansas Department of Wildlife and Parks, Route 2, Box 54A, Pratt 67124. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity at the hearing to orally express their views in regard to the adoption of the regulations. Following the hearing, all written and oral comments submitted by interested parties will be considered by the commission as a basis for adoption, amendment or rejection of the proposed regulations.

The following is a brief summary of the proposed regulations:

K.A.R. 23-1-10. Turkey season restrictions. This amended permanent regulation adds recurve bows to the list of legal archery equipment; specifies that only size 2 through size 9 shot shall be used for shotgun hunting; clarifies that decoys, other than live decoys, and lures are legal to use during turkey hunting; and clarifies that persons not having a permit the prior year have priority over those who did have a permit the prior year in the drawing for turkey permits.

K.A.R. 23-1-12. Turkey; spring open season; bag limit and permits. This exempt regulation will provide for the 1988 spring turkey season.

K.A.R. 23-2-7. Deer; firearms management units. This amended permanent regulation adjusts the

boundaries for Units 1 and 2, making use of I-70 instead of several other highways.

K.A.R. 23-2-14. Antelope and deer; season restrictions. This amended permanent regulation adds recurve bows to the list of legal archery equipment and clarifies that decoys, other than live decoys, non-electronic calls and lures are legal.

K.A.R. 23-2-15. Elk; season restrictions. This amended permanent regulation adds recurve bows to the list of legal archery equipment and clarifies that decoys, other than live decoys, non-electronic calls and lures are legal.

K.A.R. 23-2-16. Coyote; season. This exempt regulation will provide for a coyote season (hunting, trapping, pursuing) during the special January, 1988 deer hunts that will occur in two areas of the state. Without this regulation, no hunting, trapping or pursuing of coyotes could occur during the January 9-day special deer season in the two areas.

K.A.R. 23-8-2. Certain acts prohibited in wildlife areas. This amended permanent regulation restricts target practice (on areas where authorized) to between sunrise and sunset; restricts horseback riding and vehicles to maintained or established roads, trails and parking areas unless special department approval has been granted or is posted otherwise; and prohibits the stocking or releasing of any wildlife unless approved in writing by the department.

K.A.R. 23-18-1. Amount of fees. This amended permanent regulation adds a 48-hour waterfowl permit and establishes a \$20 fee for that permit starting January 1, 1989. The 1987 Legislature created the permit and set a \$20 fee for 1988. The permit allows a person to hunt waterfowl during a 48-hour period in lieu of purchasing a hunting license.

K.A.R. 23-18-3. Issuance of duplicate hunting, fishing, or furharvesting licenses; procedures. This new permanent regulation enables a person losing a license to make application for a duplicate without having to go to the vendor where the original license was purchased.

K.A.R. 23-18-4. Purchase of lifetime hunting or combination lifetime hunting and fishing licenses without certificate of competency and safety in the handling of firearms. This new permanent regulation authorizes the purchase for another of a lifetime hunting or combination lifetime hunting and fishing license prior to issuance of a certificate. State law still requires the certificate before a person born after July 1, 1957 can hunt in Kansas on lands other than their own.

K.A.R. 23-21-1 through 23-21-14. Falconry. These new permanent regulations would provide for the sport of falconry in the state of Kansas.

All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity at the hearing to orally present their views in regard to the adoption of the proposed regulations. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request each participant to limit their oral presentation to five minutes.

Following the hearing, all written and oral comments submitted by interested parties will be considered by the Secretary of Commerce as the basis for making changes to these proposed regulations.

Copies of the regulations and the fiscal impact statement may be obtained by writing to the Department of Commerce at the address above.

The following is a brief summary of the proposed regulations:

K.A.R. 110-1-1 and 110-1-2 are sections of Article 1 of the Kansas Administrative Regulations relating to certification of venture capital companies. Revisions to these regulations are necessitated by amendments to the Kansas Venture Capital Company Act, pursuant to L. 1987, Chapters 319 and 320.

K.A.R. 110-2-1 and 110-2-2 are proposed new regulations for certification of local seed capital pools authorized by L. 1987, Chapter 365.

Opinion No. 87-152

State Departments; Public Officers and Employees—Private Investigation or Security Operations Polygraphists—Board Meetings; Quorum and Voting. Mary Beth Mudrick, Executive Director, Kansas Board of Polygraphists, Topeka, October 16, 1987.

A quorum must be present before a public body can conduct business. Quorum for the five-member Kansas Board of Polygraphists (board) is a majority of the total membership, or three members. Kansas case law provides that persons disqualified from voting cannot be counted toward the number necessary for a quorum.

Three positions on the board have been filled by a public member who is not a polygraphist and two privately employed polygraphists. The two positions for law enforcement representatives are vacant due to the lack of qualified persons. The public member of the board is precluded by law from voting on "technical" matters. Therefore, it is our opinion that, while the board may lawfully meet and take action on non-technical matters with its current three members, the board cannot take action on technical matters due to lack of quorum. State Boards, Commissions and Authorities—State Corporation Commission—Corporation Commission; Qualifications and Oaths of Members, Secretary and Attorney. Frank A. Caro, Jr., General Counsel, Kansas Corporation Commission, Topeka, October 16, 1987.

The clear and unambiguous language of K.S.A. 74-605 prohibits a commissioner from serving as a duly elected member on the state committee of a political party. The statute does not, however, expressly prohibit a commissioner from serving as a delegate or alternate to a national party convention, and therefore it is our opinion that the statute permits such activity. AND ENVIRONMENT****NOTICE CONCERNING HAZARDOUS
WASTE FACILITY PERMIT**

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment, Forbes Field, Topeka, is providing public notice that an order granting review of the hazardous waste facility permit issued to Vulcan Materials Company, 6200 S. Ridge Road, Wichita, has been issued.

Pursuant to K.A.R. 28-31-9, incorporating by reference 40 CFR Parts 270 and 124, a draft hazardous waste facility permit for this facility was placed on public notice from July 24, 1986 to September 12, 1986. A public hearing to consider the draft permit was held on August 27, 1986.

On December 19, 1986, a permit was issued by KDHE to Vulcan Materials Company to treat, store and dispose of hazardous waste. This permit became effective on January 18, 1987.

K.A.R. 28-31-9, incorporating by reference 40 CFR Part 124.19, provides that any person who filed comments on the draft permit or participated in the public hearing may petition the Secretary of Health and Environment to review any condition of the permit decision. KDHE received three petitions for review of specific conditions in the permit. The specific conditions of the permit and KDHE policies for which the review is sought are summarized as follows:

1. Section IV.C. Limitations on wastes for hazardous waste incinerator.
2. Section IV.D. Operating conditions of hazardous waste incinerator.
3. Section V. Underground injection wells.
4. The use of a surrogate to prove hex waste DRE and operating standards during the trial burn.
5. The testing during the actual hex waste stream trial burn of the permitted 0.8 gpm because of the conclusion that the consent decree did prohibit utilizing the proposed increase in feed rate during the trial burn.

The secretary finds that pursuant to K.A.R. 28-31-9, incorporating by reference 40 CFR 124.19(a)(2), the above permit conditions and policies are based on an exercise of discretion on an important policy consideration which the secretary should review. Pursuant to K.A.R. 28-31-9, incorporating by reference 40 CFR 124.19(c), the secretary has granted the three petitions for review.

Copies of the three requests for review are available for public review at the Department of Health and Environment, Building 730, Forbes Field, Topeka, and the KDHE district office, 3244 E. KANSAS INSURANCE DEPARTMENT

**TEMPORARY ADMINISTRATIVE
REGULATIONS**

Article 1.—GENERAL

40-1-36. Life and health insurance applications; underwriting; acquired immunodeficiency syndrome (AIDS); defined. (a) As used in this regulation, these terms shall have the following meanings:

(1) "Acquired immunodeficiency syndrome (AIDS)" means one or more opportunistic diseases which are at least moderately indicative of underlying cellular immunodeficiency, along with the absence of all known underlying causes of cellular immunodeficiency and all other causes of reduced resistance reported to be associated with at least one of those opportunistic diseases.

(2) "AIDS related complex (ARC)" means a syndrome in which the individual displays many of the same symptoms of AIDS, including the presence of the HIV antibody.

(3) "Adverse underwriting decisions" mean the actions described in K.S.A. 40-2,111(a).

(4) "Applicant" means the individual proposed for coverage.

(b) All individual and group applications for insurance that require health information or questions shall comply with the following standards:

(1) Whenever an applicant is requested to take an HIV antibody test in connection with an application for insurance, the insurer shall:

(A) Obtain written informed consent from the applicant;

(B) reveal the use of the test to the applicant;

(C) provide the applicant printed material prior to testing containing factual information describing AIDS, its causes, symptoms, how it is and can be spread, the tests used to detect the AIDS virus antibody and what a person should do whose test results are positive; or, arrange for the applicant to receive relevant counseling from a qualified practitioner who has had extensive training and experience in addressing the fears, questions and concerns of persons tested for the HIV antibody;

(D) administer an initial test which meets the test protocol established by the food and drug administration of the federal department of health and human services;

(E) administer a second test, the immunoelectro-precipitate using disrupted whole virus antigen test (western blot), to substantiate an initial positive test result; and

(F) disclose the results of the testing in accordance with K.S.A. 40-2,112(b)(2) and (3).

(2) Insurers may ask diagnostic questions on applications for insurance.

(3) Application questions shall be formed in a manner designed to elicit specific medical information and not lifestyle, sexual orientation or other inferential information.

(continued)

(4) Questions which are vague, subjective, unfairly discriminatory, or so technical as to inhibit a clear understanding by the applicant are prohibited.

(c) All underwriting shall be based on individual review of specific health information furnished on the application, any reports provided as a result of medical examinations performed at the company's request, medical record information obtained from the applicant's health care providers or any combination of the foregoing. Adverse underwriting decisions shall not be based on less than conclusive responses to application questions.

(d) Adverse underwriting decisions shall be based on sound actuarial principles pursuant to K.S.A. 40-2,109. (Authorized by K.S.A. 40-103, 40-2404a; implementing K.S.A. 40-2,109, 40-2404(7) as amended by L. 1987, Ch. 171, Sec. 1; effective, T-88-35, Sept. 17, 1987.)

Article 3.—PERSONS HOLDING LICENSES; DUTIES

86-3-18. Trust account records. (a) Each supervising broker, and each branch broker who maintains a separate trust account for a branch office as provided by K.S.A. 58-3061 and amendments thereto, shall maintain in the broker's office a complete record of all monies received or escrowed on real estate transactions, including the following:

(1) Deposit slips showing the transaction number assigned pursuant to K.A.R. 86-3-22, the date of deposit, the amount, and where deposited;

(2) monthly trust account bank, savings and loan association or credit union statements, including canceled checks and deposit slips;

(3) all voided trust account checks;

(4) a check register which shows the chronological sequence in which funds are received and disbursed. For funds received, the check register shall include the date of deposit, the transaction number assigned pursuant to K.A.R. 86-3-22, and the amount. For disbursement, the check register shall include the date, the transaction number assigned pursuant to K.A.R. 86-3-22, the payee, and the amount. The names of the principals may be included. A balance shall be shown, and the balances shall be kept current;

(5) a ledger for each transaction. The ledger shall include the names of the principals, the property address, and the transaction number assigned pursuant to K.A.R. 86-3-22; the amount and date of deposit of all monies received; and the check number, the date, the payee, and the amount of each disbursement. A bal-

ance shall be shown for each ledger account, and balances shall be kept current; and

(6) a ledger for broker's funds, if such funds are deposited in the trust account pursuant to K.S.A. 58-3062(a)(3) and amendments thereto. The balance shall be kept current.

(b) The trust account shall be reconciled monthly against bank, savings and loan association, or credit union records unless there has been no activity during the month.

(c) Trust account liability, as established by ledger sheet balances, shall be compared to the reconciled trust account balance monthly unless there has been no activity during the month. This regulation shall take effect on and after January 1, 1988. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-4202(b), implementing K.S.A. 1986 Supp. 58-3061; effective May 1, 1975; amended, E-81-18, July 16, 1980; amended May 1, 1981; amended T-88-32, Jan. 1, 1988.)

86-3-22. Transaction identification. (a) Each supervising broker shall assign a transaction number to each real estate sales contract, option agreement, and lease agreement for which the broker acts as an employee of, or on behalf of, the owner, purchaser, lessor or lessee. If a separate trust account is maintained for a branch office as provided by K.S.A. 58-3061 and amendments thereto, the transaction number shall be assigned by the branch broker.

(b) Sales contracts and option agreements shall be numbered in consecutive order by contract date each calendar year with the first two digits designating the year (88-1, 88-2). Lease agreements shall be numbered in consecutive order by contract date each calendar year with the first two digits designating the year and preceded by the letter "L" (L88-1, L88-2).

(c) The transaction number shall be shown on the transaction file and shall be included on any of the following applicable records:

(1) The trust account check register to identify funds deposited or disbursed;

(2) each trust account deposit slip with the amount of the deposit related to each transaction designated;

(3) each check drawn on the trust account;

(4) each transaction ledger maintained in accordance with K.A.R. 86-3-18(5); and

(5) each receipt from an escrow agent required by K.A.R. 86-3-21.

(d) If the broker's records are computerized, the transaction number shall be shown on any applicable computer sensitive record.

(e) A different transaction numbering system requested by a broker may be approved by the commission. This regulation shall take effect on and after January 1, 1988. (Authorized by 74-4202(b); implementing K.S.A. 1986 Supp. 58-3061; effective, T-88-32, Jan. 1, 1988.)

REGULATIONS****Article 3.—INSTANT GAME RULES**

111-3-1. Definitions. The following definitions apply to all regulations in Article 3: (a) "Claimant" means a person who presents a ticket for payment of a prize.

(b) "Instant game" means a lottery game in which a ticket is purchased by a player and the player can immediately determine whether he or she has won a prize by removing the removable covering on the ticket and comparing the exposed play numbers or symbols with those specified as winners in the published game rules for that instant game.

(c) "Low-tier prize" means a lottery instant game prize not exceeding \$25.00.

(d) "Mid-tier prize" means a lottery instant game prize of more than \$25.00 but not exceeding \$100.00.

(e) "High-tier prize" means a lottery instant game prize in excess of \$100.00.

(f) "Play numbers or symbols" are the numbers, letters, symbols or pictures printed on an instant game ticket and which can only be seen by removing the removable covering on the ticket.

(g) "Special event" means a drawing or other method of awarding an additional prize or prizes within a group of lottery instant game winners as defined by the rules for a particular instant game.

(h) "Ticket bearer" means the person who has signed the ticket or has possession of the unsigned ticket.

(i) "Validation number" means the unique, multi-digit number or combination of numbers and letters appearing on each instant game ticket and used to verify the validity of the ticket. (Authorized by and implementing L. 1987, Chapter 292, Section 10; effective, T-88-39, Oct. 15, 1987.)

111-3-2. Manner of selection of winners. Winners of an instant game are determined by the matching or specified alignment of the play symbols on a valid instant game ticket in accordance with the rules for each instant game. (Authorized by and implementing L. 1987, Chapter 292, Section 10(b); effective, T-88-39, Oct. 15, 1987.)

111-3-3. Validation of winning tickets. (a) Each instant game ticket shall be validated prior to payment of a prize. To be valid, each ticket must meet all the following requirements:

(1) The ticket must have been issued by the Kansas lottery in an authorized manner;

(2) the ticket must not be altered, unreadable, reconstructed or tampered with in any manner;

(3) the ticket must not be counterfeit in whole or in part;

(4) the ticket must not be stolen;

(5) the ticket must be complete and not blank or partially blank, miscut, misregistered, defective, or printed or produced in error;

(6) the ticket must have the correct number of play numbers or symbols and each play number or symbol must be legible, right side up and present in its entirety;

(7) the validation number of an apparent winning ticket must appear on the official list of validation numbers of winning tickets and a ticket with that validation number must not have been previously paid;

(8) the ticket must be stamped with the name and identification number of the retailer or lottery office which sold or issued the ticket;

(9) the ticket must pass all additional confidential validation requirements established by agreement between the Kansas lottery and the instant ticket vendor;

(b) If the ticket cannot be validated, then the claim shall be denied and the claimant promptly notified of the reason for denial. (Authorized by and implementing L. 1987, Chapter 292, Section 10(c), effective, T-88-39, Oct. 15, 1987.)

111-3-4. Payment of prizes. Unless otherwise provided in the game rules for a particular instant game, the procedures for claiming instant prizes are as follows:

(a) Low-tier instant game prizes shall be claimed by one of the following methods:

(1) Present the ticket to the same retailer from whom the ticket was purchased. Upon validation of the ticket, the retailer shall immediately make payment for the prize to the claimant. If the retailer cannot validate the claim, the claimant shall fill out a claim form provided by the retailer and personally present or mail the completed form together with the ticket to Kansas Lottery headquarters. If the claim is validated, then payment shall be made to the claimant by mail.

(2) Bring the ticket to any office of the Kansas Lottery during the hours that such office is open to the public for business. Upon verification of the claim, payment for such claim shall be made to the winner in the following manner:

(A) The prize for a validated free ticket winner redeemed in this manner shall be \$1.00 which shall be paid out of the Kansas Lottery's imprest fund.

(B) The prize for a validated \$2.00 ticket winner redeemed in this manner shall be \$2.00 which shall be paid out of the Kansas Lottery's imprest fund.

(C) The prize for a validated \$10.00 ticket redeemed in this manner shall be \$10.00. All payments for \$10.00 winning tickets shall be made out of the lottery prize payment fund. Upon verification of the claim, the payment for the prize shall be mailed to the claimant.

(3) Mail the ticket with a completed claim form to any office of the Kansas Lottery. Claim forms can be obtained from any lottery instant game retailer or any office of the Kansas Lottery. Upon verification of the claim, the payment for such claim shall be made to the winner in the following manner:

(A) The prize for a validated free ticket winner

(continued)

redeemed in this manner shall be \$1.00 which shall be paid out of the Kansas Lottery imprest fund. Upon verification of the claim, the payment for the prize shall be mailed to the claimant.

(B) The prize for a validated \$2.00 ticket winner redeemed in this manner shall be \$2.00 which shall be paid out of the Kansas Lottery's imprest fund. Upon verification of the claim, the payment for the prize shall be mailed to the claimant.

(C) The prize for a validated \$10.00 ticket redeemed in this manner shall be \$10.00 which shall be paid out of the lottery prize payment fund. Upon verification of the claim, the payment for the prize shall be mailed to the claimant.

(D) Mid-tier instant game prizes shall be claimed by one of the following methods.

(1) Present the ticket to any authorized Kansas Lottery retailer. Upon validation of the ticket the retailer may immediately make payment of the prize to the claimant. If the retailer chooses not to make the payment, the claimant shall claim the prize in another manner prescribed in these rules.

(2) Bring the ticket to any office of the Kansas Lottery during the hours that such office is open to the public for business. Upon verification of the claim, the payment for the prize shall be mailed to the claimant.

(3) Mail the ticket with a completed claim form to the Kansas Lottery headquarters. Claim forms can be obtained from any lottery instant game retailer or any office of the Kansas Lottery. Upon verification of the claim, the payment for the prize shall be mailed to the claimant.

(c) High-tier instant game prizes shall be claimed by one of the following methods:

(1) Bring the ticket to any office of the Kansas Lottery during the hours that such office is open to the public for business. Upon verification of the claim, the payment shall be made to the claimant by the executive director by any means deemed appropriate.

(2) Mail the ticket with a completed claim form to any office of the Kansas Lottery. Claim forms may be obtained from any lottery instant game retailer or any office of the Kansas Lottery. Upon verification of the claim, the payment shall be made to the claimant by the executive director by any means deemed appropriate. (Authorized by and implementing L. 1987 Chapter 292, Section 10(c) & 20(c); effective T-88-39, Oct. 15, 1987.)

111-3-5. Deadline for claiming prizes. A ticket which is not submitted for payment of a prize or for participation in a special event within the time limit and in the manner set forth in the rules for each instant game is invalid and ineligible for any prize or participation in the special event. (Authorized by and implementing L. 1987, Chapter 292, Section 10; effective, T-88-39, Oct. 15, 1987.)

111-3-6. Disclosure of winners. The Kansas Lottery may use the name, city of residence and photograph of any lottery instant game prize winner in its promotional materials. (Authorized by and implementing L. 1987, Chapter 292, Section 10; effective, T-88-39, Oct. 15, 1987.)

111-3-7. Confidentiality of play numbers and symbols. No person shall attempt to ascertain the play numbers or symbols appearing under the removable covering on any unsold instant ticket or otherwise attempt to identify which unsold tickets are winning tickets. (Authorized by and implementing L. 1987, Chapter 292, Section 10; effective, T-88-39, Oct. 15, 1987.)

111-3-8. Special Drawings. The executive director may conduct special drawings to award prizes. The nature of a drawing and the prizes to be awarded shall be determined in accordance with the rules for each drawing as proposed by the executive director and approved by the Kansas lottery commission. (Authorized by and implementing L. 1987, Chapter 292, Section 10(a); effective, T-88-39, Oct. 15, 1987.)

111-3-9. Televised Game Show. The Kansas Lottery may conduct a televised game show to award prizes. The nature of the game show and the prizes to be awarded shall be determined in accordance with rules proposed by the executive director and approved by the Kansas lottery commission. (Authorized by and implementing L. 1987, Chapter 292, Section 10(a); effective, T-88-39, Oct. 15, 1987.)

Article 4.—INDIVIDUAL GAME RULES

111-4-1. Name of Drawing. The Kansas lottery shall conduct a series of special drawings entitled "Gala Drawings." The date of "Gala Drawings" will coincide with the first day of the first game of the Kansas lottery. The date of the "Gala Drawing" shall be selected by the executive director. (Authorized by and implementing L. 1987, Chapter 292, Section 10(a); effective T-88-38, Sept. 28, 1987.)

111-4-2. Definitions. (a) All definitions contained in the Kansas lottery act (Chapter 292, 1987 Session Laws) and lottery regulations are hereby incorporated by reference and govern unless otherwise indicated.

(b) "Gala event" means an evening event held on the first day of Kansas instant game lottery ticket sales.

(c) "Gala Drawing" means the act of drawing a door prize at gala events where one person per location is selected to win a one-thousand dollar (\$1,000) prize.

(d) "Sponsor drawings" means an act of drawing a door prize which may be held at the gala event subsequent to the "Gala Drawing."

(e) "Sponsor" means the person designated by the executive director to be in charge of organizing each gala event.

(f) "Non-winning ticket" means a Kansas instant game lottery ticket not eligible to win a prize under the "Up and Away" game rules.

(g) "Receptacle" means a container in which non-winning Kansas instant game lottery tickets are placed and from which the "Gala Drawing" is made. Receptacles shall be sealable and capable of being rotated for the purpose of mixing.

(h) "Bare arm technique" means a type of drawing where the person drawing the winning ticket from the receptacle wears a short-sleeved (sleeve not extending past the elbow) or a no-sleeve shirt which exposes the

drawer's bare arm. (Authorized by and implementing L. 1987, Chapter 292, Section 10(a)(b); effective T-88-38, Sept. 28, 1987.)

111-4-3. Location of Drawings. Gala drawings shall be held in Kansas City, Topeka, Wichita and Great Bend, and such other cities as deemed appropriate by the executive director. (Authorized by and implementing L. 1987, Chapter 292, Section 10(b); effective T-88-38, Sept. 28, 1987.)

111-4-4. Prerequisites for a Drawing. Before a "Gala Drawing" may be validly conducted, a sponsor(s), a location, and a receptacle must be approved in writing by the executive director, the drawing must be open to the public and at least fifty (50) persons must actually attend the drawing as determined by the sponsor of the "Gala Drawing." (Authorized by and implementing L. 1987, Chapter 292, Section 10(b); effective T-88-38, Sept. 28, 1987.)

111-4-5. Prizes. The winner selected at each approved "Gala Drawing" location shall receive a one thousand dollar (\$1,000) prize. All prize awards are subject to lottery validation, set offs, and deductions as provided for by law. (Authorized by and implementing L. 1987, Chapter 292, Section 10(c); effective T-88-38, Sept. 28, 1987.)

111-4-6. Entry into Drawing. Entry into the "Gala Drawing" is accomplished by the process detailed in the following subparagraphs:

- (a) Obtain a valid Kansas instant lottery ticket;
- (b) Determine if the ticket is a winning ticket in accordance with the "Up and Away" game rules, K.A.R. 11-4-_____ et seq. If the ticket is a winning ticket, it is not eligible for the "Gala Drawing" and shall be redeemed in accordance with the game rules;
- (c) If the ticket is a non-winning ticket, the ticket is eligible for winning the drawing and the holder of the ticket may enter the "Gala Drawing";
- (d) The holder of the non-winning ticket must complete the information form on the back of the ticket in a legible manner;
- (e) The holder of the non-winning ticket must take the non-winning ticket with the completed information form to the location of the "Gala Drawing" and place it in the receptacle provided;
- (f) The receptacle shall be available and entries may be made commencing one hour prior to the beginning of the gala event. Entries shall be allowed until the actual winner selection process begins;
- (g) The holder of the ticket must personally attend the "Gala Drawing" and be present at the time of the drawing to be determined a winner;
- (h) The drawing will be conducted within one hour of the commencement of the gala event;
- (i) There is no limit to the number of entries a participant may make. (Authorized by and implementing L. 1987, Chapter 292, Section 10(b); effective T-88-38, Sept. 28, 1987.)

111-4-7. Determination of "Gala Drawing" Winners. (a) The sponsor shall announce to the audience that the winner selection process is about to begin.

Any persons wishing to enter the drawing who has not yet done so, shall immediately place their tickets into the receptacle at this time.

(b) Prior to sealing the receptacle, the sponsor shall announce that entries into the "Gala Drawing" are closed. No further entries will be accepted.

(c) The receptacle shall be sealed and mixed to ensure random selection.

(d) The sponsor(s) of each approved "Gala Drawing" event shall designate one individual of their choice to participate in the selection process.

(e) The selection of the "Gala Drawing" winner shall be accomplished by the individual designated by the sponsor, using a bare arm technique, removing only one ticket from the receptacle in which all entries were placed. A person representing the sponsor of the "Gala Drawing" event as well as a law enforcement officer selected by the Kansas lottery, division of security, and a Kansas lottery employee, shall review the selected ticket to determine if the name stated on the information form located on the back of the selected ticket is legible. If the name is determined to be legible, the name shall be announced to the audience.

(f) The named person must be in attendance and present him/herself to the person announcing the winner within three minutes of the announcement in order to win the "Gala Drawing" prize.

(g) If the person whose ticket has been drawn from the receptacle is in attendance, upon proper identification that person shall be determined the "Gala Drawing" winner.

(h) The winner shall be given a prize claim form to be completed and returned to the lottery employee in attendance at the drawing;

(i) If the name on the ticket is not legible, or if the person is not in attendance, the ticket drawn will be void and the selection process shall be repeated until a winner is selected. (Authorized by and implementing L. 1987, Chapter 292, Section 10(b); effective T-88-38, Sept. 28, 1987.)

111-4-8. Security of Drawing. The receptacle located at the drawing site into which drawing participants place their ticket entries shall be monitored from the commencement of ticket entries beginning one hour prior to the start of the gala event until completion of the gala event by a law enforcement officer selected by the Kansas lottery, division of security and approved by the executive director.

(b) The actual drawing event shall be recorded on both audio and video tape by the designated law enforcement officer. The audio and video tape shall contain no other material than the actual drawing beginning with the sealing of the receptacle and continuing through the announcement and verification of the winner. (Authorized by and implementing L. 1987, Chapter 292, Section 10(d); effective T-88-38, Sept. 28, 1987.)

111-4-9. Ticket Disqualification. Any Kansas instant game lottery ticket entered into a "Gala Drawing" is disqualified from any other Kansas lottery prize or eligibility that ticket may have been redeemable

for. (Authorized by and implementing L. 1987, Chapter 292, Section 10(d); effective T-88-38, Sept. 28, 1987.)

111-4-10. Sponsor Drawings. Sponsors of gala events may hold sponsor drawings in conjunction with local retailers and businesses at the gala event. In no instance shall these drawings take place prior to the lottery "Gala Drawing." Such drawings, if conducted, shall not be construed to be part of a "Gala Drawing" and shall be separate and apart from the "Gala Drawing" in every way. The Kansas lottery shall not be liable for any claim arising from the sponsor drawing and the drawing, if conducted, shall be the sole responsibility of the sponsor(s) of the gala event. (Authorized by and implementing L. 1987, Chapter 292, Section 10(b); effective T-88-38, Sept. 28, 1987.)

111-4-11. Disposal of Tickets. Upon completion of the gala event, the sponsor(s) of the event, the law enforcement officer selected by the Kansas lottery, division of security, or their substitutes, and the Kansas lottery employee shall return to the Topeka lottery headquarters all tickets remaining in the receptacle at the completion of the gala event. (Authorized by and implementing L. 1987, Chapter 292, Section 10(b); effective T-88-38, Sept. 28, 1987.)

111-4-12. Certification of Drawing. (a) All "Gala Drawings" shall be personally observed by the sponsor(s) of the event, the law enforcement officer selected by the Kansas lottery, division of security, and an employee of the Kansas lottery.

(b) Should any of these individuals be unable to attend, the executive director shall designate a replacement.

(c) Upon completion of the drawing, the persons designated to officially observe the drawing shall issue a signed report in affidavit form to the executive director. This report shall certify that to the best of their knowledge, the procedures required by these rules were followed in selecting the winner at the "Gala Drawing." The winning ticket, all other tickets placed in the receptacle, the audio and video tape of the drawing, the prize claim form completed by the winner, and the signed affidavit shall be delivered to the Topeka lottery headquarters by the lottery employee attending the event. (Authorized by and implementing L. 1987, Chapter 292, Section 10(b); effective T-88-38, Sept. 28, 1987.)

111-4-13. Validation of Winner. The following validation requirements shall apply to all tickets for the "Gala Drawing":

(a) The ticket must have been issued by the Kansas lottery in an authorized manner and must not be counterfeit in whole or in part;

(b) The ticket must be complete and intact and not mutilated, altered, unreadable, reconstructed, or tampered with in any way;

(c) The ticket must not be blank or partially blank, misregistered, defective, or printed or produced in error;

(d) The display printing on the ticket must be reg-

ular in every respect and correspond precisely with the artwork on file at the Kansas lottery;

(e) The ticket must not be stolen nor appear on any list of omitted tickets on file at the Kansas lottery;

(f) The ticket must have exactly one ticket validation number, one book-ticket number, and two retailer validation codes, each of which must be present in its entirety, be fully legible, be exactly as described in paragraph (b) above, and correspond precisely to the artwork on file at the Kansas lottery. The ticket validation number shall correspond to the play symbols on the ticket; and

(g) The ticket validation number of an apparent "Gala Drawing" winning ticket shall not appear on the Kansas lottery's official list of ticket validation numbers of winning tickets. (Authorized by and implementing L. 1987, Chapter 292, Section 10(b); effective T-88-38, Sept. 28, 1987.)

111-4-14. Payment of Prizes. The executive director shall award the designated prize to the person whose ticket was drawn from the receptacle as soon as it has been determined that all laws, regulations, and rules have been adhered to. (Authorized by and implementing L. 1987, Chapter 292, Section 10(c), 20(b); effective T-88-38, Sept. 28, 1987.)

111-4-15. Disputes. In the event of a dispute concerning the "Gala Drawing," the executive director shall determine the facts underlying the dispute. The executive director has the authority to settle any dispute by determining the holder of the ticket drawn at a "Gala Drawing." The executive director has the authority to pay a prize to the person the executive director determines to be the holder of a valid ticket drawn at a "Gala Drawing." If the executive director is unable to determine the holder of a ticket drawn at a "Gala Drawing," the executive director may, solely at his or her discretion, reimburse the ticket holder for the price of the disputed ticket. (Authorized by and implementing L. 1987, Chapter 292, Section 10(b)(c), Section 20(b); effective T-88-38, Sept. 28, 1987.)

111-4-16. Governing Laws, Regulations, and Rules. In purchasing a ticket and entering the "Gala Drawing," the player agrees to comply with and abide by the Kansas lottery act (Chapter 292 of the 1987 Session Laws); all regulations of the Kansas lottery, whether permanent or temporary; and all rules, procedures, and instructions established by the Kansas lottery for the conduct of the "Gala Drawing." (Authorized by and implementing L. 1987, Chapter 292, Section 10; effective T-88-38, Sept. 28, 1987.)
