NOTICE CONCERNING STANDARDS FOR SSI RECIPIENTS' RESIDENTIAL FACILITIES

Public Law 94-566, section 505(d), enacted in 1976 and Public Law 97-35 enacted in 1981 established section 1616(e) of the Social Security Act, commonly known as the "Keys Amendment."

The Keys Amendment, as implemented by the federal regulation 45 CFR Part 1397, requires each state to make available for public review a summary of the standards used in regulating residential facilities in which recipients of Supplemental Security Income (SSI) reside or are likely to reside.

Standards for some types of facilities are set by the Department of Social and Rehabilitation Services, while the Department of Health and Environment sets standards for others. The summary of all standards or further information about the full standards set by SRS may be obtained by writing to the Department of Social and Rehabilitation Services, Jan Allen, Commissioner of Adult Services, Biddle Building, 1st Floor, 300 S.W. Oakley, Topeka 66606.

Further information about the full standards set by KDHE may be obtained by writing to the Department of Health and Environment, Gerald Block, Director of Field Services, Landon State Office Building, 10th Floor, Topeka 66612-1290.

All affected facilities must meet the standards. Compliance with the standards assures that facilities provide a safe and healthy environment for SSI recipients and other disadvantaged persons in need of continuous protective oversight. Persons with knowledge of facilities which may not have met the standards are urged to write either SRS or KDHE at the addresses above.

Place of Payment and Bond Registration

The principal of and interest on the bonds will be payable in lawful money of the United States of America by check or draft of the Kansas State Treasurer, Topeka, Kansas (the paying agent and bond registrar). The principal of the bonds will be payable at maturity or upon earlier redemption to the registered owners upon presentation and surrender of the bonds at the office of the paying agent. Interest on the bonds will be paid by check or draft mailed by the paying agent to the persons in whose names the bonds are registered on the registration books maintained by the bond registrar at the close of business on the record date for such interest, which shall be the 15th day (whether or not a business day) of the calendar month next preceding such interest payment date.

The city will pay for the fees of the bond registrar for registration and transfer of the bonds and will also pay for printing a reasonable supply of registered bond blanks. Any additional costs or fees that might be incurred in the secondary market, other than fees of the bond registrar, will be the responsibility of the bondholders.

Redemption of Bonds Prior to Maturity

The bonds shall not be subject to redemption prior to their respective stated maturities.

Conditions of Bids

Proposals will be received on the bonds bearing such rate or rates of interest as may be specified by the bidders, subject to the following conditions: The same rate shall apply to all bonds of the same maturity. Each interest rate specified shall be a multiple of $\frac{1}{8}$ or $\frac{1}{20}$ of 1 percent. No interest rate shall exceed the index of treasury bonds published by the weekly *Credit Markets* in New York, New York, on the Monday next preceding the day on which the bonds are sold, plus 2 percent. The difference between the highest rate specified and the lowest rate specified shall not exceed 2 percent. No supplemental interest payments will be authorized. No bid of less than the principal amount of the bonds and accrued interest will be considered. Bidders shall specify in the bid form the prices (exclusive of accrued interest), expressed as a dollar price, at which the bidder intends that each maturity amount of the bonds shall be initially offered to the public (the initial reoffering prices).

Basis of Award

The award of the bonds will be made on the basis of the lowest net interest cost to the city, which will be determined by subtracting the amount of the premium bid, if any, from the total interest cost to the city. If there is any discrepancy between the net interest cost and the average annual net interest rate specified, the specified net interest cost shall govern and the interest rates specified in the bid shall be adjusted accordingly. If two or more proper bids providing for identical amounts for the lowest net interest cost are received, the city shall determine which bid, if any, shall be accepted, and its determination shall be final.

Authorization, Purpose and Security for the Bonds

The bonds are being authorized and issued to permanently finance various trafficway improvements to the city. The bonds will be general obligations of the city payable from ad valorem taxes which may be levied without limitation as to rate or amount on all the taxable tangible property, real and personal, within the territorial limits of the city.

Internal Revenue Code of 1986

The Internal Revenue Code of 1986 imposes requirements on the city which must be met subsequent to the issuance of the bonds by the city and, as a result, the city will and does hereby covenant that it will diligently undertake those steps necessary to maintain the tax-exempt status of the bonds. The city's failure to comply with such requirements could adversely affect the tax-exempt status of the bonds. Purchasers of the bonds should be aware that should the bonds lose their status as tax-exempt obligations as a result of the city's failure to comply with such requirements, the bonds are neither

callable nor will the rate of interest on the bonds be adjusted to reflect such circumstances.

The code includes interest on tax-exempt obligations, such as the bonds, in the adjusted net book income of certain corporations for taxable years beginning after December 31, 1986, and includes, through 1989, in the calculation of alternative minimum taxable income one-half of the excess of a corporation's adjusted net book income over its alternative minimum taxable income (determined without regard to this adjustment and prior to reduction for certain net operating losses). After 1989, the use of "book income" will be replaced by "adjusted current earnings," with certain other adjustments. Furthermore, Section 59A of the code, as added by the Superfund Amendments and Reauthorization Act of 1986, provides for a new environmental tax generally based on corporate alternative minimum taxable income. The amount of the tax is equal to 0.12 percent of the excess of alternative minimum taxable income, without regard to net operating losses and the deduction for this tax, over \$2 million. The environmental tax is imposed whether or not the taxpayer is subject to the alternative minimum tax. The environmental tax, which is effective for taxable years beginning after December 31, 1986, may subject certain bondowners to additional taxation for interest earned on the bonds.

The code also requires property and casualty insurance companies, for taxable years beginning on or after January 1, 1987, to reduce the amount of their deductible underwriting losses by a percentage of the amount of tax-exempt interest received or accrued on obligations acquired after August 7, 1986.

With the exception of certain "qualified tax-exempt obligations," the code provides that banks and thrift institutions may not deduct any portion of the interest cost of purchasing or carrying tax-exempt obligations such as the bonds if such interest cost is incurred in taxable years ending after December 31, 1986, with respect to obligations acquired after August 7, 1986. The city does intend to designate the bonds as "qualified tax-exempt obligations" under Section 265 of the code.

Legal Opinion

The bonds will be sold subject to the legal opinion of Nichols and Wolfe Chartered, Topeka, Kansas, bond counsel, whose approving legal opinion as to the validity of the bonds will be furnished and paid for by the city, printed on the bonds and delivered to the successful bidder when the bonds are delivered. Said opinion will also state that in the opinion of bond counsel, assuming continued compliance by the city with the provisions of the ordinance authorizing the issuance of the bonds and the code, under existing law, the interest on the bonds is exempt from federal income taxation. Interest on the bonds will also be excludable from the computation of Kansas adjusted gross income for taxable years commencing after December 31, 1987.

Delivery and Payment

The city will pay for printing the bonds and will deliver the bonds, without cost to the successful bidder, properly prepared, executed and registered, on or prior to January 20, 1989, at such bank or trust company in the state of Kansas or the greater metropolitan area of Kansas City, Kansas. Delivery elsewhere will be at the cost of the

successful bidder. Said bidder will also be furnished with a certified transcript of the proceedings evidencing the authorization and issuance of the bonds and the usual closing documents, including a certificate that there is no litigation pending or threatened at the time of delivery of the bonds affecting their validity. The Board of Education of Unified School District 268, Sedgwick County, Kansas (Cheney), will receive sealed bids at the school district's administrative offices, 100 W. 6th, Cheney, until 7 p.m. C.S.T. on Monday, December 12, 1988, for the purchase of \$800,000 principal amount of General Obligation School Building Bonds, Series 1989, of the school district as hereinafter described. All bids will be publicly opened and read at said time and place, and will be immediately thereafter acted upon by the board of education. No oral or auction bids for the bonds will be considered.

Description of Bonds

The bonds shall consist of fully registered certificated bonds in denominations of \$5,000, or any integral multiple thereof not exceeding the principal amount of bonds maturing in each year; shall bear a dated date of January 1, 1989; and shall mature serially on October 1 in each of the years and in the principal amounts as follows:

The bonds shall bear interest from the dated date at the rates which shall be specified by the successful bidder for the bonds, which interest shall be payable semiannually on April 1 and October 1 of each year, commencing April 1, 1990, until the bonds are paid in full.

Payment of Principal and Interest; Registration

The principal of the bonds shall be payable in lawful money of the United States of America by check or draft of the Kansas State Treasurer, the school district's designated paying agent and bond registrar (herein called the paying agent), to the registered owners of the bonds upon presentation of the bonds for payment and cancellation at the paying agent's principal office in Topeka, Kansas. Interest on the bonds shall be payable in lawful money of the United States of America by check or draft of the paying agent mailed to the registered owners as their names appear on the registration books maintained by the paying agent as of the 15th day of the month next preceding the interest payment dates.

The fees of the paying agent for the registration and transfer of the bonds shall be paid by the school district, and the school district shall, at its expense, provide the paying agent with an inventory of "blank" printed bonds for that purpose. Initial Registration

The number and denominations of the bonds and the names, addresses and Social Security or taxpayer identification numbers of the initial registered owners of the bonds shall be submitted in writing to the paying agent by the successful bidder not later than Monday, January 16, 1989. In the event this information is not furnished by such date, the bonds shall be delivered one bond per maturity registered in the name of the successful bidder.

An original purchaser's certificate, which sets forth the initial reoffering price to the public on the bonds, shall be furnished to the successful bidder by bond counsel, and such certificate must be completed and returned no later than the date of delivery of the bonds.

Redemption of Bonds

The bonds maturing in the years 1990 through 1997, inclusive, shall become due and payable on their respective maturity dates without the option of prior call for redemption and payment.

The bonds maturing on and after October 1, 1998, shall be subject to call for redemption and payment at the option of the school district on and after October 1, 1997, as a whole at any time or in part and in inverse numerical order on any interest payment date, at a redemption price equal to the principal amount of a bond so called for redemption and payment plus all accrued and unpaid interest thereon to the date of redemption, and without premium.

The paying agent shall give written notice of any call

for redemption by United States first class mail to the registered owners of the bonds not less than 30 days prior to any date established for redemption of bonds. Prior to any such redemption date, the school district shall deposit with the paying agent sufficient funds to pay the principal amount of the bonds to be redeemed together with all unpaid and accrued interest thereon to the redemption date. Upon the deposit of said funds, and the giving of notice in the form and manner hereinbefore specified, bonds thus called for redemption shall cease to bear interest from and after the redemption date.

Conditions of Bidding

Proposals will be received on the bonds bearing such rate or rates of interest as may be specified by the bidder, subject to the conditions of this paragraph. The same rate of interest shall apply to all bonds of the same maturity. Each interest rate specified shall be in an even multiple of $\frac{1}{8}$ or $\frac{1}{20}$ of 1 percent. No interest rate shall exceed the maximum interest rate allowed by Kansas law, said rate being equal to the index of treasury bonds published by the *Credit Markets* in New York, New York, on the Monday next preceding the date on which the bonds are sold, plus 2 percent. Bid Form; Good Faith Deposit

Bids shall be submitted on an official bid form, which may be obtained from the school district or its financial advisor, and shall be submitted in sealed envelopes, plainly marked "Bond Bid," and addressed to the Board of Education, U.S.D. 268, Sedgwick County, Kansas, 100 W. 6th, Cheney, KS 67025. Bids may be submitted by mail or may be delivered in person, but must be received at the school district not later than the date, time and place hereinbefore specified.

Each bid shall be accompanied by a good faith deposit in the form of a certified or cashier's check payable to the order of the school district for the amount of \$16,000 (being 2 percent of the principal amount of the bonds). If a bid is accepted, the good faith deposit shall be held by the school district until the bidder shall have complied with all of the terms and conditions of this notice and of the bid. In the event a bidder whose bid is accepted shall default in the performance of any of the terms and conditions of this notice or of the bid, its good faith deposit shall be retained by the school district as and for liquidated damages. If a bid is accepted, but the school district shall fail to deliver the bonds in accordance with the terms and conditions hereof, the successful bidder's good faith deposit shall be returned. No interest shall be paid upon the successful bidder's good faith deposit. The good faith

deposit checks of the unsuccessful bidders shall be promptly returned.

Award of Bonds

The bonds shall be awarded to the bidder whose proposal results in the lowest net interest cost to the school district, which shall be determined by deducting the amount of the premium bid, if any, from the total interest cost to the school district. If there is any discrepancy between the net interest cost and the average annual net interest rate specified, the specified net interest cost shall govern and the interest rates specified in the bid shall be adjusted accordingly. If two or more identical bids for the lowest net interest cost are received, the board of education shall determine which bid, if any, shall be accepted, and such determination shall be final. The board of education reserves the right to reject any and all bids, and to waive any irregularities in a submitted bid.

Delivery of Bonds

The bonds, duly printed, executed and registered, shall be furnished and paid for by the school district and shall be delivered to the successful bidder on or about Friday, January 27, 1989, at any bank in the state of Kansas or in Kansas City, Missouri, at the expense of the school district. Delivery elsewhere shall be made at the expense of the successful bidder. The successful bidder shall also be furnished with a transcript of proceedings evidencing the authorization and issuance of the bonds and the usual closing proofs, including a certificate that there is no litigation pending or threatened at the time of delivery of the bonds affecting their validity. Payment for the bonds shall be made in Federal Reserve funds, immediately available for use by the school district.

CUSIP Identification Numbers

CUSIP identification numbers are expected to be assigned to the bonds. All expenses of the CUSIP Service Bureau for such assignment shall be the responsibility of and shall be paid for by the school district.

Official Statement

The school district shall prepare an official statement relating to the bonds, copies of which may be obtained from the school district or from the school district's financial advisor. Upon the sale of the bonds, the school district shall furnish the successful bidder with a reasonable number of copies of the official statement, without cost, upon request. Copies in excess of a reasonable number may be ordered at the successful bidder's expense.

Authority, Purpose and Security for Bonds

The bonds shall be issued under the authority of K.S.A. 10-101 *et seq.*, as amended and supplemented, and K.S.A. 72-6761. The bonds were approved by the electors of the school district at a bond election held in conjunction with the general election on November 8, 1988; and shall be authorized and issued under a bond resolution which will be adopted by the board of education immediately after the awarding of the bonds.

The proceeds of the bonds shall be used to pay the cost of constructing, reconstructing, renovating, furnishing and equipping school buildings and facilities in the school district.

The bonds and the interest thereon shall constitute

general obligations of the school district, and shall be payable as to both principal and interest from ad valorem taxes which may be levied without limitation as to rate or amount upon all of the taxable tangible property within the territorial limits of the school district.

Legal Opinion and Tax Exemption

All matters relating to the authorization and issuance of the bonds are subject to the approving opinion of Hinkle, Eberhart & Elkouri, Wichita, Kansas, bond counsel. Bond counsel's opinion will be printed on the bonds, and a manually signed original of bond counsel's opinion will be furnished without expense to the successful bidder concurrently with delivery of the bonds. All fees and expenses of bond counsel will be paid by the school district.

In the opinion of bond counsel, assuming continued compliance by the school district with the terms of the bond resolution, under existing law, the interest on the bonds: (i) is excludable from gross income for federal income tax purposes, and (ii) is not an item of tax preference for purposes of the federal alternative minimum tax imposed on individuals and corporations. However, it should be noted that with respect to corporations (as defined for federal income tax purposes), such interest is taken into account in determining adjusted net book income (adjusted current earnings for taxable years ending after December 31, 1989) for the purpose of computing the alternative minimum tax imposed on such corporations. The exclusion mentioned in the preceding clause (i) is subject to compliance by the school district with all requirements of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, which must be satisfied subsequent to issuance of the bonds in order for the interest on the bonds to qualify for such exclusion. Failure to comply with certain of such requirements could cause the interest on the bonds to be so included in federal gross income retroactive to the date of issuance of the bonds. The school district will covenant to comply with all such requirements. Bond counsel expresses no opinion regarding other federal tax consequences arising with respect to the bonds.

The bonds are exempt from intangible personal property taxes levied by Kansas counties, cities and townships, and the interest on the bonds is excludable from the computation of Kansas adjusted gross income for taxable years commencing after December 31, 1987.

Related Federal Tax Matters

Prospective bidders for purchase of the bonds should be aware that: (i) Section 265 of the code denies a deduction for interest on indebtedness incurred or continued to purchase or carry obligations other than qualified tax-exempt obligations (as described in the next paragraph), or, in the case of a financial institution within the meaning of Section 265(b)(5) of the code, that portion of a bondholder's interest expense allocable to interest on such obligations; (ii) with respect to insurance companies subject to the tax imposed by Section 831 of the code, for taxable years beginning after December 31, 1986, Section 832(b)(5)(B)(i) of the code reduces the deduction for loss reserves by 15 percent of the sum of certain items, including interest on the bonds; (iii) for taxable years beginning after December 31, 1986, and prior to January

1, 1992, interest on the bonds earned by some corporations could be subject to the environmental tax imposed by Section 59A of the code; (iv) for taxable years beginning after December 31, 1986, interest on the bonds earned by certain foreign corporations doing business in the United States could be subject to a branch profits tax imposed by Section 884 of the code; (v) passive investment income, including interest on the bonds, may be subject to federal income taxation under Section 1375 of the code for Subchapter S corporations that have Subchapter C earnings and profits at the close of the taxable year if greater than 25 percent of the gross receipts of such Subchapter S corporation is passive investment income; and (vi) Section 86 of the code requires recipients of certain Social Security and railroad retirement benefits to take into account in determining gross income, receipts or accruals of interest on the bonds. The foregoing categories of prospective bondowners should consult their own tax advisors as to the applicability of these consequences.

Qualified Tax-Exempt Obligations

The school district will covenant to take such actions as are necessary to designate the bonds as "qualified tax-exempt obligations" within the meaning of Section 265(b)(3) of the code, and, in the case of certain financial institutions within the meaning of Section 265(b)(5) of the code, a deduction is allowed for 80 percent of that portion of such financial institution's interest expense allocable to interest on the bonds.

75-6-29. Refunding Precomputed Installment Contracts made on and after July 1, 1988. (a) Upon prepayment of a consumer credit transaction in full before the final due date, the amount of the unearned portion of the finance charge shall be determined by applying the annual percentage rate (APR), or contract rate if an origination fee was charged, to:

(1) the unpaid balances and time as originally scheduled for the period following prepayment. The period following prepayment shall be the number of days between the date of prepayment and the beginning of the computational period following the date of prepayment, and all full computational periods following the date of prepayment; or

(2) the actual unpaid balances of the amount financed, or the actual unpaid principal balances if an origination fee was charged, for the actual time the unpaid balances were outstanding. Any deferral charges collected before the date of prepayment shall be applied to reduce the unpaid balance as if the deferral charge was a payment made on the date the charge was collected. The finance charge earned using this method shall be deducted from the original

precomputed finance charge, or interest charged if an origination fee was charged, to determine the unearned portion of the finance charge.

(b) Precomputed contracts whose payments are not scheduled to be made in substantially equal installments at equal periodic intervals, other than the first installment, shall be refunded by the method stated in paragraph (2). 54-3-3. Procedure for determining contract payments. (a) Federal funds. Article 13.—STUDENT ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS

88-13-1. Definitions. Terms used herein are defined as follows: (a) "Parent" means a guardian or any person who is legally responsible for the maintenance, care, or support of a dependent who is an applicant under this program.

(b) "Parent's contribution" means the amount parents can reasonably be expected to contribute from their income and assets toward a year's college education costs for a dependent. This amount shall be determined based upon criteria approved by the board and established by the financial needs analysis agency selected by the board.

(c) "Independent student" means a student who demonstrates independence from a parent's support to the satisfaction of the board. Documentation that will meet U.S. education department guidelines for an independent student may be required from the applicant, applicant's parent or parents, or guardian to verify emancipation from the parent or parents.

(d) "Student contribution" means the amount a student can contribute from the student's own work and resources toward a year's college education costs. This amount shall be determined based upon criteria approved by the board and established by the financial needs analysis agency selected by the board. The student contribution shall not be less than \$450.

(e) "Student resources" means assets, earnings, income or benefits from other sources, and any grant or loan coming directly to the student from non-college sources, as defined by the U.S. department of education in 34 C.F.R. 674.14, effective February 2, 1988, which are hereby adopted by reference.

(f) "Family contribution" means the sum of parents' contribution and student contribution. The family contribution shall be determined annually.

(g) "Tuition" means the amount of money charged a full-time student for the cost of educational services for the academic year, excluding any summer session. The amount of the tuition shall be set by the eligible postsecondary institution and shall be the same for the grantee and non-grantee students who are in identical circumstances at the institution.

(h) "Required fees" means fees which are not optional for the full-time student and which are considered by the board to be for educational purposes.

(i) "College budget" means the total amount required for a student to attend the postsecondary institution of the student's choice. The costs of tuition and required fees, room and board, supplies, and incidentals shall be included in the college budget. For married students, a family maintenance budget shall be substituted for room and board. All amounts to be used for maintenance, supplies and incidentals shall be comparable for all eligible institutions.

(j) "Tuition grant offer" means the annual amount

offered to a student under this program, rounded to the nearest \$10. Each tuition grant offer shall be the lesser of the following amounts:

(1) an amount equal to one-half of the difference between the average amount of the total tuition and required fees of full-time in-state students who are enrolled at the state universities and the average amount of the total tuition and required fees of full-time in-state students who are enrolled at the accredited independent institutions in Kansas;

(2) the total tuition and required fees for two semesters, or the equivalent thereof, at the college of the student's choice;

(3) the financial need of the student; or

(4) the pro-rata amount determined by the board.

(k) "State scholarship offer" means the annual amount offered to a state scholar under this program, rounded to the nearest \$10. Each state scholarship offer shall be the lesser of the following amounts:

(1) \$1,000 for scholars designated for fall, 1985 and thereafter;

(2) \$500 for any scholar designated prior to fall, 1985;

(3) the financial need of the state scholar;

(4) the pro-rata amount determined by the board.

(l) "Grantee" means a person possessing a valid tuition grant offer, or state scholarship offer, or both.

(m) "Tuition grant payment or state scholarship payment" means the amount awarded to a student to enroll in a course of study of at least 12 hours each semester, or the equivalent thereof. This amount shall be determined by pro-rating the amount of the tuition grant offer, or state scholarship offer, or both.

(n) "Unmet need" means the financial need of a grantee less the amount of the student's tuition grant offer or state scholarship offer, or both. 88-13-4. Applicant eligibility. To be eligible for a tuition grant offer, or state scholarship offer, or both, each applicant shall demonstrate to the executive director of the board that the applicant: (a) Qualifies as a resident of the state of Kansas for fee purposes at a state educational institution according to K.S.A. 76-729 and K.A.R. 88-3-1, *et seq.*;

(b) is initially accepted or enrolled at an eligible Kansas postsecondary institution;

(c) is an undergraduate who has never received a baccalaureate degree;

(d) has financial need as determined by an analysis of information submitted on the current year's American College Testing Service Family Financial Statement, which is hereby adopted as the board's family financial statement;

(e) having received a state scholarship and having completed the initial enrollment in a postsecondary

educational institution, has attained the academic standard of a cumulative 3.3 grade point average for all postsecondary academic terms or semesters. The average shall be calculated on a 4.0 scale where an A equals four points;

(f) having received a tuition grant and having completed the initial enrollment in a postsecondary educational institution, has attained the academic standard of a cumulative 2.0 grade point average for all postsecondary academic terms or semesters. The average shall be calculated on a 4.0 scale where an A equals four points;

(g) having received federal financial assistance, does not owe a refund on any federal financial assistance and is not in default on any such federal financial assistance; and

(h) has otherwise complied with the requirements of 34 C.F.R. 692.40, effective February 2, 1988, which are hereby adopted by reference. (c) is a full-time undergraduate student in good standing who is responsible for paying full tuition and required fees;

(d) has met the state scholarship academic standard of a cumulative 3.3 grade point average for grantees participating in the state scholarship program;

(e) has met the tuition grant academic standard of a cumulative 2.0 grade point average for grantees participating in the tuition grant program;

(f) has reported accurate parent or student income data, as verified by a copy of the income tax return for the most recent tax year or through other verification of income criteria as provided in 34 C.F.R. 688.51-668.58, effective April 29, 1986, which are hereby adopted by reference;

(g) for an independent grantee, that the grantee meets the U.S. education department guidelines for an independent student as provided in 34 C.F.R. 668.2, effective February 2, 1988, which are hereby adopted by reference, and as verified by the institution;

(h) where applicable, is in compliance with the eligibility requirements of 34 C.F.R. 692.40, effective February 2, 1988, which are hereby adopted by reference; and

TEMPORARY ADMINISTRATIVE REGULATIONS

Article 1.—GENERAL OPERATION

111-1-5. Restrictions on Who May Participate. (a) Persons directly involved in the production of Kansas Lottery Live, the installation and maintenance of computers or computer equipment for on-line games, the installation and maintenance of telecommunications equipment connecting on-line terminals to the central computer system, and any person, or any officers, agents or employees of a business providing supplies, services and equipment used directly in the operation of a lottery game are precluded from purchasing lottery tickets and from winning prizes. Persons only tangentially connected to the Kansas lottery are not included within this prohibition.

(b) In the event of a dispute concerning this requirement, the executive director has the authority to determine the facts underlying the dispute and make a decision as to the participation of such a person in purchasing lottery tickets and winning prizes. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1987 Supp. 74-8710 as amended by L. 1988, Ch. 366, § 23; and implementing 74-8710 as amended by L. 1988, Ch. 366, § 23; and 74-8719 as amended by L. 1988, Ch. 314, § 6; effective T-111-11-16-88, Nov. 15, 1988.)

Article 4.—INDIVIDUAL GAME RULES

111-4-7. Determination of "Gala Drawing" Winners. (a) The sponsor shall announce to the audience at least ten minutes before the drawing of the time that the winner selection process will begin. Any persons wishing to enter the drawing who have not yet done so, shall immediately place their tickets into the receptacle at this time.

(b) Prior to sealing the receptacle, the sponsor shall announce that entries into the "Gala Drawing" are closed. No further entries will be accepted.

(c) The receptacle shall be sealed and mixed to ensure random selection.

(d) The sponsor(s) of each approved "Gala Drawing" event shall designate one individual of their choice to participate in the selection process.

(continued)

(e) The selection of the "Gala Drawing" winner shall be accomplished by the individual designated by the sponsor, using a bare arm technique, removing only one ticket from the receptacle in which all entries were placed. A person representing the sponsor of the "Gala Drawing" event as well as a law enforcement officer approved by the Kansas lottery, division of security, and a Kansas lottery employee, shall review the selected ticket to determine if the name stated on the information form located on the back of the selected ticket is legible and if the ticket is signed. If the name is determined to be legible and the ticket is signed, the name shall be announced to the audience.

(f) The named person must be present in order to win the "Gala Drawing" prize.

(g) The person whose ticket has been drawn from the receptacle shall be determined the "Gala Drawing" winner.

(h) The winner shall be given a prize claim form to be completed and returned to the lottery.

(i) If the name on the ticket is not legible or the ticket is not signed the ticket drawn will be void and the selection process shall be repeated until a winner is selected. 111-4-115. Name of Game. The Kansas Lottery shall conduct an instant winner lottery game entitled "Instant Dough" commencing on November 17, 1988. The specific rules for the "Instant Dough" game are contained in K.A.R. 111-3-1 *et seq.* and 111-4-115 through 111-4-118. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1987 Supp. 74-8710 as amended by L. 1988, Ch. 366, § 23; effective T-111-11-16-88, Nov. 15, 1988.)

111-4-116. Definitions. The following definitions shall apply to the "Instant Dough" instant lottery game:

(a) "Play Symbols" are the numbers, letters, symbols or pictures printed in the play area of each instant game ticket and which determine if the ticket bearer is entitled to a prize. In this instant game, the play symbols are printed in gray-black ink in 12 pt. Archer. A play symbol appears in each of the six play spots within the play area. Each play symbol in the play area for this instant game is one of the following: "FREE," "\$2.00," "\$5.00," "\$10\$," "\$20\$," "\$50," "\$100," or "\$5,000." A play symbol also appears in the play area on the Pizza Hut® Supreme bonus stub attached to the instant ticket. A play symbol in this instant game appearing in the play area of the stub is one of the following: "FREE LARGE SUPREME," "FREE MEDIUM SUPREME," "FREE SMALL SUPREME," "\$1 OFF LARGE SUPREME."

(b) "Play symbol captions" are the words, portions of words, letters or numbers printed beneath each play symbol in the play area and are used to repeat or

explain the play symbol. The play symbol caption associated with each play symbol is as follows:

No play symbol captions shall appear beneath the play symbol printed on the Pizza Hut® Supreme bonus stub.

(c) "Ticket validation number" means a unique number appearing on each ticket which is used to validate winning tickets. For this instant game, the ticket validation number is a 10-digit number which appears on the front of each instant ticket and will be covered by latex.

(d) "Book-ticket number" means the unique number appearing on each ticket which includes the number of the book from which it was removed and the serially assigned number of the ticket within that book. For this instant game, the book-ticket number is an 8-digit book number followed by a dash and then a 3-digit ticket number. The ticket numbers in each book start with 000 and end with 299. The book-ticket number is printed in gray-black ink on the bottom right portion of the front of each instant game ticket.

(e) "Retailer validation code" means the small letters found under removable covering in the play area of each instant game ticket. The retailer uses this code to verify and validate winners which are to be paid by the retailer. In this instant game, the retailer validation code is a two letter code printed and appearing in two of nine varying locations among the play symbols. The codes and their meanings are as follows: AA = free; DD = \$2.00; KK = \$5.00; JJ = \$10.00; NN = \$20.00. 111-4-117. Determination of Instant Prize Winners.
