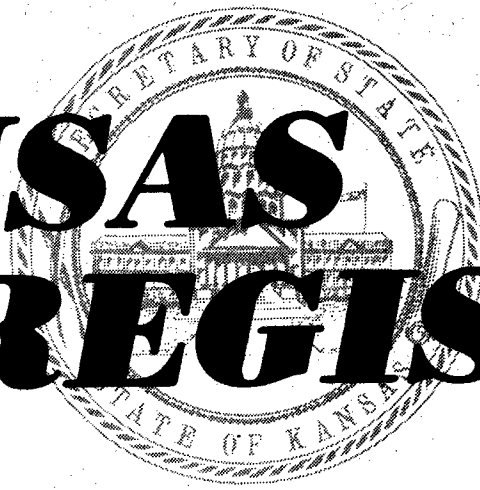

K.S.A. 58-3924 does not by its terms mandate the disclosure of confidential vital statistic information to the state treasurer. However, K.S.A. 1987 Supp. 65-2422(a) and (e) allow the secretary of the Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE) to promulgate regulations, containing the mandated safeguards, authorizing the transfer of such vital statistic information to the state treasurer. To date, the secretary has not adopted such a regulation.

Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-2418, the legislature has provided the secretary of KDHE with the authority and discretion to charge a fee for the transfer of vital statistic information. K.A.R. 28-17-6 implements that authority and sets forth the fees for such transfers. Unless the secretary of KDHE promulgates a specific exemption or has previously interpreted K.A.R. 28-17-6 to allow fees to be waived, the state treasurer must pay the fees set forth in that regulation.

Should the state treasurer obtain vital statistic information, the limitations contained in the enabling authority protect the information from all uses not connected with the purposes for which it was obtained. Description of Bonds

The bonds shall bear interest from the dated date at the rates which shall be specified by the successful bidder for the bonds, which interest shall be payable semiannually on March 1 and September 1 of each year, commencing March 1, 1990, until the bonds are paid in full.

Payment of Principal and Interest; Registration

The principal of the bonds shall be payable in lawful money of the United States of America by check or draft of the Kansas State Treasurer, the city's designated paying agent and bond registrar (herein called the paying agent), to the registered owners of the bonds upon presentation of the bonds for payment and cancellation at the paying agent's principal office in Topeka, Kansas. Interest on the bonds shall be payable in lawful money of the United States of America by check or draft of the paying agent mailed to the registered owners as their names appear on the registration books maintained by the paying agent as of the 15th day of the month next preceding the interest payment dates.

The fees of the paying agent for the registration and transfer of the bonds shall be paid by the city, and the city shall, at its expense, provide the paying agent with an inventory of "blank" printed bonds for that purpose. Any additional costs or fees that might be incurred in the secondary market, except the paying agent's fees, shall be the responsibility of the registered owners of the bonds.

Initial Registration

The number and denominations of the bonds and the names, addresses and Social Security or taxpayer identification numbers of the initial registered owners of the bonds shall be submitted in writing to the paying agent by the successful bidder not later than Tuesday, December 27, 1988. In the event this information is not furnished by such date, the bonds shall be delivered one bond per maturity registered in the name of the successful bidder.

An original purchaser's certificate, which sets forth the initial reoffering price to the public on the bonds, shall be furnished to the successful bidder by bond counsel, and such certificate must be completed and returned no later than the date of delivery of the bonds.

Redemption of Bonds

The bonds shall become due and payable on their respective maturity dates without the option of prior call for redemption and payment.

Conditions of Bidding

Proposals will be received on the bonds bearing such rate or rates of interest as may be specified by the bidder, subject to the conditions of this paragraph. The same rate of interest shall apply to all bonds of the same maturity. Each interest rate specified shall be in an even multiple of 1/8 or 1/20 of 1 percent. No interest rate shall exceed the maximum interest rate allowed by Kansas law, said rate being equal to the index of treasury bonds published by *Credit Markets* in New York, New York, on the Monday next preceding the date on which the bonds are sold, plus 2 percent. No bid of less than the entire par value of the bonds and accrued interest thereon from the dated date to the delivery date shall be considered, and no supplemental interest payments shall be authorized. Each bid shall be certified by the bidder to be correct, and the governing body shall be entitled to rely on such certificate of correctness.

Bid Form; Good Faith Deposit

Bids shall be submitted on an official bid form, which may be obtained from the city or its financial advisor, and shall be submitted in sealed envelopes, plainly marked "Bond Bid," and addressed to the Governing Body, City Hall, 304 N. Main, Andale, KS 67001. Bids may be submitted by mail or may be delivered in person, but must be received at the city not later than the date, time and place hereinbefore specified.

Each bid shall be accompanied by a good faith deposit in the form of a certified or cashier's check payable to the order of the city for the amount of \$4,400 (being 2 percent of the principal amount of the bonds). If a bid is accepted, the good faith deposit shall be held by the city until the bidder shall have complied with all of the terms and conditions of this notice and of the bid. In the event a bidder whose bid is accepted shall default in the performance of any of the terms and conditions of this notice or of the bid, its good faith deposit shall be retained

by the city as and for liquidated damages. If a bid is accepted, but the city shall fail to deliver the bonds in accordance with the terms and conditions hereof, the successful bidder's good faith deposit shall be returned. No interest shall be paid upon the successful bidder's good faith deposit. The good faith deposit checks of the unsuccessful bidders shall be promptly returned.

Award of Bonds

The bonds shall be awarded to the bidder whose proposal results in the lowest net interest cost to the city, which shall be determined by deducting the amount of the premium bid, if any, from the total interest cost to the city. If there is any discrepancy between the net interest cost and the average annual net interest rate specified, the specified net interest cost shall govern and the interest rates specified in the bid shall be adjusted accordingly. If two or more identical bids for the lowest net interest cost are received, the governing body shall determine which bid, if any, shall be accepted, and such determination shall be final. The governing body reserves the right to reject any and all bids, and to waive any irregularities in a submitted bid.

Delivery of Bonds

The bonds, duly printed, executed and registered, shall be furnished and paid for by the city, and shall be delivered to the successful bidder on or about Thursday, December 29, 1988, at any bank in the state of Kansas or in Kansas City, Missouri, at the expense of the city. Delivery elsewhere shall be made at the expense of the successful bidder. The successful bidder shall also be furnished with a transcript of proceedings evidencing the authorization and issuance of the bonds and the usual closing proofs, including a certificate that there is no litigation pending or threatened at the time of delivery of the bonds affecting their validity. Payment for the bonds shall be made in Federal Reserve funds, immediately available for use by the city.

CUSIP Identification Numbers

CUSIP identification numbers are not expected to be assigned to the bonds.

Official Statement

The city shall prepare an official statement relating to the bonds, copies of which may be obtained from the city or from the city's financial advisor. Upon the sale of the bonds, the city shall furnish the successful bidder with a reasonable number of copies of the official statement, without cost, upon request. Copies in excess of a reasonable number may be ordered at the successful bidder's expense.

Authority, Purpose and Security for Bonds

The bonds shall be issued under the authority of K.S.A. 10-101 *et seq.*, as amended and supplemented; K.S.A. 12-685 *et seq.*, and K.S.A. 12-6a01 *et seq.*, as amended and supplemented. The bonds shall be authorized and issued under a bond ordinance that will be adopted by the governing body immediately after the awarding of the bonds.

The proceeds of the bonds shall be used to pay the cost of constructing improvements to various streets in the city.

The bonds and the interest thereon shall constitute

general obligations of the city and shall be payable as to both principal and interest, in part from the collection of special assessment taxes which have been levied against certain properties in the city, and any portion of the specially assessed part not so paid, and the remainder of said principal and interest shall be paid from ad valorem taxes which may be levied without limitation as to rate or amount upon all of the taxable tangible property within the territorial limits of the city.

Legal Opinion and Tax Exemption

All matters relating to the authorization and issuance of the bonds are subject to the approving opinion of Hinkle, Eberhart & Elkouri, Wichita, Kansas, bond counsel. Bond counsel's opinion will be printed on the bonds, and a manually signed original copy of bond counsel's opinion will be furnished without expense to the successful bidder concurrently with delivery of the bonds. All fees and expenses of bond counsel will be paid by the city.

In the opinion of bond counsel, assuming continued compliance by the city with the terms of the bond ordinance, under existing law, the interest on the bonds: (i) is excludable from gross income for federal income tax purposes, and (ii) is not an item of tax preference for purposes of the federal alternative minimum tax imposed on individuals and corporations. However, it should be noted that with respect to corporations (as defined for federal income tax purposes), such interest is taken into account in determining adjusted net book income (adjusted current earnings for taxable years ending after December 31, 1989) for the purpose of computing the alternative minimum tax imposed on such corporations. The exclusion mentioned in the preceding clause (i) is subject to compliance by the city with all requirements of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, which must be satisfied subsequent to issuance of the bonds in order for the interest on the bonds to qualify for such exclusion. Failure to comply with certain of such requirements could cause the interest on the bonds to be so included in federal gross income retroactive to the date of issuance of the bonds. The city will covenant to comply with all such requirements. Bond counsel expresses no opinion regarding other federal tax consequences arising with respect to the bonds.

The bonds are exempt from intangible personal property taxes levied by Kansas counties, cities and townships, and the interest on the bonds is excludable from the computation of Kansas adjusted gross income for taxable years commencing after December 31, 1987.

Related Federal Tax Matters

Prospective bidders for purchase of the bonds should be aware that: (i) Section 265 of the code denies a deduction for interest on indebtedness incurred or continued to purchase or carry obligations other than qualified tax-exempt obligations (as described in the next paragraph), or, in the case of a financial institution within the meaning of Section 265(b)(5) of the code, that portion of a bondholder's interest expense allocable to interest on such obligations; (ii) with respect to insurance companies subject to the tax imposed by Section 831 of the code, for taxable years beginning after December 31, 1986, Section 832(b)(5)(B)(i) of the code reduces the deduction for loss reserves by 15 percent of the sum of certain items, in-

cluding interest on the bonds; (iii) for taxable years beginning after December 31, 1986, and prior to January 1, 1992, interest on the bonds earned by some corporations could be subject to the environmental tax imposed by Section 59A of the code; (iv) for taxable years beginning after December 31, 1986, interest on the bonds earned by certain foreign corporations doing business in the United States could be subject to a branch profits tax imposed by Section 884 of the code; (v) passive investment income, including interest on the bonds, may be subject to federal income taxation under Section 1375 of the code for Subchapter S corporations that have Subchapter C earnings and profits at the close of the taxable year if more than 25 percent of the gross receipts of such Subchapter S corporation is passive investment income; and (vi) Section 86 of the code requires recipients of certain Social Security and railroad retirement benefits to take into account in determining gross income, receipts or accruals of interest on the bonds. The foregoing categories of prospective bondowners should consult their own tax advisors as to the applicability of any of these consequences.

Qualified Tax-Exempt Obligations

The city will covenant to take such actions as are necessary to designate the bonds as "qualified tax-exempt obligations" within the meaning of Section 265(b)(3) of the code, and, in the case of certain financial institutions within the meaning of Section 265(b)(5) of the code, a deduction is allowed for 80 percent of that portion of such financial institution's interest expense allocable to interest on the bonds.
