The Kansas Private Industry Council (PIC) for the Job Training Partnership Act in Service Delivery Area III is seeking solicitations of comprehensive proposals to sub-contract with any group, agency or institution, public or private, to provide the various services and training needed to serve eligible youth in Johnson, Wyandotte and Leavenworth counties in the PIC Summer Youth Employment and Training Program. 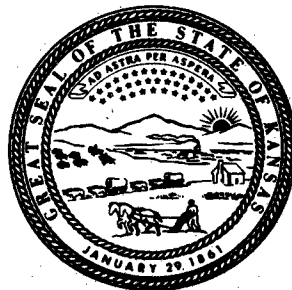

Opinion No. 88-171

Counties and County Officers—County Commissioners—Powers and Duties; Budget for Operation of Sheriff's Office.

Counties and County Officers—Sheriff—Preservation of Peace; Courthouse Security. Herbert W. Walton, District Judge, Division No. 1, Olathe, December 28, 1988.

K.S.A. 19-812 and 19-813 do not by their terms mandate the continual presence of a county sheriff at the courts of record in the county. However, the county sheriff possesses the discretionary authority to determine if and when such security is necessary. The board of county commissioners is vested with general authority and responsibility over county expenditures, but may not prevent a county official from carrying out statutorily imposed duties. Competing county budgetary constraints must therefore be reasonably balanced with the need to fund the performance of discretionary official duties. Cited herein: Kan. State Boards, Commissions and Authorities—Regulation of Psychologists; Licensure of Psychologists—Practice of Psychology; Exempt Settings. Mary Ann Gabel, Executive Director, Behavioral Sciences Regulatory Board, Topeka, December 28, 1988.

A person with a Ph.D. in psychology who is eligible for licensure is not required to be a licensed psychologist or a registered masters level psychologist (RMLP) if that person teaches psychology for a state university or college. However, a person hired by a state university or college to provide psychological services to students, or whose duties include providing such services, must be either a licensed psychologist or an RMLP. Cities of the Second Class—Elections—Elective and Appointive Officers; Terms; Compensation. Ronald S. Reuter, Roeland Park City Attorney, Overland Park, December 28, 1988.

Pursuant to ordinances of the city of Roeland Park, the duties of the city attorney must be prescribed by ordinance passed by the governing body. Accordingly, where no ordinance prescribes that the city attorney shall represent city officers who are sued in an individual capacity (for actions they have taken in their official capacities), the city attorney may refuse to represent such city officials, and such refusal is not a cause for removal from office. If, at the direction of the governing body, and in the absence of any fee agreement with an individual official, the Roeland Park City Attorney voluntarily undertakes the defense of a city officer who has been sued in an individual capacity, it is our opinion that he is to be compensated at the hourly rate established for services provided for the city. K.S.A. 38-1202 and K.S.A. 1987 Supp. 59-2278b do not require a pregnant woman who is not a Kansas resident, but whose child is born in Kansas, to comply with the procedures of the interstate compact on placement of children. Opinion No. 88-175

Taxation—Judicial Foreclosure and Sale of Real Estate by County—Order of Sale; Deed, Execution and Recordation; Tax Liens. Constance M. Achterberg, Saline County Counselor, Salina; and Joseph O'Sullivan, Reno County Counselor, Hutchinson, December 28, 1988.

K.S.A. 79-2804 gives fee simple title to purchasers at tax foreclosure sales subject only to valid covenants running with the land, valid easements of record, and taxes and interest that have become a lien on the property subsequent to the date upon which the judgment was rendered. Taxes do not become due and current until November 1 of the year. At that time those taxes become a lien upon the property. If the tax foreclosure judgment is rendered before the attachment of a tax lien, a purchaser takes subject to that lien. To the extent that Attorney General Opinion No. 77-167 conflicts with conclusions contained herein, it is hereby withdrawn. **NOTICE OF HEARING
ON PROPOSED**

ADMINISTRATIVE REGULATIONS

A public hearing will be conducted at 10 a.m. Monday,
February 6, in Hearing Room B, fourth floor, Docking
State Office Building, Topeka, to consider the adoption
of proposed permanent regulations for the conservation
of crude oil and natural gas.

The period of 30 days notice from the date of this
publication to the date of the public hearing constitutes
a public comment period for the purpose of receiving
written public comments on the proposed rules and regu-
lations. Comments may be submitted to the State Cor-
poration Commission, Attn: Shari Feist Albrecht,
Director, 200 Colorado Derby Building, 202 W. 1st,
Wichita 67202.

Copies of the proposed regulations and the economic
impact statements may be obtained at the Wichita ad-
dress. Persons requesting a copy of the proposed regu-
lations and economic impact statements, in accordance
with K.S.A. 45-219, will be required to compensate the
State Corporation Commission for the cost of
reproduction.

All interested parties will be given a reasonable op-
portunity at the hearing to present their views, orally or
in writing, in regard to the adoption of the proposed
regulations. All written or oral comments submitted by
interested parties on or before February 6 will be con-
sidered by the commission as a basis for making changes
to these proposed permanent regulations.

The following is a brief summary of the proposed regu-
lations and economic impact statements:

K.A.R. 82-3-101 (Permanent Regulation). The amend-
ment adds one new definition (core), deletes an existing
definition that is unnecessary because the definition exists
in K.S.A. 1987 Supp. 55-150 (operator), and amends four
existing definitions: conservation division, gas well, oil
well, and tertiary recovery process. These definitions were
added or amended to further clarify existing rules and
regulations.

Economic Impact: None.

K.A.R. 82-3-103a (Permanent Regulation). This new regulation requires an operator to give written notice to the Conservation Division before drilling any hole where intended deviation from the surface to the top of the producing formation exceeds 7°. The regulation further requires permitting of such deviation or the drilling of holes laterally into producing formations only after notice and hearing before the commission.

Economic Impact: Operators and the Conservation Division will bear associated hearing costs. Where water rights are involved, Division of Water Resources may be affected.

K.A.R. 82-3-105 (Permanent Regulation). The amendment deletes language requiring operators to attach cementing information to well completion reports. The deleted language has been more appropriately relocated in K.A.R. 82-3-130, which addresses completion reports.

Economic Impact: None.

K.A.R. 82-3-106 (Permanent Regulation). The amendment clarifies the identity of Table 1 as referenced throughout the regulation and clarifies the method for cement placement. The amendment provides for an alternative method of cement placement, the backside squeeze, which is permitted only upon request to the appropriate Conservation Division district field office.

Economic Impact: Limited to cost of Conservation Division's review of cementing proposals.

K.A.R. 82-3-107 (Permanent Regulation). The amendment requires operators drilling service wells or drilling or recompleting holes for the exploration of oil and gas to preserve samples and cores to be delivered to the Kansas Geological Survey. The amendment also requires the operator to retain samples and cores for 120 days after the spudding of the well or hole. The amendment specifies the manner by which the samples or cores shall be prepared for delivery to KGS. The amendment further requires that the operator provide unrestricted access to the operator's facility to KGS personnel where retention of the core is required by the operator. Any such access shall be subject to any requests for confidentiality under the rule. The amendment prohibits disposal of cores requested by KGS without permission of KGS. The amendment clarifies that wire line service companies are to provide a monthly list of all logging services performed on each hole serviced in Kansas to the Conservation Division.

Economic Impact: Operators will bear the expense of providing samples and cores to KGS and the expense of requesting confidentiality. KCC and KGS will bear the cost of handling the additional information from cores.

K.A.R. 82-3-109 (Permanent Regulation). The amendment clarifies the number of copies of the well spacing application to be filed and with whom. The amendment prohibits the drilling of wells within the area sought to be spaced once the notice of the spacing hearing has been provided and before the commission has approved the proposal unless the intended well location conforms to the most restrictive location provision sought in the pending application. The amendment also provides for exceptions to the prohibition after notice and hearing on the exception request or when the nonconforming notice of intent is accompanied by waivers of objection signed by each operator, unleased mineral owner, and lessee entitled to notice under the rule.

Economic Impact: Applicants for exception and the Conservation Division will bear associated hearing costs.

K.A.R. 82-3-114 (Permanent Regulation). The amendment clarifies that all zones which are open in the well and which are being produced on the adjacent lease shall be plugged if the well in question is located one-half mile or less from the lease or unit boundary line. The rule does not apply to zones which are not producing within one-half mile of the well to be plugged.

Economic Impact: None.

K.A.R. 82-3-120 (Permanent Regulation). The amendment requires licensees to notify the Conservation Division in writing of any change in information supplied on the license application.

Economic Impact: Licensees will bear the cost of notification.

K.A.R. 82-3-123 (Permanent Regulation). The amendment allows the commingling of oil and/or gas, either from prorated or nonprorated sources of supply. The amendment specifies that when an applicant is seeking to commingle prorated sources of supply that such commingling shall be permitted only after notice and hearing. Where gas is to be commingled the applicant is required to notify the gas purchaser in addition to the usual noticed parties specified in the rule. Notice is required to be given to each offset operator or lessee of record within a one-half mile radius of the subject well. Notice to unleased mineral owners within the same distance has been deleted since K.S.A. 1987 Supp. 55-703 provides that only owners and operators of developed leases have correlative rights.

Economic Impact: Operators will bear the cost of preparing the commingling application. The operator and the Conservation Division will bear associated hearing costs if a hearing is warranted.

K.A.R. 82-3-123a (Permanent Regulation). This new regulation allows the commingling of fluids from one or more intervals with fluids from a productive interval (dump flood) only upon application to and approval by the commission. The regulation specifies the contents of such applications, notice provisions, and a protest period.

Economic Impact: Operators will bear expense of preparing application. The operator and the Conservation Division will bear associated hearing costs if a hearing is warranted.

K.A.R. 82-3-124 (Permanent Regulation). The amendment clarifies that dual completion applications shall be served without attachments to each operator or lessee of record within one-half mile of the subject well.

Economic Impact: None.

K.A.R. 82-3-130 (Permanent Regulation). The amendment clarifies that completion reports are to be filed on all wells including dry and abandoned wells. The amendment also includes language relocated from K.A.R. 82-3-105 requiring operators to include cementing information with the affidavit of completion.

Economic Impact: None.

K.A.R. 82-3-139 (Permanent Regulation). The amendment requires applicants in matters which can be handled summarily to file a proposed order with the application.

Economic Impact: Applicants will bear costs of preparing a proposed order.

K.A.R. 82-3-140 (Permanent Regulation). The amendment deletes reference to the Crude Oil Windfall Profit Tax of 1980, which was repealed in August 1988. The amendment further specifies that applications for tertiary recovery project certification are to be filed with the Conservation Division.

(continued)

Economic Impact: None.

K.A.R. 82-3-142 (Permanent Regulation). This new regulation incorporates the commission's general rule of practice and procedure (K.A.R. 82-1-229) and modifies it for use in the Conservation Division. The rule requires the pre-filing of written testimony at least 20 days in advance of hearing for the applicant and at least 10 days in advance of hearing for any intervenor or protestant in matters coming before the commission on its monthly oil and gas docket.

Economic Impact: Applicants, intervenors, protestants, and commission staff will bear the cost of preparing written testimony.

K.A.R. 82-3-143 (Permanent Regulation). This new regulation describes the procedure by which certain specified monthly docket matters may be handled on a summary basis. The rule requires that applicants in such proceedings serve and publish notice of the pending application, allowing potential protestants 15 days in which to file a protest to the application. If no protest is filed within the specified time frame the application is granted without hearing. If a protest is filed or if the commission deems, on its own motion, that there shall be a hearing, a hearing shall ensue. The rule further specifies where notice is to be published.

Economic Impact: None.

K.A.R. 82-3-203 (Permanent Regulation). The amendment clarifies that the effective date for oil allowables is the date of first production.

Economic Impact: None.

K.A.R. 82-3-205 (Permanent Regulation). The amendment clarifies that the proration period and allowable period previously referenced is one month.

Economic Impact: None.

K.A.R. 82-3-305 (Permanent Regulation). The amendment specifies that those parties owning, maintaining, or operating metering devices used to record gas sales shall keep the original field record consisting of magnetic tapes as an option to the required meter charts or records of gas purchased.

Economic Impact: None.

K.A.R. 82-3-311 (Permanent Regulation). The amendment deletes reference to rules and regulations at the request of the Joint Committee on Rules and Regulations.

Economic Impact: None.

K.A.R. 82-3-400 (Permanent Regulation). The amendment adds enhanced recovery natural gas injection or disposal operations and natural gas injection for storage operations to those operations for which an injection or disposal application is required. The amendment further specifies March 1 as the deadline for submitting injection or disposal reports to the commission for the previous calendar year.

Economic Impact: Operators will bear cost of preparing and filing the application and providing notice as required. The operator and the Conservation Division will bear associated hearing costs if a hearing is warranted.

K.A.R. 82-3-401 (Permanent Regulation). The amendment specifies that the original and two copies of an application for authority to inject or dispose fluids into a well shall be filed with the commission, relocates existing language addressing disposal and producing zones to a more logical location for sequential clarity, sets out requirements for dually completed injection and production or disposal and production wells, requires the cancellation

of the injection or disposal authority for dually completed wells when the producing interval ceases commercial production, and adds formation pressure or pressure at the formation face as factors for consideration by the commission in addition to maximum surface pressure in approving injection or disposal applications.

Economic Impact: Operators will bear costs of providing additional copies of the application and demonstrating mechanical integrity and sealing perforations (upon cessation of commercial production) in dually completed injection or disposal wells.

K.A.R. 82-3-402 (Permanent Regulation). The amendment clarifies that all additional casing next to the borehole shall be cemented to protect and isolate fresh and usable water resources. Cementing is to be completed with a portland cement blend unless otherwise provided by K.A.R. 82-3-106. The amendment requires the operator to notify the proper district office prior to cementing and also allows the use of a backside squeeze with the approval of the district office. The amendment further provides that operators may seek an exception to the required cementing only upon written request to the director of the Conservation Division.

Economic Impact: None.

K.A.R. 82-3-405 (Permanent Regulation). The amendment further explains the fluid depression test and establishes a minimum calculated pressure for such tests of no less than 100 psig. The amendment prohibits the operation of injection or disposal wells which have not first shown mechanical integrity. Failure to demonstrate mechanical integrity triggers a 90-day period during which the well must be repaired and retested to show mechanical integrity, plugged, or the leaks isolated to show that the well will not pose a threat to fresh or usable water resources or endanger correlative rights.

Economic Impact: Operators will bear costs of assuring mechanical integrity of injection or disposal wells or of plugging such wells.

K.A.R. 82-3-407 (Permanent Regulation). The amendment clarifies that the deadline for submitting annual injection or disposal reports to the commission for the previous calendar year is the following March 1.

Economic Impact: None.

K.A.R. 82-3-408 (Permanent Regulation). The amendment clarifies that a copy of the approved transfer of injection or disposal authority shall be mailed to the new operator.

Economic Impact: None.

K.A.R. 82-3-409 (Permanent Regulation). The amendment clarifies that injection or disposal wells in existence before December 8, 1982, are considered to be existing injection or disposal wells in which injection or disposal are prohibited unless the operator has filed by May 1, 1983, an inventory of existing wells.

Economic Impact: None unless operators failed to timely provide the commission with an inventory of existing injection or disposal wells.

THE KANSAS LOTTERY

TEMPORARY ADMINISTRATIVE
REGULATIONS

Article 1.—GENERAL OPERATION

111-1-5. Restrictions on Who May Participate. (a) Persons directly involved in the production of Kansas Lottery Live, the installation and maintenance of computers or computer equipment for on-line games, the installation and maintenance of telecommunications equipment connecting on-line terminals to the central computer system, and any person, or any officers, agents or employees of a business providing supplies, services and equipment used directly in the operation of a lottery game or any other employee of such a business working the majority of his or her time at the Kansas Lottery or any regional Lottery office, are precluded from purchasing lottery tickets and from winning prizes. Persons only tangentially connected to the Kansas lottery are not included within this prohibition.

(b) In the event of a dispute concerning this requirement, the executive director has the authority to determine the facts underlying the dispute and make a decision as to the participation of such a person in purchasing lottery tickets and winning prizes. Article 2.—LOTTERY RETAILERS

111-2-5. Retailer Incentive Bonus. (a) On all instant tickets validated on or after December 19, 1988, in which the prize is the "top prize" offered in the game it represents, the Kansas Lottery instant ticket retailer selling the ticket shall receive an incentive bonus of 10% of the amount of winnings paid to the holder of the winning ticket. The bonus shall be in addition to compensation specified in K.A.R. 111-2-4.

(b) "Top prize" is the highest prize reflected in the prize structure of the specific instant game it represents, or a doubled amount in the event there is a "doubler provision" in effect at the time of the validation.

(c) Lottery retailers selling an instant ticket producing a winning Lotto stub will also receive 10% of the prize paid to the holder of the winning Lotto stub. **TEMPORARY ADMINISTRATIVE
REGULATIONS**

**Article 11.—ADVANCED REGISTERED
NURSE PRACTITIONERS**

60-11-104a. Protocols or guidelines, defined; requirements: (a) When used in this article, the term "protocols or guidelines" means written documents containing a precise and detailed medical plan of care.

(b) Each protocol or guideline shall, at a minimum:

(1) Contain the name and signature of the nurse clinician or nurse practitioner and the name and signature of the responsible physician who have adopted the protocol or guideline;

(2) show the date the protocol or guideline was adopted or last reviewed;

(3) specify all prescription-only drugs for which the nurse clinician or nurse practitioner is permitted to write a prescription order without direct authorization from the responsible physician;

(4) specify under what circumstances, and how soon, the responsible physician must be contacted after a prescription order is written by the nurse clinician or nurse practitioner; and

(5) be maintained in an 8½ inch by 11 inch looseleaf notebook containing all protocols adopted by the nurse and doctor and kept at the nurse's principal place of practice. The notebook shall include a cover page containing:

(A) the name, license number, certificate number and telephone number of the nurse practitioner or nurse clinician and the responsible physician;

(B) the name, address and telephone number of a designated physician who agrees to direct and supervise the nurse clinician or nurse practitioner in the absence or unavailability of the responsible physician;

(C) the minimum frequency with which the protocols or guidelines are to be revised by the nurse and physician. The minimum frequency for review shall not be less than once each year; and

(D) the minimum frequency with which prescription orders are reviewed and patient charts are co-signed. The minimum frequency shall not be more than once each 30 days.

(c) This regulation shall not be construed to authorize a nurse clinician or nurse practitioner to issue a prescription order for a controlled substance.

(d) Nothing in this regulation shall be construed to prohibit any registered nurse, licensed practical nurse or advanced registered nurse practitioner from transmitting a prescription order orally or telephonically, or from administering a prescription-only drug pursuant to a lawful direction of a person licensed to practice medicine and surgery or dentistry or of a nurse practitioner or nurse clinician.

(e) When used in this regulation, terms shall be construed to have the meanings set forth in the pharmacy act of the state of Kansas, K.S.A. 1987 Supp. 65-1626.

(f) This regulation shall take effect January 10, 1989. (Authorized by K.S.A. 65-1129 and 65-1130; implementing K.S.A. 65-1130; effective T-60-9-12-88, September 12, 1988; effective T-60-12-16-88, Jan. 10, 1989.)
