## Opinion No. 89-32

**Crimes and Punishments—Kansas Criminal Code; Crimes Against Persons—Criminal Abortion; Statute Unconstitutional.** Senator Don Sallee, 1st District, Troy, March 21, 1989.

While the state may require abortions to be performed in licensed facilities from and after the first trimester, K.S.A. 21-3407 sweeps too broadly and the offending provisions cannot be severed from the rest without legislative amendment. We note that the United States Supreme Court is currently considering a case which may modify *Roe v. Wade*, and thus render this opinion invalid. Cited herein: K.S.A. 21-3407. JLM

## Opinion No. 89-33

**Waters and Watercourses—Water Storage—State Water Plan Storage Act; Conservation Storage Water Supply Fund.** Senator Paul Feleciano, Jr., 28th District, Wichita, March 21, 1989.

Kansas statutes authorize expenditures from the state conservation storage water supply fund to be made only for the purpose of acquiring or developing conservation storage water supply to implement the state water plan. Appropriations from the fund for land treatment and flood control in this instance do not meet the purpose of the statute. **Intoxicating Liquors and Beverages—Miscellaneous Provisions—Discrimination in Sales, Services or Prices Unlawful.** Senator Wint Winter, Jr., 2nd District, Lawrence, March 21, 1989.

The quantity discount prohibition of K.A.R. 14-14-11 constitutes a regulation imposed on the alcoholic beverage industry by the state itself and is therefore not subject to federal antitrust laws. **Cities and Municipalities—Modified Mayor-Council Form of Government—Adoption of Modified Mayor-Council Form of Government; Submission to Election.** Representative Clyde D. Graeber, 41st District, Leavenworth, March 22, 1989.

K.S.A. 12-10a01 provides that any city may adopt the modified mayor-council form of government pursuant to the procedure prescribed therein. The provisions of K.S.A. 12-1019, relating to acceptance of the commission form of government or the mayor-council form of government (and prescribing the form of the ballot for any election held thereunder), do not apply where the question of adopting the modified mayor-council form of government is submitted to voters pursuant to the provisions of K.S.A. 12-10a01. **REQUEST FOR ENGINEERING SERVICES**

In accordance with K.S.A. 75-5801 *et seq.*, it is the policy of the Division of Water Resources, Kansas State Board of Agriculture, to negotiate contracts for engineering services on the basis of demonstrated competence and qualifications for the type of professional services required at fair and reasonable fees. Selection criteria will consist of the following:

1. Size and professional qualifications of the firm.
2. Experience and training of the firm's staff in the measurements of rate and quality of water pumped or removed from wells, lakes and streams, collection of data in conjunction with the use of water for irrigation, industrial, or municipal purposes with principal emphasis on irrigation use. Experience and training in hydrology and hydraulics, water flow measurements (primarily in closed conduits), and knowledge of energy and consumption metering will be a consideration.
3. Workload of the firm.
4. The firm's performance record.
5. Compliance with Kansas statutes. All firms must comply with the requirements set forth in K.S.A. 74-7001 *et seq.*

Engineering firms engaged in lawful practice of providing engineering services and interested in providing services for collecting water use data, to determine the extent that a water right is perfected (developed), are encouraged to submit by April 28 a statement of qualification and experience to: Division of Water Resources, Kansas State Board of Agriculture, 109 S.W. 9th, Topeka 66612-1283.

**Advisory Opinion No. 89-5**

Written March 15, 1989, to Robert G. Knight, Wichita.

This opinion is in response to your letter of February 8, 1989, in which you request an opinion from the Kansas Public Disclosure Commission concerning the local conflict of interest laws.

We understand you request this opinion in your capacity as a city council member of the city of Wichita.

You advise us you recently took a new position with a public relations firm. You are an independent contractor and handle only certain accounts for the firm. All the clients are clients of the firm and pay their fees for services to the firm. You are paid by the firm a percentage of the fees paid by those clients.

You have disclosed your substantial interest in the public relations firm. You ask if you have to disclose the individual clients of the firm for which you do work as well.

K.S.A. 75-4301 defines "Substantial interest" as follows:

"The ownership by an individual or his or her spouse, either individually or collectively of a legal or equitable interest exceeding five thousand dollars (\$5,000) or five percent (5%) of any business, whichever is less, and also including the receipt by an individual or his or her spouse directly or indirectly of any salary, gratuity, other compensation or remuneration or a contract for or promise or expectation of any such salary, gratuity, other compensation or remuneration having a dollar value of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) or more in the current or immediately preceding or succeeding calendar year from any business or combination of businesses, and also including the holding of the position of officer or director of any business, irrespective of the amount of compensation or remuneration received by the person holding any such position. If a person's salary, compensation or other remuneration is a portion or percentage of a fee paid to a business or combination of businesses, a person shall have a substantial interest in any client who pays a fee to such business or combination of businesses from which fee such person receives one thousand dollars (\$1,000) or more in the current or immediately preceding calendar year."

Applying this language to your situation, we can only conclude that you do hold a "substantial interest" in any client from which your portion of the fee is \$1,000 or more. Thus, under K.S.A. 75-4302(c), you will need to file an amended report within 10 days of the receipt of a portion of a fee which meets the above test.

## Article 11.—COMMUNITY CORRECTIONS

**44-11-113. Comprehensive plan; background information.** The initial comprehensive plan shall include background information defining the planning unit's correctional problems and needs. The information shall be updated annually and the plan shall describe trends that are evolving or anticipated. The information shall include:

- (a) The number and types of reported offenses;
- (b) the number of adult and juvenile arrests, by offense;
- (c) the disposition of adult and juvenile arrests, by offense;
- (d) the local correctional and related resources currently available, extent of use, and potential for increased use; and
- (e) primary correctional needs as identified by the corrections advisory board. The set of primary correctional needs specified annually in the month of July by the secretary shall be considered by the corrections advisory board in preparing the comprehensive plan. (Authorized by K.S.A. and implementing K.S.A. 75-5292, 75-5294, 75-52,102; effective May 1, 1981; amended Feb. 6, 1989; amended May 15, 1989.)

**44-11-121. Fiscal management.** (a) Each planning

unit shall designate one person to be responsible for the supervision of all fiscal matters related to the community corrections grant funds received. This person shall comply with state and county rules governing the management of county funds and shall provide information to the corrections advisory board and the secretary on a monthly basis on forms provided by the secretary.

(b) A monthly financial status report shall be submitted to the secretary within 10 days after the end of each month, including certified statements detailing the amounts expended and cost incurred for correctional services.

(c) Each county receiving grant funds shall submit to the secretary a quarterly financial report within 10 days after the end of each calendar quarter. The quarterly financial report shall include the amount of funds received to date, the amount expended to date, and the amount of funds needed for program operations during the next quarter based on the approved operational budget.

(d) Each county shall be required to submit a final financial status report to the secretary within 60 days after the end of each calendar year. The total amount of unexpended funds for each county receiving grant funds shall be determined by the secretary by March 1st of each calendar year.

(e) Each county receiving grant funds shall submit to the secretary an audit of community corrections grant funds in the manner provided by K.S.A. 75-1124, and amendments thereto. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 75-5294, 75-5296; effective May 1, 1981; amended Feb. 6, 1989; amended May 15, 1989.)

**44-11-123. Changes in the comprehensive plan and budget.** When a planning unit wishes to change the comprehensive plan during the grant year, it may do so by either amendment of the plans or transfer of funds. (a) Amendments.

(1) The comprehensive plan shall be amended any time funded programs or administrative activities are being added to or deleted from a comprehensive plan or whenever community corrections grant funds in excess of \$5,000 or 5% of the total annual grant, whichever is less, are being reallocated within or between funded program items in the comprehensive plan.

(2) Each amendment to the comprehensive plan shall be adopted by the corrections advisory board and the board of county commissioners and submitted to the secretary for approval.

(b) Transfers.

(1) A transfer of funds shall be required whenever community corrections grant funds less than \$5,000 or 5% of the total annual grant, whichever is less, are being reallocated within or between funded items in the comprehensive plan. The total amount transferred within or between fund items shall not exceed \$5,000 or 5% of the total grant, within that grant year.

(2) Transfers shall be approved by the community corrections administrator, where appointed, or by the corrections advisory board and shall be reported to the secretary on the monthly financial report for the period in which the transfer was made. **40-1-28. Insurance holding companies; information required; disclaimer of affiliation; termination of registration; acquisition of control.** National association of insurance commissioners insurance holding company system model regulation with reporting forms and instructions, June 1986 edition, is hereby adopted by reference, subject to the following exceptions:

- (a) Sections 1, 2 and 3 are not adopted;
- (b) form D "Prior Notice of a Transaction" and all references thereto are not adopted;
- (c) section 4(b) is completed by inserting "Two"; "Kansas, 420 S.W. 9th Street, Topeka, Kansas"; "Chief Examiner"; and, "30" respectively in the spaces provided;
- (d) section 4(a) is amended by substituting "K.S.A. 60-3304 and 40-3305" for "Sections 3, 4 and 5 of this Act" appearing in the first sentence;
- (e) section 6(b)(3) is completed by inserting "30" in the space provided;
- (f) section 8 is hereby amended by the addition of the following: "The Act means the statutes relating to insurance holding companies contained in Article 33, Chapter 40 Kansas Statutes Annotated";
- (g) section 9 is not adopted;
- (h) section 10 is amended by substituting "K.S.A. 40-3304" for "Section 3 of the Act";
- (i) section 12(a) is amended by substituting "K.S.A. 40-3304(a)" for "Section 3(a)(1) of the Act";
- (j) section 12(b) is amended by substituting "K.S.A. 40-3304(a)" for "Section 3(a)(1)";
- (k) section 13 is amended by substituting "K.S.A. 40-3305" for "Section 4 of the Act";
- (l) section 14 is amended by substituting "K.S.A. 40-3305" for "Section 4 of the Act";

- (q) section 21 is added as follows: "Section 21. Acquisition of control—statement filing. (1) A person required to file a statement pursuant to K.S.A. 40-3304 shall, prior to doing any act towards the acquisition of control of a domestic insurer, file a letter with the commissioner of insurance indicating the person's interest in the possible acquisition of control, the name of the domestic insurer to be acquired, that the person is aware of and will comply with the applicable provisions of the Kansas insurance holding companies act, and that all negotiations or agreements to acquire control of the domestic insurer will be conditioned upon the approval of the commissioner of insurance.
- (2) A person required to file a statement pursuant to K.S.A. 40-3304 shall furnish the required information on form A, hereby made a part of this regulation."

(r) item 12(b) and (c) of form A is amended to read as follows: "(b) The financial statements shall include the annual financial statements of the persons identified in item 2(c) for the preceding five fiscal years or for such lesser period as such applicant and its affiliates and any predecessors thereof shall have been in existence, and similar information covering the period from the end of such person's last fiscal year, to a date not earlier than 90 days prior to the filing of the Form A. Such statements may be prepared on either an individual basis, or, unless the commissioner otherwise requires, on a consolidated basis if such consolidated statements are prepared in the usual course of business.

Unless otherwise permitted by the commissioner, the annual financial statements of the applicant shall be accompanied by the certificate of an independent public accountant to the effect that such statements present fairly the financial position of the applicant and the results of its operations for the year then ended, in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles or with requirements of insurance or other accounting principles prescribed or permitted under law. If the applicant is an insurer which is actively engaged in the business of insurance, the financial statements need not be certified, provided they are based on the annual statement of such person filed with the insurance department of the person's domiciliary state and are in accordance with the requirements of insurance or other accounting principles prescribed or permitted under the law and regulations of such state.

(c) File as exhibits copies of all tender offers for, requests or invitations for, tenders of, exchange offers for, and agreements to acquire or exchange any voting securities of the insurer, and if distributed, of additional soliciting material relating thereto, any proposed employment, consultation, advisory or management contracts concerning the insurer, annual reports to the stockholders of the insurer and the applicant for the last two fiscal years, and any additional documents or papers required by form A or K.S.A. 40-3304."

(s) item 13 is amended by substituting "K.S.A. 40-3304" for "Section 3 of the Act";

(t) the second sentence of item 2(c) of form A is not adopted;

(u) the second sentence of item 2 of form B is not adopted;

(v) item 5 of form B is amended by substituting "K.S.A. 40-3305" for "Section 4 of the Act";

## Article 2.—LIFE INSURANCE

**40-2-12. Replacement of life insurance and annuities.** (a) Definitions.

(1) "Agent" means each agent, broker, or other person representing an insurer in the sale of any type of policy.

(2) "Company" or "insurer" means each company, society, association or other financial institution which issues

a policy subject to the supervision of the Kansas insurance department.

(3) "Life insurance" means each life insurance policy, annuity, or variable annuity contract, unless specifically exempted in subsection (b).

(4) "Substantial cash values" means each transaction in which an amount exceeding 50 percent of the tabular cash value may be released on one or more of the existing policies.

(5) "Substantial borrowings" means all transactions in which an amount exceeding 50 percent of the tabular cash value may be borrowed on one or more existing policies.

(6) "Securities," as used in this rule, shall not include any insurance or endowment policy, or annuity contract under which an insurance company promises to pay a fixed or variable sum of money either in a lump sum or periodically for life or for some other specified period.

(7) "Replacement" means each transaction in which new life insurance may be purchased from an agent who knows, or reasonably should know that, as a part of the transaction or in consequence of it, a previously existing life insurance has been or is likely to be:

(A) Lapsed or surrendered;

(B) converted into paid-up insurance, continued as extended term insurance or another form of non-forfeiture benefit;

(C) converted to effect a reduction either in the amount of the existing life insurance, or in the period of time the existing life insurance will continue in force;

(D) reissued with a reduction in amount so that substantial cash values are released; or

(E) assigned as collateral for a loan or subjected to substantial borrowing of loan values in single or multiple transactions.

(8) "Sales proposal" means individualized, written sales aids. Sales aids of a general nature, which are maintained in the insurer's advertising compliance file, shall not be considered a sales proposal.

(b) This regulation shall not apply when:

(1) The application for the new life insurance is made to the same insurer that issued the existing life insurance, and a contractual policy change or conversion privilege is being exercised;

(2) The new life insurance is provided under:

(A) A group life insurance policy; or

(B) policies covering employees of an employer, debtors of a creditor, or members of an association, which are distributed on a mass merchandising basis and administered by group-type methods;

(3) The existing life insurance is a non-convertible term policy with five years or less to expire and which cannot be renewed;

(4) The solicitation is made by direct mail and:

(A) All sales material is standard and printed;

(B) the insurance company notifies the existing insurance company within three business days that the proposed insured has answered "yes" to the replacement question in the application; and

(C) concurrent with the notice to the existing company, the insurance company mails to the applicant a copy of the "notice to applicant regarding replacement of life insurance" described in subsection (h); or

(5) The policy is issued in connection with a pension, profit sharing, an individual retirement account, or other benefit plan qualifying for an income tax deduction of premiums.

(c) Each life insurance agent shall:

(1) Obtain a statement signed by the applicant as a part of each life insurance application as to whether this insurance will replace existing life insurance; and

(2) submit to the insurer in connection with each life insurance application a statement as to whether, to the best of the agent's knowledge, a life insurance replacement is involved in the transaction.

(d) When a replacement is involved, each life insurance agent shall:

(1) Include as part of each application a list of all existing life insurance policies to be replaced;

(2) present to the applicant, when the application is submitted, a copy of each sales proposal used, and a "notice to applicants regarding replacement of life insurance" in a form acceptable to the commissioner. The agent shall leave the forms with the applicant after explaining their content;

(3) submit with the application a copy of each proposal used, and the name of each insurer which issued the insurance being replaced; and

(4) have the applicant acknowledge receipt of the "notice to applicants regarding replacement of life insurance."

(e) Each insurer shall:

(1) Inform its field representatives of the requirements of this regulation;

(2) require with each application a statement signed by the applicant as to whether the insurance will replace existing life insurance; and

(3) require in connection with each application for life insurance a statement signed by the agent as to whether, to the best of the agent's knowledge, a life insurance replacement is involved in the transaction.

(f) When a replacement is involved, the replacing insurer shall:

(1) Require with each application a list prepared by the agent of all existing life insurance policies to be replaced;

(2) obtain a copy of any sales proposal used, proof of the receipt by the applicant of the "notice to applicants regarding replacement of life insurance," and the name of each insurer whose insurance is being replaced;

(3) within three working days, notify each insurer whose insurance is being replaced;

(4) delay, if it is not the existing insurer, policy issuance for 20 days after sending the notification required by subparagraph (3). The replacing insurer may issue its policy immediately when:

(A) Each notice states that the policy or a separate written notice shall state that the applicant has a right to an unconditional refund of all premiums paid, within 20 days after delivery of the policy; and

(B) notice to the existing insurer is sent within three working days of the date its policy is issued;

(5) maintain copies of each sales proposal used, proof of receipt by the applicant of the "notice to applicants regarding replacement," and the applicant's signed statement with respect to replacement, in its home office for at least three years or until the conclusion of the next succeeding regular examination by the insurance department of its state of domicile, whichever is later. Each insurer receiving notice that its existing insurance may be replaced shall maintain a copy of the notice, indexed by insurer, for three years after receipt or until the conclusion of the next regular examination conducted by the

(continued)

insurance department of its state of domicile, whichever is later; and

(6) either by inclusion in the replacement policy or by a rider attached thereto; provide that the new life insurance issued by the replacing insurer will not be contestable by it, in the event of the insured's death, to any greater extent than the replaced life insurance would have been contestable by the insurer providing the replaced coverage had a replacement not occurred. This subsection shall not apply to any amount of insurance provided by the replacement policy which exceeds the amount of insurance provided by the replaced policy.

(g) With the exception of the reference to a comparative information form, the forms set forth in exhibits A, B, and C of the national association of insurance commissioners' model life insurance replacement regulation, December 1978 edition, are hereby adopted by reference. Equivalent forms may be adopted with the prior approval of the insurance commissioner. If the forms adopted by reference require modification for replacements involving annuity contracts or contracts sold by direct mail methods, each company shall modify the form and submit the modified form to the insurance commissioner for approval. A copy of the modified forms shall be filed with the insurance commissioner.

(h) If an agent who holds both a life insurance license and a securities license proposes to sell securities to a policyholder which will result in situations set forth in paragraph (7) of subsection (a), the agent shall give written notice to the policyholder before consummating the proposal. Each written notice shall:

(1) Be dated and signed by the licensed agent, and state the agent's address;

(2) state the name and address of the policyholder;

(3) describe the insurance which has been or is to be affected, including the policy number, amount of insurance, plan of insurance, issue age, effective date, and the total premium;

(4) state how the insurance will be affected, the amount of cash value affected and the facts which support replacement; and

(5) list the company or companies involved.

(i) Each dually licensed agent shall keep a file containing a copy of each written notice. The agent shall keep a copy of each notice for three years. The file shall be subject to inspection and review by the insurance department, upon written request.

(j) When any licensed agent solicits life insurance in connection with the sale of securities not prohibited by K.S.A. 40-232, this agent shall, in addition to the requirements of subsections (c) and (d), submit a copy of the notice required by this subsection (i) to the insurer. Each notice shall be attached to and become a part of exhibit A.

(k) Any violation of this rule shall be presumed to constitute a misleading representation for the purpose of inducing or tending to induce an insured to lapse, forfeit or surrender the insured's existing insurance. (Authorized by K.S.A. 40-103, 40-240a; implementing K.S.A. 1988 Supp. 40-2404; effective Jan. 1, 1971; amended Jan. 1, 1972; amended, E-72-20, Sept. 1, 1972; amended Jan. 1, 1973; amended Feb. 15, 1977; amended May 1, 1982; amended May 1, 1983; amended May 1, 1986; amended May 1, 1987; amended May 15, 1989.)

### Article 3.—FIRE AND CASUALTY INSURANCE

**40-3-5. Fire and casualty insurance; rating organizations; filing of forms.** For the purpose of this regulation, the word "company" includes a company or exchange of any type that is required to file rates pursuant to K.S.A. 40-931 or 40-1115, or both. The word "forms" means policies, endorsements, and standard provisions used in policies or endorsements. (a) When the constitution, articles of association, bylaws, or regulations of a rating organization grant control over the forms to be used by its member and subscriber companies, the policy forms shall be filed in compliance with K.S.A. 40-216. Each individual company shall also submit the Kansas mandatory endorsements, the policy declarations, and each policy jacket to the department of insurance for approval.

(b) After approval, forms shall be adhered to by all members and subscribers of the rating organization making the filings. Each deviation from approved filings shall be in violation of K.S.A. 40-216, except as provided under K.S.A. 40-931, and 40-1115.

(c) Except as provided in subsection (a), each company shall control the filings of forms to prevent unauthorized filings by individuals. Each company shall comply with the filing requirements for those forms not filed in their behalf by a rating organization. Acceptance of each standardized form filed by a rating organization shall not permit a company, a company member, or a subscriber to use the form without making an individual filing in accordance with K.S.A. 40-216.

(d) Each company becoming a member or subscriber of a rating organization shall be presumed to be issuing the forms of the rating organization from the effective date of membership or subscribership.

(e) Upon retiring from membership or subscribership in a rating organization, each company shall meet filing requirements by making individual filings. (Authorized by K.S.A. 40-103; implementing K.S.A. 40-216; effective Jan. 1, 1966; amended Jan. 1, 1967; amended May 1, 1979; amended May 1, 1986; amended May 15, 1989.)

**40-3-44. Automobile insurance; underwriting information; restrictions.** (a) Except as otherwise provided in this regulation, information regarding motor vehicle accidents, traffic violations or related convictions occurring more than three years prior to the date of the application shall not be requested or utilized by insurers in connection with or in making an underwriting decision.

(b) In lieu of the prohibition contained in section (a) of this regulation, information regarding convictions for violations enumerated in K.S.A. 1987 Supp. 8-285 occurring no more than five years prior to the date of the application may be utilized for underwriting purposes. (Authorized by K.S.A. 40-103; implementing K.S.A. 40-1112; effective May 15, 1989.)

### Article 4.—ACCIDENT AND HEALTH INSURANCE

**40-4-35a. Medicare supplement policies; P.L. 100-360, transitional requirements.** Sections 3, 4, 5, 6 and 8 of the national association of insurance commissioner's model regulation to implement transitional requirements for the conversion of medicare supplement insurance benefits and premiums to conform to medicare program revisions, June 1988 edition, are hereby adopted by reference. (Authorized by K.S.A. 40-103; implementing

K.S.A. 40-2221; effective T-40-12-16-88, Dec. 16, 1988; effective May 15, 1989.)

**40-4-38.** Accident and health insurance policies; limited benefits; notice required. Each limited individual policy of accident and health insurance shall have the words "this is a limited policy—read it carefully" printed on or attached to the face of the policy in not less than 18 point bold face type or in some other manner that distinguishes it from the print otherwise appearing in the policy. For the purposes of this regulation, a limited policy is one that provides long-term care coverage, accident only coverage, specified disease coverage, specific accident coverage, or one that contains unusual exclusions, limitations, reductions or conditions of such a restrictive nature that the benefits under the policy are limited in frequency or in amounts. #### Article 7.—AGENTS

**40-7-7.** Agents; procedure for obtaining licenses and company certification. (a) Licenses.

(1) Each individual desiring to become licensed shall complete and submit an application and evidence of graduation from an accredited four year high school or its equivalent. A copy of the applicant's high school diploma or college diploma or transcript, certified by school authorities, or a certificate of completion of the general education development test (GED) by the applicant shall be acceptable evidence.

(2) From and after May 1, 1989, the application fee prescribed by L. 1988, Ch. 151, Sec. 2. shall accompany the application and other required material.

(3) If the applicant has not been licensed and certified as a resident agent in this state during the two years immediately preceding the date of the application, the applicant shall pass an examination covering each class or subclass of insurance that the applicant intends to write.

(b) Certification.

(1) The company certification shall be completed to show the company name, name and address of the agent to be certified, the code of the desired certification, the effective date, and the address of the 457 office submitting the certification.

(2) Certification shall be made only by an authorized representative of the insurance company or, from and after May 1, 1989, by an authorized representative of a corporation, association, partnership, proprietorship or other legal entity holding a direct agency appointment from an insurance company and shall be accompanied by proper certification fees.

(3) The company certification of a nonresident agent shall be accompanied by a certification from the chief insurance regulatory official of the applicant's state of domicile indicating that the applicant is duly licensed as an insurance agent in that state for the classes of insurance to be transacted in Kansas. **40-7-13.** Agents; scope, subclassification; type and conduct of examinations; reexamination. (a) The licensing examination for each agent shall test the applicant's knowledge in the following areas:

(1) The laws of Kansas, including:

(A) pertinent provisions of the statutes of Kansas; and  
(B) rules and regulations of the insurance department;

(2) general insurance, including:

(A) duties and responsibilities of a licensed agent; and  
(B) basic insurance knowledge; and

(3) the specific classes or subclasses of insurance for which application is made.

(b) for examination purposes, the classifications and subclassifications of insurance shall be as follows:

Class	Subclass
(1) Life Insurance;	
(2) health insurance;	
(3) casualty insurance;	title insurance;
(4) property insurance;	crop insurance; and
(5) variable contracts.	

(c) Persons failing to score at least 70 percent on any examination shall have failed that examination and shall not be qualified for a license for that class or subclass. Notification of the result of each examination shall be provided to the applicant only.

(d) Examinations shall be conducted as follows:

(1) Each applicant shall be advised of eligibility for examination by the commissioner or the commissioner's designee.

(2) The applicant's licensing application shall remain effective for a period of one year from the date received. On and after May 1, 1989, an examination registration shall be effective for a period of 90 days from the date the registration is validated. **40-7-20.** (Authorized by and implementing L. 1986, Ch. 170, Sec. 1; effective, T-88-1, Jan. 5, 1987; effective May 1, 1987; revoked May 15, 1989.)

**40-7-20a.** Agents; brokers; continuing education; approval of courses; requirements. (a) Definitions. For the purposes of this regulation:

(1) "Coordinator" means an individual who is responsible for monitoring continuing education offerings;

(2) "correspondence courses" means courses that are primarily delivered or conducted in other than a classroom setting or with on-site instruction and are designed to be completed independently by the student;

(3) "course" means a series of lectures or lessons dealing with a particular subject following a prearranged agenda or study plan and may culminate in a written examination;

(continued)



(4) "instructor" means an individual lecturing in a continuing education offering;

(5) "licensee," "licensed agent" or "agent" means a natural person licensed by this state as an agent or broker;

(6) "person" means a natural person, firm, institution, partnership, corporation or association; and

(7) "sponsor," or "sponsoring organization" means a person or firm offering or providing insurance education.

(b) General requirements.

(1) Only courses which impart substantive and procedural knowledge relating to insurance and are beneficial to the insuring public subsequent to initial licensing shall be approved for credit. Approved courses shall be classified as life, health, variable contracts courses; property and casualty courses; or, general courses. Credit earned from general courses are acceptable in meeting the requirements for any single license classification.

(2) Courses of the following types do not meet the basic criteria for approvable courses described in paragraph (1) of this section:

(A) Courses designed to prepare students for a license examination;

(B) courses in mechanical office or business skills, including typing, speed reading, or use of calculators or other machines or equipment;

(C) courses in sales promotion, including meetings held in conjunction with the general business of the licensee;

(D) courses related to office management or intended to improve the operation of the licensee's business, not leading to a recognized professional insurance designation or enhancing the licensee's ability to serve the public; and

(E) courses which are primarily intended to impart knowledge of specific products of specific companies if the courses relate to the sales promotion or marketing of one or more of the products discussed.

(3)(A) Courses must be attended in their entirety in order for a licensee to receive full credit. Proportional credit may be given for partial attendance at a course.

(B) Upon completion of approved courses, students shall receive credit for the number of hours approved for the course which will generally be equivalent to one hour of credit for each hour of instruction.

(C) If the number of credit hours for which a course is approved is fewer than the total number of hours of the course presentation, the student must attend the entire course in order to receive credit for the number of approved hours.

(D) The number of approved hours will not include time spent on introductions, breaks, or other activities not directly related to approved educational information or material.

(E) Neither students or instructors may earn full credit for attending or instructing at any subsequent offering of the same course for three years after attending or teaching such course.

(4) Course examinations will not be required for approval of continuing education courses except correspondence courses.

(5) Sponsors shall submit proposed courses to the commissioner for pre-approval at least 30 days prior to the date on which the course is to be held, except as provided in L. 1988, Ch. 148(g)(6).

(6) Courses cannot be advertised in any manner as approved unless approval has been granted, in writing, by the commissioner.

(7) If approval has been granted for the initial offering of a course, approval for subsequent offerings not disclosed in the initial submission may be granted by providing written notification to the commissioner at least 30 days in advance of the date the program is to be held indicating that no change has been made in the course and specifying the additional times and places the course will be presented.

(8) All fees required for individual course approval shall be submitted with the course submission. If the sponsor elects to pay the prescribed fee for all courses, the fee shall be paid annually and shall be submitted with the first course submission each year. Subsequent course submissions should include documentation of prior fee payment.

(9) Each course of study except correspondence courses shall be conducted in a classroom or other facility which is adequate to comfortably accommodate the faculty and the number of students enrolled. The sponsor may limit the number of students enrolled in a course.

(10)(A) Each course leading to a nationally or regionally recognized designation shall receive credit as approved by the commissioner. A listing of all courses approved as nationally or regionally recognized insurance education programs or otherwise including approved credit hours shall be available to the public upon request. In no event shall the credit for any approved course exceed the biennial requirement except as provided by L. 1988, Ch. 148(e).

(B) Any agent attending at least 80 but less than 100 percent of regularly scheduled classroom sessions for any single course may receive 50 percent of the educational credit received by those agents who attend all sessions and satisfactorily complete the course. Such credit may be earned to the extent that adequate records are maintained and appropriate certification of such attendance is provided by the course instructor.

(11)(A) The amount of credit received by an agent for a correspondence course shall be based upon successful completion of the course and an independently monitored examination subject to the number of hours assigned by the commissioner. Credit earned through correspondence courses shall not exceed 25 percent of the biennial requirement.

(B) Examination monitors shall not be affiliated in any way with the sponsoring organization or the licensee and shall be subject to approval by the commissioner. Any examinations utilized or to be utilized shall be included in the material submitted for course approval. No examination will be approved unless the commissioner is satisfied that security procedures protecting the integrity of the examination can be maintained. If security is compromised no credit will be granted.

(C) Any sponsor of correspondence courses shall clearly disclose to any agent wishing to receive credit in Kansas the number of hours for which that particular course has been approved by the commissioner.

(12) Any agent who attends approved education courses sponsored by insurance companies may use the credit so obtained to fulfill a maximum of 75% of their biennial requirement.

(c) Any licensee found to have falsified a continuing education report to the commissioner shall be subject to suspension or revocation of his or her insurance license in accordance with K.S.A. 40-246, or a penalty as prescribed in K.S.A. 40-254 or both.

(d) The commissioner reserves the right to audit course offerings with or without notice to the sponsor.

(e) The commissioner may refuse to approve courses by specific sponsors if it is determined that past offerings in this or any other state have not been in compliance with continuing education laws and regulations.

(f) Course requirements.

(1) Each course of study shall have a coordinator, who is responsible for supervising the course and assuring compliance with the statutes and regulations governing the offering of insurance continuing education courses.

(2)(A) As required by L. 1988, Ch. 148(g)(5), sponsoring organizations shall maintain accurate records relating to course offerings, instructors, and student attendance. If the coordinator leaves the employ of the sponsor or otherwise ceases to monitor continuing education offerings, the records shall be transferred to the replacement coordinator or an officer of the sponsor. If a sponsor ceases operations, the coordinator shall be responsible for maintaining the records or providing a custodian of the records acceptable to the commissioner. In order to be acceptable, custodians shall agree to make copies of student records available to students free of charge or at a reasonable fee. Under no circumstances will the commissioner act as custodian of the records.

(B) Each sponsor shall provide students with course completion certificates, on a form prescribed or approved by the commissioner, within 30 days of completion of the course. A sponsor may require payment of the course tuition as a condition for receiving the course completion certificate.

(3) Each instructor shall possess the following qualifications:

(A) Three years of recent experience in the subject area being taught;

(B) a college degree related to the subject area being taught;

(C) two years of recent experience in the subject area being taught and 60 classroom hours of acceptable course work in the subject area being taught; or

(D) an appropriate professional designation in the area being taught.

(4) Instructors shall:

(A) Comply with all laws and rules pertaining to insurance continuing education;

(B) provide students with current and accurate information;

(C) maintain an atmosphere conducive to learning in a classroom; and

(D) provide assistance to the students and respond to questions relating to course material.

(5) Each sponsor, coordinator and instructor shall notify the commissioner within 10 days after the occurrence of any of the following:

(A) A felony or misdemeanor conviction or disciplinary action taken against an insurance or other occupational license held by the coordinator or instructor; and

(B) any change of information contained in an application for course approval.

(g) Licensee reporting requirement.

(1) Continuing education credit shall be reported by the licensee on forms and in a manner prescribed by the commissioner. All courses shall be completed or attended during the two year period for which the credit hours are to be applied. An agent may not apply the credit

earned for any one course to more than one reporting period except as provided by L. 1988, Ch. 148(e).

(2) Requests for an extension permitted by L. 1988, Ch. 148(f)(6) shall be submitted in writing no later than March 1 of the year due and shall include an explanation and independent verification of the hardship. (Authorized by K.S.A. 40-103; implementing L. 1988, Ch. 148; effective May 15, 1989.)

**40-7-21. Agents; examination fee; amount.** From and after May 1, 1989, an examination fee in the amount of \$55 for each single line examination of 100 items or limited line examination of up to 50 items; or, \$75 for each combination examination of 130 items covering two or more lines of coverage included in two different classes of insurance as prescribed by L. 1988, Ch. 151, Sec. 3 shall be paid by each person for each attempt to pass the examination. EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 89-115

### DIRECTING STATE AGENCIES TO DEVELOP WATER CONSERVATION PLANS FOR STATE FACILITIES

WHEREAS, the executive power of the Governor of the State of Kansas may be exercised through issuance of Executive Orders; and

WHEREAS, the issuance of such a document is recognized as inherent power vested in the chief executive of the state; and

WHEREAS, drought or near-drought conditions have existed throughout much of the state in the last year and these conditions may continue this spring and summer; and

WHEREAS, I am urging all municipal, industrial, domestic and agricultural water users to develop water conservation and drought contingency plans; and

WHEREAS, state government has a responsibility to the citizens of Kansas to set the example and to demonstrate its leadership and commitment to the wise use and conservation of water;

NOW, THEREFORE, under the authority vested in me as Governor of the State of Kansas, I hereby direct the head of each state agency to prepare a water conservation plan for their agency, in accordance with water conservation planning guidelines developed by the Kansas Water Office, and to submit the plan to the Director of the Kansas Water Office by April 30, 1989.

This document shall be filed with the Secretary of State as Executive Order No. 89-115, and shall become effective immediately.

REGULATIONS****Article 7.—CASH LOTTO GAME RULES**

**111-7-37a. Promotional Prize Drawings.** The executive director shall conduct at least five drawings for promotional prizes in addition to prizes described in K.A.R. 111-7-32 and K.A.R. 111-7-32b, in conjunction with each Cash Lotto Saturday instant ticket draws, and prior to the \$100 drawing, according to the following procedures:

(a) The drum containing non-winning instant tickets utilized in the drawings described in K.A.R. 111-4-71a, which immediately precedes the Cash Lotto Saturday instant ticket draw, shall be monitored by lottery security personnel, or a lottery official designated by the lottery security official, prior to its use in the Cash Lotto promotional prize drawing. At this time, any persons wishing to enter the drawing who have not yet done so shall place their tickets into the drum.

(b) Prior to the promotional prize drawings, the contents of the sealed receptacle or drum shall be mixed by rotating.

(c) Lottery security personnel shall then unseal the drum and the individual selected by the executive director or the person designated by the executive director shall, using the bare arm technique, remove only one ticket from the receptacle or drum. The lottery security official and the auditor shall then examine the selected ticket to determine if the information form located on the back of the selected ticket is complete, the name is legible and the ticket is signed. If the information form is complete, the name is determined to be legible and the ticket is signed, the name shall be announced to the audience.

(d) Tickets drawn for promotional prizes may be returned to the drum, if the person whose name is drawn wishes to waive the promotional prize for entry into Cash Lotto prize drawings.

(e) Named persons must be present in order to win promotional prizes. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1988 Supp. 74-8710(b); effective T-111-2-24-89, Feb. 23, 1989; amended T-111-3-17-89, March 14, 1989.)

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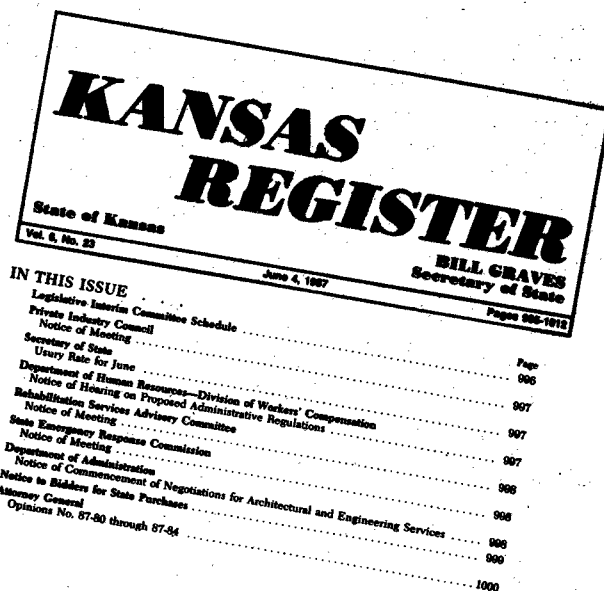
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
