WILDLIFE AND PARKS COMMISSION**NOTICE OF MEETING AND
HEARING ON PROPOSED
ADMINISTRATIVE REGULATIONS**

A public hearing will be conducted at 7 p.m. Thursday July 13, in the Flame Room of the Harvest Inn, 1001 E. 6th (I-70 Exit 299), Junction City, to consider the adoption and amendment of several permanent and temporary regulations of the department. If necessary, the public hearing will continue at 9 a.m. Friday, July 14, at the same location.

This 30-day notice period prior to the hearing constitutes a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the regulation.

All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the chairman of the commission, c/o Kansas Department of Wildlife and Parks, Suite 502, Landon State Office Building, 900 S.W. Jackson, Topeka 66612. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity at the hearing to express their views orally in regard to the adoption of the proposed regulation. During the hearing, all written and oral comments submitted by interested parties will be considered by the commission as a basis for adopting, amending, or rejecting the proposed regulations.

The following is a brief summary of the proposed permanent and temporary regulations:

115-3-1. Game birds; legal equipment, taking methods and possession. This regulation will be considered as both a temporary and permanent regulation. The regulation specifies the equipment and methods that may be used when hunting game birds. It also specifies conditions for the possession of game birds.

Economic Impact Summary: Department revenue will not be altered. This regulation replaces statutory requirements that are in effect until June 30, 1989, and does not represent any significant change from existing requirements. There will be no anticipated costs to either state agencies or the public as a result of this regulation.

115-3-2. Rabbits, hares and squirrels; legal equipment, taking methods and possession. This regulation will be

considered as both a temporary and permanent regulation. The regulation specifies the equipment and methods that may be used when hunting rabbits, hares and squirrels. It also specifies conditions for the possession of rabbits, hares and squirrels.

Economic Impact Summary: Department revenue will not be altered. This regulation replaces statutory requirements that are in effect until June 30, 1989 and does not represent any significant change from existing requirements. There will be no anticipated costs to either state agencies or the public as a result of this regulation.

115-8-3. Steel Shot. This permanent regulation defines the legal shot type that may be possessed and used when hunting waterfowl, coot, rail, and snipe. In addition, the regulation specifies that for department lands posted as "steel shot only," hunters using shotguns may only possess steel shot.

Economic Impact Summary: Department revenue will not be altered. Certain businesses will benefit from the sale of higher priced steel shot. Higher shotshell cost and the need for a few hunters to procure different shotguns may represent an increased cost to sportsmen. However, since this change will be mandated by federal regulations in the 1991-1992 season, these increased costs represent a one year effect. In addition, sportsman participation is voluntary.

115-9-6. Vehicle permits; display. This regulation will be considered as both a temporary and permanent regulation. The regulation specifies how department-issued vehicle permits will be displayed.

Economic Impact Summary: Department revenue will not be altered. This regulation replaces statutory requirements that are in effect until June 30, 1989, and does not represent any significant change from existing requirements. There will be no anticipated costs to either state agencies or the public as a result of this regulation.

Copies of the full text of the proposed regulations and the economic impact statement may be obtained by writing to the assistant secretary at the address above.

At the same meeting, the commission will make recommendations for the 1989 seasons on early migratory birds based on proposed federal frameworks. Copies of the proposed seasons can be obtained at the meeting. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the chairman of the commission at the address above. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity at the meeting to express their views orally in regard to the seasons. During the meeting, all written and oral comments submitted by interested parties will be considered by the commission as a basis for its recommendations.

KANSAS PUBLIC DISCLOSURE COMMISSION

Advisory Opinion No. 89-6

Written May 24, 1989, to Marcia Poell, Executive Director, Kansas Bar Association, Topeka.

This opinion is in response to your letter of May 17, 1989, in which you request an opinion from the Kansas Public Disclosure Commission concerning the state conflict of interest law (K.S.A. 46-215 *et seq.*).

We note at the outset that the commission's jurisdiction is limited on the issue you raise to the statute just cited. Thus, whether some other common law or statutory system, rule or policy outside our jurisdiction applies to your question is not covered by this opinion.

We understand you request this opinion in your capacity as executive director of the Kansas Bar Association. You advise us that the Kansas Bar Association is a non-profit voluntary organization of 5,100 attorneys engaged in, among other activities, the presentation of continuing education seminars. The registration fee for the KBA annual meeting, scheduled for June 14-17 in Vail, Colorado, is \$160 for KBA members and \$220 for non-members. Registration fees at other seminars vary but average \$85 per full day program.

The KBA Board of Governors voted to waive the annual meeting registration fee for Kansas appellate and district court judges and is currently considering extending the registration fee waiver to the appellate judges' research staff for selected seminars. These judges and attorneys would remain responsible for transportation, lodging and meals.

You seek an advisory opinion whether, consistent with K.S.A. 46-237, the KBA may offer the judges and their research staff such a registration fee waiver at educational programming.

The prohibitions contained in K.S.A. 46-237 apply to "state officers or employees" and "candidates for state."

"State officer or employee" is defined in K.S.A. 46-221(a) with the following exception:

"State officer or employee does not include any justice or commissioner of the supreme court or judge of the judicial branch or employee or officer of the judicial branch or any member of a board, council or commission who is appointed by the supreme court or who is elected or appointed to exercise duties pertaining to functions of the judicial branch, when such person is engaged in performing a function or duty for the judicial branch."

With this exception we are satisfied that none of the individuals you have described meet the definition of "state officer or employee" as that phrase is used in K.S.A. 46-237.

"Candidate for state office" is also defined in K.S.A. 46-221(b) as follows:

"Candidate for state office' means a candidate for nomination or election to any state office as defined in K.S.A. 25-2505 and amendments thereto, except district judges."

Suffice it to say that district judges are the only category of persons you have mentioned who are "candidates for state office" under K.S.A. 25-2505. Since they are exempted by this definition, none of the persons you have described meet this definition either.

Thus, since neither definition applies to the categories of persons you have described, it is our opinion that K.S.A. 46-237 does not apply to the situation you have described.

Advisory Opinion No. 89-7

Written May 24, 1989, to Delores Dalke, CRB, Hillsboro.

This opinion is in response to your letter of May 1, 1989, in which you request an opinion from the Kansas Public Disclosure Commission concerning K.S.A. 75-4301 *et seq.*

We understand you request this opinion in your capacity as a city commissioner.

You advise us that you own a corporation that is engaged in listing, selling and managing real estate. You state that commissions are not paid directly to you, but rather to the corporation, and you receive a fee from the corporation for each sale.

You ask whether you hold a substantial interest in each person paying a commission to the corporation and, if so, on what date does the interest arise and for how long does it continue to exist.

K.S.A 75-4301 defines "substantial interest" in pertinent part as follows:

". . . If a person's salary, compensation or other remuneration is a portion or percentage of a fee paid to a business or combination of businesses, a person shall have a substantial interest in any client who pays a fee to such business or combination of businesses from which fee such person receives one thousand dollars (\$1000) or more in the current or immediately preceding calendar year."

From a review of this section, it is our opinion, in the situation where you are paid a fee directly related to each sale, that you do have a "substantial interest" in each client of the corporation if the dollar threshold is met. The substantial interest arises on the date you receive your fee from the corporation and lasts through the calendar year in which the fee is received and for one year thereafter.

Cities and Municipalities—Ordinances of Cities; General Provisions—Style or Ordaining Clause.

Cities and Municipalities—Ordinances of Cities; Initiative and Referendum Ordinances—Petition for Proposed Ordinance; Requirements. Thomas A. Glinstra, City of Olathe Municipal Counsel, Olathe, May 18, 1989.

K.S.A. 12-3005 prescribes that "[t]he style or ordaining clause of all ordinances shall be: 'Be it ordained by the governing body of the city of _____.'" This requirement is mandatory, and a proposed ordinance submitted under the provisions of K.S.A. 12-3013 must include an ordaining clause. As Ordinance No. 112-A of the city of Olathe contains no such clause, it is our opinion that the "ordinance" is void and unenforceable. Cited herein: K.S.A. 12-3005; 12-3013; Kan. Taxation—Judicial Foreclosure and Sale of Real Estate by County—Purchase by City of Property Offered for Sale Under K.S.A. 79-2804; Apportionment of Proceeds of Sale. Joel R. Kriss, Colby City Attorney, Colby, May 18, 1989.

Under the provisions of K.S.A. 79-2804i, if a city (to which special assessments are owed) is the successful bidder at a foreclosure sale, it shall be required to pay the delinquent real estate taxes plus the costs and expenses of sale, but shall not be required to pay any delinquent special assessments that are a result of improvements made or work done by or on behalf of the city or any interest and penalties on said delinquent special assessments. A portion of said payment will be returned to the city under the provisions of K.S.A. 79-2805, which prescribes that the proceeds of the foreclosure sale are to be prorated to each fund, if practicable, based upon its pro-

portionate interest in the entire lien for taxes and interest included in the foreclosure action. Cited herein: K.S.A. 79-2804i; 79-2805; 1976 Senate Bill No. 386. TRH

Land is classified according to "quality" insofar as it is grouped by predicted production capability. The value of a particular tract of land may be further adjusted by the local appraiser to reflect adverse conditions peculiar to that tract. Cited herein: K.S.A. 1988 Supp. 79-1476; Kan. Insurance—Regulation of Certain Trade Practices—Unfair Methods of Competition or Unfair and Deceptive Acts or Practices; Title Insurance. Debra K. Schauf, State Representative, 81st District, Mulvane, May 22, 1989.

"Gross operating revenue," as that term is used in 1989 House Bill No. 2502, includes revenue received from transactions other than title insurance. For purposes of determining whether 2 percent of gross operating revenue received in the previous six months is derived from controlled business, revenue received from transactions involving land sales in counties populated by 10,000 or less is not included.

Since the prohibitions contained in the act do not apply to existing title insurance contracts, the act does not violate the contracts clause of the United States Constitution.

The distinction between counties having a population of 10,000 or less and those having a population of more than 10,000 does not create an impermissible classification.

Finally, the rule-making authority granted by the act does not conflict with the statute granting rulemaking authority in areas not affected by the act. HAZARDOUS WASTE DELISTING PETITION

On March 31, 1988, the Kansas Department of Health and Environment first published in the *Kansas Register* its intent to deny a hazardous waste delisting petition held by the Texaco Refining and Marketing Company, Inc., El Dorado. This public notice makes final the decision to deny Texaco's petition.

As noted above, KDHE first announced its intent to deny Texaco's petition on March 31, 1988. In this first announcement, KDHE provided background information on Texaco's petition and a brief description of the procedures used to re-evaluate the petition. Several public comments were received on this proposed action.

In response to these comments, KDHE published a second public notice on this action in the *Kansas Register* on February 16, 1989. The second notice specifically requested comments on the appropriateness of the groundwater models used to evaluate Texaco's petition.

Several comments were received. These comments claimed that the models used were not appropriate because the models were not designed for use with the landfarming operations conducted by Texaco at its El Dorado facility and that the models do not take into account site specific information.

A landfarm version of EPA's groundwater model was, in fact, used to evaluate Texaco's petitions. Site specific information was not considered because once a delisting petition is approved, the waste may be managed as non-hazardous at any site, i.e., there is no regulatory requirement that the waste must always be managed at the site described in the petition. Site specific groundwater monitoring data may be used, but it must be obtained from a monitoring system that meets all of the requirements outlined in 40 CFR 264 Subpart F. The current groundwater monitoring system at Texaco's El Dorado facility for the landfarm does not meet these requirements.

This public notice makes final KDHE's tentative decision to deny Texaco's hazardous waste delisting petition #82-3 for K048, K049, K050, K051, and K052. The effective date for this action shall be September 1, 1989. After September 1, 1989, the petitioned waste will be considered a hazardous waste and must be managed in compliance with all rules and regulations contained in K.S.A. 65-3430 *et seq.* and K.A.R. 28-31-1 through 28-31-14.

PERMANENT ADMINISTRATIVE REGULATIONS

Article 11.—SECURITY AND SAFETY

112-11-20. Racetrack facility safety standards, greyhound race meets. (a) Each greyhound racetrack shall have:

(1) a minimum width of 20 feet with inside and outside fixed curbs at a specified slope in the outside curb;

(2) a first turn radius of 128 feet, with a second turn radius of 118 feet, and straight-aways of 279.6 feet;

(3) a graduated minimum bank of 1³/₄ inch to each 12 inches on each turn;

(4) the five-sixteenths mile starting box set back in a chute;

(5) a water pumping system providing adequate volume and pressure to uniformly hand water the entire racing surface, as needed. Automatic sprinkling systems may be used to complement, but shall not replace, the hand watering system;

(6) automatic openers with a manual backup for each starting box;

(7) one curtain placed at least 50 feet before the escape and one curtain placed 25 feet beyond the escape and placed so as not to distract greyhounds while they are racing;

(8) an inside lure with an extendible arm;

(9) a commission-approved track base that is non-abrasive to the greyhounds' feet, adequate track drainage and proper resiliency;

(10) unless otherwise approved by the commission, a closed-fluid winterization system extending from the starting boxes to the entire width and length of the track. Chemicals shall not be applied to the racing surface of a greyhound racetrack; and

(11) a video monitoring system with a monitor in the judges' room and trainers' lounge that permits the racing judges and trainers to view the activities in the lockout kennel, the movement of the leadouts and greyhounds from the lockout kennel to the starting boxes and the activities at the starting boxes;

(b) Each lockout kennel facility shall have:

(1) Soundproofing, such as masonry construction, that will prevent the greyhounds from being disturbed by outside noises;

(2) crates located at floor level, unless otherwise approved by the commission;

(3) crates of molded fiberglass or metal with:

(A) Removable wooden floors;

(B) minimum inside dimensions of 36 inches wide, 42 inches deep and 36 inches high; and

(C) a design providing for partitions to separate each crate should this be desired by the majority of the kennels booked at that meet;

(D) a sufficient number of crates to house the greyhounds required to schedule 13 races. A second weigh-in shall be held as soon as crates are available during performances with more than 13 races;

(E) closed crate doors that leave one inch of clearance

at top, bottom, and latching sides that protect the greyhound's tail and feet from injury; and

(F) drop latches or comparable latches that prevent hazard to the greyhounds;

(4) a climate control system that can maintain a temperature between 68 and 75 degrees Fahrenheit; and

(5) an area equipped with heating and air-conditioning where greyhounds and trainers may wait to weigh in.

(c) Each organization licensee shall provide a coolout area that shall have a minimum of four water faucets with hoses and a dipping vat through which greyhounds may be walked to quickly cool them after racing. Each organization licensee shall change the water in the vat at least daily and prevent muddy residue from accumulating around it.

(d) Each organization licensee shall provide:

(1) A covered walkway from the parking area to the lockout kennel; and

(2) a covered walkway from the coolout area to the parking area.

(e) Each kennel compound area shall have:

(1) Separate kennel buildings of masonry construction for each contract kennel;

(2) a location far enough away from the grandstand and racing areas that kenned dogs will not be disturbed by racetrack noises; and

(3) twenty-four hour security for the compound enclosure provided by the organization licensee when the official racing season begins.

(f) Each kennel building shall have:

(1) A partitioned kitchen area and crate area;

(2) minimum dimensions of 20' by 62';

(3) at least two adjoining turnout pens for each kennel building, free of obstructions, and at least 30' by 40' each, with interconnecting gates, a 20' overhang that extends the length of the building, drainage and a water faucet in each. Each turnout pen shall be lighted by at least two halogen lights of at least 300 watts each, one at each end. The area shall be surrounded by chain link fence to at least six feet;

(4) a minimum of 12" of sand in turnout pens, to be removed and replaced by the organization licensee with new sand at least every 12 months of racing;

(5) a gate in each turnout pen through which a vehicle may be driven to remove the sand and deposit new sand;

(6) a fenced safety pen eight feet wide, located between the parking area and turnout pens and equipped with gates, to facilitate the moving of greyhounds directly between the parking area and the turnout pens;

(7) a maximum of 60 crates;

(8) metal crates with compartments that are at least 36 inches wide, 42 inches deep, and 36 inches high and equipped with drop latches and casters;

(9) not more than 60 greyhounds housed in each kennel building with not more than one greyhound in each crate, unless the racing judges have approved a specific request otherwise;

(10) a kitchen area equipped with a hot water heater with a minimum capacity of 20 gallons, a deep sink of durable construction with a drain board, adequate shelving and cabinet space and a shower and commode in an enclosed area;

(11) one floor drain in each crate area and one floor drain in each kitchen area;

(12) a climate control system that is capable of maintaining a temperature between 68 and 75 degrees Fahrenheit;

(13) smoke and temperature alarms in each kennel area connected to the compound security office and capable of alerting security of emergency conditions;

(14) emergency backup power adequate to provide continuous ventilation that will protect the greyhounds in the event of power failures occurring at any time during a racing season scheduled in the months of May through September;

(15) a fresh air ventilation system or a minimum of four windows of approximately four square feet each that are equipped with screens and may be opened.

(16) lighting to adequately illuminate all areas inside the kennel;

(17) adequate space within the kennel building for each contract kennel to place a dog walking machine and adequate floor space within the crate area for a hydrotherapy vat; and

(18) on line hook-up for a telephone and a video monitoring system that permits the trainers to watch the races.

(g) Unless otherwise approved by the commission, each organization licensee shall provide sprint paths as follows:

(1) One sprint path measuring at least 16 feet by 350 feet, equipped with a common center fence, and heated by a closed-fluid winterization system extending the length and width of the sprint path;

(2) two open sprint paths measuring at least 20 feet by 500 feet;

(3) one all-weather surface road sufficient to operate a vehicle on adjacent to each sprint path; and

(4) a sprint path surface to which chemicals shall not be applied.

(h) Each sprint path shall be located so that sprint activity does not disturb greyhounds in the kennel compound area. Each sprint path shall be available for use at all times, except during racing hours, and shall be equipped with side gates through which greyhounds may enter the path and a gate through which a kennel vehicle may be driven. 102-1-15 Continuing education. (a) Applicants for renewal of licensure shall have earned 100 continuing education hours in the two years preceding application for renewal. The required number of continuing education hours shall be pro-rated for periods of renewal which are less than the full two years, using the ratio of one-third of the continuing education hours for each six months since the date of licensure or most recent renewal. Each continuing education category as defined in 102-1-15(c) shall be pro-rated accordingly for those persons whose periods of renewal are less than the full two years. Persons who are licensed within six months of the current expiration period shall be exempt from the continuing education requirement for their first renewal period.

(b) One academic semester credit hour is equivalent to 15 continuing education hours.

(c) Continuing education credits counting toward the required 100 hours shall be distributed over the following categories of activities so that at least two categories are represented, and with a maximum of 75 hours in category one, a maximum of 75 hours in category two, and a maximum of 50 hours in category three. The categories shall be:

(1) Activities that are sponsored, accredited or conducted by educational institutions, by professional associations, or by private institutions that are nationally or regionally accredited for training or activities conducted by agencies and groups that do not meet the requirements of national or regional accreditation, if the content is clearly related to the enhancement of psychology skills and knowledge;

(2)(A) presentation of courses, workshops, or other formal training activities, when the content is clearly related to the enhancement of psychology skills and knowledge. Continuing education credit shall be allowed only for the initial presentation. A maximum of 25 continuing education hours shall be allowed for providing supervision. A maximum of 25 hours shall be allowed for receiving supervision; or

(B) publications and professional presentations. Fifteen hours may be claimed for each publication or book chapter authored by the applicant and 15 hours may be claimed for each scientific or professional paper presented; and

(3) non-supervised, self-programmed activities. Such activities include the following:

(A) Self-instruction. The maximum number of hours allowed shall be 25 hours;

(B) preparation by the applicant for a specialty board examination. The maximum number of hours allowed shall be 25 hours and shall be allowed only for the applicant's initial preparation for such an examination;

(C) participation in quality care, client or patient diagnosis review conferences, treatment utilization reviews, peer review, case consultation with another licensed psy-

chologist, or other quality assurance committees or activities. The maximum number of hours allowed in this subcategory shall be 25 hours;

(D) participation in professional organizations, if the organization's goals are clearly related to the enhancement of psychology values, skills, and knowledge. Such participation may include holding office or serving on committees of the organization. The maximum continuing education credit allowed shall be 25 hours; and

(E) receiving personal psychotherapy that is provided by a licensed or certified mental health provider and which is a part of a designated training program. A maximum of 25 continuing education hours shall be allowed for personal therapy. A maximum of 10 continuing education hours may be allowed for receiving personal psychotherapy which is not a part of a designated training program.

(d) Each licensed psychologist shall be responsible for maintaining personal continuing education records. Forms for the recording of continuing education activities shall be provided by the board and shall be used by the licensee for reporting continuing education activities. Personal records of participation in continuing education activities shall be submitted to the board at a time or times specified by the board but not later than 60 days prior to the date the current license expires.

(e) In determining whether a claimed continuing education activity will be allowed, the licensed psychologist may be required by the board to demonstrate that the content was clearly related to psychology, or to verify that psychologist's participation in any claimed or reported activity. If a psychologist fails to comply with this requirement, the claimed credit may be disallowed by the board.

(f) Applicants who submit continuing education documentation that fails to meet the required 100 hours may request an extension from the board. The request shall include a plan for completion of the continuing education requirements. An extension, which shall not exceed six months, may be granted by the board.

(g) Contractual agreements with sponsors of continuing education activities may be signed by the board.

(h) Each licensed psychologist shall complete a program on professional ethics consisting of at least three hours of training. This program shall meet the requirements for inclusion in category 1 or, with prior approval of the board, in another category. This requirement shall commence with the 1988-90 renewal period and all subsequent periods. 102-1-7. Licenses. (a) Each applicant who meets standards for licensure, as provided by the laws of the state of Kansas, shall receive a license appropriate for display and a wallet-size card with the same information as on the license.

(b) An area of emphasis in psychology shall not be listed on licenses issued by the board.

(c) In the case of a revocation of license, the licensee shall be informed of the board's action by certified mail,

and the licensee shall return the license and wallet-size card to the board within 30 days.

(d) If a licensee fails to renew the license or surrenders the license, the licensee shall return the license and wallet-size card to the board within 30 days of expiration or surrender of the license.
