## Opinion No. 89-131

Counties and County Officers—County Treasurer—Deputy Treasurers; Budget; Limitation of Personnel Action.

Counties and County Officers—County Commissioners; Powers and Duties—Powers of Board of Commissioners; Authority Over Employment of Assistants by County Treasurer. Doug Martin, Shawnee County Counselor, Topeka, October 26, 1989.

If the yearly budget established by the board of county commissioners includes either a line item for salaries for county treasurer personnel or another fund that may be properly expended for personnel salaries, and those funds have been previously expended or committed, the county treasurer is subject to that budget and may not commit additional funds without the approval of the board of county commissioners. K.S.A. 19-503 authorizes the county treasurer to employ deputies and assistants but such action is subject to budgetary restrictions and any existing county employee policies that are applicable to all county employees. Accordingly, a city may use its home rule authority to charter out from the provisions of that statute, including the requirement that members appointed to a library board be residents of the municipality. 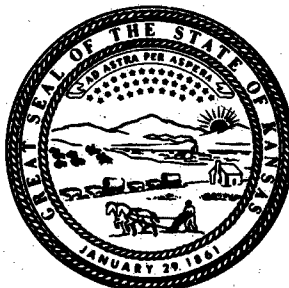

A public hearing will be conducted by the Kansas Livestock Commissioner at 10 a.m. Monday, December 11, in the Animal Health Department, Anchor Savings Building, 712 Kansas Ave., Suite 4B, Topeka, concerning the adoption of amended regulations K.A.R. 9-7-7, 9-17-1, 9-17-2, 9-17-3 and 9-17-4 and new regulations 9-17-6 through 9-17-8. These regulations will involve standards and guidelines for the operation of facilities under animal disease control and the Animal Dealers Act. The Animal Health Department will bear minimal cost of the proposed regulations, with no fiscal impact on the general public.

**EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 89-120**  
**ESTABLISHING THE GOVERNOR'S COUNCIL**  
**ON THE ARTS**

WHEREAS, there is a growing realization of the arts' strong connection to broad social and economic issues and of the importance of the arts to the quality of life in the state; and

WHEREAS, the rural communities of Kansas are concerned about maintaining the quality of life in their towns and villages; and

WHEREAS, the arts bring people together in a community, through performances, exhibits, events and positive experiences; and

WHEREAS, Kansas' "undiscovered" cultural activities, historic sites, and special events are important economic development resources for the state's convention and tourist trade if properly marketed through a program of cultural tourism; and

WHEREAS, there is a need to ensure the development of strong, diverse and creative arts endeavors for all the people of Kansas and to ensure a supportive environment for individual artists and cultural institutions; and

WHEREAS, the development of such arts endeavors can best be accomplished through a strong emphasis on public participation and the development of community/state relationships and public/private partnerships.

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the authority vested in me as Governor and chief executive of the State of Kansas, I hereby establish the Governor's Council on the Arts. Such Council shall replace the Arts Advisory Council and shall have a general mandate to cooperate with the Kansas Arts Commission in carrying out its mission; to assist the Commission in education, inventorying resources, and fund raising activities for the Arts; to assist the Commission in coordinating activities with local arts organizations and local artists; and to carry out such other duties as may be directed by the Commission.

Membership on the Council shall be by official Commission of Appointment of the Governor, certified by and filed with the Secretary of State. Chairmanship and Vice Chairmanship thereof shall be by official Commission of Appointment by the Governor, certified by and filed with the Secretary of State.

Members of the Council shall serve with no compensation and shall be appointed for terms of four years, except half of those members first appointed shall be appointed for a term of two years.

This document shall be filed with the Secretary of State as Executive Order No. 89-120 and shall be effective immediately.

## Article 1.—DEFINITIONS

**115-1-1. Definitions.** The following definitions shall apply to all department regulations unless the context requires otherwise or is specifically defined otherwise:

- (a) arrow: a missile shot from a bow or a crossbow;
- (b) bag limit: the maximum number of any species, except fish and frogs, that may be taken by a person in a calendar day;
- (c) bait fish: minnow or carp family (*Cyprinidae*), sucker family (*Catostomidae*), top minnows or killifish family (*Cyprinodontidae*), shad family (*Clupeidae*), and sunfish family (*Centrarchidae*), but excluding black basses. Any fish listed in K.A.R. 115-15-1 or K.A.R. 115-15-2 shall not be considered as bait fish.
- (d) bird dog: a dog used to point, flush or retrieve game birds or migratory birds or both;
- (e) bow: a hand-held device with a cord that connects both of its two ends and designed to propel an arrow. This includes long, recurve and compound bows;
- (f) bridle path: an established, maintained and marked pathway for the riding of animals;
- (g) camping: an activity involving an overnight stay in association with a camping unit;
- (h) camping unit: mobile or portable equipment that is used to accommodate an overnight stay by one or more individuals. This includes self-contained motorized campers, pull trailers, pop-up tent trailers, pickup campers, tents, and other motorized vehicles designed or equipped for overnight stay;

(i) cast net: a circular or conical weighted net designed to be cast mouth downward by hand and withdrawn by lines attached to its margin;

(j) creel limit: the maximum total number of any species of fish or frogs that may be taken by a person in a calendar day;

(k) crossbow: a transverse mounted bow with a cord that connects the two ends and designed to propel an arrow. This includes compound crossbows. The arrow is released by a mechanical trigger;

(l) department lands and waters: state parks, state lakes, recreational grounds, wildlife areas, sanctuaries, fish hatcheries, natural areas, historic sites and other lands, waters and facilities under the jurisdiction and control of the secretary through ownership, lease, license, cooperative agreement, memorandum of understanding, or other arrangement;

(m) depth finder: an electronic device used to locate fish or determine underwater structures.

(n) dip net: a net with rigid support about the mouth and used to land fish;

(o) draft livestock: horses, mules, donkeys, or oxen used singly or in tandem with other horses, mules, donkeys or oxen for pulling purposes;

(p) drag event: a competitive event where hounds pursue a scent trail. The event may involve a caged pen-raised furbearer that is not released from the cage during the event;

(q) dryland set: any trapping device which is placed or set on land or is not in contact with water;

(r) falconry: the taking of wildlife with a trained raptor;

(s) field trial event for dogs: a competitive event involving at least six dogs that are judged on hunting or running ability;

(t) firearm: a rimfire or centerfire rifle or handgun; shotgun; muzzleloading shotgun, rifle or handgun; and cap and ball pistol;

(u) firering: an open-top, man-made fire retaining device;

(v) fireplace: an enclosed man-made fire retaining device;

(w) fishing line: any hand-operated string or cord, utilizing hooks which may be used in conjunction with rods, poles, reels, bows or spearguns;

(x) fish trap: a device for catching fish consisting of a net or other structure which diverts the fish into an enclosure arranged to make escape more difficult than entry;

(y) fully automatic firearm: a rifle or handgun capable of firing more than one cartridge with a single trigger pull;

(z) gaff: a hook attached to a rigid pole;

(aa) gig: a hand-operated spear with one or more prongs with or without barbs;

(bb) hook: a device with a single shaft and one or more points with or without barbs used for catching fish and frogs;

(cc) moorage site: a location designated for the fastening or securing of a vessel;

(dd) nonsport fish: carp, drum, white amur, threadfin and gizzard shad, goldfish, gar, suckers (shall include carp-suckers and buffalo), eel, sturgeon, goldeye and bowfin;

(continued)

(ee) orthopedic device: a device that attaches to the body and is required to enable a handicapped person to walk;

(ff) pen-raised game animals and furbearers: any game animal or furbearer raised in captivity;

(gg) pets: shall include only dogs and cats;

(hh) possession limit: the maximum total number of a species that can be retained per person at any one time;

(ii) running: the pursuing or chasing or furbearers with hounds, but not including the capturing, killing, injuring or possessing of furbearers or having a firearm or other weapon in possession while running, except during established furbearer hunting seasons;

(jj) sanctioned or licensed coyote field trial: a competitive event involving only scent or trail hounds, which has been advertised in one of the national fox hound journals not less than 30 days prior to the event;

(kk) sanctioned or licensed furbearer field trial: a competitive event in which dogs pursue unrestrained furbearers and which is sanctioned or licensed by any of the national kennel or field dog organizations for the express purpose of improving the quality of the breed through the awarding of points or credits toward specific class championships or other national recognition.

(ll) seine: a net with a float line and lead line designed to be pulled through the water for the purpose of catching fish;

(mm) set line: a string or cord anchored at one point, with not more than two hooks and not associated with a hand-operated mechanical reel;

(nn) sight hound: a dog used to pursue furbearers, rabbits, hares or coyotes by sight;

(oo) skin and scuba diving: to swim or dive equipped with a face mask or goggles allowing underwater vision and possibly involving an underwater breathing apparatus;

(pp) snagging: the hooking of fish in any part of its anatomy other than the inside of the mouth;

(qq) speargun: a device used to propel a spear through the water by mechanical means or compressed gas;

(rr) sport fish: northern pike, walleye, saugeye, sauger, yellow perch, striped bass, white bass, black bass (largemouth, spotted and smallmouth), striped bass hybrid, trout, muskellunge, tiger muskie, channel catfish, blue catfish, flathead catfish, paddlefish, panfish (bullhead, black and white crappie, bluegill, redear sunfish, green sunfish, warmouth, rock bass);

(ss) tip-up: an ice fishing device designed to signal the strike of a fish;

(tt) total fish length: the length as measured from the tip of the snout to the end of the tail with mouth closed and the tail lobes pressed together;

(uu) trail hound: a dog used to trail furbearers, rabbits, hares or coyotes by scent;

(vv) trot line: a string or cord anchored at one or more points with not more than 25 hooks and not associated with a hand operated mechanical reel;

(ww) wake: the waves thrown by a vessel moving on water;

(xx) water race: a competitive event where hounds pursue a scent device or a caged pen-raised furbearer through water; the furbearer is not released during the event;

(yy) water set: any trapping device which has the grip-

ping portion placed or set in flowing or pooled water and remains in contact with the flowing or pooled water. (Authorized by and implementing L. 1989, Chapter 118, section 9; effective Dec. 26, 1989.)

## Article 7.—FISH AND FROGS

**115-7-1. Fishing; legal equipment and methods of take.** (a) Legal equipment and methods for taking sport fish:

(1) fishing lines with not more than two baited hooks or artificial lures per line;

(2) trotlines;

(3) setlines;

(4) tip-ups; and

(5) snagging for paddlefish in waters posted by the department as open to snagging of paddlefish.

(b) Legal equipment and methods for taking nonsport fish:

(1) fishing lines with not more than two baited hooks or artificial lures per line;

(2) trotlines;

(3) setlines;

(4) tip-ups;

(5) bow and arrow and each arrow shall be equipped with a barbed head with a line attached from bow to arrow;

(6) spear gun, without explosive charge, while skin or scuba diving; the spear, without explosive charge, shall be attached to the speargun or person by a line;

(7) snagging in waters posted by the department as open to snagging; and

(8) gigging.

(c) Dip nets and gaffs may be used to land any legally caught or hooked fish.

(d) Fish may be taken by any method as designated by the secretary when a fish salvage order has been issued by the secretary through public notice or posting the area open to fish salvage.

(e) Fish may be taken with the aid of boats, depth finders, artificial lights, sound attracters, and scents.

(f) Fish may be taken by legal means from vehicles. (Authorized by L. 1989, Chapter 118, section 9; implementing L. 1989, Chapter 118, sections 9 and 114; effective Dec. 26, 1989.)

**115-7-2. Fishing; general provisions.** (a) Each person may operate or set two fishing lines and, in addition, one trotline or eight setlines.

(b) All fishing lines, trotlines and setlines shall be checked at least once every 24 hours.

(c) Each trotline, setline, tip-up, and unattended fishing line shall have a tag or label securely attached designating the name and address of the operator. A trotline or setline shall not be set within 150 yards of any dam.

(d) Sport fish are legally taken by hook and fishing line when hooked within the mouth, except paddlefish which may be snagged as authorized by K.A.R. 115-7-1. Other sport fish hooked elsewhere shall be returned untrained to the water immediately.

(e) Fish may be taken by legal methods through the ice unless the area is closed to ice fishing by posted notice or otherwise prohibited by regulation. Ice holes used for

ice fishing shall not exceed 12 inches in diameter or 12 inches square.

(f) Eight tip-ups may be used for ice fishing in addition to the allowed two fishing lines unless otherwise posted.

(g) Bow and arrow fishing shall be permitted in all waters of the state except those waters posted closed to bow and arrow fishing and all waters within a distance of 50 yards of an occupied boat dock or ramp, occupied swimming area, occupied picnic or camping area, or other occupied public use area.

(h) Speargun fishing shall be permitted on waters open to skin and scuba diving, unless prohibited by posted notice or regulation. The secretary, by posted notice, may open certain water areas for the taking of one or more species of sport fish by spearguns during a specified time period. (Authorized by L. 1989, Chapter 118, section 9; implementing L. 1989, Chapter 118, section 114 and K.S.A. 32-154b as amended by L. 1989, Chapter 118, section 115; effective Dec. 26, 1989.)

**115-7-4. Fish; processing and possession.** (a) Any fish taken from a body of water for which a species creel limit or species length limit has been established shall have the head, body and tail fin left attached while in possession on the water, or is processed and consumed on the water.

(b) Fish taken shall be retained in possession until:

- (1) processed for consumption;
- (2) transported to a person's domicile;
- (3) transported to a place of commercial preservation or place of commercial processing for consumption;
- (4) given to another person;
- (5) consumed;
- (6) returned unrestrained to the waters from which taken; or

(7) disposed of at a location designated for fish disposal or designated fish cleaning station. (Authorized by L. 1989, Chapter 118, section 9; implementing L. 1989, Chapter 118, sections 9 and 114; effective Dec. 26, 1989.)

**115-7-5. Bullfrogs; legal equipment and methods of take.** (a) Legal equipment and methods for taking bullfrogs:

- (1) hand;
- (2) hand dip net;
- (3) hook and fishing line;
- (4) gig; and
- (5) bow and arrow with barbed head and a line attached from arrow to bow.

(b) Artificial light and boats may be used while taking bullfrogs. (Authorized by L. 1989, Chapter 118, section 9; implementing L. 1989, Chapter 118, sections 9 and 114; effective Dec. 26, 1989.)

#### Article 9.—LICENSES, PERMITS, STAMPS, AND OTHER DEPARTMENT ISSUES

**115-9-1. Licenses, stamps, permits and other department issues; procedures, form and content, and applications.** (a) The requirements for application of and the procedures for the form and content of licenses, stamps, permits and other department issues shall be as established by the secretary, unless otherwise established by law or rules and regulations.

(b) The procedures for issuance of and the form and content of licenses, stamps, permits and other department issuances shall be as established by the secretary, unless otherwise established by law or by rules and regulations. (Authorized by and implementing L. 1989, Chapter 118, section 97; effective Dec. 26, 1989.)

**115-9-2. Issuance of duplicate licenses, permits, stamps and other department issues.** (a) Any person who has lost or destroyed a current license, permit, stamp or other department issue may secure a duplicate license, permit, stamp or other department issue upon submitting the proper application and appropriate fee to the department.

(b) The application shall include the following information:

- (1) applicant's name and address;
- (2) type of duplicate applied for;
- (3) county of purchase;
- (4) location of purchase;
- (5) month of purchase;
- (6) signature of applicant attesting to the loss or destruction of the issue; and

(7) other information as required by the secretary. (Authorized by L. 1989, Chapter 118, section 9 and K.S.A. 1988 Supp. 32-104b as amended by L. 1989, Chapter 118, section 98; implementing K.S.A. 1988 Supp. 32-104b as amended by L. 1989, Chapter 118, section 98; effective Dec. 26, 1989.)

**115-9-3. Purchase of lifetime hunting or lifetime combination hunting and fishing licenses without certificate of completion of an approved hunter education course.** (a) Any individual may purchase a lifetime hunting or lifetime combination hunting and fishing license on behalf of a Kansas resident born after July 1, 1957, under procedures specified in K.S.A. 1988 Supp. 32-104m, as amended by L. 1989, Chapter 118, section 67, prior to issuance to that resident of a certificate of completion of an approved hunter education course.

(b) Any resident may purchase a lifetime hunting or lifetime combination hunting and fishing license prior to issuance of a certificate of completion of an approved hunter education course to that resident.

(c) Lifetime licenses purchased under provisions of subsection (a) and (b) shall be issued with a notice that the lifetime license is not valid until the recipient of the lifetime license has been issued a certificate of completion of an approved hunter education course. (Authorized by L. 1989, Chapter 118, section 9 and K.S.A. 1988 Supp. 32-401 as amended by L. 1989, Chapter 118, section 61; implementing K.S.A. 1988 Supp. 32-401 as amended by L. 1989, Chapter 118, section 61; effective Dec. 26, 1989.)

**115-9-4. Hunting license purchase.** (a) Any individual required to have a certificate of completion of an approved hunter education course prior to purchase of a hunting license may purchase a hunting license by attesting to the license seller of the individual's successful completion of an approved hunter education course.

(b) The signature of the individual on the hunting license shall satisfy the attesting requirement of subsection (a). (Authorized by L. 1989, Chapter 118, section 9; im-

### DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND ENVIRONMENT

#### PERMANENT ADMINISTRATIVE REGULATIONS

#### Article 4.—MATERNAL AND CHILD HEALTH

**28-4-400. Definitions.** (a) "Cash assets" means money, savings accounts, saving certificates, checking accounts and stocks and bonds.

(b) "Diagnostic service" means an evaluation to identify a handicapping disease or disease process.

(c) "Emergency" means an unanticipated, urgent event requiring immediate medical treatment.

(d) Family.

(1) "Family," for an eligible person who resides with the person's parents, stepparents or legal guardian or who is considered to be a dependent of that person's parents, stepparents or legal guardian for income tax purposes, means the eligible person, person's parents, stepparents or legal guardian and all other persons who reside in the same home as the person. Family shall not include persons who lease or rent a portion of the residence.

(2) "Family," for an eligible person who has established a separate residence and is no longer considered a dependent of the person's parents, stepparents or legal guardian for income tax purposes, means the eligible person, the person's spouse, children and relatives and all other persons who reside in the same home as that person. Family shall not include persons who lease or rent a portion of the residence.

(e) "Family income" means the total amount of adjusted gross income reported for federal income tax purposes on the most recent federal income tax return filed by each adult member of the family, with the addition of non-taxable benefits from whatever source.

(f) "Family living allowance" means the amount established by the secretary as specified in K.A.R. 28-4-403(b).

(g) "Individual service plan" means documents prepared by services for children with special health care needs which state a plan of treatment, authorized services, approved providers of service, time frame for provision of services, and party responsible for payment for services.

(h) "Prior authorization" means the approval of a request to provide a specific service before the provision of the service, or in an emergency, within two working days after the emergency occurs.

(i) "Medical treatment" means any medical or surgical services and any medical equipment, devices or supplies provided to a person who is eligible for assistance under services for children with special health care needs.

(j) "Resident" means a person who is living in the state

with the intention of making a permanent home in the state.

(k) "Secretary" means the secretary of the department of health and environment or the secretary's designee. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1988 Supp. 65-5a08; effective, E-82-10, April 27, 1981; effective May 1, 1982; amended May 1, 1983; amended T-85-41, Dec. 19, 1984; amended May 1, 1985; amended Dec. 26, 1989.)

**28-4-401. Responsibilities of individuals who apply for or who receive services.** (a) Each applicant shall supply financial, insurance, and family information essential to the establishment of eligibility within 30 days of the request for service, on forms prescribed by the secretary.

(b) Each applicant shall give written permission, on forms prescribed by the secretary, for release of information needed to determine medical and financial eligibility.

(c) Each applicant or eligible person shall report changes in address, number of children living in the home, marital status, custody of children, insurance coverage, family income or cash assets of more than \$500.00 per year or other circumstances that affect the special health care needs of the applicant or eligible person, within 10 working days of the change.

(d) Each applicant or eligible person enrolled in the department of social and rehabilitation's primary care network shall report the applicant's or eligible person's medicaid number and the name of the applicant's or eligible person's primary care network physician at the time of application or subsequent enrollment in the primary care network and within 10 working days of any changes.

(e) Each eligible person shall obtain prior authorization from services for children with special health care needs for services.

(f) Each eligible person shall:

(1) Apply for insurance benefits, title XIX medicaid program benefits, supplemental security income benefits, or benefits from other sources, when requested;

(3) apply the benefits of any non-assignable insurance by making payments to hospitals or other providers of service for items ordered by the attending physician; and

(4) reimburse services for children with special health care needs for any insurance proceeds sent directly to the recipient if the insurance payment is made for medical treatment provided by services for children with special health care needs. **28-4-403. Financial eligibility.** (a) (1) The uniform standard for determining eligibility shall be the annual margin as calculated in paragraph (2) below. If the annual margin is zero or below, the person shall be eligible for financial assistance for medical treatment. If the annual margin is above zero, the person shall not be eligible for financial assistance, except as provided in subsections (f) and (g) below. The factors to be used in calculating the annual margin shall be: family income, cash assets, family living allowance, anticipated specialized health care ex-



penditures for the person and the health insurance coverage of the person.

(2) The annual margin shall be calculated by:

(A) Adding the amount of the family income to the amount of cash assets above the maximum allowed under subsections (d) and (e) below; and

(B) Subtracting from the total of paragraph (A) above the following:

(i) The family living allowance as determined in subsections (b) and (c) below; and

(ii) The amount of the anticipated health care expenditures for the person that will not be paid by the person's health insurance coverage.

(b) the following table shall be used to determine the family living allowance.

(c) For each additional person, \$3,626 shall be added to \$25,179 in defining the family living allowance.

(d) The following table shall be used to determine the maximum cash assets allowed a family.

(e) For each additional person, \$544 shall be added to \$3,777 in determining maximum allowable family assets.

(f) If, within twelve months after application, the annual margin is spent down per subsection (g) to zero or below by the family's actual or obligated expenditures for medical care, the person shall be, at that time, financially eligible for assistance for the remainder of the twelve-month period. These expenditures shall be in addition to any expenditure or reimbursement made by health insurance or other third party payor.

(g) In order to spend the annual margin down to zero, the family shall agree to:

(1) pay for medical expenses and travel expenses related to medical treatment or for health support services, supplies or equipment; or

(2) pay for a portion of actual or anticipated medical expenses, and travel expense related to medical treatment or for a portion of health support services, supplies or equipment as documented in the individual service plan. **28-4-405. Providers of service.** (a) Application. Each person or corporation desiring to supply services or sell prosthetic devices, equipment, appliances or supplies shall file an application with the secretary. The secretary shall approve or disapprove each application, notify interested parties of the action taken, and maintain a list of approved providers of service.

(b) Designation of hospitals. Each hospital approved to provide medical and surgical services for the care and

treatment of eligible persons except for those hospitals out-of-state authorized by K.A.R. 28-4-408 shall:

(1) For inpatient services:

(A) Be licensed as a hospital in Kansas;

(B) be certified by the joint commission on accreditation of hospitals;

(C) have a social work department;

(D) have staff physicians certified by specialty boards in the specialty appropriate for the needs of the eligible person;

(E) have facilities to isolate persons with communicable diseases or other conditions requiring isolation or separation;

(F) have available consultation in other specialty areas for the cases being treated;

(G) have adequate operating facilities for the specialty for which the hospital is approved;

(H) have persons qualified to give anesthesia;

(I) have hematologic, chemistry, microbiology and serologic laboratory facilities appropriate for the needs of the eligible person;

(J) have x-ray facilities appropriate for the needs of the eligible person;

(K) have facilities for the application of plaster or other cast material for orthopedic cases;

(L) have a physical therapy department with qualified personnel to treat eligible persons;

(M) have regularly scheduled inservice programs; and

(N) have the following services for children:

(i) A separate department for pediatrics and for adult medicine, with qualified nurses assigned to each area;

(ii) at least one pediatrician on the hospital staff, with a designated chief of pediatrics; and

(iii) a separate area for children, with provisions made for parents who wish to live in with their child; and

(iv) nonrestrictive visiting hours for parents and suitable recreational facilities for children; and

(2) For outpatient services:

(A) Be licensed as a hospital in Kansas;

(B) have an x-ray department with facilities and qualified personnel equipped to treat children;

(C) have a physical therapy department with qualified personnel equipped to treat children;

(D) have an occupational therapy department with qualified personnel equipped to treat children;

(E) have a respiratory therapy department with qualified personnel equipped to treat children;

(F) have regularly scheduled inservice programs for all health-care staff relating to children and pediatric conditions;

(G) have a laboratory department with facilities and qualified personnel for hematologic, chemistry, microbiology and serologic testing; and

(H) have persons qualified to give anesthesia.

(c) Designation of laboratory facilities. Each laboratory facility approved to provide services for the care and treatment of eligible persons, except for those laboratory facilities authorized by K.A.R. 28-4-408, shall meet the requirements for medicare approval as an independent laboratory.

(d) Designation of radiology and nuclear medicine fa-

(continued)

ilities. Each x-ray facility approved to provide services for the care and treatment of eligible persons, except for those x-ray facilities authorized by K.A.R. 28-4-408, shall:

(1) Maintain compliance with K.A.R. 28-35-145 through 28-35-338 as authorized by K.S.A. 1988 Supp. 48-1607;

(2) have on staff a radiologist supervising the facility and all patient services;

(3) have on staff technical personnel who are qualified for the type of services being provided;

(4) have written medical policies and procedures, developed and maintained under the direction of the radiologist responsible for patient services. These shall include, but not be limited to, policies and procedures related to interpretation of all radiologic exams, preparation and provision of written reports, and emergency situations; and

(4) have regularly scheduled inservice programs for all staff relating to children and pediatric conditions.

(e) Designation of ambulatory surgical facilities. Each ambulatory surgical facility approved to provide services for the care and treatment of eligible persons, except for those ambulatory surgical facilities authorized by K.A.R. 28-4-408, shall:

(1) Be licensed by Kansas or certified by medicare as an ambulatory surgical facility;

(2) have qualified pediatric nurses regularly assigned to care for the pediatric clients;

(3) have physicians performing the surgeries that are certified by specialty boards in the specialty appropriate for the needs of the child and for which the facility is approved;

(4) have dentists that are qualified to perform the procedures for which the facility is approved;

(5) have qualified personnel to give anesthesia to pediatric clients;

(6) have a separate area for children with provisions made for parents who wish to remain with their child during preparation for surgery and the post-operative period, including the recovery from anesthesia;

(7) have facilities to isolate clients with conditions requiring isolation or separation;

(8) have operating facilities appropriate for the type of procedures conducted at the facility;

(9) have a laboratory department with facilities and qualified personnel for hematologic, chemistry, microbiology and serologic testing as appropriate for the type of procedures conducted at the facility;

(10) have a radiology department with facilities and qualified personnel equipped to treat children related to the type of procedures conducted at the facility;

(11) have adequate facilities for application of plaster or other cast material as they relate to the type of procedures conducted at the facility;

(12) have regularly scheduled inservice programs for all health-care staff relating to children and pediatric conditions;

(13) have written protocols which state the conditions under which a client would be transferred to a hospital to receive services not available within the ambulatory surgical facility;

(14) have written protocols which state the method of transfer of a client to the hospital, when necessary; and

(15) have a written agreement with a hospital to accept

a patient in transfer from the ambulatory surgical facility in an emergency situation.

(f) Designation of other providers. Other providers approved to provide medical, surgical and other services for the care and treatment of eligible persons, except for providers out-of-state authorized by K.A.R. 28-4-408, shall meet the following standards:

(1) Audiologists shall meet the requirements for certification by the American speech and hearing association, or its equivalent, and possess professional experience.

(2) Dentists shall be licensed by the Kansas dental board and dental specialists shall be licensed to practice their specialty by the Kansas dental board.

(3) Hearing aid dealers shall be licensed by the Kansas board of examiners to fit and dispense hearing aids.

(4) Nurses shall be registered with the Kansas state board of nursing.

(5) Nutritionists shall meet the requirements for registration by the American dietetic association.

(6) Occupational therapists shall have completed the requirements necessary to be registered by the national registry of the American occupational therapy association.

(7) Optometrists shall be licensed by the Kansas board of examiners in optometry.

(8) Pharmacists shall be licensed by the Kansas state board of pharmacy.

(9) Physical therapists shall be registered by the Kansas state board of healing arts.

(10) Physicians shall be licensed by the Kansas state board of healing arts and shall be certified by their respective specialty board.

(11) Prosthetic and orthotic appliance facilities shall have employees who meet the requirements for certification by the American board of certification in orthotics and prosthetics.

(12) Social workers shall have a master's degree in social work and shall be licensed by the Kansas behavioral sciences regulatory board.

(d) Responsibilities. Each provider of service shall agree:

(1) That race, color, religion, national origin or ancestry will not be basis for refusing to provide service;

(2) to submit reports requested by services for children with special health care needs;

(3) to accept personal responsibility for the care and treatment provided to persons under services for children with special health care needs;

(4) to accept and bill insurance, title XIX Medicaid and other coverage, when available;

(5) to accept payment in accordance with the fees established by the secretary as payment in full and not to bill families for any service covered services for children with special health care needs without permission of the secretary; and

(6) to notify the secretary of withdrawal from services for children with special health care needs. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1988 Supp. 65-5a08; implementing K.S.A. 65-5a09; effective May 1, 1982; amended May 1, 1983; amended, T-85-41, Dec. 19, 1984; amended May 1, 1985; amended, T-86-46, Dec. 18, 1985; amended May 1, 1986; amended May 1, 1987; amended Dec. 26, 1989.)

**28-4-405a. Payment.** (a) Service shall not be paid

for without prior authorization. The secretary shall specify in the prior authorization for service the number of types of service, including days of hospitalization, for which services for children with special health care needs shall be responsible for payment. Services in excess of those having prior authorization shall not be paid for under services for children with special health care needs unless a provider of service, patient, parent, stepparent or guardian requests an extension which is granted by the secretary.

(b) Insurance, title XIX, and other coverage. For persons receiving funding from both the title XIX medicaid program and services for children with special health care needs, the medicaid program shall have primary funding responsibility. Services for children with special health care needs shall not pay for services eligible for the title XIX medicaid reimbursement. Private insurance shall have primary funding responsibility over services for children with special health care needs and every effort shall be made to utilize insurance benefits. When insurance fails to pay or pays only a portion of the total bill, the providers shall file a claim with services for children with special health care needs. If the insurance payment is less than the maximum allowable rate of services for children with special health care needs, additional payment may be made up to the allowable rate. If the insurance payment exceeds or equals the maximum allowable rate of services for children with special health care needs, an additional payment shall not be made.

(c) Any person who provides a prior-authorized service, product or item shall submit a claim for payment.

(d) Each claim submitted for payment shall state the eligible person's name and address and the date of the services provided and indicate the appropriate procedure code. The claim also shall specify one of the following:

(1) The services provided were covered by a policy of insurance;

(2) a claim on a policy of insurance was made but rejected by the insurer;

(3) a policy of insurance was not available for the services provided;

(4) the services provided were covered by a policy of insurance, but the costs of the services were not paid in full by the insurer; or

(5) a claim for the services provided was filed under the medicaid program but was rejected. The reason for the rejection of the claim by medicaid shall be stated if known to the claimant.

(e) The secretary may allow claims by individuals or hospitals who do not meet the requirements of subsections (a) to (c), inclusive, of K.A.R. 28-4-405, and its amendments, if the individual or hospital provides emergency medical treatment for an eligible person, or with the prior authorization of the secretary, provides specialized medical treatment for an eligible person. **28-4-405b. Termination.** (a) The secretary shall terminate a provider's participation in services for children

with special health care needs for one or more of the following reasons:

(1) Voluntary withdrawal of the provider from participation in the program;

(2) suspension or termination of license or certificate; or

(3) (A) non-compliance with applicable state laws or regulations; or

(B) unethical or unprofessional conduct.

(b) An opportunity for a hearing before the secretary shall be provided prior to termination of a provider's participation in the services for children with special health care needs for the reasons listed in paragraph (a) (3). (Authorized by K.S.A. 1988 Supp. 65-5a08; implementing K.S.A. 65-6a09; effective, T-85-41, Dec. 19, 1984; amended May 1, 1985; amended, T-86-46, Dec. 18, 1985; amended May 1, 1986; amended May 1, 1987; amended Dec. 26, 1989.)

**28-4-406. Conditions eligible for treatment.** For a person to be eligible for financial assistance under services for children with special health care needs, the person shall be afflicted with one or more of the following conditions:

(a) Myelomeningocele;

(b) Cleft palate, cleft lip and related problems;

(c) Cardiovascular conditions, including the following congenital and acquired heart diseases or anomalies of the major blood vessels:

(1) Congenital heart defects, including ventricular septal defect, atrial septal defect, tetralogy of Fallot, transposition of the great arteries, complete heart block, aortic stenosis with or without regurgitation, coarctation of the aorta, persistent patent ductus arteriosus, mitral stenosis or pulmonary stenosis; or

(2) Rheumatic fever; or

(3) Conditions related to heart disease requiring hospitalization, including measures to treat or prevent pneumonia or congestive heart failure or arrhythmias;

(d) Neurosurgical conditions, including spinal injury as a result of accident or hydrocephalus related to myelomeningocele;

(e) Orthopedic conditions, including:

(1) Congenital anomalies leading to physical handicaps, including club foot, congenital dislocated hips, progressive scoliosis which is severe enough that it is likely to become a functional disability in the patient's lifetime, osteogenesis imperfecta, dwarfisms, phocomelia, polydactyly and syndactyly of hands and feet, arthrogryposis multiplex congenita, osteopetrosis, or cerebral palsy; or

(2) Acquired conditions leading to physical handicaps, including Legge-Calve-Perthes, Scheuermann's, vitamin D-resistant rickets, Osgood-Schlatter's, Pott's, neurofibromatosis or idiopathic scoliosis; or

(3) Fractures in which there is a complication in healing; or

(4) Joint conditions, including hemarthrosis and juvenile rheumatoid arthritis; or

(5) Developmental problems, including internal tibial torsion, femoral anteversion, knock knees or bowlegs, requiring surgical correction; or

(6) Muscle problems that are of a disabling nature,

(continued)

limited to muscular dystrophies, myositis ossificans progressiva or poliomyelitis;

(f) Specified genetic and metabolic and conditions, limited to phenylketonuria, cystic fibrosis, congenital hypothyroid, galactosemia, and sickle cell disease;

(g) Hearing problems which lead to or which present a high risk for permanent hearing loss;

(h) Gastrointestinal problems requiring surgical correction, including tracheoesophageal fistula, intestinal atresia, Hirschsprung's disease, imperforate anus, meconium ileus, diaphragmatic hernia, omphalocele and gastroschisis, gastro-esophageal reflux, or tracheo-malacia;

(i) Genitourinary problems, limited to exstrophy of bladder or urethral valves which require surgery;

(j) Burns requiring plastic surgery;

(k) Seizures;

(l) Craniofacial anomalies, including hydrocephalus; or

(m) Vision problems, limited to glaucoma, congenital cataracts or cataracts resulting from metabolic disease, retinal detachment with retinal defect, retinoblastoma, or retinal disorders excluding retrolental-fibroplasia. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1988 Supp. 65-5a14; effective May 1, 1982; amended, T-85-41, Dec. 19, 1984; amended May 1, 1985; amended, T-86-46, Dec. 18, 1985; amended May 1, 1986; amended Dec. 26, 1989.)

**28-4-407. System of priorities.** Because assistance under services for children with special health care needs is constrained by the amount of funds appropriated for this assistance, a system of priorities for assistance shall be established as follows: priority for assistance shall be given to persons afflicted with the condition specified in subsection (a) of K.A.R. 28-4-406, with priorities for assistance established in descending order for conditions listed in subsection (b) through (m), inclusive. Persons afflicted with that condition specified in subsection (m) of K.A.R. 28-4-406 shall be assigned the lowest priority for assistance. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1988 Supp. 65-5a14; effective May 1, 1982; amended, T-85-41, Dec. 19, 1984; amended May 1, 1985; amended, T-86-46, Dec. 18, 1985; amended May 1, 1986; amended Dec. 26, 1989.)

**28-4-408. Out of state service provision.** (a) Treatment services may be provided out of state on an individual basis if:

(1) the medical specialty is not practiced in Kansas;

(2) the medical treatment is not available in Kansas and two approved medical specialists recommend out of state treatment;

(3) Kansas facilities have no hospital beds available for the client; or

(4) the eligible person, traveling outside of Kansas but within the United States and its possessions, requires emergency treatment for the eligible condition, providing Kansas residency is not severed through action or intent.

(b) Treatment services may be provided out of state for eligible children with specific conditions if there is a written agreement between the secretary and the service provider establishing a treatment site for ongoing care.

(c) The eligible family is responsible for:

(1) Any cost of treatment that is greater than approved charges of services for children with special health care needs;

(2) cost of travel for the eligible child and family; and

(3) maintenance of the family during the treatment.

(d) Initial diagnostic services out-of-state shall not be authorized. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1988 Supp. 65-5a08; effective, T-86-46, Dec. 18, 1985; effective May 1, 1986; amended May 1, 1987; amended Dec. 26, 1989.)

**28-4-410. Definitions.** (a) "Blood bank" means a licensed facility that supplies blood or blood products.

(b) "Blood product" means a substance derived from human blood. Blood products provided by the hemophilia program shall be limited to the following:

(1) purified anti-hemophiliac fraction—Factor VIII;

(2) purified anti-hemophiliac fraction—Factor IX; and

(3) fresh frozen plasma and cryoprecipitate.

(c) "Cash assets" means money, savings accounts, savings certificates, checking accounts and stocks and bonds.

(d) "Comprehensive centers" means those facilities which provide services to individuals with hemophilia, and meet the standards established by the great plains regional comprehensive hemophilia center, effective May 2, 1988.

(e) "Emergency" means an unanticipated, urgent event requiring immediate medical treatment.

(f) Family.

(1) "Family," for an eligible person who resides with the person's parents, stepparents or legal guardian or who is considered to be a dependent of that person's parents, stepparents or legal guardian for income tax purposes, means the person who has hemophilia, that person's parents, stepparents or legal guardian and all other persons who reside in the same home as the person who has hemophilia. Family shall not include persons who lease or rent a portion of the residence.

(2) "Family," for an eligible person who has established a separate residence and is no longer considered a dependent of that person's parents, stepparents or legal guardian for income tax purposes, means the person who has hemophilia, that person's spouse, children and relatives and all other persons who reside in the same home as the person who has hemophilia. Family shall not include persons who lease or rent a portion of the residence.

(g) "Family income" means the total amount of adjusted gross income reported for federal income tax purposes on the most recent federal income tax return filed by each adult member of the family, with the addition of non-taxable benefits from whatever source.

(h) "Family living allowance" means the amount established by the secretary as specified in K.A.R. 28-4-413.

(i) "Hemophilia" means a bleeding tendency that results from a genetically determined deficiency factor in the blood.

(j) "Hemophilia program" means services that are provided for the care and treatment of persons with hemophilia and that are administered by services for children with special health care needs.

(k) "Home therapy," or "self therapy," means the administration of transfusions of blood concentrates or blood derivatives in a home setting.

(l) "Individual service plan" means documents prepared by services for children with special health care needs that state a plan of treatment, authorized services, pro-

viders of service, time frame for provision of services and party responsible for payment for services.

(m) "Infusion" means therapeutic introduction of a fluid into a vein.

(n) "Infusion supplies" means syringes, needles and hemophilia infusion sets.

(o) "Prior authorization" means the approval of a request to obtain blood, blood derivatives and concentrates and other efficacious agents or educational services pertaining to hemophilia before the provision of the service, or in an emergency, within two working days after the emergency occurs.

(p) "Secretary" means the secretary of the department of health and environment or the secretary's designee. (Authorized by K.S.A. 65-1,134; implementing K.S.A. 65-1,132, 65-1,133; effective, T-85-41, Dec. 19, 1984; effective May 1, 1985; amended Dec. 26, 1989.)

**28-4-411. Responsibilities of individuals who apply for or who receive assistance.** (a) Each applicant shall supply, insofar as possible, information essential to the establishment of eligibility within 30 days of the request for assistance.

(b) Each applicant shall give written permission on forms prescribed by the secretary for release of information needed to determine medical and financial eligibility.

(c) Each applicant or eligible person shall report changes in address, number of children living in the home, marital status, custody of children, insurance coverage, family income or cash assets of more than \$500.00 per year or other circumstances that affect the special health care needs of the applicant or eligible person within 10 working days of the change.

(d) Each applicant or eligible person, enrolled in the department of social and rehabilitation's primary care network, shall report the applicant's or eligible person's medical number and the name of the applicant's or eligible person's primary care network physician at the time of application of subsequent enrollment in the primary care network and within 10 working days of any changes.

(e) Each eligible person shall:

(1) Apply for insurance benefits, title XIX medicaid program benefits, supplemental security income benefits or benefits from other sources when requested;

(2) assign the insurance benefits to hospitals and other providers of service for any medical treatment provided by the hemophilia program;

(3) apply the benefits of any non-assignable insurance by making payments to hospitals or other providers of service for items ordered by the attending physician; and

(4) reimburse the hemophilia program for any insurance proceeds sent directly to the recipient if the insurance payment is made for medical treatment provided by the hemophilia program.

(f) Each eligible person shall obtain from one of the comprehensive centers initial and annual evaluations of medical eligibility for the hemophilia program.

(g) Each eligible person shall obtain from one of the comprehensive centers a written prescription for blood, blood derivatives and concentrates or other efficacious agents and shall provide a copy of the current prescription to the hemophilia program. (Authorized by and imple-

menting K.S.A. 65-1,132; effective, T-85-41, Dec. 19, 1984; effective May 1, 1985; amended Dec. 26, 1989.)

**28-4-412.** (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1984 Supp. 65-1,132; effective, T-85-41, Dec. 19, 1984; effective May 1, 1985; revoked Dec. 26, 1989.)

**28-4-413. Financial eligibility.** (a)(1) The uniform standard for determining eligibility shall be the annual margin as calculated in paragraph (2) below. If the annual margin is zero or below, the person shall be eligible for financial assistance under the hemophilia program. If the annual margin is above zero, the person shall not be eligible for financial assistance, except as provided in subsections (d) and (e) below. The factors to be utilized in calculating the annual margin shall be: family income, cash assets, family living allowance, anticipated specialized health care expenditures for the person and the health care expenditures for the person and the health insurance coverage of the person.

(2) The annual margin shall be calculated by:

(A) Adding the amount of the family income to the amount of cash assets above the maximum allowed under subsection (c) below; and

(B) Subtracting from the total of paragraph (A) above the following:

(i) The family living allowance as determined in subsection (b) below; and

(ii) The amount of the anticipated health care expenditures for the person that will not be paid by the person's health insurance coverage.

(b) The following table shall be used to determine the family living allowance;

For each additional person, \$3,626 shall be added to \$25,179.

(c) The following table shall be used to determine the maximum cash assets allowed a family.

For each additional person, \$544 shall be added to \$3,777.

(d) If within twelve months after application the annual margin is spent down per subsection (e) to zero or below by the family's actual or obligated expenditures for medical care, the person shall be, at that time, financially eligible for assistance for the remainder of the twelve-month period. These expenditures shall be in addition to any expenditure or reimbursement made by health insurance or other third-party payor.

(e) In order to spend the annual margin down to zero, the family shall agree to:

(1) pay for medical expenses and travel expenses related to medical treatment, or for health support services, supplies or equipment; or

(2) pay for a portion of actual or anticipated medical

(continued)

expenses, and travel expenses related to medical treatment or for a portion of health support services, supplies or equipment as documented in the individual service plan. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 65-1,132; effective, T-85-41, Dec. 19, 1984; effective May 1, 1985; amended Dec. 26, 1989.)

Article 16.—WATER POLLUTION CONTROL

28-16-137. Environmental review. (a) The Kansas environmental review procedure for the Kansas water pollution control revolving loan program, dated February, 1989 is adopted by reference as the required environmental procedure for an equivalency project.

(f) For an equivalency project, 40 CFR, 6.508(a), 6.511(b) and 6.512 as in effect on July 1, 1988, are adopted by reference.

(c) Those members of the public who participate in the

environmental review process shall have the right to appeal the decisions made within that process. All such appeals shall be conducted pursuant to the Kansas administrative procedures act and the act for judicial review set forth in K.S.A. 1988 Supp. 77-501 et seq. and K.S.A. 77-601 et seq., respectively.

(d) When used in any provision adopted from 40 CFR Part 6, references to "EPA" shall be replaced with the Kansas department of health and environment; "grant" shall be replaced with loan agreement; "grantee" shall be replaced with applicant.
