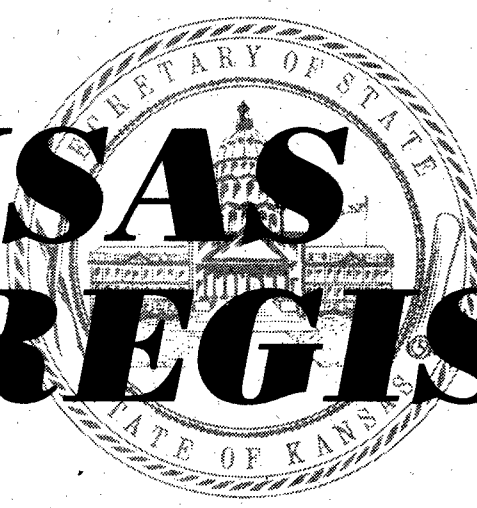

Hazardous Waste Regulations

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment is providing public notice that on March 28, 1990, Exline Incorporated, 3256 East Country Club Road, Salina, submitted a request for a variance from specific hazardous waste regulations. The request for a variance was submitted in accordance with Kansas Administrative Regulation 28-31-13(a).

The variance was requested from K.A.R. 28-31-10, which requires payment of specified annual monitoring fees by hazardous waste treatment, storage, or disposal facilities, hazardous waste generators, and hazardous waste transporters.

Exline owns a hazardous waste disposal facility in Salina. This facility has obtained a Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA) post-closure care permit. The permit establishes long term care, inspection, and monitoring requirements for a hazardous waste landfill located at the facility. K.A.R. 28-31-10(c) specifies that each RCRA regulated hazardous waste disposal facility with a landfill shall pay an annual monitoring fee of \$10,000. Exline requested that this fee be reduced to \$1,500 because the facility is no longer actively disposing of waste.

KDHE reviewed the variance request and concluded that the variance was not justified. KDHE considers all permitted facilities to be operating irregardless of whether they are currently disposing of waste. Exline has a permit and is therefore considered an operating facility. Exline did not remove all contaminants from a surface impoundment during closure of the unit. The unit is considered to be a hazardous waste landfill because of the remaining contamination.

Kansas Statutes Annotated 65-3431(u), which is the basis for K.A.R. 28-31-10, directs the Secretary of Health and Environment to establish a schedule of fees paid by permittees operating hazardous waste facilities. K.S.A. 65-3431(u) specifies that the fees established shall be for monitoring of the facility during operation. K.A.R. 28-31-10 specifies that the fee for those facilities with hazardous waste landfills shall be \$10,000. KDHE has determined that this fee is appropriate for oversight of a facility undergoing post-closure care; therefore, KDHE made a tentative decision to deny the variance.

In accordance with K.A.R. 28-31-13(b), public notice was provided of KDHE's decision. Copies of the variance request were available for public review and comment from August 15, 1990, to September 15, 1990. Exline submitted comments on KDHE's decision on September 13, 1990. The comments do indicate that revisions in the current framework of K.A.R. 28-31-10 may be necessary, but do not justify the requested variance from the regulation.

In accordance with K.A.R. 28-31-13(b), KDHE announces its decision to deny this request for a variance.

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment is providing public notice that on April 5, 1990, the Sherwin-Williams Company, 1800 W. 4th, Coffeyville, submitted a request for a variance from specific hazardous waste regulations. The request for a variance was submitted in accordance with Kansas Administrative Regulation 28-31-13(a).

The variance was requested from K.A.R. 28-31-10, which requires payment of specified annual monitoring fees by hazardous waste treatment, storage, or disposal facilities, hazardous waste generators, and hazardous waste transporters.

The Sherwin-Williams Company owns and operates a hazardous waste disposal facility in Coffeyville. This facility has obtained a Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA) post-closure care permit. The permit establishes long term care, inspection, and monitoring requirements for several hazardous waste landfills located at the facility. K.A.R. 28-31-10(c) specifies that each hazardous waste disposal facility with a landfill shall pay an annual monitoring fee of \$10,000. Sherwin-Williams requested that this fee be reduced to \$1,500 because the facility is no longer actively disposing of waste in the landfills.

KDHE reviewed the variance request and concluded that the variance is not justified. KDHE considers all permitted facilities to be operating irregardless of whether they are currently disposing of waste. Sherwin-Williams' Coffeyville facility has a permit and is therefore considered an operating facility. The Coffeyville facility did not remove all contaminants from several surface impoundments and a waste pile during closure of these units. These units are considered hazardous waste landfills because of the remaining contamination.

Kansas Statutes Annotated 65-3431(u), which is the basis for K.A.R. 28-31-10, directs the Secretary of Health and Environment to establish a schedule of fees paid by permittees operating hazardous waste facilities. K.S.A. 65-3431(u) specifies that the fees established shall be for monitoring of the facility during operation. K.A.R. 28-31-10 specifies that the fee for those facilities with hazardous waste landfills shall be \$10,000. KDHE determined that this fee is appropriate for oversight of a facility undergoing post-closure care; therefore, KDHE tentatively decided to deny the variance.

In accordance with K.A.R. 28-31-13(b), public notice was provided of KDHE's decision. Copies of the variance request were available for public review and comment from August 16, 1990, to September 15, 1990. No comments were received during the comment period for the variance.

In accordance with K.A.R. 28-31-13(b), KDHE announces its decision to deny this request for a variance.

Advisory Opinion No. 90-11

Written August 15, 1990, to Sarah Lloyd, Industrial Therapy Coordinator, Youth Center at Larned.

This opinion is in response to your letter of July 31, 1990, in which you request an opinion from the Kansas Public Disclosure Commission.

We understand you request this opinion in your capacity as an industrial therapy coordinator for the Youth Center at Larned.

You state that you and M. Maxine Vaughan, director of the Youth Center at Larned, have been the two persons authorized to approve purchases from the Work Program account. Over the past two or more years, you have purchased several pieces of lawn equipment and repair parts from the Sears store in Great Bend, Kansas. Mrs. Vaughan will retire on August 3, 1990. The person who will possibly be the interim director has a spouse who is the manager of the Sears store in Great Bend. You ask would it be considered a conflict of interest if she were to become the other person besides yourself to approve workshop purchases?

K.S.A. 46-233(a) applies to your question. That section states in pertinent part:

"(a) No state officer or employee shall in the capacity as such officer or employee participate in the making of a contract with any person or business by which such officer or employee is employed or in whose business such officer or employee has a substantial interest and no such person or business shall enter into any contract where any state officer or employee, acting in such capacity, is a signatory to or a participant in the making of such contract and is employed by or has a substantial interest in such person or business."

We note at the outset that the possible interim director would be deemed to hold a substantial interest in the Sears store because of her husband's income pursuant to K.S.A. 46-229. Thus, it is our opinion that she could not participate in any manner in the making of any contracts with Sears in her capacity as a state official.

Nothing stated herein, however, would preclude her from accepting the position and participating in the making of contracts with entities in which she does not have a substantial interest.

Advisory Opinion No. 90-12

Written August 15, 1990, to Jay Scott Emler, Corporate Counsel, Kansas Independent Networks, Inc., Salina.

This opinion is in response to your letter of July 19, 1990, in which you request an opinion from the Kansas Public Disclosure Commission.

We understand you request this opinion as corporate counsel for the Kansas Independent Networks, Inc.

You ask the following question:

If a corporation contributes to the campaign of a political candidate, may the corporations which own stock in the contributing corporation also contribute to the campaign of the same political candidate?

(continued)

K.S.A. 25-4153 sets out contribution limitations which are applicable to each "person." "Person" is defined in K.S.A. 25-4143(h) to include "any corporation." It is, therefore, our opinion that each corporation may contribute the maximum amount permissible under K.S.A. 25-4153, so long as funds are not funneled from one corporation to another to permit the contribution to be made.

We note for your information that a different outcome might well have been rendered under K.S.A. 25-4153 (1989 Supp.) subsection (c) except that subsection (c) was repealed by the 1990 Legislature.

Advisory Opinion No. 90-13

Written August 15, 1990, to Louis C. Rasmussen, Leawood.

This opinion is in response to your letter of June 21, 1990, in which you request an opinion from the Kansas Public Disclosure Commission.

We understand you request this opinion in your capacity as a councilperson for the city of Leawood.

You advise us that you are also chairperson of the board of directors of Carondelet Health Corporation, a not-for-profit corporation whose major subsidiary is Saint Joseph Hospital. The hospital is located at I-435 and State Line Road in Kansas City, Missouri. You receive no compensation as chairperson. As chairperson, you are encouraging the widening of State Line Road which abuts the hospital property so that emergency vehicles can have safer and quicker access to the emergency facilities. The city of Leawood is on the other side of State Line Road. If State Line Road is to be widened, some city monies will be expended.

K.S.A. 75-4304 and 75-4305 apply to your questions. Those sections state:

"75-4304. Public officers and employees prohibited from making certain contracts; abstaining from action, effect; exceptions. (a) No public officer or employee shall in his or her capacity as such officer or employee, make or participate in the making of a contract with any person or business by which he or she is employed or in whose business he or she has a substantial interest, and no such person or business shall enter into any contract where any public officer or employee, acting in such capacity, is a signatory to or a participant in the making of such contract and is employed by or has a substantial interest in such person or business. A public officer or employee does not make or participate in the making of a contract if he or she abstains from any action in regard to the contract. This section shall not apply to the following: (1) Contracts let after competitive bidding has been advertised for by published notice; and (2) Contracts for property or services for which the price or rate is fixed by law. (b) Any public officer or employee who is convicted of violating this section shall forfeit his or her office or employment."

"75-4305. Public officers and employees to file report of interest in business affected by official acts; abstaining from action, effect. Any public officer or employee who has not filed a disclosure of substantial interests and who, while acting in his or her official capacity,

shall pass upon any matter which will affect any business in which such officer or employee shall hold a substantial interest, shall, before he or she acts upon such matter, file a written report of the nature of said interest with the office of the secretary of state, if such person is a state officer or employee, or if such person is an officer or employee of a municipal or quasi-municipal corporation, with the county clerk of the county in which all or the largest geographical part of such municipal or quasi-municipal corporation is located. A public officer or employee does not pass or act upon any matter if he or she abstains from any action in regard to the matter."

K.S.A. 75-4304 relates only to "contracts" between the city and other entities, thus as your questions relate to votes on legislative issues such as zoning, this section does not prohibit you from participating so long as you have disclosed your interest as required by K.S.A. 75-4305. In addition, even though an entity in which you may hold a substantial interest will be benefitted by the expenditure of public funds to widen the street, you could vote on such expenditures so long as the hospital does not receive any funds. You should keep in mind the requirement of disclosure under K.S.A. 75-4305.

Advisory Opinion No. 90-14

Written August 15, 1990, to Beverly E. Eversmeyer, Ph.D., Manhattan.

This opinion is in response to your letter of July 13, 1990, in which you request an opinion from the Kansas Public Disclosure Commission.

We understand you are a member of a local school board and also a school counselor at a school under the board's jurisdiction.

You ask whether it is appropriate for you to participate on behalf of the school board on the negotiated package for school employees which would include your own contract.

K.S.A. 75-4304 prohibits a local official from participating in the making of contracts between the public entity and "businesses" or "persons" by which the official is employed or in which the elected official holds a substantial interest. This commission has consistently held under the local conflicts law that a school board is not a "business" and since the term "person" is undefined, a school board is not a "person" either. Thus, under the local conflicts law, it is permissible for a member of a school board to vote on his or her own contract.

We note that the outcome would be different under the law applicable to state employees, since there "person" is a defined term which includes governmental entities.

Advisory Opinion No. 90-15

Written September 19, 1990, to H. Philip Martin, Member, Kansas Racing Commission, Topeka.

This opinion is in response to your letter of September 11, 1990, in which you request an opinion from the Kansas Public Disclosure Commission.

We understand you request this opinion in your capacity as a member of the Kansas Racing Commission.

You state that at the primary election in August you

were elected as a Democratic Committeeperson for Logan Township in Pawnee County, Kansas. You were uncertain if you could accept that position while serving as a member of the Kansas Racing Commission. You also ask if you may be actively involved in campaigns for persons seeking elective office.

We have reviewed K.S.A. 75-4301 *et seq.*, K.S.A. 46-215 *et seq.* and K.S.A. 25-4119 *et seq.*, which are the laws under our jurisdiction, and none of them cover either of the questions you have raised. It is, therefore, our opinion, absent some law outside our jurisdiction to the contrary, especially the law establishing the Kansas Racing Commission, that the situations you have described are permissible.

Advisory Opinion No. 90-16

Written September 19, 1990, to Louis C. Rasmussen, Leawood.

In this opinion, we take up a question left unanswered in Opinion No. 90-13 issued to Louis C. Rasmussen.

The question is whether a city councilperson of Leawood who has retired from employment with Kansas City Power and Light Company but receives retirement checks from a pension fund guaranteed by an insurance company and KCPL may vote on contracts and franchises between the city of Leawood and KCPL.

The threshold question is whether the receipt of retirement funds from an entity constitutes the holding of a "substantial interest" in the entity.

It is our opinion that retirement benefits do not meet the definition of "compensation" as set out in the definition of "substantial interest" in K.S.A. 75-4301." Thus, since the city councilperson does not hold a substantial interest in KCPL due to retirement benefits alone, he may participate in franchising and contracts with KCPL on behalf of the city. Of course, any public official may abstain if he or she thinks it appropriate to do so.

Advisory Opinion No. 90-17

Written September 19, 1990, to Bob McDanel, Administrator, Board of Emergency Medical Services, Topeka.

This opinion is in response to your letter of September 7, 1990, in which you request an opinion from the Kansas Public Disclosure Commission.

We understand you ask for this opinion in your capacity as administrator of the Board of Emergency Medical Services.

You state: "The Board of Emergency Medical Services is the state agency responsible for the regulation of ambulance services and attendants. As a part of that statutory responsibility, the board examines all applicants for certification as attendants by giving a written and practical examination.

"In order to administer the practical examination, the board contracts with individuals who work at examination sites examining applicants for certification. These individuals are called adjunct staff members.

"Two of the 24 adjunct staff members are also members of the board. They were adjunct staff members before being named to the board and have continued in that role since their appointment. The board has adopted writ-

ten policies which outline the responsibilities of adjunct staff members. These policies provide the administrator may take disciplinary action, including dismissal, if problems occur."

You ask whether as the administrator you may take disciplinary action against a member of the board in the member's capacity as an adjunct staff member.

We have reviewed K.S.A. 75-4301, *et seq.*, K.S.A. 46-215 *et seq.* and K.S.A. 25-4119 *et seq.*, which are the laws under our jurisdiction, and none of them cover the question you have raised. Although we recognize the difficult situation in which you have been placed, it is our opinion, absent some law outside our jurisdiction to the contrary, that the situation you have described is permissible.

**Permanent Administrative
Regulations**

Article 1.—DEFINITIONS

5-1-1. Definitions. As used in these rules and regulations, the Kansas water appropriation act, and by the division of water resources in the administration of the Kansas water appropriation act, unless the context clearly requires otherwise, the following words and phrases shall have the meaning ascribed to them in this section:

(a) "Application" means the formal document submitted on the prescribed form furnished by the division for a permit to appropriate water for beneficial use and filed in the office of the chief engineer as provided by K.S.A. 82a-708a and 709.

(b) "Approval of application" means a permit to proceed with construction of diversion works and the diversion and use of water in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth in the permit. Approval of application does not constitute any permit which may be required by other state laws.

(c) "Artificial recharge" means the use of water to artificially replenish the water supply in an aquifer.

(d) "Authorized representative" means any staff employee designated by the chief engineer to perform duties and functions in the chief engineer's behalf.

(e) "Battery of wells" means two or more wells connected to a common pump by a manifold, or not more than four wells in the same local source of supply within a 300 foot radius circle which are being operated by pumps not to exceed a maximum of 200 gallons per minute per well and which supply water to a common distribution system.

(f) "Beneficial uses of water" are domestic, stockwatering, municipal, irrigation, industrial, recreational, water power, artificial recharge, hydraulic dredging and contamination remediation.

(g) "Diversion" means the act of bringing water under

(continued)

control by means of a well, pump, dam or other device for delivery and distribution for the proposed use.

(h) "Diversion works" means all well(s), pump(s), power unit(s), power source(s), dam(s) and all other devices necessary to bring water under control for delivery to a distribution system by which the water will be distributed to the proposed use and any other equipment required as a condition of the permit, such as a check valve, water level measurement tube, meter or other measuring device.

(i) "Division" means the division of water resources of the Kansas state board of agriculture.

(j) "Full irrigation" means the application of water to crops during the growing season. Full irrigation includes water for preirrigation.

(k) "Groundwater" means water below the surface of the earth.

(l) "Growing season" means the average frost-free period of the year.

(m) "Household purposes" means the use of water by a person for cooking, cleaning, washing, bathing, human consumption, restroom facilities or other uses normally associated with the operation of a household. Household purposes includes the use of one and one-half acre-feet of water or less per calendar year by an industrial user, restaurant, hotel, motel, church, camp, correctional facility, educational institution or similar entity for household purposes.

(n) "Industrial use" means the use of water in connection with the manufacture, production, transport or storage of products, or the use of water in connection with providing commercial services, including water used in connection with steam electric power plants, secondary and tertiary oil recovery, air conditioning, heat pumps, and, except for hydraulic dredging, all other uses of water associated with the removal of aggregate for commercial purposes including the evaporation caused by exposing the groundwater table or increasing the surface area of a stream, lake, pit or quarry by excavaton or dredging.

(o) "Irrigation use" means the use of water for the growing of crops, the watering of gardens, orchards and lawns exceeding two acres in area, and the watering of golf courses and parks.

(p) "Municipal use" means the various uses made of water delivered through a common distribution system operated by: (1) a municipality; (2) a rural water district; (3) a water district; (4) a public wholesale water supply district; (5) any person or entity serving 10 or more hook-ups for residences or mobile homes; and (6) or any other similar entity distributing water to other water users for various purposes. Municipal use shall also include use of water by restaurants, hotels, motels, churches, camps, correctional facilities, educational institutions and similar entities using water which does not qualify as a domestic use.

(q) "Off-season irrigation" means the application of water to land for the purpose of storing moisture in the soil for future use by a crop which will not be irrigated during the growing season.

(r) "Perfect" means the actions of a water user to bring an appropriation right into final form by the completion of diversion works and application of water to the proposed use in accordance with the approved application.

(s) "Point of diversion" means the point at which water is diverted or withdrawn from a source of water supply.

(t) "Preirrigation" means the application of water to the

land for a crop prior to planting to assure adequate moisture for early plant growth.

(u) "Prior right" means a vested right, an appropriation right with earlier priority or a permit with earlier priority to that of a subsequent appropriation right or permit.

(v) "Recreational use" means a use of water in accordance with a water right which provides entertainment, enjoyment and relaxation.

(w) "Static water level" means the depth of the top of the groundwater level below land surface which is not affected by recent pumpage.

(x) "Stockwatering" means the use of water for the watering of livestock and other uses of water directly related to the operation of a feedlot with the capacity to confine 1,000 head or more of livestock. Such use shall not include the irrigation of feed grains or other crops.

(y) "Surface water" means water in creeks, rivers or other watercourses, and in reservoirs, lakes and ponds.

(z) "Waste of water" means any act or omission which causes:

(1) Water to be diverted or withdrawn from a source of supply and not used or reapplied to a beneficial use on or in connection with land authorized as the place of use by a vested right, an appropriation right or an approved application for permit to appropriate water for beneficial use;

(2) The unreasonable deterioration of the quality of water in any source of supply thereby causing impairment of a person's right to the use of water;

(3) Water intended for irrigation use to escape and drain from the authorized place of use; or

(4) Water to be applied to an authorized beneficial use in excess of the needs for such use.

(aa) "Water power use" means the use of falling water for hydro-electric or hydro-mechanical power.

(bb) "Immediate vicinity," as used in specifying the place of use for a water right in which the water is authorized to be used for municipal purposes, means within 2,640 feet of the corporate limits of the municipality, rural water district or other entity.

(cc) "Completed substantially as shown on aerial photograph, topographic map or plat," as used to define the authorized point of diversion, means within 300 feet of the location as shown on the aerial photograph, topographic map or plat accompanying the application.

(dd) "Hydraulic dredging" means the removal of saturated aggregate from a stream channel, pit or quarry by means of hydraulic suction and the pumping of the aggregate and water mixture as a slurry to a location on the shore where at least 95% of the water returns directly to the source of supply.

(ee) "Contamination remediation" means the diversion of water by a state agency, or under a written agreement or order of an appropriate state agency, for the purpose of improving the water quality.

(ff) "Dewatering" means the removal of surface water or groundwater which would otherwise enter an excavation and interfere with construction or mining activities. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 82a-706a; implementing K.S.A. 82a-706a; modified, L. 1978, Ch. 460, May 1, 1978; amended May 1, 1980; amended May 1, 1981; amended May 1, 1983; amended May 1, 1986; amended Dec. 3, 1990.)

Article 5.—CHANGE IN THE PLACE OF USE, THE POINT OF DIVERSION OR THE USE MADE OF WATER UNDER AN EXISTING WATER RIGHT

5-5-7. Each person shall not commit a waste of water as defined in these regulations. Upon a finding by the chief engineer that waste of water has occurred, the chief engineer may suspend use of that water right until the owner shows to the satisfaction of the chief engineer that the waste of water will no longer occur. (Authorized by K.S.A. 82a-706(a); implementing K.S.A. 82a-706; effective Dec. 3, 1990.)

Article 9.—TEMPORARY PERMITS

5-9-3. Quantity. A temporary permit shall not be granted for a quantity in excess of 1,000,000 gallons except for dewatering purposes or when water is to be diverted from a source located on a construction site and used on the construction site in connection with a project that the chief engineer has approved under the authority of K.S.A. 82a-301 through 305a or K.S.A. 24-126. (Authorized by K.S.A. 82a-727b; implementing K.S.A. 82a-727; effective May 1, 1979; amended Dec. 3, 1990.)

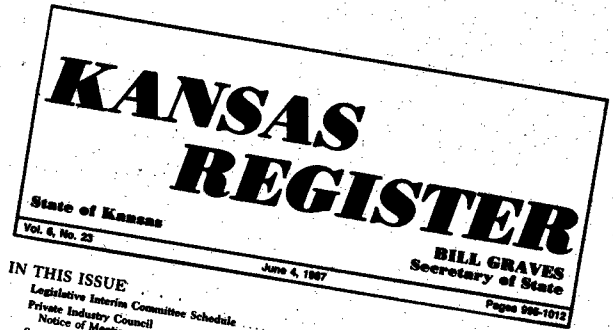
