A hearing will be conducted at 9:30 a.m. Tuesday, November 19, at the Water District No. 1 of Johnson County, Kansas, Water Treatment Plant, first floor training room, Operations and Maintenance Building, 7601 Holliday Drive, Kansas City, Kansas, to determine whether the application of Water District No. 1 of Johnson County, Kansas, to transfer water from the Missouri River for municipal use within its boundaries should be approved.

1. In accordance with K.S.A. 82a-1503(d), the presiding officer at the hearing will be a panel consisting of: David L. Pope, Chief Engineer, Kansas State Board of Agriculture, Division of Water Resources, 901 S. As authorized by K.S.A. 82a-1503(d), Mr. Jones has been appointed to serve on the panel by Dr. Azzie Young, Secretary, Kansas Department of Health and Environment.

2. The hearing is being held pursuant to the Water Transfers Act, K.S.A. 82-1501 et seq. K.S.A. 82a-1503(c) provides in pertinent part:

Within 60 days of receipt of a sufficient application for a water transfer pursuant to this act, the chief engineer shall convene and conduct a hearing thereon. At such hearing, the panel shall consider the application and determine whether to approve the proposed water transfer in accordance with the provisions of the Kansas administrative procedure act.

4. If a party fails to attend or participate in a pre-hearing conference, hearing, or other stage of an adjudicative proceeding, that party may be held in default pursuant to K.S.A. 77-520.

5. On September 27, 1991, the Division of Water Resources received a Water Transfer Application from the Water District No. 1 of Johnson County, Kansas. The application is for the transfer of 23,000 acre feet of water per calendar year at a rate of 35,000 gallons per minute from the Missouri River to be used for municipal purposes within the boundaries of Water District No. 1 of Johnson County, Kansas. Upon receipt of the application and in accordance with K.S.A. 82a-1503, the chief engineer, Division of Water Resources, determined that the application was sufficient to determine the source, nature and amount of the proposed transfer.

## Prehearing Order

NOW on this 21st day of October, 1991, the above-captioned matter comes on before the Water Transfer Hearing Panel for a prehearing conference. The applicant appears in person by Byron Johnson and Ralph Wyss and by its attorneys Mike Armstrong and Wilson E. Speer. Also present at the conference were Warren D. Lutz, William Gilliland, James O. Bagley and Rebecca J. Liggett, all staff of the Division of Water Resources, Kansas State Board of Agriculture, Steve Adams and DeAnn Hupe Seib, both staff of the Kansas Department of Wildlife and Parks, and Tom Stiles, staff of the Kansas Water Office.

Whereupon, the Hearing Panel sets the following deadlines and makes the following order:

1. The applicant shall have until November 13, 1991, to submit its revised conservation plan.
2. The applicant and any other person or organization who, upon written petition, is allowed by the Hearing Panel to intervene as a party shall submit witness and exhibit lists on or before November 13, 1991, to the Hearing Panel.
3. The applicant and any other person or organization allowed by the Hearing Panel to intervene as a party shall have until November 13, 1991, to submit copies of any exhibits that are voluminous, complex or otherwise not quickly and easily understandable.
4. Due to limited time before the evidentiary hearing, no formal discovery process will be established by the Hearing Panel. The applicant and any other person or organization allowed by the Hearing Panel to intervene as a party shall cooperate in the exchange of information. Any disputes regarding exchange of information shall be brought to the Hearing Panel through the chairperson for resolution.
5. The issues of fact in this matter are as follows:
  - a. Whether the benefits to the State for approving the transfer outweigh the benefits to the State for not approving the transfer.
  - b. Any current beneficial use being made of the water proposed to be diverted, including minimum desirable streamflow requirements.
  - c. Any reasonably foreseeable future beneficial use of the water.
  - d. The economic, environmental, public health and welfare and other impacts of approving or denying the transfer of the water.
  - e. Alternative sources of water available to the applicant and present or future users for any beneficial use.
  - f. The proposed plan of design, construction and operations of any works or facilities used in conjunction with carrying the water from the point of diversion.

- g. Whether conservation plans and practices consistent with the guidelines for conservation developed by the Kansas Water Office have been adopted by the District, the need for such plans, and practices of persons protesting or potentially affected by the proposed transfer.
6. The Hearing Panel hereby takes official notice of the following:
  - a. All files in the office of the Chief Engineer, Division of Water Resources, Kansas State Board of Agriculture, relating to Appropriation of Water, File No. 40,239.
  - b. United States Geological Survey streamflow records on the Missouri River.
  - c. Records in the office of the Chief Engineer, Division of Water Resources, Kansas State Board of Agriculture, regarding appropriations of water within a ten mile radius of the intake of Water District No. 1 of Johnson County on the Missouri River and all appropriations of water from the Missouri River in the state of Kansas.
  - d. The Municipal Water Conservation Plan Guidelines adopted by the Kansas Water Office in November, 1990, pursuant to the authority of K.S.A. 74-2608 *et seq.*
  - e. The sufficiency of Water District No. 1 of Johnson County's water transfer application to determine the source, nature and amount of the proposed transfer.
  - f. The minimum desirable streamflow designations found at K.S.A. 82a-703(c).
7. The Hearing Panel will receive statements by non-parties either orally or in writing. Members of the Hearing Panel may question non-parties; however, statements presented by non-parties will not be subject to cross-examination.
8. The cost to record the evidentiary hearing, to transcribe the record and to provide a copy to the Kansas Water Authority, if the application is approved by the Hearing Panel, shall be shared on a *pro rata* basis by the state agencies represented on the Hearing Panel. The applicant or any other person or organization may, at their own expense, obtain a copy of the transcript from the shorthand reporter.
9. An evidentiary hearing shall be held at the Water District No. 1 of Johnson County, Kansas, Water Treatment Plant, First Floor Training Room, Operations and Maintenance Building, 7601 Holliday Drive, Kansas City, Kansas 66106, on Tuesday, November 19, 1991, at 9:30 a.m.

- (f) section 9 is not adopted;
- (g) section 10 is amended by substituting "K.S.A. 40-3304" for "Section 3 of the Act";
- (h) section 12(a) is amended by substituting "K.S.A. 40-3304(a)" for "Section 3(a)(1) of the Act";
- (i) section 12(b) is amended by substituting "K.S.A. 40-3304(a)" for "Section 3(a)(1)";

(r) item 12(b) and (c) of form A is amended to read as follows: "(b) The financial statements shall include the annual financial statements of the persons identified in item 2(c) for the preceding five fiscal years or for such lesser period as such applicant and its affiliates and any predecessors thereof shall have been in existence, and similar information covering the period from the end of such person's last fiscal year, to a date not earlier than 90 days prior to the filing of the Form A. Such statements may be prepared on either an individual basis, or on a consolidated basis if such consolidated statements are prepared in the usual course of business.

Unless otherwise permitted by the commissioner, the annual financial statements of the applicant shall be accompanied by the certificate of an independent public accountant to the effect that such statements present fairly the financial position of the applicant and the results of its operations for the year then ended, in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles or with requirements of insurance or other accounting principles prescribed or permitted under law. If the applicant is an insurer which is actively engaged in the business of insurance, the financial statements need not be certified, if they are based on the annual statement of such person filed with the insurance department of the person's domiciliary state and are in accordance with the requirements of insurance or other accounting principles prescribed or permitted under the law and regulations of such state.

(c) File as exhibits copies of all tender offers for, requests or invitations for, tenders of, exchange offers for, and agreements to acquire or exchange any voting securities of the insurer, and if distributed, of additional soliciting material relating thereto, any proposed employment, consultation, advisory or management contracts concerning the insurer, annual reports to the stockholders of the insurer and the applicant for the last two fiscal years, and any additional documents or papers required by form A or K.S.A. 40-3304."

## Article 2.—LIFE INSURANCE

**40-2-21. Life insurance companies; reinsurance agreements; accounting requirements; limitations.** (a) This regulation shall apply to all life insurers organized under the laws of this state, as well as to all other life insurers admitted to do business in this state who are not subject to substantially similar requirements in their domiciliary state.

(b) No life insurer subject to this regulation shall, for reinsurance ceded, reduce any liability or establish any asset in any financial statement filed with the commissioner if, by the terms of the reinsurance agreement, in substance or effect, any of the following conditions exist:

(1) The primary effect of the reinsurance agreement is to transfer deficiency reserves or excess interest reserves to the books of the reinsurer for a risk charge, and the agreement does not provide for significant participation by the reinsurer in one or more of the following risks:

- (A) mortality;
- (B) morbidity;
- (C) investment; or
- (D) surrender benefit;

(2) the reserve credit taken by the ceding insurer is not in compliance with the laws of this state, administrative rules or regulations adopted by the commissioner;

(3) the reserve credit taken by the ceding insurer is greater than the underlying reserve of the ceding company supporting the policy obligations transferred under the reinsurance agreement;

(4) the ceding insurer is required to reimburse the reinsurer for negative experience under the reinsurance agreement. However, neither the offsetting of experience refunds against the losses of previous years, nor payment by the ceding insurer of an amount equal to the losses of previous years upon voluntary termination of in-force reinsurance by that ceding insurer shall be considered such a reimbursement to the reinsurer for negative experience;

(5) the ceding insurer can be deprived of surplus at the reinsurer's option, or automatically upon the insolvency of the ceding insurer or the occurrence of some similar event except that termination of the reinsurance agreement by the reinsurer for non-payment of reinsurance premiums shall not be considered to be a deprivation of surplus;

(6) the ceding insurer must, at specific points in time scheduled in the agreement, terminate or automatically recapture all or part of the reinsurance ceded;

(7) no cash payment is due from the reinsurer throughout the lifetime of the reinsurance agreement, with all settlements prior to the termination date of the agreement made only in a designated reinsurance account and no funds in such account are available for the payment of benefits; or

(continued)

(8) the reinsurance agreement involves the possible payment by the ceding insurer to the reinsurer of amounts other than from income reasonably expected from the reinsured policies.

(c)(1) No reinsurance agreement or amendment to any agreement may be used to reduce any liability or to establish any asset in any financial statement filed with the commissioner, unless the agreement, amendment or a letter of intent has been duly executed by both parties no later than the "as of date" of the financial statement.

(2) In the case of a letter of intent, a reinsurance agreement or an amendment to a reinsurance agreement shall be executed within a reasonable period of time, not exceeding 90 days from the execution date of the letter of intent, in order for credit to be granted for the reinsurance ceded.

(d) Any life insurance company subject to this regulation may continue to reduce liabilities or establish assets in financial statements filed with the department for reinsurance ceded under of the types of reinsurance agreements described in section (b) of this regulation if:

(1) The reinsurance agreement produces significant surplus aid for the ceding insurer, while providing little or no indemnification of policy benefits by the reinsurer;

(2) the agreements were executed and in force prior to the effective date of this regulation;

(3) no new business is ceded under the agreements after the effective date of this regulation;

(4) the reduction of the liability or the asset established for the reinsurance ceded is reduced to zero by December 31, 1994, or any later date approved by the commissioner as a result of an application made by the ceding insurer prior to December 31 of the year in which this regulation becomes effective; and

(5) the department is notified, within 90 days following the effective date of this regulation, of the existence of those reinsurance agreements and all corresponding credits taken in the ceding insurer's 1990 annual statement.

(e) Notwithstanding section (b) of this regulation, a life insurer may, with the prior approval of the commissioner, take such reserve credit as is otherwise permissible under all other applicable provisions of the insurance laws of this state and administrative rules or regulations. (Authorized by K.S.A. 40-103; implementing K.S.A. 40-221a; effective Dec. 16, 1991.)

### Article 3.—FIRE AND CASUALTY INSURANCE

**40-3-48. Insurance companies; managing general agents; definitions; requirements; penalties.** (a) The term "managing general agent," or "MGA" as defined in K.S.A. 1990 Supp. 40-2,130(d), shall include any person who, in addition to the criteria set forth therein, adjusts or pays any claim in excess of \$5,000.

(b) The term "gross written premium" shall include all direct premiums written by a managing general agent regardless of where the risks are located.

(c) All managing general agents shall acquire and

maintain a fidelity bond for the protection of the insurer contracting with the managing general agent. The bond shall be in the amount of \$100,000, or 25% of the gross amount of direct written premiums received by the insurer for the previous calendar year that is attributable to the managing general agent, whichever is greater. The bond amount shall be adjusted accordingly on or before April 1 of each year. Coverage shall not be written by the insurer or an affiliate of the insurer contracting with the managing general agent. The bond shall be executed by a fidelity insurer admitted to do business in Kansas, or an insurer appearing on the list maintained by the commissioner pursuant to K.S.A. 40-246e, on a form supplied by the department. A copy of the executed bond shall be filed with the department.

(d) All managing general agents shall acquire and maintain an errors and omissions insurance policy. The policy coverage limits shall be set at \$1,000,000, or 25% of the gross written premium received by an insurer for the previous calendar year that is attributable to the managing general agent, whichever is greater. The policy coverage limits shall be adjusted accordingly on or before April 1 of each year. The errors and omissions policy shall be issued by an insurer admitted to do business in Kansas or an insurer appearing on the list maintained by the commissioner pursuant to K.S.A. 40-246e. Coverage shall not be written by the insurer or an affiliate of the insurer contracting with the managing general agent. Proof of insurance shall be filed with the department.

(e) Any contract entered into between a managing general agent and a domestic insurer shall be retained by the insurer.

(f) Every managing general agent shall keep the usual and customary records pertaining to transactions taking place under their managing general agent agreements at the managing general agent's place of business. All books, bank accounts and records shall be kept available and open to the inspection of the commissioner or the commissioner's representatives at any time during business hours. Such records shall be retained by the managing general agent until the insurer and the business to which they pertain has been the subject of an examination pursuant to the provisions of K.S.A. 40-222 and amendments thereto.

(g) If the contract between an insurer and a managing general agent is terminated for any reason, the managing general agent shall, upon request of the insurer, deliver all records to the insurer within 90 days of the request.

(h) A managing general agent shall send the insurer a claim file as soon as it becomes known that such claim might exceed a limit set by the insurer, or one-quarter of one percent of the policyholder surplus as reported in the last annual statement of the insurer, whichever is less.

(i) A managing general agent shall send the insurer a claim file as soon as it becomes known that the claim file is closed by payment of an amount set by the insurer, or an amount in excess of one-quarter of one percent of the policyholder surplus as reported in the last annual statement of the insurer, whichever is less.

(j) A domestic insurer, or other insurers specifically identified by the commissioner, shall file with the department a current list of names and addresses of all managing general agents with which it has a contract and the name of an officer of the insurer responsible for the contract. The insurer shall provide written notification of changes to the list on a continuing basis.

(k) An independent audit by a certified public accountant shall be conducted annually upon managing general agents currently under contract, and shall be contracted for by the insurer. The independent audit shall include the following:

- (1) a report of an independent certified public accountant;
- (2) a balance sheet;
- (3) a statement of income;
- (4) a statement of cash flows;
- (5) a statement of income and retained earnings;
- (6) notes to financial statements required by generally accepted accounting principles; and
- (7) a listing of all exceptions and internal control weaknesses noted in the course of the audit.

(l) An insurer shall retain a current independent audit report by a certified public accountant of each managing general agent with which the insurer has done business.

(m) The department shall retain the authority to examine a managing general agent notwithstanding termination of the managing general agent's contractual authority. The expense of such examination shall be reimbursed to the department by the insurer employing the managing general agent according to the provisions of K.S.A. 40-223. The specific rules for the "Holiday Doubler" are contained in K.A.R. 111-3-1 *et seq.* and 111-4-346 through 111-4-349. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1990 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-22-91, Oct. 18, 1991.)

**111-4-347. Definitions.** The following definitions shall apply to the "Holiday Doubler" instant lottery game:

(a) "Play symbols" are the numbers, letters, symbols, or pictures printed in the play area of each instant game ticket and which determine if the ticket bearer is entitled to a prize. In this instant game, the play symbols are printed in black ink in 15 pt. Archer. A play symbol appears in each of seven play spots within each game in the play area. Each play symbol for this instant game is one of the following: FREE—\$1.00—\$3.00—10.00—20.00—\$250—Figure of Santa's Face.

(b) "Play symbol captions" are the words or portions of words printed beneath each play symbol in the play area and are used to repeat or explain the play symbol. The play symbol caption associated with each play symbol is as follows:

\$3.00	THR\$
10.00	TEN\$

(c) "Ticket validation number" means a unique number appearing on each ticket which is used to validate winning tickets. For this instant game, the ticket validation number is a 10-digit number which appears under the "Void If Removed" spot on the front of each instant ticket.

(d) "Book-ticket number" means the unique number appearing on each ticket which includes the number of the book from which it was removed and the serially assigned number of the ticket within that book. For this instant game, the book-ticket number is an 8-digit

book number followed by a dash and then a 3-digit ticket number. The ticket numbers in each book start with 000 and end with 299. The book-ticket number is printed in black ink on the front of each instant game ticket.

(e) "Retailer validation code" means the small letters found under removable covering in the play area of each instant game ticket. The retailer uses this code to verify and validate winners which are to be paid by the retailer. In this instant game, the retailer validation code is a two letter code printed and appearing in two of six varying locations among the play symbols. The codes and their meanings are as follows: AA = FREE TICKET; QQ = 2 FREE TICKETS; CC = \$1.00; EE = \$3.00; HH = \$6.00; BB = \$10.00; NN = \$20.00. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1990 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-22-91, Oct. 18, 1991.)

**111-4-348. Determination of Instant Prize Winners.** An instant prize winner is determined for this instant game when the player removes or "scratches off" the removable layer of material covering the play area to reveal the six play symbols and captions. This is a match three (3) of seven (7) game with a special doubler feature. If three (3) of the seven (7) concealed prize amounts match, the player wins the amount shown. If two like prize amounts match and a doubler symbol is revealed, the player wins double the prize amount. No ticket will be eligible to win more than one prize. Prizes a player may win are as follows:

#### "WICHITA WINGS DRAWINGS"

**111-4-350. Name of Drawing.** (a) The Kansas Lottery shall conduct a series of instant ticket drawings entitled "Wichita Wings Drawings." The drawings shall take place at the Wichita Wings game at the Kansas Coliseum, 1229 E. 85th North, Wichita, Kansas, on November 2, 1991.

(b) The drum shall open at 5:30 p.m. on November 2, 1991, and eight tickets shall be drawn at the following four drawings: two tickets shall be drawn at the end of the first quarter, two at the end of the second quarter, two prior to the beginning of the third quarter and two at the end of the third quarter. The drum shall be closed immediately prior to the drawings and reopened immediately following each drawing until completion of the final drawing at the end of the third quarter. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1990 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-22-91, Oct. 18, 1991.)

**111-4-351. Definitions.** (a) All definitions contained in the Kansas lottery act (K.S.A. 1990 Supp. 74-8701 *et seq.*) and lottery regulations are hereby incorporated by reference.

(b) "Wichita Wings Drawings" means the acts of drawing prizes conducted by the Kansas Lottery at the Wichita Wings game in Wichita, Kansas, in which participants are selected to win various prizes as described in K.A.R. 111-4-352. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1990 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-22-91, Oct. 18, 1991.)

**111-4-352. Prizes.** Each of eight winners selected at the "Wichita Wings Drawings" specified in subsection (b) of K.A.R. 111-4-350 on November 2, 1991, shall receive a prize of \$100. No "Wichita Wings Drawings" prize winner shall be entitled to win more than one prize. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1990 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-22-91, Oct. 18, 1991.)

**111-4-353. Entry into Drawing.** Entry into the "Wichita Wings Drawings" is accomplished by the process detailed in the following subparagraphs:

- Obtain a valid Kansas instant lottery ticket;
- Determine if the ticket is a winning ticket in accordance with any instant game rules. If the ticket is a winning ticket, it is not eligible for the "Wichita Wings Drawings" and shall be redeemed in accordance with the instant game rules;
- If the ticket is a valid non-winning ticket, the ticket is eligible for winning the drawing and the

holder of the ticket may enter the "Wichita Wings Drawings;"

(d) The holder of the non-winning ticket must complete the information form on the back of the ticket in a legible manner and sign it. Unsigned tickets shall not be considered valid entries in any drawing conducted by the lottery;

(e) The holder of the non-winning ticket must take the non-winning ticket with the completed information form to the location of the "Wichita Wings Drawings" and place it in the receptacle provided;

(f) The receptacle or drum shall be available and entries may be made at the times stated in K.A.R. 111-4-350. Entries shall be allowed until the actual winner selection process begins;

(g) The holder of the ticket is not required to be present at the time of the drawing to be determined a winner;

(h) The drawings will be conducted at the approximate times listed in K.A.R. 111-4-350.

(i) There is no limit to the number of entries a participant may make. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1990 Supp. 74-8710(b); effective, T-111-10-22-91, Oct. 18, 1991.)

**111-4-354. Determination of "Wichita Wings Drawings" Winners.** (a) At least 5 minutes before the drawings, the person designated by the executive director, shall announce to the audience that the winner selection process will begin. Any persons wishing to enter the drawing who have not yet done so, shall immediately place their tickets into the receptacle or drum at this time.

(b) Prior to sealing the receptacle or drum, the person designated by the executive director shall announce that entries into the "Wichita Wings Drawings" are closed. No further entries will be accepted.

(c) The receptacle or drum shall be sealed and rotated a minimum of 10 times to ensure random selection.

(d) The executive director shall designate one individual of his choice to participate in the selection process.

(e) The selection of "Wichita Wings Drawings" winners on November 2, 1991, shall be accomplished by the individual designated by the executive director, who shall remove only two tickets from the receptacle or drum in which all entries were placed at each of the drawings conducted at the times specified in K.A.R. 111-4-350. A lottery employee designated by the executive director as well as a lottery security officer or a Kansas lottery employee designated by lottery security shall review the selected ticket to determine if the name stated on the information form located on the back of the selected ticket is legible and if the ticket is signed. If the name is determined to be legible and the ticket is signed, the name of the winner shall be announced to the audience. This process shall be repeated until eight valid winners have been selected.

(f) The named person is not required to be present in order to win the "Wichita Wings Drawings" prizes described in K.A.R. 111-4-352. The security person con-

ducting the drawing shall be responsible for the final determination concerning the legibility of the name on any ticket drawn.

(g) A person whose valid ticket has been drawn from the receptacle or drum at each drawing shall be determined a "Wichita Wings Drawing" winner, but regardless of the number of entries a person whose name appears on a valid entry drawn in the "Wichita Wings Drawings" has made, he or she shall not be eligible to win more than one \$100 prize.

(h) Each winner shall be given a prize claim form to be completed and returned to the lottery;

(i) If the name on any ticket drawn is not legible or the ticket is not signed, the ticket drawn will be void and the selection process shall be repeated until a valid winning ticket is selected. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1990 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-22-91, Oct. 18, 1991.)

**111-4-355. Co-sponsor Drawings.** Co-sponsors of "Wichita Wings Drawings" may hold co-sponsor drawings in conjunction with local retailers, businesses and organizations at the drawing event. In no instance shall these drawings take place prior to the lottery "Wichita Wings Drawings." Such drawings, if conducted, shall be a part of the lottery "Wichita Wings Drawings" and prizes, in addition to those presented by the lottery, may be donated by the co-sponsor(s). The person drawing tickets for the lottery may draw additional tickets for the co-sponsor(s). At the end of the drawing event(s) all tickets except tickets drawn for use by the lottery shall be returned to the receptacle or drum. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1990 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-22-91, Oct. 18, 1991.)

#### "KFDI COUNTRY FAIR DRAWINGS"

**111-4-356. Name of Drawing.** (a) The Kansas Lottery shall conduct an instant ticket drawing entitled "KFDI Country Fair Drawing." The date of the drawing shall coincide with the 1991 "KFDI Country Fair" at the Kansas Coliseum, 1229 E. 85th, Wichita, KS 67147.

(b) The drum shall be open from 3:00 p.m. until 9:00 p.m. on November 1, 1991; from 10:00 a.m. until 9:00 p.m. on November 2, 1991 and from 12:00 noon until 6:00 p.m. on November 3, 1991.

(c) The drawing shall be conducted immediately following the closing of the drum at 6:00 p.m. on November 3, 1991. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1990 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-22-91, Oct. 18, 1991.)

**111-4-357. Definitions.** (a) All definitions contained in the Kansas lottery act (K.S.A. 1990 Supp. 74-8701 *et seq.*) and lottery regulations are hereby incorporated by reference.

(b) "KFDI Country Fair Drawing" or "KFDI Drawing" means the act of drawing for prizes conducted by the Kansas Lottery at the "KFDI Country Fair" celebration in Wichita, Kansas, in which participants are selected to win various prizes as described in K.A.R. 111-4-358. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1990 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-22-91, Oct. 18, 1991.)

**111-4-358. Prizes.** Each of the 10 winners selected at the "KFDI Country Fair Drawing" specified in subsection (c) of K.A.R. 111-4-356 on November 3, 1991, shall receive a prize of \$100. No "KFDI Drawing" prize winner shall be entitled to win more than one prize. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1990 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-22-91, Oct. 18, 1991.)

**111-4-359. Entry into Drawing.** Entry into the "KFDI Country Fair Drawing" is accomplished by the process detailed in the following subparagraphs:

(a) Obtain a valid Kansas instant lottery ticket;

(b) Determine if the ticket is a winning ticket in accordance with any instant game rules. If the ticket is a winning ticket, it is not eligible for the "KFDI Country Fair Drawing" and shall be redeemed in accordance with the instant game rules;

(c) If the ticket is a valid non-winning ticket, the ticket is eligible for winning the drawing and the holder of the ticket may enter the "KFDI Country Fair Drawing";

(d) The holder of the non-winning ticket must complete the information form on the back of the ticket in a legible manner and sign it. Unsigned tickets shall not be considered valid entries in any drawing conducted by the lottery;

(e) The holder of the non-winning ticket must take the non-winning ticket with the completed information form to the location of the "KFDI Country Fair Drawing" and place it in the receptacle provided;

(f) The receptacle or drum shall be available and entries may be made at the times stated in K.A.R. 111-4-356. Entries shall be allowed until the actual winner selection process begins;

(g) The holder of the ticket is not required to personally attend the "KFDI Country Fair Drawing" or be present at the time of the drawing to be determined a winner;

(h) The drawings will be conducted at the approximate times listed in K.A.R. 111-4-356.

(i) There is no limit to the number of entries a participant may make. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1990 Supp. 74-8710(b); effective, T-111-10-22-91, Oct. 18, 1991.)

**111-4-360. Determination of "KFDI Country Fair Drawing" Winners.** (a) At least 5 minutes before the drawing, the person designated by the executive director, shall announce to the audience that the winner selection process will begin. Any persons wishing to enter the drawing who have not yet done so, shall immediately place their tickets into the receptacle or drum at this time.

(b) Prior to sealing the receptacle or drum, the person designated by the executive director shall announce that entries into the "KFDI Country Fair Drawing" are closed. No further entries will be accepted.

(c) The receptacle or drum shall be sealed and rotated a minimum of 10 times to ensure random selection.

(d) The executive director shall designate one individual of his choice to participate in the selection process.



(e) The selection of "KFDI Country Fair Drawing" winners on November 3, 1991, shall be accomplished by the individual designated by the executive director, who shall remove 10 tickets from the receptacle or drum in which all entries were placed at the drawing conducted at 6:00 p.m. A lottery employee designated by the executive director as well as a lottery security officer or a Kansas lottery employee designated by lottery security shall review the selected ticket to determine if the name stated on the information form located on the back of the selected ticket is legible and if the ticket is signed. If the name is determined to be legible and the ticket is signed, the name of the winner shall be announced to the audience. This process shall be repeated until ten valid winners have been selected.

(f) A named person is not required to be present in order to win the "KFDI Country Fair Drawing" prizes described in K.A.R. 111-4-358. The security person conducting the drawing shall be responsible for the final determination concerning the legibility of the name on any ticket drawn.

(g) A person whose valid ticket has been drawn from the receptacle or drum at each drawing shall be determined a "KFDI Country Fair Drawing" winner, but regardless of the number of entries a person whose name appears on a valid entry drawn in the "KFDI Country Fair Drawing" has made, he or she shall not be eligible to win more than one \$100 prize.

(h) Each winner shall be given a prize claim form to be completed and returned to the lottery;

(i) If the name on any ticket drawn is not legible or the ticket is not signed, the ticket drawn will be void and the selection process shall be repeated until a valid winning ticket is selected. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1990 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-22-91; Oct. 18, 1991.)

**111-4-361. Co-sponsor Drawings.** Co-sponsors of "KFDI Country Fair Drawing" may hold co-sponsor drawings in conjunction with local retailers, businesses and organizations at the drawing event. In no instance shall these drawings take place prior to the lottery "KFDI Country Fair Drawing." Such drawings, if conducted, shall be a part of the lottery "KFDI Country Fair Drawing" and prizes, in addition to those presented by the lottery, may be donated by the co-sponsor(s). The person drawing tickets for the lottery may draw additional tickets for the co-sponsor(s). At the end of the drawing event(s) all tickets except tickets drawn for use by the lottery shall be returned to the receptacle or drum. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1990 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-22-91, Oct. 18, 1991.)

Notice of Hearing on Proposed  
Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted at 10:30 a.m. Thursday, December 12, in Room 106 of the Landon State Office Building, 900 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, to consider the adoption of proposed changes in existing rules and regulations of the Kansas Department of Transportation.

This 30-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the Secretary of Transportation, 7th Floor, Docking State Office Building, Topeka 66612. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their view orally on the adoption of the proposed regulations during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request each participant to limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

These regulations are proposed for adoption on a permanent basis. A summary of proposed regulations and their economic impact follows.

**K.A.R. 36-13-30. School Bus Chassis and Body Standards.** Amendments to this regulation require that all school buses manufactured after July 1, 1992, meet or exceed the school bus body and chassis specifications contained in the 1990 revised edition, Standards for School Buses and Operations, other than the following exceptions:

- The school bus hood may be lusterless black.
- All lettering on the exterior of the bus shall be black.
- A fuel tank with a minimum capacity of 22 gallons shall be permitted on Type A vehicles only.
- Type B, C and D vehicles shall be prohibited from using retreaded tires on the front wheels.
- Only door locks approved by the school bus manufacturer may be installed on the doors and emergency exits of school buses. Without regard to the type of locks installed, all emergency exits shall be unlocked when there are students on the bus.
- The owner's name shall be displayed on the sides of the school bus body. The designation shall include the contractor's name; unified school district name, or number, or both; non-public school name; governmental agency; or other owner's name. School bus identification numbers shall be displayed on the rear and on both sides of the school bus body. The identification numbers shall be plainly legible, in black numbers, four inches high with a minimum 1/2 inch stroke. Identification numbers may be displayed on the front on the school bus. The numbers shall not interfere with the lettering requirements on the school bus.
- Jump seats shall be prohibited.
- The stop arm shall comply with the 1990 national

standards. Additionally, the stop arm shall contain alternately flashing red lamps which are visible to motorists from both front and rear.

**K.A.R. 36-13-31. Transportation Supervisor.** Amendments were made to this regulation. In the annual inspection section the word "bus" was changed to "vehicle." The words "or his or her representative" were added to enable the transportation supervisor to delegate responsibilities in his or her absence. A statement requiring transportation supervisors to maintain documentation of attendance at driver's meetings and maintenance and repair records for a period of two years was added.

**K.A.R. 36-13-32. School Transportation Driver Qualifications and Duties.** This regulation has been changed to comply with the Commercial Motor Vehicle Safety Act of 1986, which requires school bus drivers to maintain a commercial driver's license. The regulation was also amended to exempt school employees, other than school bus drivers, from having to complete the training courses listed in sections (c)(2) and (3) and the physical examination listed in section (e). Additions were made to this regulation that require training and licensing be completed prior to the first date the driver transports students, and that require substitute drivers to complete training courses within 30 consecutive days of the date of employment. The regulation was amended to allow employers to develop and require an agility test to ascertain that school and activity bus drivers have the ability to enter and exit the bus through all emergency exits. An addition was made that requires the documentation of daily inspections to be kept for a period of two years. Also, a section was added to prohibit smoking on school or activity buses whether loaded or unloaded and that all aisles, doors and emergency exits remain unobstructed at all times.

**K.A.R. 36-13-33. Loading and Unloading Procedures.** Two major additions were made to this regulation. Sections (a) and (b) require that loading and unloading along activity trip routes or of school motor vehicles which are not classified as buses shall be limited to stops designated in advance by the transportation supervisor. Each district which chooses to allow loading and unloading along the activity trip route shall adopt a policy which governs the location of such stops and requires parental approval for discharging a student at other than the end point of the activity trip.

These sections also require that the loading and unloading of students should be conducted off the roadway, highway or street in an area away from vehicular traffic and, whenever possible, in a parking lot. Whenever the loading and unloading of students must be conducted on a roadway, street or highway, the bus involved shall be parked with the entry door facing away from the roadway.

**K.A.R. 36-13-34. Accident and Emergency Procedure.** Three changes were made to the regulation. Section (b) now states that the school districts' board of education is responsible for establishing rules that provide for safe transportation of passengers when their

(continued)

vehicle is deemed unsafe due to any defect or accident. Section (b)(4)(D) was changed to state, "The driver shall not allow students to leave the scene of the accident except as is necessary for emergency medical treatment." Section (c)(1)(E) and (F) were added. They state: Documentation of bus evacuation drills, including the date, number of participants, and names of drivers shall be kept for a period of two years by the transportation supervisor. Prior to the beginning of each activity trip in a school or activity bus, a brief explanation shall be given to passengers concerning emergency evacuation procedures of the bus in use. Students and school personnel shall be shown the location of emergency exits in case of an accident.

**K.A.R. 36-13-36. School Vehicle Definitions and Limitations.** This regulation was deleted and then reinstated as K.A.R. 36-13-39.

**K.A.R. 36-13-37. Use of Urban Mass Transportation Buses.** Much of the content of this regulation regarding driver requirements was deleted and replaced with a reference to K.A.R. 36-13-32 (a), (b), (c)(3) and (4), (e), (f), and (g). The content regarding loading and unloading procedures was deleted and replaced with a reference to K.A.R. 36-13-33 (b) and K.A.R. 36-13-34 (c)(1)(F) concerning emergency evacuation procedures.

The amended regulations listed above, e.g. K.A.R. 36-13-30 through 36-13-34 and 36-13-37, benefit the citizens of Kansas who are transported in these vehicles, since these amendments should help to make the vehicles safer. There are no anticipated costs to either state agencies or school districts as a result of these changes.

**K.A.R. 36-13-38. Special Needs Student Transportation.** This is a new regulation which adopts the provision of the 1990 revised edition, "Standards for School Buses and Operations," relating to special education found at pages 49-56 of that publication. Each specially equipped school bus ordered on or after July 1, 1992, shall comply with applicable provisions of the 1990 standards relating to specially equipped school buses found at pages 22-25 of that publication.

This amendment will benefit the special needs students transported within the state of Kansas by providing safer transportation. The potential economic impact will result primarily from modifying the existing special needs buses to provide forward facing wheel chair accommodations, as well as aisle and lift requirements. Also, additional buses will need to be purchased since forward facing wheel chair accommodations take more seating space than side facing accommodations. These costs will be incurred by the school districts and school transportation contractors and are estimated to result in \$1,063,052 dispersed over a six-year period.

**K.A.R. 36-13-39. School Vehicle Definitions and Limitations.** This regulation was amended in several ways. Section (a) was amended to state the definition of a school bus, an activity bus, school passenger vehicles or motor vehicles, and short-term leased vehicles. Those definitions are listed below.

"School bus" means a vehicle that is designed for carrying more than 10 persons and which is in conformity with the provisions of K.A.R. 36-13-30.

"Activity bus" means an over-the-road commercial-type bus utilized by school districts for the purpose of transporting students to and from school activities as authorized in K.S.A. 72-8301(c)(3).

"School passenger vehicles or motor vehicles" means a vehicle that has a manufacturer capacity rating for 10 or less persons and that is used to provide student transportation by a school district or under its direction.

"Short-term leased vehicle" means a school bus, activity bus or school motor vehicle, as defined above, that is leased by a school district for 30 days or less.

Each school bus used for any purpose shall have been manufactured after April 1, 1977. This provision shall become effective on January 1, 1992.

Activity buses shall not be utilized as route buses. The owner's name shall be displayed on the sides of the bus body. This designation shall include the unified school district name or number.

The amendment of this regulation restricts the use of passenger vehicles to those vehicles which are manufacturer capacity rated for 10 or less persons. No van which is manufacturer capacity rated for more than 10 persons or which carry a door label that rates the vehicle as a bus shall be used unless the van meets all school bus standards. No additional seating over 10 positions shall be added after purchase of vans that are rated as multi-purpose passenger vehicles.

The final amendment to this regulation stipulates that seat belts shall be worn by all occupants of passenger vehicles (not school buses) when being used to provide student transportation.

These amendments will benefit the citizens of Kansas who are transported in these vehicles, since these amendments should help to make the vehicles safer. The potential economic impact will result primarily from the replacement of all vans, as stated above, and from the replacement of all buses manufactured prior to April 1, 1977. These costs will be incurred by the school districts and are estimated to be \$1,610,000.

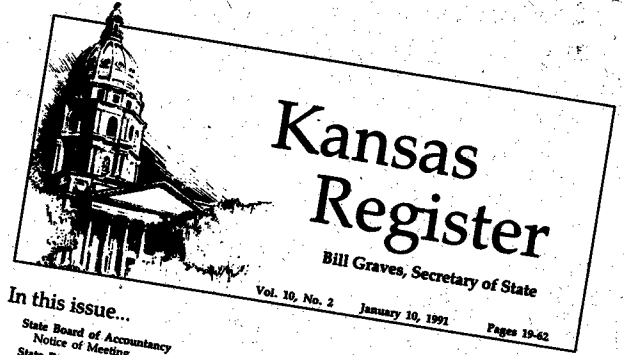
