**Social and Rehabilitation Services****Notice of Hearing on Proposed  
Administrative Regulations**

A public hearing will be conducted at 9 a.m. Tuesday, September 1, in the SRS Staff Development conference room, 300 S.W. Oakley, Topeka, to consider the adoption of proposed changes in existing rules and regulations on a permanent basis. This 30-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the Secretary of Social and Rehabilitation Services, Room 603-N, Docking State Office Building, 915 Harrison, Topeka 66612. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulations during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request each participant to limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

These regulations are scheduled to become effective November 2, 1992. A summary of the proposed regulations and their economic impact follows.

**Article 5.—PROVIDER PARTICIPATION, SCOPE OF SERVICES, AND REIMBURSEMENTS FOR THE MEDICAID (MEDICAL ASSISTANCE) PROGRAM**

**30-5-70. Payment of medical expenses for eligible recipients.** This regulation is being amended to include the payment of premiums for recipients for group health plans offered by the recipient's employer where the agency has determined that such a plan is cost effective.

**Economic Impact:** The cost savings of a fully implemented Health Insurance Premium Payment System (HIPPS) is expected to be \$2.5 million per year (\$995,750 state general funds).

This regulation is being further amended to include the denial of payments to providers if the service performed exceeds the limitations defined by the program policies.

**Economic Impact:** The fiscal impact is minimal.

**Article 10.—ADULT CARE HOME PROGRAM**

**30-10-1a. Nursing facility program definitions.** This regulation is being amended to change or to make additions to the definitions to more accurately reflect current terms.

Economic Impact: None.

**30-10-1b. Nursing facilities.** This regulation is being amended to provide for a clearer explanation for the timely notification of a change in ownership or change of a lessee of a nursing facility, the procedures involved in the change, and the conditions that constitute a change of provider.

Economic Impact: None.

**30-10-1c. Provider agreement.** This regulation is being amended to add the words real and personal to the description of the property ownership.

Economic Impact: None.

**30-10-2. Standards for participation; nursing facility, including nursing facility for mental health.** This regulation is being amended to add nursing facilities for mental health to the standards for participation in the medicaid/medikan program and to require the submission of resident assessment forms to the agency.

Economic Impact: The cost of submitting resident assessment forms will be reflected in the cost reports filed by providers at the end of each year. The cost to the state will be approximately \$2,340 each year.

**30-10-3. Standards for participation; nursing facility for mental health.** This regulation is being revoked.

Economic Impact: None.

**30-10-4. Standards for participation; intermediate care facility for the mentally retarded or persons with related conditions.** This regulation is being revoked.

Economic Impact: None.

**30-10-6. Admission procedure.** This regulation is being amended to delete nursing facilities for mental health since these facilities fall under the general description of nursing facility.

Economic Impact: None.

**30-10-8. Inspection of care review in nursing facilities and nursing facilities for mental health.** This regulation is being revoked.

Economic Impact: None.

**30-10-15a. Reimbursement.** This regulation is being amended to delete reference to the inspection of care review teams in section (a) which are no longer required, add federal language in section (b), and change the wording in section (d) from "a day activity program for an NF-MH facility" to "specialized rehabilitative services for active treatment programs."

Economic Impact: None.

**30-10-15b. Financial data.** This regulation is being amended to change the words "adult care home" to "nursing facility."

Economic Impact: None.

**30-10-17. Cost reports.** This regulation is being amended to change the method of cost report submissions for nursing facilities. It provides a better description of the cost report requirements for providers on projection status and the due dates for cost report submissions. A description of the working trial balance

is provided. The nursing facility cost reports and instructions have been updated.

Economic Impact: None.

**30-10-18. Rates of reimbursement.** This regulation is being amended to clarify the method of determining and processing rates of reimbursement and moves the cost of report requirements to K.A.R. 30-10-17.

Economic Impact: None.

**30-10-19. Rates; effective dates.** This regulation is being amended to clarify the effective dates for per diem rates for nursing facility providers not on projection status.

Economic Impact: None.

**30-10-20. Payment of claims.** This regulation is being amended to add electronic claims submission to payment of claims.

Economic Impact: None.

**30-10-23a. Non-reimbursable costs.** This regulation is being amended to delete the separate cost limitations for day activity programs in nursing facilities for mental health and to include instructions for the treatment of purchase discounts, allowances and refunds.

Economic Impact: None.

**30-10-23b. Costs allowed with limitations.** This regulation is being amended to delete the instructions for the cost treatment for purchase discounts, allowances and refunds, as these instructions have been included in K.A.R. 30-10-23a.

Economic Impact: None.

**30-10-23c. Revenues.** This regulation is being amended to delete the additional provisions for day habilitation programs in nursing facilities for mental health.

Economic Impact: None.

**30-10-25. Real and personal property fee.** This regulation is being amended to delete the stipulation that the secretary will determine a percentage for the value factor computation on an annual basis.

Economic Impact: None.

**30-10-28. Resident days.** This regulation is being amended to delete the word "available" from the definition of minimum occupancy.

Economic Impact: None.

**30-10-29. Reimbursement for 24-hour nursing care.** This regulation is being amended to clarify the definition of "evening and night shifts" and to change "adult care home" to "nursing facility."

Economic Impact: None.

Proposals will be issued upon request to all prospective bidders who have been prequalified by the Kansas Department of Transportation on the basis of financial condition, available construction equipment, and experience. Also, a statement of unearned contracts (Form No. 284) must be filed. There will be no discrimination against anyone because of race, age, religion, color, sex, handicap, or national origin in the award of contracts.

Each bidder shall file a sworn statement executed by or on behalf of the person, firm, association or corporation submitting the bid, certifying that such person, firm, association or corporation has not, either directly or indirectly, entered into any agreement, participated in any collusion, or otherwise taken any action in restraint of free competitive bidding in connection with the submitted bid. This sworn statement shall be in the form of an affidavit executed and sworn to by the bidder before a person who is authorized by the laws of the state to administer oaths. The required form of the affidavit will be provided by

the state to each prospective bidder. Failure to submit the sworn statement as part of the bid-approval package will make the bid nonresponsive and not eligible for award consideration.

Plans and specifications for the projects may be examined at the office of the respective county clerk or at the KDOT district office responsible for the work.

**Permanent Administrative Regulations**

**Article 4.—FEES**

**60-4-103. Fees and travel expenses for school accreditation and approval of continuing education providers.** (a) The fees for school accreditation and approval of continuing nursing providers shall be:

- (1) Application for accreditation—schools of nursing .. \$700.00
- (2) Biennial renewal of accreditation—schools of nursing..... 300.00
- (3) Application for approval of continuing nursing education providers ..... 200.00
- (4) Annual renewal for continuing nursing education providers ..... 50.00
- (5) Approval of single continuing nursing education offerings..... 25.00
- (6) Consultation by request, per day on site..... 300.00
- (7) Application for continuing nursing education providers approval pursuant to K.A.R. 60-9-107(n) 100.00
- (8) Annual renewal of continuing nursing educational providership approved pursuant to K.A.R. 60-9-107(n)..... 25.00

(b) All fees prescribed in (a) shall be payable at the time of application.

(c) The person, firm, corporation or institution requesting the Board's consultation services shall pay the consultants' travel expenses. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 65-1118a; effective, E-82-18, Sept. 30, 1981; effective May 1, 1982; amended Sept. 14, 1992.)

**Article 11.—ADVANCED REGISTERED NURSE PRACTITIONERS**

**60-11-103. Qualifications of advanced registered nurse practitioners.** (a) To be certified as an advanced registered nurse practitioner in the category of nurse anesthetist or nurse midwife, each applicant shall:

(1) complete a formal, post-basic nursing education program located or offered in Kansas that has been approved by the board and that prepares the nurse to function in the expanded role for which application is made;

(2) complete a formal, post-basic nursing education program which is not located or offered in Kansas but which is determined by the board to meet the standards for program approval established by K.A.R. 60-11-108;

(3) complete a formal, post-basic nursing education program which is no longer in existence but which is determined by the board to meet standards at least as stringent as required for program approval by the board as of the time of graduation; or

(4) hold a current certificate of authority to practice as an advanced registered nurse practitioner in the category for which application is made, issued by another board of nursing which requires completion of a program meeting standards equal to or greater than those established by K.A.R. 60-11-108;

(b) To be certified as an advanced registered nurse practitioner in the category of nurse clinician or practitioner, each applicant shall either:

(1) Meet one of the requirements of subsection (a) of this regulation before July 1, 1994; or

(2) If a requirement in subsection (a) of this regulation has not been met prior to July 1, 1994, then applicant shall meet one of the requirements of subsection (a) of this regulation and hold a baccalaureate degree in nursing.

(c) To be certified as an advanced registered nurse practitioner in the category of clinical nurse specialist, each applicant shall hold a master's degree in a nursing clinical area which prepares the nurse to function in the expanded role, and:

(1) Meet one of the requirements of subsection (a) of this regulation; or

(2) complete prior to June 1, 1990, a formal educational program of post-basic study and clinical experience which can be demonstrated by the applicant to have sufficiently prepared the applicant for practice in the category of advanced practice for which application is made. The applicant must show that the curriculum of the program is consistent with the public health and safety policy and that it prepared individuals to perform acts generally recognized by the nursing profession as capable of being performed by persons with post-basic education in nursing.

(d) (1) Certification may be granted if an individual has been certified by a national nursing organization whose certifying standards have been approved by the board as equal to or greater than the corresponding standards established by the board for obtaining certification to practice as an advanced registered nurse practitioner. Certification by the board under this section may be dependent upon independent review by the board whether the individual has fulfilled board requirements.

(2) Board approval of the standards and criteria of national nursing organizations that certify advanced registered nurse practitioners shall expire annually. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1991 Supp. 65-1130; effective May 1, 1984; amended, T-85-16, June 5, 1984; amended May 1, 1985; amended, T-60-11-14-90, Nov. 14, 1990; amended, T-60-3-14-91, March 14, 1991; amended Sept. 2, 1991; amended March 9, 1992; amended Sept. 14, 1992.)

RegulationsArticle 9.—HOURS; LEAVES; EMPLOYEE—  
MANAGEMENT RELATIONS

**1-9-23. Shared leave.** (a) (1) Each classified employee, excluding those who are on emergency, intermittent, or temporary appointment, and each unclassified employee, excluding those on emergency, intermittent, or temporary appointment, or on a temporary appointment made pursuant to K.S.A. 1991 Supp. 75-2935(1)(i), may be eligible to receive or donate shared leave as provided in this regulation.

(2) Shared leave may be granted to an employee if the employee or the employee's relative or household member experiences a catastrophic illness or a catastrophic injury, including but not limited to, cancer, major surgery, serious accident or heart attack, that:

(A) poses a threat to life or requires inpatient or hospice care, extensive outpatient treatment or care at home; and

(B) keeps the employee from performing regular work duties.

(b) For purposes of this regulation:

(1) A "relative" means a spouse, parent, child, sibling, grandchild or grandparent, step, foster or adoptive child, or legal ward.

(2) A "household member" means a person who resides in the same home and maintains a relationship with the employee which involves reciprocal duties and financial support.

(c) (1) An employee shall be eligible to receive shared leave if:

(A) the employee has exhausted all paid leave including annual leave, sick leave, and compensatory time credits; and

(B) the employee has six months of continuous service.

(2) An employee shall be eligible to donate annual leave or sick leave to another employee if:

(A) the donation of annual leave does not cause the accumulated annual leave balance of the donating employee to be less than 80 hours; and

(B) the donation of sick leave does not cause the accumulated sick leave balance of the donating employee to be less than 480 hours.

(d) (1) Each employee wishing to use or donate shared leave shall request to use or donate in the form and at such time as prescribed by the appointing authority, as required by K.A.R. 1-9-3(a).

(2) When requesting shared leave, or at any time during the use of shared leave, any employee may be required by the appointing authority or the director to provide a physician's statement or other medical evidence necessary to establish that the illness or injury is of a catastrophic nature and keeps the employee from performing regular work duties. If the shared leave is being used for a relative or a household member, the employee may also be required to show ev-

idence that the relative's or household member's illness or injury keeps the employee from performing regular work duties. If the employee fails to provide evidence as required, the use of shared leave may be denied or terminated by the appointing authority.

(3) (A) If the appointing authority determines the employee meets the initial eligibility requirements in paragraph (c)(1), and if applicable, determines that the employee would be caring for an individual who meets the definition of relative or household member in subsection (b), a leave share review committee shall be established as prescribed by the director. The leave share review committee shall review shared leave requests and provide a recommendation to the appointing authority.

(B) Shared leave may be denied if it is determined that the requesting employee has a history of leave abuse. Common illness or minor injury that is not serious or life-threatening shall be excluded from eligibility for shared leave.

(C) If the employee receives worker's compensation, long-term disability payments, or both, shared leave used each payroll period shall be that amount which, together with the payment of worker's compensation, long-term disability, or both, equals but does not exceed the regular salary for the employee.

(D) The appointing authority may grant all or a portion of the time requested. The decision by the appointing authority to approve or deny the request shall be final and not subject to appeal to the civil service board.

(e) Employees shall not be notified of the need for shared leave until the request for shared leave has been approved by the appointing authority. No employee shall be coerced, threatened, intimidated, or financially induced into donating leave for purposes of the shared leave program.

(f) (1) Shared leave may be used only for the duration of the current catastrophic illness or injury for which it was collected, up to a maximum of one year from the date the employee began using the shared leave. Shared leave shall not be transferable to any employee other than the employee for which it was requested and donated.

(2) Shared leave may be applied retroactively for a period not to exceed 30 calendar days. The director shall be given written notification of each instance in which shared leave is applied retroactively.

(3) The employee shall no longer be eligible to receive shared leave for that particular occurrence if:

(A) the catastrophic illness or injury improves so that the employee is no longer prevented from performing regular work duties;

(B) the recipient terminates or retires; or

(C) the employee can no longer show evidence that the relative's or household member's illness or injury keeps the employee from performing regular work duties. The employee shall be determined to no longer be prevented from performing regular work duties when the physician states the employee is able to return to work or when the employee has returned to work for 20 continuous working days.



(4) Any unused portion of the shared leave shall be prorated among all donating employees based on the original amount and type of donated leave. Shared leave shall not be returned to donating employees in increments of less than one full hour or to any person who has left state service.

(g) (1) Shared leave shall be paid according to the receiving employee's regular rate of pay by the receiving employee's agency. The rate of pay of the donating employee shall not be used in figuring the amount of shared leave the requesting employee receives.

(2) Shared leave shall be donated in full-hour increments.

(h) Under extenuating circumstances, the requirements of this regulation may be waived or modified by the director upon written request of the appointing authority. (Authorized by K.S.A. 75-3706, 75-3747; implementing K.S.A. 75-2925, 75-3707, 75-3746; effective, T-1-7-23-92, July 23, 1992; effective Sept. 14, 1992.)

#### Article 45.—MOTOR VEHICLE PARKING ON CERTAIN STATE-OWNED OR OPERATED PROPERTY IN SHAWNEE COUNTY

**1-45-14. Violations.** A violation of any of these rules and regulations shall be deemed to have occurred each and every time a motor vehicle is found to be parked in a manner prohibited by these rules and regulations. However, a second or subsequent violation of these rules and regulations shall not be deemed to have occurred on the same day when the same motor vehicle continues in the same violation at the same location, unless and until the motor vehicle remains continuously parked in the location in violation of these rules and regulations for a period in excess of two hours from the time the previous violation was found. (Authorized by K.S.A. 75-3706 and 75-4507; implementing K.S.A. 75-4507; effective May 1, 1979; amended Sept. 14, 1992.)

#### Article 46.—PARKING FOR THE STATEHOUSE

**1-46-1. Applicability.** (a) The provisions of this article shall apply only to parking on the statehouse grounds unless expressly stated otherwise. Except as

provided in K.A.R. 1-46-3, these regulations shall apply:

(1) between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, holidays excepted;

(2) between 8:00 a.m. and noon on Saturday, holidays excepted; and

(3) during any other time that either chamber of the legislature is meeting in session.

(b) "Statehouse grounds" means the area bounded by 8th, 10th, Jackson and Harrison streets in Topeka, Kansas.

(c) "Person" means:

(1) the individual, partnership, corporation, association, or governmental body to whom the motor vehicle is registered pursuant to K.S.A. 8-127, as amended; or

(2) a person who has lawful possession of a motor vehicle pursuant to a lease entered into for valuable consideration, including assignments of motor vehicles to individuals or state agencies in accordance with K.S.A. 75-4601 *et seq.*, and any amendments thereto, and rules and regulations promulgated thereunder.

(d) The term "motor vehicle" shall have the meaning prescribed by K.S.A. 8-126 as amended. (Authorized by K.S.A. 75-3706 and 75-4507; implementing K.S.A. 75-4507; effective, E-74-4, Nov. 2, 1973; effective May 1, 1975; amended May 1, 1979; amended Sept. 14, 1992.)

**1-46-3. Additional parking restrictions.** Unless otherwise authorized by the secretary of administration for reasons of business or emergency, no person shall, at any time, park a motor vehicle or permit that person's motor vehicle to be parked so that it is: (a) double parked in a tunnel or archway;

(b) on a pedestrian walk;

(c) in a driveway;

(d) backed into a parking stall; or

(e) not within a marked parking stall. (Authorized by K.S.A. 75-3706 and 75-4507; implementing K.S.A. 75-4507; effective, E-74-4, Nov. 2, 1973; effective May 1, 1975; amended May 1, 1979; amended Sept. 14, 1992.)

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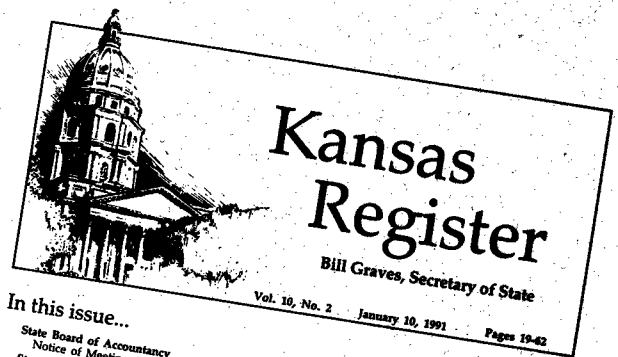
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
