Department of Transportation**Disadvantaged Businesses Utilization
Program Policy Statement**

It is the policy of the Kansas Department of Transportation that disadvantaged businesses, as defined in 49 Code of Federal Regulations, Part 23, shall have the maximum opportunity to participate in the performance of KDOT contracts that are financed in whole or in part with federal funds. In this regard, KDOT is committed to provide all necessary and reasonable steps in accordance with 49 CFR, Part 23 to ensure that such businesses will be utilized to the maximum extent feasible.

To administer this program, a KDOT External EEO Officer shall be designated who will be responsible for developing, managing and implementing the DBE program on a daily basis. The program objective will be to meet or exceed the established DBE program goals.

Contract goals will be established monthly on individual projects having practical and feasible DBE subcontracting possibilities.

Overall goals will be established on an annual basis and will be based on the following factors:

1. A projection of the number of DBEs available to compete for subcontracts.
2. A projection of the number and type of federal aid contracts to be let for bid.
3. An analysis of the past year's performance and capabilities of the active DBEs.

The overall DBE goal for federal fiscal year 1993 (October 1, 1992 to September 30, 1993) shall be 10 percent. Comments, for informational purposes only, will be accepted from the general public in relation to these goals for 45 days following the date of publication of this notice.

Proposals will be issued upon request to all prospective bidders who have been prequalified by the Kansas Department of Transportation on the basis of financial condition, available construction equipment, and experience. Also, a statement of unearned contracts (Form No. 284) must be filed. There will be no discrimination against anyone because of race, age, religion, color, sex, handicap, or national origin in the award of contracts.

Each bidder shall file a sworn statement executed by or on behalf of the person, firm, association or corporation submitting the bid, certifying that such person, firm, association or corporation has not, either directly or indirectly, entered into any agreement, participated in any collusion, or otherwise taken any action in restraint of free competitive bidding in connection with the submitted bid. This sworn statement shall be in the form of an affidavit executed and sworn to by the bidder before a person who is authorized by the laws of the state to administer oaths. The required form of the affidavit will be provided by the state to each prospective bidder. Failure to submit the sworn statement as part of the bid-approval package will make the bid nonresponsive and not eligible for award consideration.

Plans and specifications for the projects may be examined at the office of the respective county clerk or at the KDOT district office responsible for the work.

Public Records, Documents and Information—Records Open to Public—Certain Records Not Required to be Open; Peer Assistance Program Records.

Legislature—Legislative Post Audit—Additional Financial Compliance or Performance Audits Authorized at Direction of Post Audit Committees; Persons Subject to Audit; Access to Records; Limitations; Peer Assistance Program Records. Barbara J. Hinton, Legislative Post Auditor, Legislative Division of Post Audit, Topeka, July 31, 1992.

Persons and corporations conducting a state funded peer assistance program on behalf of a state agency are subject to the audit authority of the state insofar as such audits relate to the state funded program. The confidentiality and privilege provisions of 42 U.S.C., § 290ee-3, K.S.A. 1991 Supp. 65-4921 *et seq.* or K.S.A. 1991 Supp. 47-846 *et seq.* may be read in harmony with the access authority given the Legislative Division of Post Audit pursuant to K.S.A. 46-1101 *et seq.* The record closure laws cited herein do not prohibit or prevent access to such records by the Legislative Division of Post Audit. Cities and Municipalities—General Provisions—Initiative Election on Levying Tax or Other Revenue Measure. Greg A. Bengston, Salina City Attorney, Salina, July 29, 1992.

A specific ad valorem tax levy may be proposed by electors under K.S.A. 12-138a if the authority for the tax is home rule power. If the specific levy is properly proposed under K.S.A. 12-138a, it must be put to a referendum, and if approved, the city must adopt it. A specific ad valorem tax may be proposed by electors under K.S.A. 12-3013 if the authority for the tax is statutory. A proposed levy is not necessarily inherently administrative in character and initiative is not precluded. Any levy adopted pursuant to initiative must be considered in determining the city's aggregate tax levy limit. Therefore, the EPA portion of the joint permit will address the requirements of HSWA.

The permit will allow Safety-Kleen Corporation to operate a container storage unit and a storage tank. The container storage unit will be used for storage of spent immersion cleaner, filter cartridges and still bottoms contaminated with dry cleaning solvent, and antifreeze waste generated off-site. The storage tank will be used for storage of spent solvents generated off-site. The container storage unit will store a maximum of 2,304 gallons of hazardous waste and the storage tank will store a maximum of 10,000 gallons of hazardous waste. All of the containers will meet current U.S. Department of Transportation specifications. The storage tank and container unit have secondary containment systems.

(Editor's Note: The following regulation, which was filed with the Secretary of State August 4, 1992, was inadvertently omitted from publication in the August 13, 1992, Kansas Register.)

Article 2.—GENERAL

30-2-16. Permanency planning goals for title IV-E of the federal social security act. (a) The agency's permanency planning goal for the federal fiscal year commencing on October 1, 1992 shall be to have no more than 450 children who have been in foster care placements in excess of 24 consecutive months receive federal funding during the course of the year.

(b) The following steps shall be taken by the agency to achieve the above stated goal.

(1) A reasonable effort shall be made to make adoption assistance available on behalf of eligible children; and

(2) a case review shall be initiated and a plan shall be developed for each child in the custody of the agency. The effective date of this regulation shall be October 1, 1992. Article 23.—VOTER REGISTRATION

7-23-8. Change of residence of registered voter; proof of residence. (a) Acceptable forms of identification to prove a change or residence within a precinct shall include the following:

- (1) a valid driver's license;
- (2) a valid division of motor vehicles identification card;
- (3) a current utility or telephone bill;
- (4) a utility service confirmation; or

(5) any other form of identification which lists the name of the registered voter and such voter's residence.

(b) Upon a change of residence by a registered voter, proof of the new residence shall be presented to the election judges, who shall determine whether the registered voter's residence is within precinct boundaries. The county clerk shall provide a map or a list of precinct boundaries so that the election judges may make this determination. 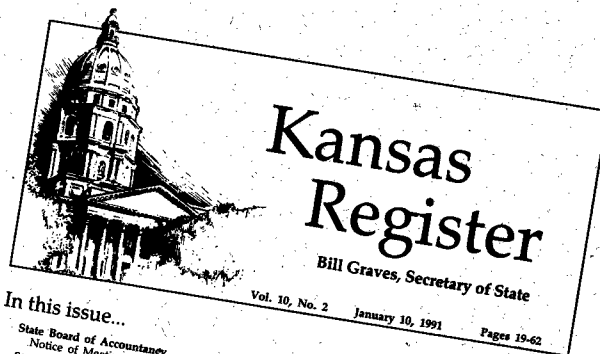
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
