for Consulting Engineering Services**

The Abandoned Mined Land Program of the Surface Mining Section will commence negotiations to obtain qualified engineering firms, permitted by law to practice engineering in the state of Kansas, for the design of abandoned mined-land reclamation projects.

Notice of Hearing on Proposed Administrative Regulations

A hearing will be conducted at 1 p.m. Monday, November 30, in the Kansas Department of Transportation's seventh floor conference room, Docking State Office Building, 915 S.W. Harrison, Topeka, in order to allow interested parties to express their views and comment on proposed regulations K.A.R. 36-39-1 through 36-39-6. The proposed regulations establish a standardized process for consideration of requests for state loan guarantees, loans, or grants for rail service preservation and revitalization in Kansas. This process is intended to fulfill the Secretary of Transportation's duty under K.S.A. 1991 Supp. 75-5040 et seq. to ensure that any obligations or contingent liability incurred by the state of Kansas for such projects is held within fiscally responsible limitations.

The railroad loan guarantee, grant and loan programs are expected to provide public benefits to the state of Kansas through preservation of local rail service, lower transportation costs and increased marketing opportunities for Kansas products, avoidance of declines in tax revenues, and savings for state and local governments in highway maintenance costs. The loan program is expected to also permit better utilization of any available federal funding for these purposes by creating a revolving fund which will make funds received from repayment of low-interest loans available for additional use on other projects by small railroad companies in Kansas. No significant net increase of cost to the Kansas Department of Transportation or other state or local agencies is expected. Fees will be charged to loan guarantee, loan, and grant applicants to cover the costs of processing.

Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted from 9 to 10:30 a.m. Tuesday, December 1, in the board room of the State Board of Regents, Suite 609, Capitol Tower, 400 S.W. 8th, Topeka, to consider the adoption of proposed rules and regulations 88-22-1 through 88-22-10 of the Board of Regents on a permanent basis.

All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the general counsel of the State Board of Regents, 400 S.W. 8th, Suite 609, Topeka 66603. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity at the hearing to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulations. In order to give all parties an opportunity to express their views, it may be necessary to request each participant to limit oral presentation to five minutes.

This 30-day notice constitutes a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulations.

A summary of K.A.R. 88-22-1, 88-22-2, 88-22-3, 88-22-4, 88-22-5, 88-22-6, 88-22-7, 88-22-8, 88-22-9 and 88-22-10 follows:

88-22-1. Defines terms used in the regulations relating to the Teacher Scholarship Program.

88-22-2. Establishes eligibility requirements for participation in the Teacher Scholarship Program.

88-22-3. Sets forth information on filing applications for the Teacher Scholarship Program.

88-22-4. Establishes requirements relative to eligibility for renewal of the Teacher Scholarship.

88-22-5. Deals with the confidentiality of information submitted to the board by applicants and parents.

88-22-6. Discusses authority of the board to limit awards if necessary.

88-22-7. Sets forth information on certification required from each eligible postsecondary institution which enrolls the recipient of a Teacher Scholarship.

88-22-8. Sets forth terms to be included in agreement to be entered into by the recipients of a Teacher Scholarship.

88-22-9. Establishes the number of scholarships available and the amount of the award.

88-22-10. Discusses mechanisms and procedures for scholarship repayment if service obligations are not satisfied.

The regulations will provide for the awarding of financial assistance to individuals selected as teacher scholarship recipients; \$491,931 has been appropriated for FY 1993. It is proposed that up to 100 scholarships of \$5,000 be awarded annually to students enrolled in a course of instruction leading to teacher certification in a hard-to-fill discipline as designated by the Kansas Department of Education.

Scholarships are renewed annually as constrained by funding limits, continued enrollment in programs leading to teacher certification and maintenance of satis-

factory academic progress as measured by the recipients' schools. The scholarships can be renewed for up to five years if the certification requirements requires five years of study. Funding is only available for those seeking first-time certification. An applicant who has already received teacher certification is not eligible.

Selection is based on academic performance at the high school and/or the college level. Taken into consideration will be completion of the Regents' recommended curriculum, cumulative GPA, rank in class and ACT score. Students who have completed or are completing two consecutive semesters of three-fourths or full-time college enrollment may submit college transcripts and college advisor recommendations to supplement high school information. Preference may be given to applicants who are upperclass students. Preference may be given to applicants who are of non-traditional age (over 24 years). When the Board of Education submits the list of hard-to-fill disciplines, relative weight may be given to disciplines with higher vacancy and/or turnover rates.

Terms of the Bonds

Redemption of Bonds

Bonds maturing in the years 1995 through 1999, inclusive, shall become due and payable on their respective maturity dates without option of prior call for redemption and payment. Bonds maturing in the year 2000, and thereafter, at the city's option may be called for redemption and payment prior to their respective maturities on and after October 1, 1999. Bonds called for redemption and payment may be called in whole or in part at any time on any interest payment date from and after the first date authorized for redemption. Condition of Bids

No changes to said form are authorized; changes or erasures thereon may cause rejection of any bid. Each bid will specify the total interest cost to the city on the basis of such bid and the average annual net interest rate on the basis of such bid. Topeka, Kansas, a copy of whose opinion will be printed on the reverse side of each bond. Manually signed originals of the opinion will be furnished without expense to the purchaser of the bonds at the delivery thereof. The cost of this legal opinion and the expense of printing the bonds will be paid by the city. Said legal opinion will contain a statement to the effect that the bonds constitute a general obligation of the city payable as to both principal and interest from ad valorem taxes which may be levied without limitation as to rate or amount upon all of the taxable tangible property within the territorial limits of the city. The opinion will also address the exclusion from federal and Kansas income taxation of the interest on the bonds.

The denomination of the bonds and the names, addresses and Social Security or taxpayer identification numbers of the registered owners to be shown on the bonds initially delivered shall be submitted in writing by the successful bidder to the city and bond registrar not later than 5 p.m. C.S.T. on December 1, 1992. In the absence of such information, the city will deliver the bonds in the denomination of each maturity registered in the name of the successful bidder.

The successful bidder shall furnish the city by not later than the date of delivery of the bonds a certificate acceptable to city's bond counsel which sets forth the initial reoffering price of the bonds to the public.

However, such interest with respect to corporations as defined for federal income tax purposes, is taken into account in determining adjusted net book income (adjusted current earnings for taxable years ending after December 31, 1989) for the purpose of computing the alternative minimum tax imposed on such corporations. The exclusion identified in the preceding clause (1) is subject to compliance by the city with all requirements of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, which must be satisfied subsequent to issuance of the bonds in order for the interest on the bonds to qualify

for such exclusion. Failure to comply with certain of such requirements could cause the interest on the bonds to be so included in federal gross income retroactive to the date of issuance of the bonds. The city will covenant to comply with all such requirements. Bond counsel expresses no opinion regarding other federal tax consequences arising with respect to the bonds.

Prospective bidders for the purchase of the bonds should be aware that: (1) Section 265 of the code denies a deduction for interest on indebtedness incurred or continued to purchase or carry the bonds, or, in the case of a financial institution within the meaning of Section 265(b)(5) of the code, that portion of a bondholder's interest expense allocable to the interest on the bonds; (2) with respect to insurance companies subject to the tax imposed by Section 831 of the code, for taxable years beginning after December 31, 1986, Section 832(b)(5)(B)(i) of the code reduces the deduction for loss reserves by 15 percent of the sum of certain items, including interest on the bonds; (3) for taxable years beginning after December 31, 1986, and prior to January 1, 1992, interest earned on the bonds by some corporations could be subject to the environmental tax imposed by Section 59A of the code; (4) for taxable years beginning after December 31, 1986, the interest earned on the bonds by certain foreign corporations doing business in the United States could be subject to a branch profits tax imposed by Section 884 of the code; (5) passive investment income, including interest on the bonds, may be subject to federal income taxation under Section 1375 of the code for Subchapter S corporations that have Subchapter C earnings and profits at the close of the taxable year if more than 25 percent of the gross receipts of such Subchapter S corporation is passive investment income; and (6) Section 86 of the code requires recipients of certain Social Security and Railroad Retirement benefits to take into account in determining gross income, receipts or accruals of interest on the bonds. These categories of prospective bondowners should consult their own tax advisers as to the applicability of any of these consequences.

The bonds are exempt from intangible personal property taxes levied by Kansas counties, cities and townships. Interest on the bonds is excludable from the computation of Kansas adjusted gross income whether or not included in federal adjusted gross income.

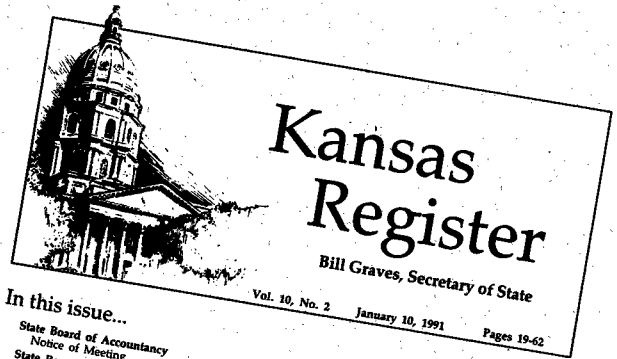
