Notice of Hearing on Proposed
Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be held at 9 a.m. Thursday, February 18, in the Conservation Division hearing room, third floor, 200 Colorado Derby Building, 202 W. 1st, Wichita, to consider the adoption of proposed permanent regulations for the conservation of crude oil and natural gas.

The period of 30 days notice from the date of this publication to the date of the public hearing constitutes a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed rules and regulations. Comments may be submitted to the State Corporation Commission, John McCannon, Assistant General Counsel, 200 Colorado Derby Building, 202 W. 1st, Wichita 67202.

Copies of the proposed regulations and the economic impact statements may be obtained at the Wichita address. Persons requesting a copy of the proposed regulations and economic impact statements, in accordance with K.S.A. 45-219, will be required to compensate the State Corporation Commission for the cost of reproduction. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity at the hearing to present their views orally or in writing in regard to the adoption of the proposed regulations.

All written or oral comments submitted by interested parties on or before February 18 will be considered by the commission as a basis for making changes to these proposed permanent regulations.

The following is a brief summary of the proposed regulations and economic impact statements:

K.A.R. 82-3-401a. This new regulation allows operators of enhanced recovery projects the alternative of providing notice on a project basis. The initial notice must be published in the official county newspaper of each county where the project is located. In addition, the operator must mail notice to each operator, or lessee of record, and each owner of record of the mineral rights of unleased acreage within a one-half mile radius of the project boundary and each landowner within the project boundaries.

A memorandum of notification containing the information set out in the published notice must be filed with the register of deeds in the counties where the project is located. This is to inform subsequent landowners within the project acreage that it is part of an enhanced recovery project.

Subsequent applications for additional injection wells within the project boundary may be noticed by publication only.

Economic Impact: This alternative notification procedure for enhanced recovery projects will allow operators of large enhanced recovery projects to save the expense of continual record search and mailing notice as additional wells in a project are added. There will be savings to industry and no additional cost to the agency.

K.A.R. 82-3-401. This amendment allows the use of area notice for enhanced recovery projects as an alternative to using the K.A.R. 82-3-135a notice as each well or group of wells are made part of an enhanced recovery project.

Permanent Administrative Regulations

Article 16.—TRAVEL REIMBURSEMENT

1-16-18. Subsistence allowance; rates. (a) General provisions.

(1) Except as otherwise specifically provided by law, subsistence allowances for in-state and out-of-state travel shall be paid on the basis of a quarter-day rate for meal expenses and the actual cost of lodging expenses incurred, within the lodging expense limits set forth in this regulation. The subsistence rates for meal expenses shall be paid on a per diem basis at the appropriate rate for any fraction of a quarter-day in which the official travel begins and for each full quarter-day thereafter. For purposes of this regulation, a

day shall commence at 12:01 a.m. No quarter-day allowance shall be paid for any fractional quarter-day in which the traveler returns to the traveler's official station or domicile. As used in this regulation, "international travel" means travel outside the fifty states and the District of Columbia.

(2) Reimbursement for lodging shall be made on the basis of actual single-rate lodging expenses incurred, including taxes, and shall be supported by the original official receipt of the lodging place or other suitable evidential matter. Reimbursement for lodging expenses shall be limited to the lodging place's lowest available rate for normal single occupancy on the day or days the lodging expense was incurred.

(3) Subject to the approval of the secretary of administration, the director of accounts and reports may designate any city in a state bordering or near Kansas as a "border city." All meals allowances and lodging expense limitations shall be at the appropriate in-state rate for travel by state personnel to a border city.

(b) Meals allowance. The quarter-day meals allowance shall be:

(1) In-state	\$5.50
(2) Out-of-state	\$6.50
(3) Designated high cost geographic area— out-of-state	\$7.00
(4) Borough of Manhattan and the District of Columbia	\$9.00
(5) International Travel	\$9.00

An exception to the quarter-day meal allowance for international travel may be made at the option of each agency by claiming actual expenses subject to a daily limitation of \$66 for meals.

(c) Lodging expense limitations. The lodging expense limitations shall be:

In-state, exclusive of designated high cost geographic areas	\$ 48.00
In-state, designated high cost geographic area	\$ 60.00
Out-of-state, exclusive of designated high cost geographic areas	\$ 72.00
Out-of-state, designated high cost geographic area	\$105.00
Borough of Manhattan and the District of Columbia	\$115.00
International Travel	actual

Specific exceptions to the dollar limitation on lodging expenses may be made pursuant to provisions in K.S.A. 75-3207a and amendments thereto.

(d) If the cost of meals is included within the cost of registration fees or other fees and charges paid by the agency or supplied without cost by another party, the meal expenses shall be reduced as follows:

1-16-18a. Designated high cost geographic areas.

(a) For official travel to and from, or within, any high cost geographic area designated in subsection (c) in which the traveler is required to sleep away from home, the applicable subsistence allowance rate for that designated high cost geographic area may be paid. However, reimbursement on this basis shall not be allowable when such an area is only an intermediate stopover at which no official duty is performed, or when the subsistence expenses incurred relate to relocation, travel to seek residence quarters or to report to a new permanent duty station or to temporary quarters.

(b) Reimbursement for travel in high cost geographic areas shall be at the prescribed high cost geographic rate unless the agency establishes a reduced rate as provided in K.A.R. 1-16-15. When an out-of-state trip is to two or more destination cities, and when one of these cities is designated as a high cost geographic area, the subsistence allowance rate shall change from the high cost geographic area rate to the regular rate, or from the regular rate to the high cost geographic area rate, subject to and on application of the appropriate quarter-day allowance as determined by the time of arrival at the second destination city.

Article 5.—ATTORNEY COMPENSATION

105-5-2. Rates of compensation. Each appointed and assigned counsel shall be compensated at the rate of \$50 per hour for time spent in preparing cases for trial or appeal and shall be compensated at the rate of \$65 per hour for in-court presentation. This regulation shall take effect on and after July 1, 1993. (Authorized by K.S.A. 22-4507 and 22-4522; implementing K.S.A. 22-4507; effective May 1, 1984; amended May 1, 1988; amended, T-105-6-13-88, July 1, 1988; amended Oct. 31, 1988; amended July 1, 1993.)

105-5-6. Reasonable compensation; non-tried cases. (a) Each appointed and assigned attorney shall be compensated for time expended in representing indigent defendants and other indigent persons at the hourly rate prescribed in K.A.R. 105-5-2. Except as provided in K.A.R. 105-5-8, reasonable compensation shall not exceed \$1,200 in the following cases:

(1) Class A, B and C felony cases in the trial court that are not submitted to a judge or jury, including services at a preliminary hearing and sentencing, if applicable; and

(2) class D and E felony cases in the trial court that have not been submitted to a judge or jury and in which there have been six hours or more spent in court in defense of the indigent defendant, including services at a preliminary hearing and sentencing, if applicable.

(b) Except as provided in K.A.R. 105-5-8 and K.A.R. 105-5-6(a), reasonable compensation shall not exceed \$1,000 in class D and E felony cases in the trial court that are not submitted to a judge or jury. This includes services at a preliminary hearing and sentencing, if applicable.

(c) Except as provided in K.A.R. 105-5-8 and K.A.R. 105-5-6(a), reasonable compensation shall not exceed \$450 in the following types of cases:

(1) Habeas corpus cases as authorized by K.S.A. 22-4506;

(2) cases filed pursuant to K.S.A. 60-1507 and K.S.A. 22-4506;

(3) habeas corpus cases as authorized by K.S.A. 22-2710;

(4) habeas corpus cases as authorized by K.S.A. 1991 Supp. 22-3428 and K.S.A. 1991 Supp. 22-3428a; and

(5) habeas corpus cases as authorized by K.S.A. 1991 Supp. 59-2917.

(d) Except as provided in K.A.R. 105-5-8, reasonable compensation shall not exceed \$225 in the following types of cases:

(1) Representation of grand jury witnesses determined to be indigent and called to testify pursuant to K.S.A. 22-3009;

(2) representation of indigent persons committed to custody as material witnesses pursuant to K.S.A. 22-2805;

(3) probation revocation hearings; and

(4) motions to modify sentence pursuant to K.S.A. 1991 Supp. 21-4603. This regulation shall take effect on and after July 1, 1993. (Authorized by K.S.A. 22-4507 and 22-4522; implementing K.S.A. 1991 Supp. 21-4603, K.S.A. 22-2710, K.S.A. 22-2805, K.S.A. 22-3009, K.S.A. 1991 Supp. 22-3428, K.S.A. 1991 Supp. 22-3428a, K.S.A. 1991 Supp. 22-3716, K.S.A. 22-4506, K.S.A. 22-4507, K.S.A. 1991 Supp. 59-2917 and K.S.A. 60-1507; effective May 1, 1984; amended May 1, 1985; amended May 1, 1986; amended May 1, 1988; amended, T-105-6-13-88, July 1, 1988; amended Nov. 1, 1988; amended Oct. 30, 1989; amended July 1, 1993.)

105-5-7. Reasonable compensation; tried cases. Each appointed and assigned attorney shall be compensated for time expended in representing indigent defendants at the hourly rate prescribed in K.A.R. 105-5-2. Except as provided in K.A.R. 105-5-8, reasonable compensation for felony cases tried on pleas of not guilty and submitted to a judge or jury for adjudication, including compensation for services at the preliminary hearing, sentencing and motions to modify the sentence, shall not exceed \$1,600 for class D and class E felonies, \$2,400 for class C felonies, and \$6,000 for class A and class B felonies. This regulation shall take effect on and after July 1, 1993. (Authorized by K.S.A. 22-4507 and 22-4522; implementing K.S.A. 22-4507; effective May 1, 1984; amended, T-105-6-13-88, July 1, 1988; amended Nov. 1, 1988; amended Oct. 30, 1989; amended July 1, 1993.)

105-5-8. Compensation; exceptional cases. (a) Any compensation for attorneys' services in excess of the amounts set out in K.A.R. 105-5-6 and K.A.R. 105-5-7 may be approved only in exceptional cases. An exceptional case means:

(1) Any case involving a Class A or Class B felony charge in the trial court; or

(2) any felony case tried on a not guilty plea in which there have been 25 or more hours spent in court in defense of the indigent defendant; or

(3) any felony case not submitted to a judge or jury in which there have been 10 hours or more of in-court time spent in defense of the indigent defendant; or

(4) any such case that has been declared an exceptional case by the court due to its complexity or other significant characteristics. A finding by the court that a case is exceptional shall be subject to final approval by the board.

(b) Each claim for compensation in an exceptional case shall be accompanied by a specific finding in a court order setting forth the basis for the declaration that the case is exceptional.

(c) Reasonable compensation for attorneys' services in exceptional cases shall not exceed \$6,000 per case. However, additional compensation may be approved by the board if warranted by the extreme complexity of the case. This regulation shall take effect on and after July 1, 1993. Article 6.—PROFESSIONAL PRACTICE

66-6-1. Seal. (a) Each licensee shall purchase a seal of the design approved by the board and shall forward a facsimile of the seal to the office of the board as proof of compliance with K.S.A. 74-7023.

(b) Failure of any licensee to comply with this requirement within 90 days from date of issuance of that person's license shall be cause for the suspension of that license, in accordance with K.A.R. 66-13-1.

(c) Original drawings, documents, technical reports, legal descriptions, records and papers prepared by or under the direct supervision of the licensee in the licensee's professional capacity shall be stamped with the licensee's seal.

After the licensee's seal has been applied to the original or record copy, the licensee shall place the licensee's handwritten signature and date across the seal.

(d) All architects shall endeavor to take all practical measures to ensure that drawings and specifications are not utilized for projects not contemplated at the time of the completion of the drawings and specifications.

(e) The architect shall endeavor to insure that the drawings and specifications as instruments of service remain the property of the architect whether the project for which they are made is executed or not.

(f) The owner may retain copies, including reproducible copies, of drawings and specifications for information and reference in connection with the owner's use and occupancy of the project.

(g) The architect shall endeavor to insure that the drawings and specifications are not used by the owner on any other projects, for additions to the contemplated project, or for completion of this project if the architect is not in default, except by agreement in writing and with appropriate compensation to the architect. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-7013; implementing K.S.A. 74-7023; effective May 1, 1978; amended May 1, 1984; amended May 1, 1985; amended May 4, 1992; amended Feb. 22, 1993.)

66-6-3. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-7013; effective May 1, 1978; amended May 1, 1984; amended May 4, 1992; revoked Feb. 22, 1993.)

66-6-4. Rules of professional conduct. (a) For the purposes of this regulation, "licensee" means any architect, landscape architect, land surveyor or professional engineer licensed by the board of technical professions.

(b) If any licensee's judgment is overruled under circumstances in which the safety, health or welfare of the public is endangered, the licensee shall inform the employer or client of the possible consequences and the licensee shall notify the authority who issued the building permit or otherwise has jurisdiction.

(c) The licensee shall not advertise to perform or undertake to perform any assignment involving a spe-

cific technical profession unless licensed and qualified by education and experience in that technical profession, as defined in K.S.A. 74-7003.

(d) Any licensee may accept an assignment requiring education or experience outside of the licensee's field of competence, but only to the extent that the services are restricted to those phases of the project in which the licensee is qualified. All other phases of that project shall be performed by licensed associates, licensed consultants, or employees who are otherwise qualified by virtue of their education or experience.

(e) Except as provided in K.S.A. 74-7023(b), no licensee shall affix a personal signature, seal or both to any plan or document dealing with subject matter which is outside of the licensee's field of competence by virtue of education or experience. Additionally, no licensee shall affix a personal signature, seal or both to any plan or document except after completion of a detailed review and evaluation of the documents.

(f) Where the competence of any licensee to perform an assignment in a specific technical field is at issue, the board may require the licensee to pass an appropriate examination.

(g) In all professional reports, statements and testimony, each licensee shall:

- (1) be completely objective and truthful; and
- (2) include all relevant and pertinent information.

(h) When serving as an expert or technical witness before any court, commission or other tribunal, each licensee shall express only opinions founded on:

- (1) an adequate knowledge of the facts at issue;
- (2) a background of technical competence in the subject matter; and

(3) an actual, good-faith belief of the accuracy and propriety of the licensee's testimony.

(i) If a licensee issues any statements, criticisms, or arguments on public policy matters which are inspired or paid for by an interested party or parties, those comments shall be prefaced by and include disclosure of:

- (1) the identities of the party or parties on whose behalf the licensee is speaking; and
- (2) the existence of any pecuniary interest of the licensee.

(j) Each licensee shall disclose all known or potential conflicts of interest to employers or clients by promptly informing them of any business association, interest, or any other circumstances which could influence that licensee's judgment or the quality of the licensee's services.

(k) No licensee shall accept compensation, financial or otherwise, from more than one party for services on the same project or for services pertaining to the same project, unless the circumstances are fully disclosed and agreed to by all interested parties.

(l) No licensee shall solicit or accept financial or other valuable consideration, directly or indirectly, from:

- (1) material or equipment suppliers for specifying their products; or

(2) contractors, their agents, or other parties in connection with work for employers or clients for which the licensee is responsible.

(m) No licensee shall solicit a contract from a governmental body on which a principal or officer of the licensee's organization serves as a member, except upon public disclosure of all pertinent facts and circumstances and consent of the appropriate public authority.

(n) No licensee shall offer, directly or indirectly, to pay a commission or other consideration or to make a political contribution or other gift in order to secure work, except for payment made to an employment agency for its services.

(o) In all contacts with prospective or existing clients or employers, each licensee shall accurately represent the licensee's qualifications and the scope of the licensee's responsibility in connection with work for which the licensee is claiming credit.

(p) No licensee shall associate with, or permit the use of the licensee's personal name or firm name in, a business venture by any person or firm which the licensee knows, or has reason to believe is engaging in:

(1) business or professional practice of a fraudulent or dishonest nature; or

(2) a violation of K.S.A. 74-7001 *et seq.* or the rules and regulations promulgated and adopted by the board.

(q) Each licensee with knowledge of any alleged violation of any of the rules of professional conduct shall:

(1) report the alleged violation to the board; and

(2) cooperate with the board in furnishing information or any assistance that may be required.

(r) No licensee shall assist any person in applying for registration when the licensee knows that person to be unqualified with respect to education, training, experience or character.

(s) Conviction of a felony or the revocation or suspension of a professional license by another jurisdiction, if for a cause which in the state of Kansas would constitute a violation of Kansas law or of these regulations, shall be grounds for a charge of violation of these regulations. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-7013; effective May 1, 1978; amended May 1, 1984; amended May 1, 1985; amended May 4, 1992; amended Feb. 22, 1993.)

66-6-6. Renewal of licenses and certificates of authorization. (a) Each licensee whose last name begins with one of the letters A through L shall receive a notice of renewal in even-numbered years. Each licensee whose last name begins with one of the letters M through Z shall receive a notice of renewal in odd-numbered years. A written notice shall be sent by the board to each licensee during the appropriate renewal year, and not later than the following dates:

(1) Architects	May 31
(2) Engineers	March 31
(3) Land Surveyors	February 28
(4) Landscape Architects	November 30

(b) A written notice shall be sent by the board to each corporation holding a certificate of authorization

to practice a technical profession not later than November 30 of even-numbered years.

(c) The notice shall state the amount of the renewal fee fixed by the board, as provided by K.S.A. 74-7025. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-7013; implementing K.S.A. 74-7025; effective May 1, 1984; amended May 4, 1992; amended Feb. 22, 1993.)

66-6-7. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-7013; implementing K.S.A. 74-7025; effective May 1, 1984; amended May 4, 1992; revoked Feb. 22, 1993.)

66-6-8. Second renewal notice. Any individual or corporation failing to pay the renewal fee within 60 days from the date of first written renewal notice shall be sent, not later than 75 calendar days from the date of the first written renewal notice, a second written renewal notice. The second written renewal notice shall state the renewal fee that is owed and shall further advise that if that fee is not paid within 90 calendar days from date of issuance of first written renewal notice, the individual's license or the corporation's authorization will be cancelled, in accordance with K.A.R. 66-13-1. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-7013; implementing K.S.A. 74-7025; effective May 1, 1984; amended May 4, 1992; amended Feb. 22, 1993.)

66-6-9. Revocation of license or certificate of authorization. (a) If any individual or corporation fails to pay the renewal fee within 90 calendar days from the date of the first written renewal notice, the individual's license or the corporation's authorization shall be revoked, in accordance with K.A.R. 66-13-1.

(b) A new license may be obtained in the manner prescribed for new applicants, unless the original license is reinstated by the board for good cause shown and upon payment of the reinstatement fee. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-7013; implementing K.S.A. 74-7025; effective May 1, 1984; amended May 1, 1985; amended May 4, 1992; amended Feb. 22, 1993.)

Article 8.—EXAMINATIONS

66-8-2. Architectural examination. (a) The written examination required of an applicant for architectural licensure shall be the architectural registration examination as prepared by the national council of architectural registration boards (NCARB).

(b) The examination shall be graded by the NCARB, subject to approval by the board.

(c) Each applicant who has passed a section or sections of previous registration examinations shall be granted transfer credits in accordance with the rules approved by the board. These rules are available from the board upon request.

(d) Each applicant for a professional license shall take and pass all sections of the architectural examination and meet the architectural experience requirements under K.S.A. 74-7019. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-7013; implementing K.S.A. 74-7017; effective May 1, 1984; amended May 1, 1985; amended May 4, 1992; amended Feb. 22, 1993.)

66-8-3. Engineering examinations. (a) The written examination required of an applicant for engineering
(continued)

licensure shall be the national council of examiners for engineering and surveying (NCEES) examination consisting of an engineering fundamentals section and a professional practice section.

(b) The examination shall be graded by the NCEES, subject to approval by the board.

(c) Each applicant who has passed a section or sections of previous registration examinations shall be granted transfer credits in accordance with the rules approved by the board. These rules are available from the board upon request.

(d) Each applicant for a professional license shall take and pass the section on engineering fundamentals and meet the professional engineering experience requirements under K.S.A. 74-7021 before the applicant may take the section on professional practice. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-7013; implementing K.S.A. 74-7017; effective May 1, 1984; amended May 4, 1992; amended Feb. 22, 1993.)

66-8-4. Land surveyor examinations. (a) The written examination required of an applicant for land surveying licensure shall include:

(1) the national council of examiners for engineering and surveying (NCEES) examinations covering:

(A) the fundamentals of land surveying; and
(B) the principles and practices of land surveying; and

(2) an examination covering Kansas land surveying laws and practices.

(b) The examinations shall be graded by the NCEES, subject to approval by the board.

(c) Each applicant who has passed a section or sections of previous registration examinations shall be granted transfer credits in accordance with the rules approved by the board. These rules are available from the board upon request.

(d) Each applicant for a professional license for land surveying shall be required to take and pass all sections of the land surveying examinations and meet the land surveying experience requirements under K.S.A. 74-7022. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-7013; implementing K.S.A. 74-7017; effective May 1, 1984; amended May 4, 1992; amended Feb. 22, 1993.)

66-8-5. Landscape architectural examinations. (a) The written examination required of an applicant for landscape architectural licensure shall be:

(1) the landscape architect registration examination as prepared by the national council of landscape architectural registration boards (CLARB); and

(2) the Kansas plant material identification examination.

(b) The landscape architectural registration examination shall be graded by the CLARB, subject to approval by the board.

(c) Each applicant who has passed a section or sections of previous registration examinations shall be granted transfer credits in accordance with the rules approved by the board. These rules are available from the board upon request.

(d) Each applicant for a professional license shall be required to take and pass all sections of the landscape architecture examinations and to meet the landscape

architectural experience requirements under K.S.A. 74-7020. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-7013; implementing K.S.A. 74-7017; effective May 1, 1984; amended May 4, 1992; amended Feb. 22, 1993.)

Article 9.—EDUCATION

66-9-1. Architectural curriculum approved by the board. "A college or university program that is adequate in its preparation of students for the practice of architecture" means a curriculum accredited by the national architectural accreditation board (NAAB). Any other architectural curriculum which has not been accredited by NAAB but has been evaluated and found to be of an equivalent standard, may be reviewed and accepted by the board. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-7013; implementing K.S.A. 74-7019; effective May 1, 1984; amended May 4, 1992; amended Feb. 22, 1993.)

66-9-2. Landscape architectural curriculum approved by the board. "A college or university program that is adequate in its preparation of students for the practice of landscape architecture" means: a curriculum accredited by the landscape architectural accreditation board (LAAB). Any landscape architectural curriculum which has not been accredited by LAAB but has been evaluated and found to be of an equivalent standard, may be reviewed and accepted by the board. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-7013; implementing K.S.A. 74-7020; effective May 1, 1984; amended May 4, 1992; amended Feb. 22, 1993.)

66-9-3. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-7013; implementing K.S.A. 74-7021; effective May 1, 1984; amended May 4, 1992; revoked Feb. 22, 1993.)

66-9-4. Engineering curriculum approved by the board. "A college or university program that is adequate in its preparation of students for the practice of engineering" means a curriculum accredited by the accreditation board for engineering and technology (ABET). Any other engineering curriculum which has not been accredited by ABET but has been evaluated and found to be of an equivalent standard, may be reviewed and accepted by the board. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-7013; implementing K.S.A. 1990 Supp. 74-7022; effective May 1, 1984; amended May 4, 1992; amended Feb. 22, 1993.)

66-9-5. Surveying curriculum approved by the board. Until a Kansas Regents Institution has a four year or more land surveyor curriculum, or a reciprocal agreement approved by the Kansas Board of Regents, applicants seeking licensure as land surveyors may fulfill their education with:

(1) graduation in an approved engineering curriculum as defined in 66-9-4; or

(2) a four-year land surveying curriculum accredited by the accreditation board for engineering and technology (ABET); or

(3) graduation in an approved land surveying curriculum of two (2) years from a school or college approved by the board. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-7013; implementing K.S.A. 1990 Supp. 74-7022; effective Feb. 22, 1993.)

Article 10.—EXPERIENCE

66-10-1. Architectural experience required of a graduate of an accredited architectural curriculum. (a) Prior to January 1, 1994, each applicant who is a graduate of an accredited architectural curriculum, as defined by K.A.R. 66-9-1, shall be required to provide a verified record of architectural experience of three years as specified by K.S.A. 74-7019(a)(1). The required work experience shall expose the applicant to all phases of work in design and construction, construction administration and office management. Each applicant shall provide a record of architectural experience compiled and evaluated by the national council of architectural registration boards (NCARB).

(b) Beginning January 1, 1994, each applicant who is a graduate of an accredited architectural curriculum, as defined by K.A.R. 66-9-1, shall complete the intern development program (IDP) as defined in the "IDP Guidelines: Intern Development Program, 1991-1992," as published in July, 1991. Each applicant shall provide a completed and bound record of architectural experience in the form transmitted by the national council of architectural registration boards (NCARB). (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-7013; implementing K.S.A. 74-7019; effective May 1, 1984; amended May 4, 1992; amended Feb. 22, 1993.)

66-10-2. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-7013; implementing K.S.A. 74-7019; effective May 1, 1984; amended May 4, 1992; revoked Feb. 22, 1993.)

66-10-3. Architectural experience required of a reciprocity applicant. Each architectural reciprocity applicant shall provide proof of certification by the national council of architectural registration boards (NCARB), for approval by the board. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-7013; implementing K.S.A. 74-7019; effective May 1, 1984; amended May 1, 1985; amended May 4, 1992; amended Feb. 22, 1993.)

66-10-4. Experience in landscape architecture work of a grade and character satisfactory to the board. (a) The required work experience shall expose the applicant to all phases of work integral to the practice of landscape architecture.

(b) Landscape architectural work experience shall:

- (1) fall within the definition of "the practice of landscape architecture" under K.S.A. 74-7003(g); and
- (2) be performed under the supervision of a licensed landscape architect, architect, or engineer, and be verified by a licensed landscape architect.

(c) The following guidelines shall be used to assign credit for work experience:

(1) A master's degree in landscape architecture may equal one year of credit toward the four-year experience requirement for a graduate of an accredited, four-year curriculum in landscape architecture.

(2) Each applicant who is a graduate of an accredited, master's level curriculum in landscape architecture as the first professional degree shall be considered by the board to be equivalent to a graduate of a five-year curriculum and shall meet the experience requirements of that curriculum as specified in K.S.A. 74-7020(a)(2).

(3) Teaching landscape architecture in a college or university which offers an approved landscape architectural curriculum of four years or more may be considered landscape architectural experience.

(d) The applicant shall supply at least three references from licensed landscape architects, architects, or engineers who are familiar with the applicant's landscape architectural experience. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-7013; implementing K.S.A. 74-7020; effective May 1, 1984; amended May 1, 1985; amended May 4, 1992; amended Feb. 22, 1993.)

66-10-5. Engineering experience required of a graduate of an approved engineering curriculum. Each graduate of an approved engineering curriculum, as defined by K.A.R. 66-9-4, shall be required to provide a verified record of engineering experience of four years. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-7013; implementing K.S.A. 74-7021; effective May 1, 1984; amended May 4, 1992; amended Feb. 22, 1993.)

66-10-10. Surveying experience required of a graduate of an accredited engineering curriculum. Each graduate of an accredited engineering curriculum, as defined by K.A.R. 66-9-4, shall provide a verified record of six years of surveying experience as specified by K.S.A. 74-7022(a). At least four years of experience shall have been in progressive land surveying, as defined in K.A.R. 66-10-12(b)(1). (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-7013; implementing K.S.A. 1990 Supp. 74-7022; effective May 1, 1984; amended May 4, 1992; amended Feb. 22, 1993.)

66-10-10a. Surveying experience required of an applicant who is a graduate of an approved land surveying curriculum. (a) Each graduate of a four-year land surveying curriculum, as defined in K.A.R. 66-9-5(2), shall be required to provide a verified record of four years of surveying experience, as specified by K.S.A. 74-7022(a). The four years of experience shall have been in progressive land surveying, as defined in K.A.R. 66-10-12(b)(1).

(b) Each graduate of an approved land surveying curriculum of two years, as defined in K.A.R. 66-9-5(3), shall be required to provide a verified record of six years of surveying experience, as specified in K.S.A. 74-7022(a). At least four years of experience shall have been in progressive land surveying as defined in K.A.R. 66-10-12(b)(1) and the remainder shall have been in either progressive land surveying or basic land surveying, as defined in K.A.R. 66-10-12(b)(2), (3),

and (4). (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-7013; implementing K.S.A. 1990 Supp. 74-7022; effective Feb. 22, 1993.)

66-10-11. Surveying experience required of an applicant who is not a graduate of an accredited land surveying or engineering curriculum. Each applicant for land surveyor license under K.S.A. 74-7022 (a) who is not a graduate of an accredited engineering curriculum, as defined by K.A.R. 66-9-4, and who is not a graduate of a land surveyor curriculum as defined in K.A.R. 66-9-5(2) and (3), shall provide a verified record of eight years of land surveying experience. At least six years shall have been in progressive land surveying, as defined in 66-10-12(b)(1) and the remainder shall have been in either progressive or basic land surveying, as defined in K.A.R. 66-10-12(b)(2), (3), and (4). (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-7013; implementing K.S.A. 1990 Supp. 74-7022; effective May 1, 1984; amended May 4, 1992; amended Feb. 22, 1993.)

66-10-12. Surveying experience of a character satisfactory to the board. (a) Land surveying experience shall:

(1) fall within the definition of "the practice of land surveying" as defined by K.S.A. 74-7003(k);

(2) be under the direct supervision of a licensed land surveyor for work performed after May 1, 1988; and

(3) be verified by the employer or former employer of the applicant and either a licensed land surveyor or professional engineer.

(b) The following guidelines shall be used to assign credit for work experience.

(1) Progressive land surveying experience shall include each of the following elements of professional land surveying: project management; research; measurements and locations; computations and analysis; legal principles and reconciliation; land planning and design; monumentation; and documentation and land information systems.

(2) Land surveying experience normally identified with engineering projects, including construction staking, curb and gutter projects, sanitary sewers, and design surveys for highways or bridges other than those that relate to right-of-way surveys, shall not be considered progressive land surveying experience. This experience, however, may be considered by the board as basic land surveying experience.

(3) Teaching experience in land surveying courses in an accredited engineering or land surveying curriculum may be considered as equal to one year of basic land surveying experience.

(4) If the applicant can provide a record of surveying and related technical education courses, including mathematics and drafting, the applicant may be given credit for 0.5 years of experience in basic land surveying for every 15 semester hours in such educational courses. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-7013; implementing K.S.A. 1990 Supp. 74-7022; effective May 1, 1984; amended May 4, 1992; amended Feb. 22, 1992.)

Article 11.—EIT CERTIFICATION

66-11-2. Admittance requirements for fundamentals of engineering examination. Each applicant who

meets one or more of the following requirements shall be reviewed by the board for admittance to the fundamentals of engineering examination as administered by NCEES:

(a) any student in an accredited engineering curriculum who is in the last semester of that student's education; or

(b) any graduate of an accredited engineering curriculum. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-7013; implementing K.S.A. 74-7021; effective May 1, 1984; amended May 4, 1992; amended Feb. 22, 1993.)

66-11-3. Subsequent application for professional engineer. Any certified intern engineer may apply for a professional engineer's license when the intern engineer has acquired four or more years of experience in engineering work of a character which is satisfactory to the board. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-7013; implementing K.S.A. 74-7021; effective May 1, 1984; amended May 4, 1992; amended Feb. 22, 1993.)

Article 13.—ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURES

66-13-1. Types of hearings. (a) Where required by Article 74 of the Kansas Statutes Annotated, hearings and procedures of the board shall be in accordance with the hearings and procedures established by the Kansas administrative procedure act.

(b) Summary adjudicative proceedings pursuant to the Kansas administrative procedure act, and amendments thereto may be used for the following types of action:

(1) cease and desist orders;

(2) enforcement orders based on stipulations;

(3) public or private censures.

(c) Any party who disagrees with and is subject to a summary adjudicative action may request that the proceedings be converted to a conference adjudicative proceeding or a formal adjudicative proceeding. Upon request, the summary proceeding shall be converted to the appropriate proceeding available under the Kansas administrative procedure act or rules and regulations promulgated thereunder.

(d) The order issued pursuant to subsection (b) of this regulation shall contain a notice informing those who are subject to the order that a request for review or conversion must be made within 15 days.

(e) The presiding officer for summary adjudicative proceedings may be the executive director or the executive director's designee.

(f) Conference adjudicative proceedings pursuant to K.S.A. 77-533, 77-534 and 77-535 of the Kansas administrative procedure act may be used for actions in which:

(1) there is no disputed issue of material fact; or

(2) the parties agree to a conference adjudicative proceeding. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-7013; effective May 4, 1992; amended Feb. 22, 1993.)

Notice of Hearing on Proposed Administrative Regulations

The Kansas State Board of Nursing will conduct a public hearing on administrative rules and regulations at 9 a.m. Tuesday, February 9, in Room 106, Landon State Office Building, 900 S.W. Jackson, Topeka. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulations during the hearing. The proposed regulations and their economic impact follows:

Fees

K.A.R. 60-4-101, 60-8-101, 60-11-119, and 60-13-101. Payment of fees. With the change of fees, there will be two types of reinstatement, with or without a temporary permit. Temporary permits will be extended to all licensees who need additional time to complete continuing education requirements. With a possible increase in those numbers, it is necessary to have additional moneys to cover the clerical and mailing costs which may be incurred. An inactive license fee will be also be added for those who request an inactive license versus letting the license lapse. In K.A.R. 60-8-101, a fee was established for continuing education providerships for mental health technicians.

K.A.R. 60-4-103. Fees and travel expenses for school accreditation and approval of continuing education providers. The fee for approval of single continuing nursing education offerings was increased.

The economic impact on licensees with regard to the temporary permit should be positive. Currently, an individual is unable to be employed until a license or authorization is reinstated. By being able to get the permit to resume work, the individual will not lose income or be lost from the work force. In addition, it may prevent the licensee, who may still continue to work without a license, to have to pay an administrative fine for working unlicensed. There will be added clerical time used for processing the permits as well as additional mailing costs for the agency. No additional staff should have to be added at this time.

Reinstatement

K.A.R. 60-3-104, Reinstatement of license after revocation; and K.A.R. 60-7-104, Reinstatement of license. The time period a nurse or licensed mental health technician has to wait to ask for reinstatement after revocation is now one year. In some cases this is a very short period. It was determined that the time period should not be set in regulation but left as part of the disciplinary process. In K.A.R. 60-7-104, additional flexibility in reinstating for mental health technicians has been added. The rest of the changes is language update.

The changes should have minimal economic impact.

Temporary Certification

K.A.R. 60-11-118. Temporary certification to practice. The regulation allows for a temporary certification for the advanced registered nurse practitioner who

may need additional time in completing the application process for certification.

In allowing the temporary certification, individuals will not be delayed in securing employment in an advanced role because of the sometimes lengthy application process for certification. This would assist the licensee. There would be little or no impact on the agency.

Inactive License

K.A.R. 60-3-11 and 60-7-108. These new regulations establish for nurses and licensed mental health technicians the avenue to place a license on inactive status rather than letting it lapse. A one-time fee would be changed.

There would be some increase in clerical activity, but the current computer system is programmed to assist with the process. There would also be some increased mailing costs. Except for the minimum cost to the licensee, there would be no economic impact on licensees.

Licensure

K.A.R. 60-3-101. Licensure. Most of the changes in this regulation are language revisions. One new section has been added to require licensure candidates with learning disabilities to present documentation as to the disability.

There will be no economic impact on licensure candidates or the agency.

Advanced Registered Nurse Practitioner

K.A.R. 60-11-103. Qualifications of advanced registered nurse practitioners. Other than slight language revisions, the main change was to add that having a higher degree than master's in nursing would qualify a nurse for certification as an advanced registered nurse practitioner.

This change in the regulation would be positive for the few nurses who might have a doctorate in nursing but not the master's degree. There would be no economic impact on the agency.

Continuing Nursing Education

K.A.R. 60-9-105. Definitions. Several new definitions were added to increase understanding of continuing nursing education for the licensee. Other new definitions were with regard to the continuing nursing education providerships.

There should be no economic impact on licensees, providerships, or the agency.

Education

K.A.R. 60-1-102. Approval procedure. Additional explanation of the requirements for approval of a school of nursing have been added to this regulation. The information has been in agency policy and is being moved into regulation.

K.A.R. 60-1-103. Discontinuing a school of nursing. The regulation is being simplified and now only requires a plan for disposition of the school records.

K.A.R. 60-1-104. Definitions. This is a new regulation setting out definitions for schools of nursing. The definitions had been in agency policy and are currently being utilized by the schools.

There should be no economic impact on the schools of nursing in Kansas or the agency.
