Notice of Hearing on Proposed Administrative Regulations

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment will conduct a public hearing at 1:30 p.m. Monday, February 22, in Conference Room A of the Kansas Department of Health and Environment, Building 740, Forbes Field, Topeka, to consider adoption of proposed permanent regulations K.A.R. 28-15-11, 28-15-13, and 28-15-21. These proposals will update the Kansas pub-

lic water supply regulations to agree with national requirements for treatment of surface water sources and groundwater sources under the influence of surface water.

K.A.R. 28-15-11. Definitions.

This regulation adds 18 new definitions to clarify terms used in K.A.R. 28-15-13 and K.A.R. 28-15-21. There is no economic impact from this regulation.

K.A.R. 28-15-13. Standards for bacteriological, chemical, physical and radiological quality.

This regulation is modified to delete the turbidity maximum contaminant level. Requirements for treated water clarity are now specified under new regulation K.A.R. 28-15-21.

K.A.R. 28-15-21. Surface water treatment rule.

This new regulation specifies treatment requirements for public water systems using either surface water or groundwater under the influence of surface water as their source of supply. Minimum levels of removal for Giardia lamblia and viruses are specified. Compliance with the treatment requirements will be achieved through clarification and disinfection. It is anticipated two existing surface water treatment plants will have difficulty meeting the new requirements. These two facilities are also having difficulty meeting existing requirements and are examining options to improve their treatment facilities or to purchase water from another public water supply. The estimated economic impact for these two plants is \$750,000. An estimated 45 wells may need additional treatment at a cost of \$15,000 each for a total of \$675,000. The additional economic impact from the monitoring requirements specified in this regulation are \$175,000 for equipment and an additional \$258,000 annually.

The time period between the publication of this notice and the scheduled hearing constitutes a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written comments on the proposed regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the Bureau of Water, Kansas Department of Health and Environment, Forbes Field, Topeka 66620. All interested parties will be given reasonable opportunity during the hearing to present their views, orally or in writing, concerning the adoption of the regulations. Following the hearing, all written and oral comments submitted will be considered as the basis for making changes to the proposed regulations.

Public Notice

K.S.A. 79-3603(d) imposes a sales tax "upon the gross receipts from the sale of meals or drinks furnished at any private club, drinking establishment, catered event, restaurant, eating house, dining car, hotel, drugstore or other place where meals or drinks are regularly sold to the public."

K.A.R. 92-19-21(d) states, "When a public or private nonprofit hospital operates a lunch room, cafeteria or dining room for the exclusive purpose of providing meals for its respective employees and staff the hospital shall not be considered to be engaged in conducting a place where meals or drinks are regularly sold to the public and shall not collect and remit tax on these sales."

Based on these authorities, sales tax is not due on the sale of meals to hospital employees and staff if the lunch room, cafeteria or dining room is open *only* to the employees and staff of that hospital.

K.A.R. 92-19-21(d) also states, "When a public or private nonprofit hospital makes its cafeteria, lunch room or dining room available for use by the general public, the hospital shall be considered to be in the business of conducting a place where meals or drinks are regularly sold to the public and shall collect and remit the sales tax."

If the cafeteria, lunch room or dining room is available for use by the general public, the cafeteria, lunch room, or dining room operator is required to collect sales tax on the gross receipts from the sale of *all* meals, including the sale of meals to hospital employees and staff.

K.S.A. 79-3606(b) exempts from sales tax all sales of tangible personal property or service, including the renting and leasing of tangible personal property, purchased directly by a public or private nonprofit hospital and used exclusively for such hospital, except when such "hospital is engaged or proposes to engage in any business specifically taxable under the provisions of this act and such items of tangible personal property or service are used or proposed to be used in such business." Therefore, any hospital that operates a cafeteria, lunch room, or dining room that is available for use by the general public shall *not* be exempt from sales tax on purchases of tangible personal property or services used in that cafeteria, lunch room or dining room. (This includes, but is not limited to, items such as cash registers, chairs, tables, plates, eating utensils, repair parts and services, construction services, etc.)

This notice supersedes all previous Department of Revenue rulings and opinions and shall become effective upon its publication in the Kansas Register.

The existing facility has capacity to wash up to 30 livestock trucks per week.

Wastewater Control Facilities: Wastewater will be impounded in a four-cell earthen lagoon system. Settlable solids will be retained in a concrete pit. All truck washing wastes will be applied to agricultural land for beneficial use. Wastewater storage capacity will be provided in excess of minimum requirements.

Compliance Schedule:

1. A lagoon seepage test must be conducted on cell 4 by a registered professional engineer using a procedure approved by the department. The results shall be submitted to Industrial Programs Section, Bureau of Water, Building 740, Forbes Field, Topeka, KS 66620, by April 1, 1993. If the test results show lagoon cell #4 seepage exceeds the maximum allowed rate, cell 34 shall be fully dewatered using every day suitable for land application of wastewater. The cell shall then be upgraded within one month of dewatering to achieve acceptable seepage rate. The cell shall be placed back in operation following approval by the department.
2. The sidewalls of the concrete solids settling pit shall be repaired and the overflow channel to lagoon cell 3 shall be eliminated by May 1, 1993.
3. The east berm of lagoon cell 3 shall be raised to an elevation at least as high as the south and west exterior berms by May 1, 1993.
4. Permittee shall retain the services of a Kansas-licensed consulting engineer to provide a KDHE-approvable plan and schedule to desludge and renovate the three treatment facility cells defined as cells 1, 2, and 3 in the "Sludge and Waste Management Plan" dated May 1992. The plan shall at a minimum include the current quantities of sludge and wastewater to be removed; details of how each cell will be dewatered; how the sludge will be removed; characteristics (nutrient content) of the sludge and wastewater; transportation equipment to be used and land application method for the wastewater and sludge; location, acreage, topography and soil characteristics (infiltration rate and nutrient content) of the waste application site(s); proposed sludge and wastewater application rates; and determination of nitrogen up-take rate for the current/next season's crops. The plan and schedule shall be provided to KDHE by May 1, 1993. The schedule shall indicate that permittee shall initiate action within 15 days of KDHE approval of the plan and schedule and desludging activity shall be completed by November 1, 1993.
5. Permittee shall retain the services of a Kansas-licensed engineer to develop a comprehensive wastewater and sludge management plan for the immediate and long term operation of the facility.

The plan shall be submitted to the department by May 1, 1993. The plan shall include, but not be limited to, the following items: dewatering and land application equipment for both wastewater and sludge, land application practices to prevent runoff or leaching of wastes, waste application rates based upon crop nutrient utilization, and identification of suitable sites (topography, soil characteristics, flooding frequency and proximity to residences shall be evaluated) for application of all wastes. The plans shall provide for nutrient analysis of wastewater, sludge, and soils at all waste application sites on at least an annual frequency. The plan shall provide for annual recommendations of waste application rates by an independent agronomic consultant on the basis of annual nutrient analyses.

The plan shall provide for equipment and procedures capable of dewatering the lagoons at a rate of at least 167,000 gallons per day, in compliance with Section A of this permit. The plan shall include a detailed feasibility analysis of various wastewater management options, including connection to the Emporia sanitary sewer, hauling to off-site land application, wastewater re-use, etc., or any combination of these options.

Written comments on the proposed determinations may be submitted to Bethel Spotts, Permit Clerk, or Dorothy Geisler (agricultural permits), Kansas Department of Health and Environment, Division of Environment, Bureau of Water, Forbes Field, Topeka 66620. All comments postmarked or received on or before February 20 will be considered in the formulation of final determinations regarding this public notice. Please refer to the appropriate public notice number (KS-93-6/8, KS-EG-93-1, KS-AG-93-8) and the name of applicant as listed when preparing comments.

If no objections are received during the public notice period, the Secretary of Health and Environment will issue the final determinations. If response to this notice indicates significant public interest, a public hearing may be held in conformance with state regulation 28-16-61 (28-46-21 for UIC). Media coordination (newspapers, radio) for publication and/or announcement of the public notice or public hearing is handled by the Kansas Department of Health and Environment.

The application, proposed permit, including proposed effluent limitations and special conditions, fact sheets as appropriate, comments received, and other information are on file and may be inspected at the Kansas Department of Health and Environment offices, Building 740, Forbes Field, Topeka, from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday. Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted at 10:30 a.m. Tuesday, February 23, in the first floor hearing room of the State Corporation Commission, 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, to consider proposed changes in existing administrative rules and regulations of the commission.

The period of 30 days notice from the date of this publication to the date of the public hearing constitutes a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed rules and regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the executive director of the commission at the address above.

All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity at the hearing to present their views orally in regard to adoption of the proposed amendments. Following the hearing, all written and oral comments submitted by interested parties will be considered by the commission as a basis for making amendments to the proposed changes.

The following is a brief summary of the purpose of the proposed changes to the regulations and the anticipated fiscal impact of each proposed change:

K.A.R. 82-4-1. Definitions. The amendment to this regulation in section (u)(3) cites the December 31, 1991,

effective date of the federal hazardous materials regulations which are being adopted. There is no economic impact associated with this amendment.

K.A.R. 82-4-3. Motor Carrier Safety Regulations. The amendment to section (a) of this regulation is intended to bring the safety regulations applicable to vehicles operating under the jurisdiction of the State Corporation Commission into conformity with federal regulations. The amendment cites the March 1, 1992, effective date of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations which are being adopted by reference. There is no economic impact associated with this amendment.

The amendments to subsections (a)(2) and (a)(12) are being made to bring the regulations into conformity with the federal regulations. Under (a)(2) intrastate motor carriers will be subject to Subpart H of 49 CFR Part 391, Controlled Substances Testing. Under (a)(12) intrastate motor carriers will be subject to the Procedures for Transportation Workplace Drug Testing Programs under 49 CFR Part 40. This should help improve the safety of Kansas roadways.

There is an economic impact associated with amendments (a)(2) and (a)(12). However, the total economic impact cannot be determined at this time. Those motor carriers that operate strictly intrastate that are subject to the safety regulation and whose vehicles weigh over 26,000 pounds or transport hazardous materials will be subject to the Controlled Substances Testing and to the Procedures for Transportation Workplace Drug Testing Programs.

The amendment to (c)(1) is just a typing error correction. There is no economic impact associated with this amendment.

K.A.R. 82-4-6d. Waiver of physical requirements. The amendment to this regulation is to cite the March 1, 1992, effective date of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations which are being adopted by reference. There is no economic impact associated with this amendment.

K.A.R. 82-4-8a. Accessories and equipment. The amendment to this regulation is to clarify what vehicles shall be equipped with safety equipment. There is no economic impact associated with this amendment.

K.A.R. 82-4-20. Transportation of hazardous materials by motor vehicles. The amendment in section (a) cites the December 31, 1991, effective date of the federal hazardous materials regulations which are being adopted. The other amendments in section (a) are made for clarification purposes. In addition we are adopting some material incorporated by reference under section 49 CFR 171.7(a)(3). Section (c) is being deleted because section 49 CFR 171.7(d) no longer exists under the federal regulations. There is no economic impact associated with these amendments.

K.A.R. 82-4-27a. Applications for transfer of certificates of convenience and necessity and permits. The amendments to this regulation are grammatical in nature. The word "purchaser" is deleted to eliminate possible confusion with the term transferee. There is no economic impact associated with this amendment.

K.A.R. 82-4-29. Applications for private carrier permits. The amendments to this regulation are to delete the words "in duplicate" and to clarify grammar. There is no economic impact associated with this amendment.

K.A.R. 82-4-34. Suspension of authority for failure to comply with regulations. This regulation is being revoked because it restates K.S.A. 1991 Supp. 66-1,112j. There is no economic impact associated with this revocation.

K.A.R. 82-4-35a. Inspections of motor carrier documents. The amendment is being made for clarification and better understanding of the regulation. It now gives all law enforcement officers authority to inspect motor carrier documents. There is no economic impact associated with this amendment.

K.A.R. 82-4-37. Identification cards. The words "which have been issued identification tags" are being deleted as the State Corporation Commission no longer issues identification tags due to the 1992 Kansas Legislature amending K.S.A. 66-1,139. This regulation is being amended to be consistent with state law. There is an economic impact, since the state will save approximately \$40,000 annually with a \$140,000 saving every fifth year when new tags are issued. There will be a saving to the motor carrier by not having to distribute and install the tag on each vehicle.

K.A.R. 82-4-38. Identification tags. This regulation is being revoked. The 1992 Kansas Legislature amended K.S.A. 66-1,139 and the commission will no longer issue identification tags. The revocation of this regulation reflects the changes in the state law. There is an economic impact, since the state of Kansas will save approximately \$40,000 annually by not issuing identification tags, with a \$140,000 saving every fifth year when new tags are issued. There will be a saving to the motor carrier by not having to distribute and install the tag on each vehicle.

K.A.R. 82-4-39. Surrender of identification cards. In this regulation the words "identification tags" are being deleted. As stated above, the commission no longer issues identification cards, and there is an economic impact since the state is saving approximately \$40,000 per year with a \$140,000 saving every fifth year when new tags are issued. There will be a saving to the motor carrier by not having to distribute and install the tag on each vehicle.

Article 22.—KANSAS TEACHER SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

88-22-1. Definitions. (a) "Course of instruction" means the program of study established by a school which leads to eligibility for certification in a hard-to-fill teaching discipline.

(b) "Full time student" means a student who is taking an academic course load of a minimum of 12 semester credit hours.

(c) "Board of regents" or "board" means the state board of regents provided for in the constitution of this state.

(d) "Ethnic minority group" shall be defined as it is in K.S.A. 1991 Supp. 74-3284(e)-(i).

(e) "Student budget" means one of several budgets used by an institution to package financial assistance awards. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1991 Supp. 74-32,106; implementing K.S.A. 1991 Supp. 74-32,100 *et seq.*; effective March 8, 1993.)

88-22-2. Applicant eligibility, qualified students.

(a) To be designated a teacher scholar by the executive officer of the board, each applicant shall demonstrate to the executive officer that the applicant: (1) Is a resident of the state of Kansas;

(2) has been accepted for admission to or is enrolled full-time in a course of instruction leading to certification in a hard-to-fill teaching discipline as identified by the state board of education; and

(3) has demonstrated scholastic ability which shall be determined on a combination of the following:

(A) High ACT or SAT score;

(B) rank in high school graduation class;

(C) cumulative high school or college grade point average;

(D) completion of the regents recommended secondary school curriculum;

(E) any other indicator of scholastic ability such as participation in academic competitions or activities; and

(F) for applicants who are unable to provide adequate high school information, written recommendation of a counselor who can attest to the applicant's scholastic achievement and potential for successful completion of a course of instruction leading to certification in a hard-to-fill teaching discipline.

(b) Each applicant shall enter an agreement with the executive officer pursuant to K.A.R. 88-22-8.

(c) To the extent practicable and consistent with qualification factors, members of ethnic minority

groups shall be identified and considered. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1991 Supp. 74-32,106; implementing K.S.A. 1991 Supp. 74-32,102, 74-32,103; effective March 8, 1993.)

88-22-3. Application eligibility. Only one application will be accepted from each eligible student. Each application shall be eligible for consideration only if it: (a) Is submitted by an eligible applicant; (b) meets all deadlines listed on the application; and (c) includes all required documentation and information. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1991 Supp. 74-32,106; effective March 8, 1993.)

88-22-4. Eligibility for renewal. Each applicant for renewal shall demonstrate to the executive officer that he or she remains qualified for the scholarship in accordance with K.S.A. 1991 Supp. 74-32,102, as amended. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1991 Supp. 74-32,106; effective March 8, 1993.)

88-22-5. Confidentiality of information. All financial information received from each applicant, parent or spouse shall remain confidential and shall be released only with permission of the applicant or in anonymous statistical groupings, except that this section does not preclude communication with any other entity authorized by the applicant to receive the applicant's state financial aid application or other federally approved financial aid report. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1991 Supp. 74-32,106; effective March 8, 1993.)

88-22-6. Available funds. If available funds are insufficient to fully fund all eligible applicants, fewer new awards shall be made. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1991 Supp. 74-32,106; implementing K.S.A. 1991 Supp. 74-32,100 *et seq.*; effective March 8, 1993.)

88-22-7. College certification. Upon the enrollment of an applicant for a teacher scholarship, each eligible post-secondary institution shall certify to the board that each recipient attending its institution: (a) Is a resident of the state of Kansas according to K.S.A. 76-729(a) and applicable administrative regulations of the board of regents relating to residency determinations;

(b) is enrolled full-time in a course of instruction leading to certification in a hard-to-fill teaching discipline;

(c) has demonstrated scholastic ability or has previously demonstrated scholastic ability and remains qualified by maintaining good standing and making satisfactory progress, as defined by the institution, toward completion of requirements of the course of instruction in which enrolled; and

(d) the scholarship, in combination with other student financial assistance, does not exceed the institution's applicable student budget. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1991 Supp. 74-32,106; effective March 8, 1993.)

88-22-8. Agreement. A student who has been designated a teacher scholar by the executive officer shall enter into an agreement with the executive officer which requires the applicant to: (a) Complete the required course of instruction leading to certification in a hard-to-fill teaching discipline;

(continued)

(b) engage in teaching in a hard-to-fill teaching discipline in Kansas;

(c) commence teaching in a hard-to-fill teaching discipline in Kansas in an accredited public or private elementary or secondary school no later than the beginning of the term immediately following certification and continue teaching for a period of not less than the length of the course of instruction for which the scholarship was awarded;

(d) maintain records and make reports as required by the executive officer to document the satisfaction of the obligations under these regulations; and

(e) repay amounts to the state as required by K.S.A. 1991 Supp. 74-32,104, and amendments thereto, upon failure to satisfy an agreement to engage in teaching in a hard-to-fill discipline for the required period of time, in the manner set forth in K.A.R. 88-22-11. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1991 Supp. 74-32,106; implementing K.S.A. 1991 Supp. 74-32,103, 74-32,104; effective March 8, 1993.)

88-22-9. Amount of award, number available. A designated scholar shall be awarded a scholarship in the amount of \$5,000 per academic year. No more than four awards shall be made for undergraduate study, except that a qualified student enrolled full time in a course of instruction leading to institutional certification in hard-to-fill teaching discipline, for which graduate study is required, may be awarded a scholarship for the duration of the course of instruction. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1991 Supp. 74-32,106; implementing K.S.A. 1991 Supp. 74-32,102, 74-32,103; effective March 8, 1993.)

88-22-10. Failure to satisfy obligations; repayment; interest. A failure to satisfy the obligation occurs when a scholarship recipient does not fulfill an obligation assumed under the teacher scholarship agreement and when that recipient does not meet the

circumstances set out in K.S.A. 74-32,105(a) for postponement, or the circumstances set out in K.S.A. 74-32,105(b) for satisfaction. Such a failure invokes an obligation to repay. Repayment shall occur in the following manner. (a) Payments shall be made to the executive officer.

(b) The amount owed shall be equal to the amount of scholarship funds received in addition to interest at the rate of fifteen percent annually.

(c) If the recipient has a total obligation to teach for more than one year, and he or she teaches for one school year, or two semesters, the first agreement will be the first discharged.

(d) Teaching for time periods of less than one school year, or less than two semesters, will not reduce the time the recipient is obligated to teach.

(e) Teaching part-time, including substitute teaching arrangements, in a hard-to-fill discipline may satisfy the agreement on a proportional basis.

(f) Repayment may be by installment pursuant to the terms of the agreement and under the following conditions.

(1) The first installment shall be due six months after the date of the action or circumstance which causes the failure of the recipient to satisfy an obligation, as determined by the executive officer based upon the circumstances of each individual case.

(2) A payment schedule shall be provided by the executive officer which specifies payments adequate to repay the total of all scholarship funds received plus statutory interest within five years. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1991 Supp. 74-32,106; implementing K.S.A. 1991 Supp. 74-32,104, 74-32,105; effective March 8, 1993.)

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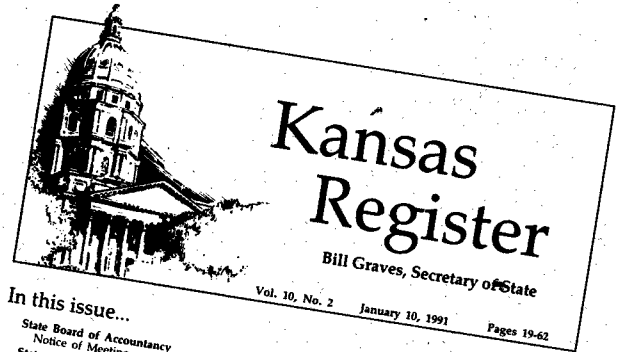
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
