Notice of Hearing on Proposed  
Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted at 9 a.m. Tuesday, March 2, in the SRS Staff Development Conference Room, 300 S.W. Oakley, Topeka, to consider proposed changes in existing rules and regulations on a permanent basis.

This 30-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the Secretary of Social and Rehabilitation Services, Room 603-N, Docking State Office Building, 915 S.W. Harrison, Topeka 66612. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the proposed regulations during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request each participant to limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

These regulations are scheduled to be adopted at a March 8 open meeting, which will not be on teleconference. This meeting will be held in the SRS executive conference room, Room 603-N, Docking State Office Building.

These regulations are scheduled to become effective May 3, 1993. A summary of the proposed regulations and their economic impact follows.

**Article 4.—PUBLIC ASSISTANCE PROGRAM**

**30-4-73. Deprivation in ADC.** This regulation is being amended to delete registration for employment as a qualifying criteria under the ADC-Unemployed Parent program. There is a requirement that the principal wage earner register for employment if exempted from either the KanWork or work program due to remoteness, but failure to meet this requirement shall not result in ineligibility for ADC-UP for the entire family. Instead, only the principal wage earner, as well as the spouse of the individual or other parent in certain instances, shall be rendered ineligible for assistance. (Federal Mandate.)

**Economic Impact:** This change is not expected to have any discernible economic impact.

**30-4-85a. Eligibility factors specific to the EA program.** This regulation is being amended to expand the emergency assistance program to incorporate additional emergency situations under which assistance can be provided and to modify the eligibility criteria. Under the changes, EA can now be provided to cover the following emergency situations:

- (a) Abuse, neglect, or abandonment of children;
- (b) family violence;
- (c) situations resulting in risk of out-of-home placement or institutionalization of children;
- (d) disasters, including fires, floods, and tornadoes; and
- (e) homelessness or risk of homelessness.

The family must have at least one child and must be without sufficient resources to provide needed emergency care or services. Assistance shall be limited to a maximum of 90 days of service or less in a 12-month period as necessary to alleviate the emergency condition.

**Economic Impact:** This expansion of the EA program will allow the agency to access federal matching funds for programs and services which have previously been provided solely with state general funds. In the area of staff expenditures, it is estimated that federal matching will provide approximately \$1.9 million in cost savings in a calendar year. Emergency and temporary residential care purchased with federally matched funds is expected to result in \$970,000 in yearly cost savings, and the yearly cost savings related to family preservation services is estimated to be \$705,000. Total cost savings for a calendar year is \$3,675,000.

**30-4-122a. Special allowances for EA.** This regulation is being amended to broaden the allowances provided in light of the expanded emergency conditions provided for in K.A.R. 30-4-85a. Persons shall be eligible for payment of the following services as necessary to alleviate the emergency condition:

- (a) Emergency shelter, including shelter to prevent homelessness of family members in circumstances of family violence, when, in order to assure the safety of all family members, the alleged perpetrator of violence needs to be separated from the family;
- (b) emergency utilities;
- (c) house repairs, including amounts necessary for adaptation or repair of residence to resolve the emergency;

- (d) household effects;
- (e) emergency clothing;
- (f) shelter care, including foster family care or group residential care for children separated from their parents;
- (g) family services, including case management, counseling, therapy, in-home intensive family services, and other social services necessary to resolve the emergency;
- (h) parenting education and training, including either in-home or residentially-based education and training as well as household management training, family support, and development services;
- (i) child and respite care, including care necessary to resolve the emergency and out-of-home placement for children at risk.

**Economic Impact:** See the economic impact statement for K.A.R. 30-4-85a.

**Article 5.—PROVIDER PARTICIPATION, SCOPE OF SERVICES, AND REIMBURSEMENTS FOR THE MEDICAID (MEDICAL ASSISTANCE) PROGRAM**

**30-5-58. Definitions.** This regulation is being amended to include a definition of "sampling" as the agency uses it to determine overpayments for providers in accordance with 42 CFR 456.22.

**Economic Impact:** None.

**30-5-59. Provider participation requirements.** This regulation is being amended to incorporate nursing facility providers into the existing provider participation requirements, to clarify current policy requiring both in-state and out-of-state providers of durable medical equipment to have a store front and a service representative in the state of Kansas, to clarify current policy of reimbursing out-of-state providers of blood fraction products for those products only, and to clarify current policy in regard to sampling techniques in the determination of overpayments to providers as required by 42 CFR 456.22.

**Economic Impact:** None.

**30-5-60. Provider termination.** This regulation is being amended to clarify that the agency retains the option to suspend a provider found to be out of compliance with provider participation requirements rather than terminating the provider. This is currently the policy of the agency. The title of the regulation is also being changed to "Provider termination/suspension."

**Economic Impact:** None.

**30-5-70. Payment of medical expenses for eligible recipients.** This regulation is being amended to reflect the current policy of restricting reimbursement to lock-in providers when a client has been placed on the lock-in program for abuse or misuse of medicaid/medikan.

**Economic Impact:** None.

**Article 6.—MEDICAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM—CLIENTS' ELIGIBILITY FOR PARTICIPATION**

**30-6-56. Transfer of property.** This regulation is being amended to allow for treatment of transfers of property for less than fair market value occurring over several months as a single transfer if those transfers

effectively reduce the period of ineligibility had they occurred in one month.

**Economic Impact:** It is expected that this provision will impact approximately six individuals each year resulting in cost savings of \$93,096 (\$37,685 state general funds) as an additional 12 months of ineligibility will result.

**30-6-113. Income exempt as applicable income.** This regulation is being amended to exempt the amount of VA pension received by a surviving spouse with no children if the pension is reduced to \$90 because the spouse resides in a medicaid nursing facility. (Federal Mandate.)

**Economic Impact:** It is expected that approximately 400 spouses will be impacted by this provision resulting in an increase in expenditures on a yearly basis of \$3,120,000 (\$1,372,800 state general funds). The change will reduce the amount of monthly liability each of these persons is required to contribute for the cost of their nursing home care by \$650.

**30-6-150. Estate recovery.** This regulation is being amended to clarify the determination of fair market value for transfers of property that are potentially voidable. Fair market value will be based on the percentage of ownership the person has in the property he or she transfers. If the property is jointly owned, the value of the property shall be prorated equally among the owners unless the percentage is otherwise specified in deed or title.

**Economic Impact:** This change is not expected to have any discernible economic impact.

#### **Article 7.—APPEALS, FAIR HEARINGS AND AFDC/GA DISQUALIFICATION HEARINGS**

**30-7-100. Definition of intentional AFDC or GA program violation.** This regulation is being amended to make a technical change to include attempted fraud in the definition.

**Economic Impact:** None.

#### **Notice of Hearing on Proposed Administrative Regulations**

A public hearing will be conducted by the Wildlife and Parks Commission at 7 p.m. Thursday, March 4, at the Wichita Marriott, Kansas Grand Ballroom, 9100 E. Corporate Hills Drive, Wichita, to consider the adoption of department regulations. There will be a public comment period at the beginning of the meeting and additional comments may be taken during the meeting on agenda items.

A workshop meeting on upcoming business of the Wildlife and Parks Commission will begin at 1:30 p.m. March 4 at the same location. The public also will be given the opportunity to comment on any items at the beginning of or during the meeting. The meeting will recess at 5 p.m., then resume at 7 p.m. at the same location for the regulatory meeting. Old and new business may also be discussed at this time. If necessary to complete the hearing or other business matters, the commission would reconvene at 9 a.m. March 5 at the same location.

If notified in advance, the department will have an interpreter available for the hard of hearing. To contact the department for this or any other reason, members of the public with a hearing impairment may call the TDD service at 1-800-766-3777. All public meeting areas are accessible to those who are physically disabled.

This 30-day notice period prior to the hearing constitutes a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulations.

All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the chairman of the commission, Kansas Department of Wildlife and Parks, Suite 502, Landon State Office Building, 900 S.W. Jackson, Topeka 66612. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity at the hearing to express their view orally in regard to the adoption of the proposed regulations. During the hearing, all written and oral comments submitted by interested parties will be considered by the commission as a basis for approving, amending and approving, or rejecting the proposed regulations.

The following is a brief summary of the regulations proposed for adoption.

**K.A.R. 115-4-1. Turkey; legal equipment, taking methods, reports, tags and general provisions.** This permanent regulation is proposed for amendment. The amendments establish a 20 inch minimum arrow length. The other amendments are editorial to maintain similar wording with other big game regulations.

**Economic Impact Summary:** The amendment is not anticipated to have any economic impact.

**K.A.R. 115-4-3. Antelope; legal equipment, taking methods, and general provisions.** This permanent regulation is proposed for amendment. The amendments establish a 20 inch minimum arrow length and clarify the possession of an antelope carcass. The other amendments are editorial to maintain similar wording with other big game regulations.

**Economic Impact Summary:** The amendments are not anticipated to have any economic impact.

**K.A.R. 115-4-5. Deer; legal equipment, taking methods, and general provisions.** This permanent regulation is proposed for amendment. The amendments establish a 20 inch minimum arrow length and clarify the possession of a deer carcass. The other amendments are editorial to maintain similar wording with other big game regulations.

**Economic Impact Summary:** The amendments are not anticipated to have any economic impact.

**K.A.R. 115-4-6. Deer; management units.** This permanent regulation is proposed for amendment. The amendment performs a small adjustment in the boundary between units 11 and 12.

**Economic Impact Summary:** The amendment will have no economic impact.

**K.A.R. 115-4-7. Elk; legal equipment, taking methods, and general provisions.** This permanent regulation is proposed for amendment. The amendments establish a 20 inch minimum arrow length and clarify the possession of an elk carcass. The other amend-

ments are editorial to maintain similar wording with other big game regulations.

**Economic Impact Summary:** No economic impact is anticipated as a result of the amendments.

**K.A.R. 115-25-5. Turkey; fall season bag limit and permits.** This proposed exempt regulation will establish the fall archery and firearm turkey hunting seasons, hunting units, permit allowances, and bag limits. Application dates are included.

**Economic Impact Summary:** The department will realize revenue based on the number of permits actually issued. Certain businesses will benefit from sportsmen hunting turkeys. Revenue to the department represents a cost to sportsmen; however, such cost is voluntary for sportsmen.

**K.A.R. 115-25-7. Antelope; open season, bag limit and permits.** This proposed exempt regulation will establish the fall archery and firearms antelope seasons, hunting units, permit allowances and bag limits. Application dates are included.

**Economic Impact Summary:** The department will realize revenue based on the number of permits actually issued. Certain businesses will benefit from sportsmen hunting antelope. Revenue to the department represents a cost to sportsmen; however, such cost is voluntary for sportsmen.

**K.A.R. 115-25-8. Elk; open season, bag limit and permits.** This proposed exempt regulation will establish the fall elk hunting season, hunting areas, permit allowances, and bag limits. Application dates are included.

**Economic Impact Summary:** The department will realize revenue based on the number of permits actually issued. Certain businesses will benefit from sportsmen hunting elk. Revenue to the department represents a cost to sportsmen; however, such cost is voluntary for sportsmen.

**K.A.R. 115-25-9. Deer; regular open season, bag limit and permits.** This proposed exempt regulation will establish the regular fall archery and firearms deer seasons, and bag limits. Application dates are included. Permit allowances would be established by Secretary's Order at the hearing.

**Economic Impact Summary:** The department will realize revenue based on the number of permits actually issued. Certain businesses will benefit from sportsmen hunting deer. Revenue to the department represents a cost to sportsmen; however, such cost is voluntary for sportsmen.

In accordance with state regulations 28-16-57 through 63, 28-18-1 through 4, and the authority vested with the state by the administrator of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, tentative permits have been prepared for discharges to the waters of the United States and the state of Kansas for the applicants described below. **RULES FOR INSTANT GAME NO. 52  
"CASH IN A FLASH"**

**111-4-462. Name of game.** The Kansas Lottery shall conduct an instant winner lottery game entitled "Cash in a Flash" commencing on February 4, 1993. The specific rules for the "Cash in a Flash" game are contained in K.A.R. 111-3-1 *et seq.* and 111-4-462 through 111-4-465. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1992 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-1-20-93, Jan. 15, 1993.)

**111-4-463. Definitions.** The following definitions shall apply to the "Cash in a Flash" instant lottery game:

(a) "Game symbols" are the numbers, letters, symbols, or pictures printed in the play area of each instant game ticket and which determine if the ticket bearer is entitled to a prize. In this instant game, the game symbols are printed in black ink in WGI Symbol Font 15. A game symbol appears in the "YOURS" area, in the "PRIZE" area and in each of four play spots within the "LUCKY NUMBERS" area. Each game symbol for this instant game is one of the following: \$1.00 - \$5.00 - 10.00 - 50.00 - \$500\$ - 1 - 2 - 3 - 4 - 5 - 6 - 7 - 8 - 9.

(b) "Game symbol captions" are the words or portions of words, letters or numbers printed beneath each game symbol in the play area and are used to repeat or explain the game symbol. The game symbol caption associated with each game symbol is as follows:

(c) "Ticket validation number" means a unique number appearing on each ticket which is used to validate winning tickets. For this instant game, the ticket validation number is a 10-digit number which

appears under the latex covering on the front of each instant ticket.

(d) "Book-ticket number" means the unique number appearing on each ticket which includes the number of the book from which it was removed and the serially assigned number of the ticket within that book. For this instant game, the book-ticket number is an 8-digit book number followed by a dash and then a 3-digit ticket number. The ticket numbers in each book start with 000 and end with 299. The book-ticket number is printed in black ink on the front of each instant game ticket.

(e) "Retailer validation code" means the small letters found under removable covering in the play area of each instant game ticket. The retailer uses this code to verify and validate winners which are to be paid by the retailer. In this instant game, the retailer validation code is a two letter code printed and appearing in two of four varying locations among the game symbols in each play area. The codes and their meanings are as follows: CC = \$1.00; KK = \$5.00; BB = \$10.00. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1992 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-1-20-93, Jan. 15, 1993.)

**111-4-464. Determination of instant prize winners.** An instant prize winner is determined for this instant game when the player removes or "scratches off" the removable layer of material covering play areas entitled, "YOURS," "PRIZE" and "LUCKY NUMBERS" to reveal the game symbols and captions in the play area. If any of the four numbers in the "LUCKY NUMBERS" area matches the number in the "YOURS" area, the player wins the amount shown in the "PRIZE" area. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1992 Supp. 74-8710(b), (c) & (i); implementing K.S.A. 1992 Supp. 74-8710(b), (c) & (i) and 74-8720 (b) & (d); effective, T-111-1-20-93, Jan. 15, 1993.)

**111-4-465. Number and value of instant prizes.**

(a) There will be approximately 3,000,000 tickets ordered for this instant game. The expected number and value of the instant prizes are as follows:
