**Notice of Hearing on Proposed
Administrative Regulations**

A public hearing will be conducted at 1:30 p.m. Wednesday, July 7, in the third floor auditorium of the Wyandotte County Health Department, 619 Ann Ave., Kansas City, Kansas. The purpose of this hearing is to consider the adoption of proposed changes to existing air quality rules and regulations of the Department of Health and Environment, Division of Environment, Bureau of Air and Radiation, K.A.R. 28-19-31, 28-19-32, 28-19-63, and 28-29-78 (Revoked).

These changes to the rules and regulations are proposed on a permanent basis. A summary of the proposed changes to the rules and regulations and their economic impact follows. The summary addresses only the substantial changes to the existing regulations. The remaining proposed changes are intended only for the purpose of clarifying requirements that are now in effect.

K.A.R. 28-19-31. Emissions limitations. These proposed changes clarify standards that are now in effect by stating the emission limitation in pounds of sulfur dioxide rather than pounds of sulfur and by clarifying that emission limitations other than those stated in the regulation are effective if specified as a permit condition. The proposed regulation will not have an economic impact upon the general public, the private sector or governmental agencies.

K.A.R. 28-19-32. Exemptions-indirect heating equipment. These proposed changes are required by the federal government to remedy inconsistencies between Kansas regulations and federal regulations. The proposed changes revoke an exemption from the requirements of K.A.R. 28-19-31(C) which apply to only three electric generating plants. Due to applicable federal requirements, two of these plants currently operate in a manner which complies with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-31(C) and can no longer take advantage of the exemptions. The third plant is currently in the process of demonstrating the rate at which it can operate without violating state or federal air quality regulations in anticipation of operating under a permit restriction rather than the exemption provided in this regulation. This proposed regulation will not have an economic impact upon the general public, the private sector or governmental agencies.

K.A.R. 28-19-63. Automobile and light duty truck coating. These proposed changes clarify requirements that are now in effect by adopting a standard industry procedure for demonstrating continual compliance with organic vapor emission requirements. This new procedure will provide an alternative compliance demonstration method and will, therefore, add some flexibility to current requirements. The changes to this regulation will not have an economic impact upon the general public. The additional compliance demonstration option may result in a slight positive economic

impact upon the private sector. There will be no economic impact upon government agencies.

K.A.R. 26-19-78. Fuel volatility. This regulation was promulgated as part of the successful effort to have Wyandotte and Johnson counties redesignated as meeting the national ambient air quality standard for ozone. A federal regulation has subsequently been promulgated by the United States Environmental Protection Agency which supersedes K.A.R. 28-19-78. Therefore, K.A.R. 28-19-78 is being revoked. This revocation will have no economic impact upon the general public, the private sector or governmental agencies.

The time period between the publication of this notice and the scheduled hearing constitutes a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed changes to the rules and regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to Chuck Layman, Bureau of Air and Radiation, Building 740, Forbes Field, Topeka 66620. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the proposed changes to the rules and regulations during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request each participant to limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

The proposed facility will have capacity for approximately 300 swine. Wastewater Control Facilities: Wastewater will be impounded for subsequent application to agricultural land for beneficial use. Wastewater storage capacity is provided in excess of minimum requirements.

Advisory Opinion No. 93-18

Written May 20, 1993, to all interested persons:

Pursuant to K.S.A. 25-4159, the Kansas Commission on Governmental Standards and Conduct takes this opportunity to issue its opinion on a question concerning the use by a candidate of campaign funds to make contributions to party committees.

In Opinion No. 92-18, this commission held that candidate campaign funds generally cannot be donated to party committees under K.S.A. 25-4157a, since those types of expenditures were not for "legitimate campaign purposes" of the candidate, but rather for the support of other candidates.

In Opinion No. 92-24, the commission noted several situations where expenditures from a candidate to a

party committee would be permissible. The situations all dealt with circumstances where the candidate received some benefit from the expenditures.

In that opinion we specifically noted as follows:

In addition, purchase of tickets at the lowest necessary price for the candidate and his or her immediate family at fundraising and political events is permissible from campaign funds to the extent necessary to allow them to attend.

We hereby modify the above portion of Opinion No. 92-24. We understand that there are situations where the lowest ticket price substantially exceeds the fair market value of food and beverages or the value of entertainment received at such events. In those situations, the excess over the fair market value is an impermissible contribution. We also note that the candidate and family members must actually attend the event or even the fair market value of the tickets is an impermissible use of campaign funds.

In closing, note that nothing in this opinion prohibits the candidate from using personal funds to attend these events.

Advisory Opinion No. 93-19

Written May 20, 1993, to Stan Ward, Director, Farmers Assistance Counseling and Training Service (FACTS), Kansas State University, Manhattan.

This opinion is in response to your letter of April 24, 1993, in which you request an opinion from the Kansas Commission on Governmental Standards and Conduct concerning the state conflict of interest law (K.S.A. 46-215 *et seq.*).

Factual Situation

We understand you request this opinion in your capacity as director of the Farmers' Assistance Counseling and Training Service (FACTS) of the Kansas Board of Agriculture.

You advise us that during the 1990 legislative session, changes were made in the enabling legislation allowing the Farmers' Assistance Counseling and Training Service (FACTS) of the Kansas Board of Agriculture to expand its services into broader areas of rural development. Following those changes, the Board of Agriculture instituted a strategic planning committee to explore possible future directions for FACTS. The committee was composed of members of the Kansas Board of Agriculture, the Kansas Cooperative Extension Service and a representative from the Governor's office. Over a period of several weeks, the committee sought input and heard testimony from, among other organizations:

1. The Kansas Center for Rural Initiatives at K-State
2. The Kansas Cooperative Extension Service
3. The Docking Institute at Fort Hays State University
4. The Kansas Department of Commerce
5. The Kansas Department of Human Resources

The committee identified several new program directions for FACTS, primary among them was rural employment retraining.

Following the direction of the committee, FACTS staff first met with extension personnel to explore possibilities of reviving a 1986-87 extension program called the Job Search Education Program. After due consideration, extension decided its priorities at that time lay elsewhere and chose not to revive the Job Search Education Program.

At that point, FACTS staff invited extension to jointly explore program development and funding possibilities utilizing federal EDWAA funds through the Kansas Department of Human Resources (KDHR). Extension agreed this was an appropriate activity for FACTS but chose not to become actively involved in either the program development aspect or in requesting funding from KDHR.

FACTS staff then began working with KDHR staff and developed two cooperative programs:

1. A Dislocated Worker Hotline serving all Kansas residents regardless of the place of residence (urban or rural).
2. A RuralWorks project to deliver specific employment/retraining services to residents of rural communities.

The Dislocated Worker Hotline began operation in January 1992 and the RuralWorks project began operation in July 1992. Both projects were funded with federal EDWAA dollars (\$225,000 for FY 93) through KDHR and monitored by KDHR. Both programs have been highly successful and have been audited twice with no fiscal irregularities found.

Initially, it was the intent of KDHR to continue both projects for several years, but federal EDWAA funds to Kansas have been cut by 43 percent for FY 1994. In an effort to cope with this cut, KDHR has re-prioritized its EDWAA projects and is placing nearly all EDWAA funds into one project that will serve dislocated workers in the aircraft industry in Wichita.

You state that this decision leaves both the Dislocated Workers Hotline and the RuralWorks project without funding for FY 1994. Unless other sources of funding can be found, both projects will be terminated July 1, 1993. However, KDHR has strongly recommended that FACTS seek funding directly from the US Department of Labor (USDOL) discretionary grant pool because they want to see these successful programs continue. They have agreed to provide whatever support they can in preparing a grant application and whatever support they can to aid in its funding.

Accordingly, FACTS staff has made preliminary contact with USDOL about funding possibilities. USDOL has indicated they will not fund a dislocated worker hotline, but that serious consideration would be given to funding a RuralWorks project, if it focused specifically on dislocated farmers and provided training dollars to assist this target group to update current work skills or acquire new work skills.

Information regarding these program circumstances and funding possibilities have been conveyed to the Secretary of Agriculture and to a committee of the Board of Agriculture that oversees the FACTS program. Information has been shared on a regular basis by personal meetings between the director of the FACTS program, the Secretary of Agriculture and the

Assistant Secretary of Agriculture; by phone calls with these individuals and members of the FACTS committee; and by memo over the past several weeks as events have developed and as information has become available.

Preliminary indications regarding a program as recommended by USDOL suggest that approximately \$900,000 would be needed to provide program services, education/retraining dollars and administrative services to a dislocated farm population. It is anticipated that the Board of Agriculture (including representatives from KDHR and the Cooperative Extension Service) will meet sometime during the next two weeks to decide if a grant application for an expanded RuralWorks project is to be submitted directly to USDOL in an attempt to continue what is perceived as a valuable rural services program.

You also advise us that the problem is that the project as recommended by USDOL will require funding substantially above the amount currently being funded by KDHR (\$900,000 vs \$225,000). This increase in funding level is necessitated primarily because the current RuralWorks project provides only basic readjustment services, no training dollars, and the project as proposed by USDOL requires training dollars be included. Nearly all increases required in a revised project would be program money spent directly on education and/or retraining for program participants.

Even so, there is a possibility that the Board of Agriculture will not want to expand FACTS program operations in this direction and may choose not to submit an application for direct funding from USDOL.

Finally, you tell us that in the event the Board of Agriculture chooses not to submit a proposal for funding, the Assistant Secretary of Agriculture has suggested the project and its services might be continued if some of the current FACTS staff formed a nonprofit corporation and submitted a proposal to USDOL for direct funding to the nonprofit corporation. In the eventuality that the nonprofit corporation was successful in its proposal, then staff could move into paid positions with the nonprofit corporation, after resigning their positions with the Board of Agriculture's FACTS program.

Question

Would it be legal under Kansas law for current employees of the FACTS program to form a nonprofit corporation to seek funding for a project the Board of Agriculture and the Cooperative Extension Service chose not to continue under their auspices, than for those employees to accept paid staff positions in the newly formed nonprofit corporation after resigning from their Board of Agriculture positions?

Opinion

We have reviewed K.S.A. 46-215 *et seq.* in its entirety. The only section we find which might apply to the situation you describe is K.S.A. 46-241. That section states:

No state officer or employee shall disclose or use confidential information acquired in the course of his or her official duties in order to further his

or her own economic interest or those of any other person.

The key here is whether the information known to the FACTS staff is "confidential." None of the information you have advised us about appears to be "confidential." Of course we do not have privy to all the types of information known to the staff. We, therefore, strongly urge that a review be completed to check whether any statute, regulations, policies or contractual provisions of the agencies involved require any of the information to be kept confidential. If not, then the situation you have described is permissible.

Advisory Opinion No. 93-20

Written May 20, 1993, to Edith L. Stunkel, City Commissioner and Assistant Director, KSU Center for Aging, Manhattan.

This opinion is in response to your letter of April 26, 1993, in which you request an opinion from the Kansas Commission on Governmental Standards and Conduct concerning the local conflict of interest law (K.S.A. 75-4301 *et seq.*).

Factual Statement

We understand you request this opinion in your capacity as a city commissioner in the city of Manhattan, Kansas. You advise us you are also employed at the Center for Aging of Kansas State University. Your direct supervisor at Kansas State University is the director of the Center for Aging who, in turn, reports to the deans of the Colleges of Human Ecology, Arts and Sciences, and Architecture.

Effective July 1, 1993, your entire salary (20-30% time) will be funded through a contract with the Kansas Department of Transportation for a K-Trans project competitively awarded to university faculty. Your paycheck will still be issued through K-State as a faculty member.

Questions

1. Does your receipt of compensation through the Department of Transportation preclude you from participating on issues involving the Department of Transportation in your capacity as a city commissioner?
2. Does your employment with KSU preclude you from participating on issues in your capacity as a city commissioner involving KSU?
3. If a city commissioner is appointed to serve on a county board, is the commissioner required to abstain when issues concerning that board come before the city commission?

Opinion

K.S.A. 75-4301 *et seq.* prohibits certain conduct when a city official holds a "substantial interest" in or is employed by a "person" or "business." This commission has consistently held under the local law that governmental entities are not "persons" or "businesses" as defined by this act. Thus, you may fully participate in your capacity as a city official in all the situations you describe.

In closing, we note that under the law applicable to state officials, a different outcome could be reached

since governmental entities are specifically included within the definition of person or business.

Advisory Opinion No. 93-21

Written May 20, 1993, to Ruth A. Sherrer, Associate Director, Kansas State Historical Society, Topeka.

This opinion is in response to your letter of April 30, 1993, in which you request an opinion from the Kansas Commission on Governmental Standards and Conduct concerning the state conflict of interest law (K.S.A. 46-215 *et seq.*).

Factual Statement

We understand you request this opinion in your capacity as associate director of the Kansas State Historical Society (KSHS). You advise us that Ms. Barbara Anderson was employed by the Society from July 1985 until April 1993 as a Historical Preservation Specialist in the Historic Preservation Department. That department is responsible for the historic preservation activities of the state and reviews, recommends, and administers historic preservation grant applications for federal funding.

The 1990 legislative session amended K.S.A. 79-3102 to establish the Heritage Trust Fund and to provide a funding mechanism for the fund. The fund is used for the purpose of awarding grants to assist historic preservation projects involving property included in the National Register of Historic Places or the State Register of Historic Places and also for the administration of the Heritage Trust Fund program. This fund is also administered by the Historic Preservation Department and from the time that the program was established until she resigned in April 1993, Ms. Anderson's duties were to administer that grant program, including establishing the regulations and procedures used in the program.

You state that the society is currently working out an agreement with KDOT officials so that you will provide technical support in the form of review of plans and specifications, on-site inspections, and technical advice on transportation enhancement projects that have been awarded to four local entities. You are proposing to hire Ms. Anderson, in a temporary position, to provide that technical support for those four projects only. The transportation enhancement funds are federal funds provided through the Department of Transportation and have no relationship to either the National Historic Preservation Act fund or the Heritage Trust Fund that are administered by the Kansas State Historical Society.

Question

May the Kansas Historical Society hire a former employee on a part-time basis to manage grants, when the former employee participated in obtaining the grants?

Opinion

We find nothing in the factual situation provided to us which is prohibited by K.S.A. 46-215 *et seq.*

These proposed regulations will result in a positive effect upon the service providers and the recipients of Senior Care Act program services.

The proposed regulations are the result of the passage of the 1989 Senate Bill No. 60 into state law authorizing the Secretary of Aging to establish a program of in-home support services for certain adults providing for requirements for and limitations on such programs and providing for the administration of the program.

The department does not have a less costly or intensive method for achieving the stated purpose of the regulations. It is estimated that the regulations will not require any additional costs. A summary of proposed regulations follows.

K.A.R. 26-8-1—Definitions. Contains definitions of terms used in the senior care act program.

K.A.R. 26-8-3—Priority for services. Contains a listing of those services that are priority services.

K.A.R. 26-8-4—Fees. Contains the fee schedule for services set by the program.

K.A.R. 26-8-7—Funds spent for each client. Contains the maximum expenditure limit for total monthly service to a specific client.

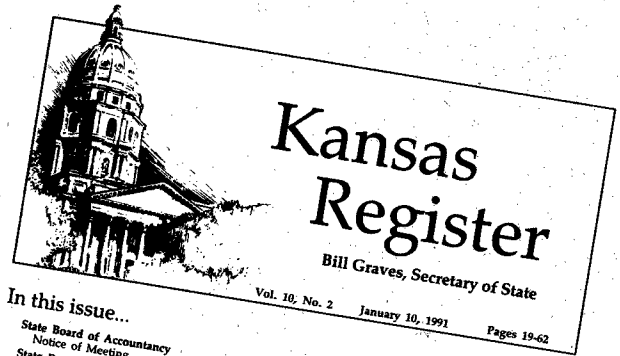
