**Notice of Hearing on Proposed
Administrative Regulations**

A public hearing will be conducted from 10 a.m. to 10:30 a.m., July 19, in the Department of Corrections' conference room, 900 S.W. Jackson, 4th Floor, Topeka, to consider the adoption of proposed regulations 44-6-146 and 44-7-116 and proposed amendments to K.A.R. 44-6-124 of the Kansas Department of Corrections. These regulations will become effective 45 days after publication in the Kansas Register unless a specific date is contained in the regulations.

All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to Charles E. Simmons, Chief Legal Counsel, Kansas Department of Corrections, 900 S.W. Jackson, 4th Floor, Topeka 66612. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity at the hearing to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulations. In order to give all parties an opportunity to express their views, it may be necessary to request each participant to limit oral presentation to five minutes.

This 30-day notice constitutes a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulations.

A summary of the regulations follows:

44-6-146: This regulation establishes criteria for determining whether inmates have earned good time credits available under the Sentencing Guidelines Act.

44-6-124: This regulation is an amendment to an existing regulation regarding the criteria for earning of good time credits by inmates under current law. The amendment establishes the criteria to be the same as for the earning of good time credits under sentencing guidelines.

44-7-116: This regulation establishes criteria for determining which inmates qualify for the payment of a gratuity upon release, and the amount of the gratuity.

These regulations are not estimated to have any economic impact on governmental units, persons subject to the proposed regulations, or the general public.

K.A.R. 44-6-124 and 44-6-146 are procedural in nature and will have no fiscal impact. The maximum cash payment authorized by K.A.R. 44-7-116 is equal to the payment now authorized, therefore, the total amount of cash payments under the regulation could not be more and probably will be less than what is now provided.

Economic Impact Statement

Proposed regulation 44-7-116 involves the payment of a release gratuity to inmates upon release from incarceration. The regulation is based on HB 2129 which was enacted during the 1993 Legislative Session.

Proposed regulation 44-6-124 involves the process for inmates to earn good time credits applicable to offenses committed on or after July 1, 1993. The regulation is based on Chapter 239 of the 1992 Session Laws of Kansas, to be effective July 1, 1993.

Amendments to K.A.R. 44-6-146 involve the process for inmates to earn good time credits applicable to offenses committed prior to July 1, 1993. The regulation reconciles the process with that for offenses committed on and after July 1, 1993.

The proposed regulations are not mandated by federal law as a requirement for participating in or implementing a federally subsidized or assisted program.

The proposed regulations are not considered as establishing more costly or intrusive requirements. Consequently, less costly or intrusive methods were not a factor in the drafting of the proposed regulations.

K.A.R. 44-7-116 will have fiscal implications for the Department of Corrections but they are not expected to be substantial and cannot be quantified at this time. Because the maximum cash payment authorized is equal to the payment inmates now receive upon release, the total amount of cash payments under the regulation could not be more and probably will be less than what is now provided. K.S.A. 44-6-124 and 44-6-146 are procedural in nature and will have no fiscal impact.

Notice of Hearing on Proposed Administrative Regulations

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment will conduct a public hearing at 10 a.m., Wednesday, July 21 in the Historical Society Auditorium at 120 W. 10th, Topeka, to consider the adoption of proposed permanent regulations concerning nursing facilities.

The regulations to be considered are: proposed permanent revocation of K.A.R. 28-39-76 through 28-39-78; proposed permanent revocation of K.A.R. 28-39-82 through 28-39-113; proposed permanent adoption of K.A.R. 28-39-144 through 28-39-163.

The department is proposing to revoke all current regulations governing definitions, licensing procedure, receivership and resident rights for all adult care homes and regulations for skilled nursing facilities and intermediate care facilities. The focus of the current regulations is on the processes used to operate a nursing facility. The proposed regulations focus on the outcomes of care provided to residents. The changes should provide nursing facilities with greater flexibility in the delivery of services to the frail elderly and the physically challenged.

The economic impact of the proposed regulations will be negligible as most nursing facilities in Kansas participate in the Medicare and Medicaid programs and have made changes in their operations due to the requirements of the Nursing Home Reform Act which became effective on October 1, 1990.

In proposed regulation 28-30-2, verbiage and punctuation is corrected.

In proposed regulation 28-30-3, the Kansas Licensed Water Well contractors will be required to complete continuing education requirements prior to renewal of license. The purpose of continuing education is to help keep the Kansas Licensed Water Well contractors aware of the ever increasing advances in technology necessary to maintain a standard of proper construction, reconstruction and plugging of water wells that is protective of the human health and the environment. Continuing education will also keep the contractors updated on changes in the Kansas Department of Health and Environment Water Well Program.

Additionally, proposed regulations 28-30-3 will slightly increase the cost of renewing a Kansas Water Well Contractors License. The additional costs for each contractor to obtain the required continuing education, as proposed in the regulations, is \$50.00 per year, not including time off from work, room and board, and travel expenses to attend continuing education presentations.

Bids may be submitted by mail or may be delivered in person and must be received at the place and no later than the date and time hereinbefore specified. Each bid shall be accompanied by a good faith deposit in the form of a certified or cashier's check drawn on a bank located within the United States, shall be made payable to the order of the city, and shall be in an amount equal to 2 percent of the principal amount of the bonds.

Details of the Bonds

The bonds shall be issued as fully registered bonds in denominations of \$5,000, or any integral multiple thereof, except one bond in the denomination of \$2,000, not exceeding the principal amount of bonds maturing in any year. The bonds shall bear a dated date of July 1, 1993. The bonds shall bear interest, payable as hereinafter set forth, at the rates specified by the successful bidder for the bonds.

Interest on the bonds shall be payable semiannually on May 1 and November 1 of each year, commencing May 1, 1994, and the bonds shall mature serially on November 1 in each of the years and principal amounts as follows:

Redemption

Certain of the bonds are subject to redemption as set forth in the official notice of bond sale.

Payment of Principal and Interest

The Kansas State Treasurer shall serve as the bond registrar and paying agent for the bonds, and the principal of the bonds shall be payable upon surrender at the paying agent's principal offices in the city of Topeka, Kansas. Interest shall be paid by the mailing of a check or draft of the paying agent to the registered owners of the bonds.

Security for the Bonds

The bonds and the interest thereon shall constitute general obligations of the city, and the full faith, credit and resources of the city shall be pledged to the payment thereof. The city is obligated to levy ad valorem taxes without limitation as to rate or amount upon all of the taxable tangible property within the territorial limits of the city for the purpose of paying the bonds and the interest thereon.

Delivery of the Bonds

The bonds, duly printed, executed and registered, shall be furnished and delivered at the expense of the city to the successful bidder, or at its direction, on or before Thursday, July 15, 1993, at such bank or trust company in the State of Kansas or Kansas City, Missouri, as may be specified by the successful bidder. Delivery elsewhere shall be made at the expense of the successful bidder.

Legal Opinion

The bonds will be sold subject to the legal opinion of Bonwell, Foster, Borniger and Ellis, Wichita, Kansas, bond counsel, whose fees will be paid by the city. Bond counsel's approving legal opinion as to the validity of the bonds will be printed on the bonds and will be delivered to the successful bidder upon delivery of the bonds. (Reference is made to the official notice of bond sale for a discussion of tax exemption and other legal matters.)

Financial Matters

The equalized assessed valuation of the city for computation of bonded debt limitations for the year 1992 is \$5,575,493. The total general obligation indebtedness of the city as of the date of the bonds, including the bonds being sold, is \$607,000.

Official Statement

The city has prepared a preliminary official statement, dated as of June 16, 1993, relating to the bonds. The preliminary official statement is in a form "deemed final" by the city for the purpose of the Securities Exchange Commission's Rule 15c2-12(b)(1), but is subject to revision, amendment and completion in the final official statement. Upon the sale of the bonds, the city shall furnish the successful bidder with a reasonable number of copies of the final official statement, without

additional cost, upon request. Copies of the final official statement in excess of a reasonable number may be ordered at the successful bidder's expense.

**Notice of Hearing on Proposed
Permanent Administrative Regulations**

A public hearing will be conducted at 9:30 a.m., Friday, July 30, in the hearing room at commission offices, 3400 Van Buren, Topeka to consider the adoption of proposed permanent regulations of the Kansas racing commission. This 30-day notice constitutes a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on these proposed regulations.

A copy of the full text of the regulations and the economic impact statement may be reviewed or obtained at the commission office, 3400 Van Buren, To-

peka. The following is a summary of the proposed amendments:

K.A.R. 112-17-15 establishes a procedure for distribution of monies from the county fair horse racing benefit fund. The enabling statute for this regulation is K.S.A. 74-8838.

K.A.R. 112-9-2 and K.A.R. 112-9-30 allow wagers placed on greyhounds to be cancelled up to five seconds after wagering is terminated with prior approval from the commission. These two amendments to existing commission regulations carve out a five-second delay to allow the cancellation of erroneously issued wagering tickets after wagering is terminated.

Economic impact statement for K.A.R. 112-17-15: \$300,000 yearly, an estimated one-third of the parimutuel tax on simulcast races. The Kansas Racing Commission's estimated yearly receipts to the county fair horse racing benefit fund has been forecasted to be \$300,000 each fiscal year. The proposed regulation deals with the disbursement of monies from the fund. It is assumed that once the county fair program becomes fully implemented the yearly request for funding will exceed available funds, resulting in the year's receipts being dispensed on a yearly basis. No additional budgeting will be required by the agency. No other costs anticipated.

Economic impact statement for K.A.R. 112-9-2 and K.A.R. 112-9-30: Minimal cost. The proposed regulations will result in less than an estimated \$1,000 drop in parimutuel taxes. When parimutuel tickets are issued in error, the tax is still due on the sale. With the revised/new regulations the incorrectly issued tickets can be cancelled, thus no tax will be due. No other costs estimated.

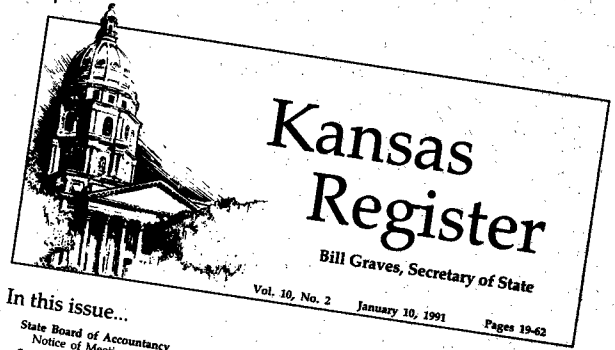
