Article 9.—PARIMUTUEL WAGERING

112-9-2. Mutuel facilities. (a) Each organization licensee shall provide:

(1) A window for each teller-cashier with a clear, legible sign, visible to the public, and showing the number of the window; and

(2) a ticket-issuing machine for each teller or teller-cashier.

(b) Each organization licensee shall use ticket-issuing machines linked to a computer-based totalisator system that:

(1) Records the progressive, the aggregate, and the final total of dollars bet in each pool and on each wagering entry or mutuel field;

(2) computes the approximate and final odds in the win pool for each wagering entry in each race in intervals not greater than 90 seconds or at such other lesser intervals, and relays those odds to the infield display board, and if applicable, to other display devices;

(3) computes commissions, breaks and components thereof; and

(4) computes the pay-off prices.

(c) For the purpose of confirming the final record of parimutuel sales for each race, each organization licensee shall for win, place, show and feature pools:

(1) Either obtain a ticket-issuing machine take-off and teller history, or store on magnetic media the following information for each ticket-issuing machine:

(A) Each bet sold on each wagering entry or combination of entries; and

(B) the total number of bets sold on each entry and combination of entries and their dollar equivalent, by each individual ticket-issuing machine and in total; and

(2) produce upon request by the commission or its designated representatives a computer print-out that shows the information required in subparagraph (B).

(d) Each organization licensee shall provide an alternate system of electrical supply to provide sufficient power to operate the central processing unit or the unit that accepts or stores wagering data.

(e) Each organization licensee shall provide, for the purpose of locking ticket-issuing machines at the start of each race:

(1) one device located in an approved area within the stewards' or judges' stand that:

(A) is controlled by a commission representative;

(B) logically disables all ticket-issuing machines from issuing tickets on the current race; and

(C) stops betting on a race no later than the official start of that race; and

(2) one device located in the totalisator room for use as an emergency locking device.

(f) Each ticket shall be identified by a unique computer-generated ticket number. Where non-resettable, ticket-issuing machine counters are used, each counter shall be read and recorded before the start and after the finish of wagering for each race. Where the counts are accumulated by machine, the sales accumulators shall be set to zero after the sales have been recorded and before wagering on the next race begins. 112-9-30. Closing of wagering in a race. (a) Prior to the official start of a race, the stewards or racing judges shall lock the parimutuel machines and shall close the wagering in the race, after which time no parimutuel tickets shall be sold for the race.

(b) Each organization licensee shall maintain in good order an electrical or other system approved by the commission for locking the parimutuel machines.

(c) It shall be the secondary responsibility of the mutuel manager to ensure that wagering is terminated.

(d) With prior approval from the commission, wagers placed on greyhounds only may be canceled for a period of time not to exceed five seconds after wagering is terminated. Article 31.—ALCOHOL AND DRUG ABUSE TREATMENT PROGRAMS

30-31-7. Administration. (a) Legal responsibility. The governing authority shall have solely legal responsibility for the overall conduct of the program.

(b) Operations manual. Each licensee shall develop and maintain a manual of its operating procedures. The manual shall comply with requirements designated in the standards adopted by the secretary. If the licensee's admission policies, as set out in the manual, restrict services to any individuals abusing alcohol, drugs, or both, on the basis of such factors as diagnosis or gender, the manual shall include formal referral agreements and specific procedures for referring those individuals to appropriate programs.

(c) Treatment records. Each licensee shall maintain, on an individual basis, adequate treatment records for each individual being admitted to the program. The records shall comply with requirements as described in the standards as adopted by the secretary.

(d) Departmental records. Each licensee shall furnish such data, statistics, schedules and other information as the secretary may require.

(e) Staff files. Each licensee shall maintain, on an individual basis, adequate records for each counselor and staff member employed. The records shall document counselor and other staff requirements as described in the standards adopted by the secretary.

(f) counselor requirements. Each licensee shall document that each counselor has attained at least 60 clock hours of continuing education activities, as described in the standards adopted by the secretary, for the two-year period beginning January 1, 1993 and for each succeeding two-year period. Article 6.—FIREWORKS

22-6-18. Public exhibitions; permits and written permissions. (a) No person shall operate a public fireworks display utilizing any Class B explosive without first obtaining a public display operators permit and obtaining written permission from the fire chief, the mayor of a city where no fire department exists, or the sheriff.

(b) A public display operators permit will be granted to operators who demonstrate knowledge and proficiency of the laws, regulations and safety practices regarding discharge of fireworks by scoring at least 80% on the State Fire Marshal's Public Display Operators Test. The test may be administered by the State Fire Marshal or by the local fire chief. Any fire chief administering such test shall send the test to the State Fire Marshal within one week for grading and issuance of the permit. Article 3.—APPOINTED ATTORNEYS

105-3-2. Eligibility to serve. (a) Each licensed attorney engaged in private practice of law shall be eligible to serve on the panel if the following criteria are met:

(1) After January 1, 1992, each attorney on the voluntary panel representing an indigent defendant shall have completed 12 hours of continuing legal education in the area of criminal law or have graduated from an accredited law school during the three years immediately preceding appointment.

(2) Each attorney assigned to the defense of class B or C felonies or felonies classified as non-drug grid offenses with a severity level of 3 or 4, or felonies classified as drug grid offenses with severity levels of 1, 2 or 3 shall have tried to verdict five or more prior felony jury trials, either as defense counsel or prosecutor.

(3) Each attorney assigned to the defense of any class A felony or felony which is classified as an off-grid offense or a non-drug grid offense with a severity level of 1 or 2 shall have tried to verdict five or more jury trials of class A, B or C felonies or have tried to verdict 5 or more jury trials involving non-drug offenses of severity levels 1 through 4 or drug grid offenses of severity levels 1 through 3 as well as any

off-grid offenses, either as defense counsel or prosecutor.

(4) Effective August 1, 1993, each attorney on the voluntary panel shall have completed at least 2 hours of continuing legal education in the area of sentencing guidelines.

(b) Any of the above conditions may be waived by the judge if the attorney selected by the judge has sufficient training and experience to undertake the case in question. Article 5.—ATTORNEY COMPENSATION

105-5-2. Rates of compensation. Each appointed and assigned counsel shall be compensated at the rate of \$50 per hour for time spent in preparing cases for trial or appeal and shall be compensated at the rate of \$50 per hour for in-court presentation. This regulation shall take effect on and after July 1, 1993. (Authorized by K.S.A. 22-4507 and 22-4522; implementing K.S.A. 22-4507; effective May 1, 1984; amended May 1, 1988; amended, T-105-6-13-88, July 1, 1988; amended Oct. 31, 1988; amended July 1, 1993; amended, T-105-6-15-93, July 1, 1993.)

105-5-6. Reasonable compensation; non-tried cases. (a) Each appointed and assigned attorney shall be compensated for time expended in representing indigent defendants and other indigent persons at the hourly rate prescribed in K.A.R. 105-5-2. Except as provided in K.A.R. 105-5-8, reasonable compensation shall not exceed 1,000 in the following cases:

(1) Those felony cases in the trial court that are classified as non-drug offenses of severity level 1 through 5 that are not submitted to a judge or jury, including services at a preliminary hearing and sentencing, if applicable; and

(2) those felony cases in the trial court that are classified as drug offenses that have not been submitted to a judge or jury and in which there have been six hours or more spent in court in defense of the indigent defendant, including services at a preliminary hearing and sentencing, if applicable.

(b) Except as provided in K.A.R. 105-5-8 and K.A.R. 105-5-6(a), reasonable compensation shall not exceed \$750 in the following cases:

(1) Those felony cases in the trial court that are not submitted to a judge or jury, including services at a preliminary hearing and sentencing, if applicable, and are classified as severity level 6 through 10 non-drug offenses; and

(2) those felony cases in the trial court that are not submitted to a judge or jury and are classified as drug offenses and in which there have been less than six hours spent in court in defense of the indigent defendant, including services at a preliminary hearing and sentencing, if applicable.

(c) Except as provided in K.A.R. 105-5-8, K.A.R. 105-5-6(a) and K.A.R. 105-5-6(b), reasonable compensation shall not exceed \$400 in the following types of cases:

(1) Habeas corpus cases as authorized by K.S.A. 22-4506;

(2) cases filed pursuant to K.S.A. 60-1507 and K.S.A. 22-4506;

(3) habeas corpus cases as authorized by K.S.A. 22-2710;

(4) habeas corpus cases as authorized by K.S.A. 1992 Supp. 22-3428 and K.S.A. 1992 Supp. 22-3428a; and

(5) habeas corpus cases as authorized by K.S.A. 1992 Supp. 59-2917.

(d) Except as provided in K.A.R. 105-5-8, reasonable compensation shall not exceed \$200 in the following types of cases:

(1) Representation of grand jury witnesses determined to be indigent and called to testify pursuant to K.S.A. 22-3009;

(2) representation of indigent persons committed to custody as material witnesses pursuant to K.S.A. 22-2805;

(3) probation revocation hearings; and

(4) motions to modify sentence pursuant to K.S.A. 1992 Supp. 21-4603.

(3) Reasonable compensation shall not exceed \$150 on any casework involving appeal of retroactivity determination pursuant to the sentencing guidelines act (1992). This regulation shall take effect on and after July 1, 1993. 105-5-7. Reasonable compensation; tried cases. Each appointed and assigned attorney shall be compensated for time expended in representing indigent defendants at the hourly rate prescribed in K.A.R. 105-5-2. Except as provided in K.A.R. 105-5-8, reasonable compensation for felony cases tried on pleas of not guilty and submitted to a judge or jury for adjudication, including compensation for services at the preliminary hearing, sentencing and motions to modify the sentence, shall not exceed \$1,500 for felonies classified as non-drug offenses of severity levels 5 through 10, \$2,000 for felonies classified as non-drug offenses of severity level 4 and felonies classified as drug offenses of severity levels 2 through 4, and \$5,000 for felonies classified as non-drug offenses of severity levels 1 through 3 and felonies classified as drug offenses of severity level 1. This regulation shall take effect on and after July 1, 1993. 105-5-8. Compensation; exceptional cases. (a) Any compensation for attorneys' services in excess of the

amounts set out in K.A.R. 105-5-6 and K.A.R. 105-5-7 may be approved only in exceptional cases. An exceptional case means:

(1) Any case involving a felony charge in the trial court which does not appear on the sentencing range grid; or

(2) any felony case tried on a not guilty plea in which there have been 25 or more hours spent in court in defense of the indigent defendant; or

(3) any felony case not submitted to a judge or jury in which there have been 10 hours or more of in-court time spent in defense of the indigent defendant; or

(4) any case that has been declared an exceptional case by the court due to its complexity or other significant characteristics. A finding by the court that a case is exceptional shall be subject to final approval by the board.

(b) Each claim for compensation in an exceptional case shall be accompanied by a specific finding in a court order setting forth the basis for the declaration that the case is exceptional.

(c) Reasonable compensation for attorneys' services in exceptional cases shall not exceed \$5,000 per case. However, additional compensation may be approved by the board if warranted by the extreme complexity of the case. This regulation shall take effect on and after July 1, 1993. Notice of Hearing on Proposed Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted at 9 a.m., Tuesday, July 27, in the SRS Staff Development Conference Room, 300 S.W. Oakley, Topeka, to consider the adoption of proposed changes in existing rules and regulations on a permanent basis. This 30-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the Secretary of Health and Environment, Landon State Office Building, Room 901, 900 S.W. Jackson, Topeka 66612. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulations during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request each participant to limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

These regulations are scheduled to become effective September 20, 1993. A summary of the proposed regulations and their economic impact follows.

Article 36.—FOOD VENDING MACHINES AND FOOD VENDING MACHINE COMPANIES AND LODGING ESTABLISHMENTS—APPLICATION AND LICENSE FEES

28-36-30. Fees. The 1993 Kansas Legislature passed HB 2118 increasing the food service establishment license fee limit from \$40 to \$100. The amendment increasing the license fee from \$40 to \$70 is in response to HB 2118 authorizing the Secretary of Health and Environment to establish license fees. The fees are to defray the cost of administering the food service establishment inspection and licensure activities.

ECONOMIC IMPACT: This increase in license fees will generate approximately \$360,000. Amendment of K.A.R. 28-36-30 is expected to increase total food service establishment license fee revenues from \$660,000 to \$1,020,000. Contributions to the SGF are expected to increase from \$435,000 to \$673,000 annually. Local health departments contracting with the Secretary to provide inspection services can expect an increase from \$225,000 to \$347,000.

Article 8.—BOARD ELECTION

80-8-1. Definitions. (a) "Board" means the board of trustees of the Kansas public employees retirement system (KPERS).

(b) "Executive Secretary" means the executive secretary of the Kansas public employees retirement system (KPERS).

(c) "Member" means an active or retired member of the system.

(d) "System" means the Kansas public employees retirement system (KPERS), the Kansas police and firemen's retirement system, and the retirement system for judges. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1991 Supp. 74-4909, as amended by L. 1992, ch. 218, sec. 6; implementing K.S.A. 74-4905, as amended by L. 1992, ch. 218, sec. 1; effective, T-80-1-22-93, Jan. 22, 1993; effective Aug. 9, 1993.)

80-8-2. Nominations. Any member who desires to be a candidate for election to the board may have the member's name placed on the ballot by submitting a petition to the board which meets the following conditions.

(a) Each petition shall be accompanied by the signatures of at least 50 members of the system who desire to have the petitioner's name on the ballot. Each signature shall include the signor's social security number. The signature of each active member shall include the name of the member's current employer. The signature of each retired member shall include the name of the signor's employer at the time of retirement. The petition shall be in a form provided by the system.

(b) Each petition shall be submitted together with the petitioner's resume of qualifications. The resume shall be limited to 150 words and contain only biographical data. The petitioner's views on issues and other election comments shall not be permitted. The resume shall be in a form provided by the board.

(c) The executive secretary shall verify each petitioner's membership in the system and the signature and membership of at least 50 of the signors of each petition.

(d) The notice to submit petitions shall be published in the system's newsletter, KPERS PAPERS, shall announce the forthcoming election, and shall contain such other information as the executive secretary may deem appropriate.

(e) Each petition shall be received in the system's office on or before March 15 at 5:00 p.m. and shall be verified only for the following election announced in KPERS PAPERS.

(f) When there is only one nomination for a vacancy, the candidate shall be declared to be elected to the board at the April meeting.

(g) System employees shall not be nominated and shall not stand for election to the KPERS board of trustees.

(h) School members may only nominate and vote for school members. Non-school members may only nominate and vote for non-school members. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1991 Supp. 74-4909, as amended by L. 1992, ch. 218, sec. 6; implementing K.S.A. 74-4905, as amended by L. 1992, ch. 218, sec. 1; effective, T-80-1-22-93, Jan. 22, 1993; effective Aug. 9, 1993.)

80-8-3. Ballot. (a) Contents.

(1) Ballots shall be prepared by the executive secretary and shall:

(A) List in alphabetical sequence the names of the candidates; and

(B) contain a resume of not more than 150 words of the qualifications of each candidate.

(2) Separate ballots shall be prepared for the school board positions and non-school board positions, if necessary.

(b) Distribution.

(1) A ballot shall be distributed to each member, together with a postage guaranteed return envelope, in April of the calendar year in which the term of an elected trustee expires. Active member ballots shall be distributed through the employers' designated agents. Retired member ballots shall be distributed by mail.

(2) The system shall maintain a listing of the names and social security numbers of each member to whom a ballot was sent.

(c) Return.

(1) Each member shall have 15 days from the date of the distribution of the ballot to return the member's ballot. The postmark date on the return envelope shall determine whether the ballot has been returned within the prescribed period. The system shall date stamp all envelopes which are hand delivered, not post-marked or received by the system after the last day for the return of ballots.

(2) All ballots received after the time prescribed for the return of ballots shall be kept separately for inspection and disposition by the election committee.

(3) The system shall keep a daily record of the number of ballots received.

(d) Tallying.

(1) The system may tally the number of ballots no earlier than four days after the last day for the return of ballots by mail.

(2) Votes shall not be counted for write-in candidates. Ballots where the number of votes exceeds the number of positions available shall not be counted. No ballot containing an erasure shall be counted. Ballots are to be marked pursuant to the instructions con-

tained on the ballot or as provided by the system. The election committee shall be the sole judge as to the validity of any questionable ballot.

(3) All ballots which have been tallied shall be held by the system for a period of at least 30 days following the day when the last successful candidate takes office.

(4) A recount of an election may be ordered by the board when the election plurality of the winning candidate over the candidate with the next highest number of votes is less than one percent of the total number of votes cast for all candidates contesting for the vacancy.

(5) Any candidate may request a recount, providing such candidate pays the total cost of the recount in advance. The executive secretary shall appoint an election committee of three members who shall supervise the opening and tallying of ballots and shall, upon completion of the tally, certify to the board the results of the election. Upon receipt of the certified results of the election from the election committee, the board shall declare as elected the person receiving the highest number of votes for each vacancy. 80-8-6. Time computation. In computing any period of time, the day of the act, event or default after which the designated period of time begins to run shall not be included. The last day of the period shall be included unless it is a Saturday, Sunday or holiday, in which case the last day shall be the next day following the Saturday, Sunday or holiday. The historic inflation factor will be based on the Data Resources, Inc. Skilled Nursing Facility Market Basket Index (DRI Index) and will be applied from the midpoint of the cost report period to the most currently available DRI Index. The estimated inflation factor will be based on the DRI Index. The estimated inflation factor will begin where the historic inflation factor ends and will be applied to the midpoint of the payment limitation period (December 31, 1993).

The rates for providers filing historic cost reports for reporting periods ending after December 31, 1992, will be subject to the July 1, 1993, upper payment limits. The historic inflation factor will be applied from the midpoint of the cost report period to the end of the cost report period. The estimated inflation factor will be applied from the end of the cost report period to the midpoint of the payment limitation period.

The cost information for each provider shall be compared with other providers that are similar in size, scope of service and other relevant factors to determine the allowable per diem cost. Percentiles will be calculated on total resident days. Previously, percentiles were based on the total number of facilities.

The expected estimated annual aggregate increase in expenditures is \$22 million.

The agency is changing its methods and standards to ensure that payment rates are reasonable and adequate to meet the costs that must be incurred by efficiently and economically operated providers to provide services in conformity with applicable state and federal laws, regulations and quality and safety standards.

Automobiles and Other Vehicles—Publicly Owned Motor Vehicles—Private Use of Publicly Owned Vehicles. William L. Frost, Manhattan City Attorney, Manhattan, June 7, 1993.

As a general rule, publicly owned vehicles may not be used for private purposes. However, city employees whose job responsibilities require them to be available 24 hours a day are not in violation of K.S.A. 8-301 *et seq.* when they use a city owned vehicle for personal uses (which are described in this opinion) because these uses are merely incidental to the primary purpose of the city which is to keep these employees accessible and responsive to city demands around the clock. 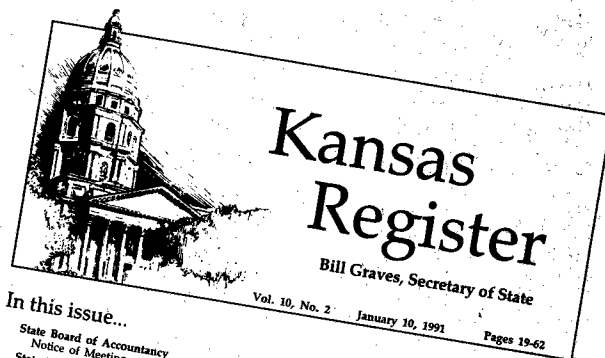
