Administrative Regulations**

A public hearing will be conducted at 9 a.m. Tuesday, September 7, in the SRS Staff Development Conference Room, 300 S.W. Oakley, Topeka, to consider the adoption of proposed changes in existing rules and regulations on a temporary and a permanent basis.

This 30-day notice of public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the Secretary of Social and Rehabilitation Services, Room 603-N, Docking State Office Building, 915 S.W. Harrison, Topeka 66612. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the proposed regulations during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request each participant to limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

The temporary regulations are scheduled to become effective upon approval by the State Rules and Regulations Board. The permanent regulations are scheduled to become effective 45 days after publication in the Kansas Register. A summary of the proposed regulations and their economic impact follows.

Temporary and Permanent Regulations**Article 4.—PUBLIC ASSISTANCE PROGRAM**

30-4-85a. Eligibility factors specific to the EA program. This regulation is being amended to clarify an

emergency situation is limited to abuse, neglect, or abandonment of children, or situations resulting in imminent risk of loss of custody or institutionalization of children. Specific reference to disasters and homelessness are removed but such assistance may be given if an emergency situation, as defined above, is met.

Economic Impact: This change is not expected to have any discernible economic impact on the EA program. It may result in lower expenditures related to rent payments related to evictions and utility shut-off when there is not an imminent risk of loss of custody or institutionalization of a child.

30-4-122a. Special allowances for EA. This regulation is being amended to limit emergency shelter to those emergency situations where such payment is necessary to assure the safety of the children.

Economic Impact: This change is not expected to have any discernible economic impact on the EA program. It may result in lower shelter expenditures when the safety of the children is not a factor.

Request for Proposals

Rehabilitation Services is seeking proposals for development of community based supported employment programs. The individuals to be served by these proposals must be Rehabilitation Services clients with a diagnosis of severe and persistent mental illness or severely emotionally disturbed adolescents who are of an employable age and transitioning into permanent employment. The services proposed must increase community integration and economic independence for the individuals served.

The total amount of grant funds to be awarded is \$938,967. Individual grant awards are expected to be between \$50,000 and \$125,000. The total number of awards will depend on the projects submitted and selected. These grants are the result of collaborative efforts between Rehabilitation Services and Mental Health and Retardation Services.

The application deadline is 5 p.m. August 30. For more information or to receive an application packet, contact Carolyn Bayless at (913) 296-3911 or (913) 296-7029 TDD.

Rehabilitation Services is also seeking proposals for consultation and training services for agencies which will be developing or expanding supported employment programs for individuals with severe and persistent mental illness. The consultation/training must address state-of-the-art techniques for developing programs with outcomes of integrated community employment.

A total of \$20,000 to \$60,000 is expected to be available for a maximum of two proposals. These grants are the result of collaborative efforts between Rehabilitation Services and Mental Health and Retardation Services.

Schools—School District Finance and Quality Performance—Local Option Budget; Authorization to Adopt; Conditions; Limitations; Additional Resolutions. Representative Robert H. Miller, Speaker of the House, Wellington, July 23, 1993.

The board of education for a unified school district which has submitted to the electors of the district a resolution authorizing adoption of a local option budget is not required to wait nine months from the date of publication of the resolution before it may adopt a second resolution authorizing adoption of a local option budget. In Board of Tax Appeals proceedings conducted in accordance with the Kansas administrative procedures act, artificial parties such as counties and corporations may participate through a duly authorized representative such as the county appraiser or a corporate officer unless and until the board requires artificial parties to participate by counsel. While a duly authorized representative may participate in the proceedings, a non-attorney representative may not engage in the unauthorized practice of law and therefore may not examine witnesses, file pleadings, make legal arguments, or perform other functions deemed to be the practice of law. Individual taxpayers may participate in person or through an attorney authorized to practice law in this state, but may not be otherwise represented, as such would constitute the unauthorized practice of law. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity at the hearing to orally express their views in regards to the adoption of the proposed permanent regulation. Following the hearing, all oral and written comments submitted by interested parties will be considered by the director as a basis for making any change to the proposed regulation.

Following is a brief summary of the proposed regulation:

K.A.R. 51-9-7.—Fees for Medical and Hospital Services—The proposed change to this regulation has occurred because of the language contained within K.S.A. 44-510, which mandates the director of Workers Compensation to adopt rules and regulations for the establishment of a medical fee schedule. Accordingly, the medical fee schedule hereby being proposed is being adopted by reference and contains changes deemed appropriate by the Workers Compensation director and which is the result of a public hearing that was held on June 8, 1993 for the adoption of this permanent regulation.

Economic Impact Statement

The change in this regulation is to adopt by reference a medical fee schedule which establishes the maximum amount that can be charged for medical and hospital services. The fiscal impact to the division by passage of this proposed regulation is already being recognized in accordance with the current operating budget. There will be a definite fiscal impact on the health care provider, hospital or other entity providing the health care services because of the establishment of the maximum amount that can be charged for the health care services.

A public hearing will be conducted at 1:30 p.m. Thursday, September 9, in the first floor hearing room, State Corporation Commission Building, 1500 S.W. Arrowhead, Topeka, to consider the adoption of proposed changes to K.A.R. 28-19-7, an existing regulation, and the adoption of K.A.R. 28-19-202 and K.A.R. 28-19-210, proposed new regulations of the Department of Health and Environment, Division of Environment, Bureau of Air and Radiation.

The regulations are proposed for adoption on a permanent basis. A summary of the proposed regulations and their economic impact follows. The summary of the existing regulation addresses only the substantial changes. The remaining proposed changes are intended only for the purpose of clarifying requirements that are now in effect.

K.A.R. 28-19-17. Definitions. Proposed revisions to K.A.R. 28-19-7 define and clarify a number of terms used in new regulations K.A.R. 28-19-202 and K.A.R. 28-19-210. Notable among these are the addition of a definition of the term "hazardous air pollutant" to include the extensive list of air pollutants required to be regulated under Title III of the Federal Clean Air Act. Other definitions have been added to clarify existing terms or to introduce terms otherwise defined in the Federal Clean Air Act.

There is no economic impact anticipated from the proposed amendments to K.A.R. 28-19-7 upon the affected regulated community, government agencies, or the general public.

K.A.R. 28-19-202. Annual emissions fee. New regulation K.A.R. 28-19-202 sets forth the administrative procedures for implementing the state fee program required by Title V of the federal clean air act. The federal act requires that states collect a fee from regulated sources equivalent to \$25 per ton of each regulated pollutant unless the state permitting authority can demonstrate that the program can be effectively implemented with revenues that correspond to a lesser fee. New regulation K.A.R. 28-19-202 proposes an annual fee of \$18 per ton based upon actual emissions of specified levels of selected pollutants. The \$18 per ton fee proposed is below the presumptive federal norm and will require a state demonstration of adequacy at the time of submittal of the Kansas permit program for approval by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. The KDHE's analysis of the resources needed to implement this new program estimates that the revenues generated will be adequate.

New regulation K.A.R. 28-19-202 will have significant economic impact upon the 250-300 major air pollution sources required to pay air emission fees. This impact will vary with each specific facility depending directly upon the quantity of air emissions from the facility subject to the \$18 per ton fee. New regulation

K.A.R. 28-19-202 is not expected to have significant impact upon government agencies except to the extent that they may be required to pay fees as major air sources or are the recipient of air fee-derived revenues as participants in the Kansas air program. Currently, the KDHE maintains agreements with local agencies in Wyandotte, Shawnee, Sedgwick and Johnson counties for assistance in implementing the state air program within these jurisdictions. Some of these local activities are related to the Title V Clean Air Act requirements and a proportional part of the fee revenues generated by new regulation K.A.R. 28-19-202 will be dispersed to participating local agencies. This new regulation will have economic impact upon the general public only to the extent that the fees paid by affected facilities are passed through to their service or product customers.

K.A.R. 28-19-210. Calculation of actual emissions. New regulation K.A.R. 28-19-210 clarifies the technical procedures required to be used to calculate actual emissions when emissions levels must be determined for such purposes as fee assessment and emission inventories. This regulation provides for several alternative emission calculation methods depending upon the type of source involved.

Significant economic impact upon the regulated community, government agencies, or the general public is not expected from the implementation of new regulation K.A.R. 28-19-210.

The time period between the publication of this notice and the scheduled hearing constitutes a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed changes to the existing regulation and the proposed new regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to Chuck Layman, Bureau of Air and Radiation, Building 740, Forbes Field, Topeka 66620. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the proposed changes to the regulations and adoption of the proposed new regulations during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to require each participant to limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

Article 3.—SOLICITING AND ADVERTISING

116-3-1. Definitions. "Non-fair event" means an event held during times other than the dates of the Kansas state fair in which a contract, lease or agreement is entered into permitting the use of all or a portion of the state fairgrounds for uses and with conditions agreed upon by both parties. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-523; effective Sept. 20, 1993.)

116-3-2. Soliciting and advertising. All persons, groups or firms that desire to sell, exhibit or distribute materials during the annual state fair or any non-fair event shall do so only from a fixed location on the fairgrounds as authorized by lease or agreement with the Kansas state fair.

(a) The sale, posting or distribution of any merchandise, products, promotional items, or printed or written material, except as authorized by contract or agreement with the Kansas State Fair shall be prohibited. Authorized merchandise, products, promotional items and printed or written materials may be offered to any state fair patron, employee, guest or visitor from the fixed location.

(b) The operation or parking of any sound trucks, or vehicles upon which any advertising signs, political or otherwise, have been affixed in any manner shall be prohibited inside and outside of the fenced-off areas of the state fairgrounds. Nothing in this rule shall be construed as applicable to lettered service trucks advertising a firm or its products while making necessary deliveries of merchandise or service to concessionaires, commercial or institutional exhibitors on the state fairgrounds, or the normal advertising on bumpers and windows of motor vehicles. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-523; effective Sept. 20, 1993.)

Article 11.—INVESTMENT SECURITIES

17-11-21. Appraisalment. (a) An accurate appraisal of all real estate mortgaged securing principal debt in excess of \$15,000, but less than \$100,000, to a bank or trust company, shall be made by two officers or directors of the bank or trust company or by an appraiser who is independent of the bank. The individual or individuals who conduct the appraisal shall view the premises and make a written statement of value and sign and file the same with the bank or trust company. The land and the improvements shall be appraised separately.

(b) An accurate appraisal of all real estate mortgaged securing principal debt of \$100,000 or more to a bank or trust company, shall be made by an appraiser licensed or certified by the state in which the property is located, and who is independent of the transaction. The appraiser shall view the premises, make a written statement of value and sign and file the same with the bank or trust company. The land and improvements shall be appraised separately. (Authorized by K.S.A. 9-1713; implementing K.S.A. 9-1101; effective Jan. 1, 1966; amended May 1, 1978; amended Jan. 27, 1992; amended Oct. 19, 1992; amended Jan. 25, 1993; amended Sept. 20, 1993.)

Article 35.—RADIATION

K.A.R. 28-35-135. Definitions. Many of the changes are definitions needed to respond to the new language in the x-ray machine standards and the regulations relating to accelerators. In addition, a large number of changes were made necessary due to the adoption of new oil well logging regulations.

K.A.R. 28-35-143. Appendix A; transport grouping of radionuclides. Revoked. This was a transportation grouping which is no longer used in the United States.

K.A.R. 28-35-180a. General requirements for the issuance of specific licenses. This adds language to remain compatible with the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) related to decommissioning funding and surety arrangements as well as bankruptcy notifications.

K.A.R. 28-35-211b. General provisions. Revoked. This regulation contained language which defined terms in the U.S. NRC regulations of 1984 in a different manner so they could be used in Kansas. The NRC regulations are no longer in effect and the Kansas regulations no longer refer to them in this section.

K.A.R. 28-35-212a. Permissible doses. This regulation is amended to show the permissible doses to occupationally exposed persons. To remain compatible with NRC regulations.

K.A.R. 28-35-212b. Exposure of individuals to concentrations of radioactive material in air in controlled areas. New regulation. To remain compatible with NRC regulations.

K.A.R. 28-35-213a. Exposure of minors. This regulation is amended to show permissible doses to minors. To remain compatible with NRC regulations.

K.A.R. 28-35-214a. Permissible levels of radiation from external sources in uncontrolled areas. This regulation amended to remain compatible with NRC regulations.

K.A.R. 28-35-215a. Concentration of radioactivity in effluents to uncontrolled areas. This regulation amended to remain compatible with NRC regulations.

K.A.R. 28-35-217a. Personnel monitoring. This regulation amended to establish by whom and how personnel monitoring will be used. This was done to remain compatible with NRC regulations.

K.A.R. 28-35-218a. Bioassays. Requires procedures for bioassay. This regulation amended to remain compatible with NRC regulations.

K.A.R. 28-35-219a. Caution signs and labels. Establishes the content and use of caution signs and labels. This regulation amended to remain compatible with NRC regulations.

K.A.R. 28-35-220a. Exceptions from posting and labeling requirements. This regulation amended to remain compatible with NRC regulations.

K.A.R. 28-35-221a. Procedures for picking up, receiving and opening packages. This regulation amended to remain compatible with NRC regulations.

K.A.R. 28-35-221b. Appendix A; determination of A₁ and A₂. New regulation. This describes current listing of Type A₁ or A₂ radionuclides.
