The purpose of the meeting will be to solicit public comments regarding proposed amendments to the 1993 CDBG final statement to enable the program to utilize grant funds as collateral for economic development project loan guarantees; to strengthen the state's position to receive program income; to correct the distribution of grant funds by eliminating planning and entrepreneurial grant categories for the 1993 fiscal year; and to change urgent need awards from a first-come basis to a priority need basis.

Article 1.—EXAMINATION AND REGISTRATION

86-1-5. Fees. (a) Each applicant shall pay a fee in an amount equal to the actual cost of the examination and the administration thereof to the testing service designated by the commission.

(b) The following fees for licensure shall be submitted to the commission:

(1) For submission of an application for an original salesperson's or broker's license, a fee of \$15;

(2) For an original salesperson's license, an amount, based on an annual amount of \$30, prorated to the nearest whole month for the period of time from date of licensure until the expiration date determined by the schedule contained in K.A.R. 86-1-3;

(3) For an original broker's license, an amount, based on an annual amount of \$50, prorated to the nearest whole month for the period of time from date of licensure until the expiration date determined by the schedule contained in K.A.R. 86-1-3;

(4) For renewal of a salesperson's license, an amount, based on an annual amount of \$30;

(5) For renewal of a broker's license, an amount, based on an annual amount of \$50;

(6) For reinstatement of a license which has been deactivated or which has been canceled pursuant to K.S.A. 58-3047(d), and amendments thereto, or by reason of termination of a salesperson or associate broker, a fee of \$15;

(7) For reinstatement of all licenses canceled pursuant to K.S.A. 58-3047(e), and amendments thereto, an amount of \$7.50 for each license canceled;

(8) For issuance of a duplicate license, a fee of \$10; and

(9) For certification of licensure to another jurisdiction, a fee of \$10.

(c) The following fees related to courses of instruction shall be submitted to the commission:

(1) For approval of a course of instruction submitted by a course provider pursuant to K.S.A. 58-3046a, and amendments thereto, a fee of \$50;

(2) For renewal of an approved course of instruction pursuant to K.S.A. 58-3046a, and amendments thereto, a fee of \$15; and

(3) For approval of a course of instruction submitted by any licensee pursuant to subsection (j) of K.S.A. 58-3046a, and amendments thereto, a fee of \$10. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-4202(b); implementing K.S.A. 1992 Supp. 58-3063, as amended by L. 1993, Chap. 241, Sec. 7; and K.S.A. 1992 Supp. 58-3045(b); effective Jan. 1, 1966; amended, E-73-30, Sept. 28, 1973; amended Jan. 1, 1974; amended, E-74-50, Sept. 13, 1974; amended May 1, 1975; amended, E-81-18, July 16, 1980; amended May 1, 1981; amended May 1, 1982; amended May 1, 1983; amended, T-86-10, May 1, 1985; amended May 1, 1986; amended, T-87-32, Nov. 19, 1986; amended May 1, 1987; amended Sept. 26, 1988; amended July 31, 1991; amended Dec. 20, 1993.)

86-1-11. Minimum curricula and standards for course. (a) Each school offering a course approved by the commission under subsection (a) of K.S.A. 58-3046a, and amendments thereto, shall use a course syllabus provided by the commission and shall register such course under the title "Principles of Real Estate."

(b) Each school offering a course approved by the commission under subsection (b) of K.S.A. 58-3046a, and amendments thereto, shall use a course syllabus provided by the commission and shall register the course under the title "Broker Pre-License Course."

(c) The 12 hours of additional instruction required by subsections (c), paragraph (d)(2) and paragraph (e)(2) of K.S.A. 58-3046a, and amendments thereto, shall consist of courses approved by the commission.

(1) The hours required for each license renewal after January 1, 1996 shall consist of at least three hours designated as mandatory core hours and no more than nine hours designated as elective hours.

(2) On and after January 1, 1994, each course approved by the commission shall be designated, at the discretion of the commission, as either meeting the mandatory core requirement or as being elective hours. Courses meeting the mandatory core requirement shall utilize a course syllabus on Kansas law relating to agency relationships and obligations approved by the commission.

(3) Credit given to any licensee for a course submitted by the licensee pursuant to subsection (j) of K.S.A. 58-4046a, and amendments thereto, shall be designated by the commission as either meeting the mandatory core requirement or as being elective hours.

(4) Nonresidents of Kansas may receive credit as elective hours for courses approved by the commission of their state of residence. Credit for the mandatory core requirement shall be given only for courses approved by the commission pursuant to paragraph (2) above or as provided by paragraph (3) above.

(5) Total instruction time of approved courses shall be not less than three hours.

(6) Any licensee may receive a maximum of three hours credit during any renewal period for real estate appraisal courses designated as such by the commission and taken after January 1, 1992 and prior to January 1, 1996.

(d) Instruction required by paragraph (d)(1) of K.S.A. 58-3046a, and amendments thereto, shall include 30 hours of instruction designated by the commission as required hours and 20 hours elected by the licensee from courses approved by the commission pursuant to subsection (c) of this regulation.

(e) The 30 hours of instruction designated as required hours under subsection (d) and the 30 hours of instruction required by paragraph (e)(1) of K.S.A. 58-3046a, and amendments thereto, shall consist of a course registered under the title "Salesperson's Post-License Course" and schools offering the course shall use a course syllabus provided by the commission. Article 3.—PERSONS HOLDING LICENSES; DUTIES

86-3-7. Advertising. (a) All advertising, except on property which is not listed with a broker and which is personally owned by a licensee or in which a licensee may have an interest, shall include the name of the broker by using the broker's trade or business name and such other information as the broker considers necessary. The use of only a post office box number, telephone number or street address shall be deemed a violation of K.S.A. 58-3062(a)(1).

(b) Unless property personally owned by a licensee or property in which a licensee may have an interest is listed with a broker, all advertising caused by the licensee on such property shall be done in such a manner as to clearly inform the public that a real estate broker, associate broker or salesperson is the owner of or has an interest in the property advertised.

(c) A real estate broker who enters into an agreement which authorizes the broker to utilize the name or trade name of any other person in the conduct of the broker's real estate business shall file a copy of such agreement in the public records of the commission. The term "trade name" shall include, but not be limited to, trademark, service mark or trade identification. Failure to comply with this section shall be deemed a violation of K.S.A. 58-3062(a)(1).

(d) A broker shall not advertise or promote the broker's business in a manner that would confuse, hinder or mislead the public as to the identity of the broker responsible for the debts and liabilities of the business or entity. Violation of this section shall be deemed a violation of K.S.A. 58-3062(a)(1). (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-4202(b); implementing K.S.A. 1992 Supp. 58-3062(a)(1); effective Jan. 1, 1966; amended Jan. 1, 1974; amended, E-76-18, April 29, 1975; modified, L. 1976,

86-3-22. Transaction identification. (a) Each supervising broker shall assign a transaction number to each real estate sales contract, option agreement, and lease agreement for which the broker acts as an employee of, or on behalf of, the owner, purchaser, lessor or lessee. If a separate trust account is maintained for a branch office as provided by K.S.A. 58-3061 and amendments thereto, the transaction number shall be assigned by the branch broker.

(b) Sales contracts and option agreements shall be numbered in consecutive order by contract date each calendar year with the first two digits designating the year (88-1, 88-2). Lease agreements shall be numbered in consecutive order by contract date each calendar year with the first two digits designating the year and preceded by the letter "L" (L88-1, L88-2).

(c)(1) If a broker deposits earnest money in the broker's trust account prior to contract acceptance, the broker shall assign a transaction number to the offer. The date of the deposit shall be used as the contract date for the sole purpose of assigning numbers in consecutive order pursuant to subsection (b) of this regulation. If the offer subsequently becomes a contract, the transaction number assigned to the offer shall be used throughout the transaction.

(2) The broker shall record the deposit on a ledger pursuant to K.A.R. 86-3-18(a)(5) with a notation on the ledger that the earnest money was deposited prior to contract acceptance. If the offer is rejected or withdrawn prior to contract acceptance, the broker shall return the earnest money to the prospective buyer and shall record the disbursement on the ledger sheet with a notation that the offer was rejected or withdrawn. If the offer is accepted, the broker shall note the contract acceptance date on the ledger.

(d) The transaction number shall be shown on the transaction file and shall be included on any of the following applicable records:

(1) The trust account check register to identify funds deposited or disbursed;

(2) each trust account deposit slip with the amount of the deposit related to each transaction designated;

(3) each check drawn on the trust account;

(4) each transaction ledger maintained in accordance with K.A.R. 86-3-18(a)(5); and

(5) each receipt from an escrow agent required by subsection (f) of K.S.A. 58-3062 and amendments thereto.

(e) If the broker's records are computerized, the transaction number shall be shown on any applicable computer sensitive record.

(f) A different transaction numbering system requested by a broker may be approved by the commission. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-4202(b); implementing K.S.A. 1992 Supp. 58-3061; effective, T-88-32, Jan. 1, 1988; effective May 1, 1988; amended Dec. 20, 1993.)

Article 4.—INDIVIDUAL GAME RULES

111-4-341c. Televised procedure. The following procedures shall be used to determine the "Birthday Game Show" winners: (a) The first game will feature the first three finalists selected pursuant to K.A.R. 111-4-339 who will participate in a "Birthday Card Game." In the order in which their names were drawn, each of the three will choose one of 15 oversized cards from a deck of cards. Ten of these cards will feature the lottery logo. They are the lucky cards. The others selected will be "Jokers." Each of the three finalists will draw a card in the same order their names were drawn until two of them receive two "Jokers." The two receiving two "Jokers" are eliminated from the game when they draw a second "Joker," and the finalist remaining will continue to the final game. The other two receive \$8,000 each. Prior to the start of the game, a lottery security official will "cut the deck."

(b) The second game will feature the fourth, fifth and sixth finalists selected pursuant to K.A.R. 111-4-339 who will participate in a "dice game." In the order their names were drawn each of these three finalists will have an opportunity to roll oversized dice against at least one wall of the "crap table" to see which one has the highest cumulative total number of spots after two rounds. If both dice do not hit a wall as determined by lottery security, the finalist rolling the dice will be required to roll the dice again. If the finalist fails to hit the wall with both dice after two attempts, the dice will be rolled on the finalist's behalf by lottery security. In the order their names were drawn each finalist will roll the dice once. Thereafter each finalist will roll the dice a second time. The finalist with the highest total after two rounds will continue to the final game. In the event of a tie for the highest total the tied finalists will continue to roll the dice in the order of selection in a "sudden death" roll off until one finalist rolls a higher total than the other(s). The two nonwinning finalists receive \$8,000 each.

(c) In the final game the advancing "game one" and "game two finalists" shall be assigned to a draw machine marked "1" and "2" for the "game one winner" and the "game two winner" respectively. Each draw machine will contain 10 balls with four balls marked with the letter "I," three balls marked with the letter "W" and three balls marked with the letter "N." The balls will be dropped into the ball machine by the lottery security person present. At the direction of the show host each finalist starting with the "game one winner" followed by the "game two winner" lottery security shall activate the draw machine to draw a ball and the letter on the ball drawn shall be displayed on a board above each finalist. Subsequent drawings will be conducted in the same order and in the same manner as directed by the host until one spells the words "I WIN." Both finalists will be entitled to the same number of draws. In the case of a tie, the game one finalist will be given the opportunity to select one of

two envelopes provided to the show host by the executive director. Inside the winning envelope will be a card containing the word "\$100,000." The other envelope will contain the word "\$20,000." The winner will be awarded the \$100,000 grand prize. The second place finalist will be awarded \$20,000.

(d) Finalists and studio audience partners must be at least 18 years of age to appear and participate in the "Birthday Game" show. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-22-93, Oct. 15, 1993.)

111-4-532. Definitions. The following definitions shall apply to the "Lucky Draw" instant lottery game:

(a) "Game symbols" are the numbers, letters, symbols, or pictures printed in the play area of each instant game ticket and which determine if the ticket bearer is entitled to a prize. In this instant game, the game symbols are printed in black ink in WGI Symbol Font 15 with matching captions in WGI Cap Font. A game symbol appears in each of seven play spots within the play area. Each game symbol for this instant game is one of the following: 9 - 10 - J - Q - K - A:

(b) "Game symbol captions" are the words or portions of words printed beneath each game symbol in the play area and are used to repeat or explain the game symbol. The game symbol caption associated with each game symbol is as follows:

Q	QEN
K	KNG
A	ACE

(c) "Ticket validation number" means a unique number appearing on each ticket which is used to validate winning tickets. For this instant game, the ticket validation number is a 10-digit number which appears on the front of each instant ticket and will be covered by latex.

(d) "Book-ticket number" means the unique number appearing on each ticket which includes the number of the book from which it was removed and the serially assigned number of the ticket within that book. For this instant game, the book-ticket number is an 8-digit book number followed by a dash and then a 3-digit ticket number. The ticket numbers in each book start with 000 and end with 299. The book-ticket number is printed in black ink on the bottom portion of the front of each instant game ticket.

(e) "Retailer validation code" means the small letters found under removable covering in the play area of each instant game ticket. The retailer uses this code to verify and validate winners which are to be paid by the retailer. In this instant game, the retailer validation code is a two letter code printed and appearing at two of five varying locations above the "YOUR HAND" game symbols. The codes and their meanings are as follows: CC = \$1.00; DD = \$2.00; KK = \$5.00; GG = \$15.00. The alphabetic character codes making up the retailer validation code do not constitute game symbols. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-22-93, Oct. 15, 1993.)

111-4-533. Determination of instant prize winners. An instant prize winner is determined for this instant game when the player removes or "scratches off" the removable layer of material covering the play area to reveal the seven game symbols and captions. This is a match three of seven game. If three of the seven concealed game symbols match, the player wins the amount shown. No ticket will be eligible to win more than one prize. Prizes a player may win are as follows:

A play slip has no pecuniary or prize value and shall not constitute evidence of ticket purchase, of numbers selected or prizes to be paid.

(e) A ticket may not be voided or cancelled by returning the ticket to the selling retailers, including tickets that are printed in error except as provided in K.A.R. 111-7-66a.

(f) Ticket sales will end at approximately 6:45 p.m. central time (CT) on each drawing day and resume at approximately 7:00 p.m.

(g) Drawings will be conducted daily except Sundays at approximately 6:55 p.m. central time (CT) immediately after the game is closed, under conditions and procedures promulgated by the executive director of the lottery.

(h) It shall be the sole responsibility of the player to verify the accuracy of the game plays and other data printed on the ticket. The placing of plays is done at the player's own risk through the on-line retailer who is acting on behalf of the player in entering the plays. Advisory Opinion No. 93-34

Written October 21, 1993, to Brenda J. Eddy, Executive Director, Kansas Commission for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing, Topeka.

This opinion is in response to your letter of October 8, 1993, in which you request an opinion from the Kansas Commission on Governmental Standards and Conduct concerning the state conflict of interest law (K.S.A. 46-215 *et seq.*).

Factual Statement

We understand you request this opinion in your capacity as executive director of the Kansas Commission for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing (KCDHH).

You advise us that approximately 1 1/2 years ago, you were asked to serve on the TILRC Board of Directors for the Topeka Independent Living Resource Center. This is a voluntary position with a non-profit agency which provides services and advocacy for people with disabilities.

TILRC is in the process of purchasing an office building in downtown Topeka (the Crawford Building) and plans to lease out some of the excess space to other disability-related organizations. The Crawford Building has been totally renovated to meet ADA guidelines and would be an attractive space option for KCDHH. The Kansas Commission for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing is currently looking for office space to relocate, as its current space is insufficient.

KCDHH is located for administrative purposes within the Department of Social and Rehabilitation Services (SRS), which has placed you within Kansas Rehabilitation Services (KRS). Any request for additional space must be approved through SRS and the Department of Administration.

Question

Is it a conflict of interest for you to encourage SRS to consider this space for lease by KCDHH when you serve on the TILRC board of directors? Do you need to resign your position with TILRC?

Opinion

K.S.A. 46-233 states in pertinent part:

- (a) No state officer or employee shall in the capacity as such officer or employee be substantially involved in the preparation of or participate in the making of a contract with any person or business by which such officer or employee is employed or in whose business such officer or employee or any member of such officer's or employee's immediate family has a substantial interest and no such person or business shall enter into any contract where any state officer or employee, acting in such capacity, is a signatory to, has been substantially involved in the preparation of or is a participant in the making of such con-

(continued)

tract and is employed by such person or business or such officer or employee or any member of such officer's or employee's immediate family has a substantial interest in such person or business

In addition, "substantial interest" is defined in K.S.A. 46-229(d) to include:

(d) If an individual or an individual's spouse holds the position of officer, director, associate, partner or proprietor of any business, the individual has a substantial interest in that business, irrespective of the amount of compensation received by the individual or individual's spouse.

Finally, "business" is defined in K.S.A. 46-230 as follows:

"Business" means any corporation, association, partnership, proprietorship, trust, joint venture, or a governmental agency unit, or a governmental subdivision and every other business interest, including ownership or use of land for income.

From a review of those statutes, it is our opinion under K.S.A. 46-229(d) that your service on the board of directors of TILRC dictates that you hold a "substantial interest" in that entity and that TILRC is a "business" since it is "any corporation, association, etc. . . ." Further, it is our opinion that any encouragement by you in your position of a lease which must be approved by SRS and the Department of Administration does constitute "participation in the making of a contract" under K.S.A. 46-233. Thus, it is not permissible to encourage the lease while on the board of TILRC. If you resign, since "substantial interest" in this case is defined by the statutes on the day of holding the position, and not holdings for the preceding 12 months or preceding calendar year, we believe that you could then take the actions described.

Advisory Opinion No. 93-35

Written October 21, 1993, to William G. Brundage, Ph.D., President, Kansas Technology Enterprise Corporation, Topeka.

This opinion is in response to your letter of October 14, 1993, in which you request an opinion from the Kansas Commission on Governmental Standards and Conduct concerning the state conflict of interest law (K.S.A. 46-215 *et seq.*).

Factual Statement

We understand you request this opinion in your capacity as president of the Kansas Technology Enterprise Corporation (KTEC). You advise us that you will be leaving the position, and an ongoing project requires immediate attention. A member of the board of directors of KTEC has the experience to manage the project until your position is filled.

Question

May KTEC contract with a member of the board of directors of KTEC to provide services to KTEC?

Opinion

We have reviewed K.S.A. 45-215 *et seq.* in its entirety and it is our opinion that, so long as the member of the board does not participate in any fashion in his capacity as a board member in the contract with himself as a private individual, the situation you describe is permissible.

A simple way to insure compliance with this requirement would be for him to resign the position on the board and remain off the board as long as any contract between he and the board exists. Of course, he may resume serving on the board when the contract terminates.

Advisory Opinion No. 93-36

Written October 21, 1993, to Denise Coatney, Lawrence.

This opinion is in response to your letter of September 16, 1993, in which you request an opinion from the Kansas Commission on Governmental Standards and Conduct concerning the state conflict of interest law (K.S.A. 46-215 *et seq.*).

We note at the outset that the commission's jurisdiction on your question is limited to the application of the above statute. Thus, whether some other statutory system, common law, or agency rule or policy relates to your inquiry is not covered by this opinion.

Factual Statement

We understand you request this opinion in your capacity as an employee of the Kansas State Board of Agriculture. You advise us you have been approached by a small group of people, one of whom is a former Kansas State Board of Agriculture employee, to work together to form a for-profit corporation. The corporation is in the planning stages at the present time. The intent of the group is for the corporation to act as a marketing representative for a group of renewable products. The types of products would be environmentally "friendly" products, such as degradable papers, soybean based oils and paints, etc.

Information to assist the corporation would be gathered from files maintained by the Board of Agriculture. You intend to take the files home to glean the information and advise us the information is not confidential.

You state you also intend to be on the board of directors of the corporation and perhaps receive pay from it while still an employee of the Board of Agriculture. At a later date you might terminate state employment to work full time with the corporation.

Questions

1) Is it permissible to use Board of Agriculture files which are public information to advance your own financial interest?

2) May you take the files home to copy them?

3) May you serve on the board of directors of the corporation while still a state employee?

4) May you receive compensation from the corporation while still an employee of the state?

5) May you terminate state employment and accept a full-time position with the corporation?

Opinion

K.S.A. 46-241 is the only section of the Act which applies to your first question. That section states:

No state officer or employee shall disclose or use confidential information acquired in the course of his or her official duties in order to further his or her own economic interest or those of any other person.

If, as you say, the information is public information, this section does not apply and you or anyone may use it for financial gain. We do not here rule that the information is in the public domain because we have insufficient data from you on this issue.

The Act does not deal with the second question. We find it difficult to believe that public files may be taken home and reviewed at your pleasure, but that is an issue outside our jurisdiction. We suggest you receive approval from your own agency and in addition request an opinion from the Attorney General on the appropriate use of public records.

Questions 3, 4, and 5 may all be answered in the affirmative if the state agency of which you are a part does not license, regulate, inspect or contract with the corporation. If the agency undertakes any of these actions with the corporation, we will need further information before answering these questions.

Advisory Opinion No. 93-37

Written October 21, 1993, to Carmin Ross-Murray, Director of Employee Relations, Human Resource Services, Kansas State University, Manhattan.

This opinion is in response to your letter of October 6, 1993, in which you request an opinion from the Kansas Commission on Governmental Standards and Conduct concerning the nepotism law contained in K.S.A. 46-246a.

We understand you request this opinion in your capacity as director of employee relations for the Human Resources Services at Kansas State University.

Factual Statement

You advise us that an employee at Kansas State University is working as an Acting Computer Operating Supervisor II. He was placed in this position a number of months ago and in this capacity supervises his spouse.

The advertising and recruitment process for filling the COS II position permanently will begin in mid-December, 1993. Both spouses are eligible to apply for the Permanent COS II position, and it is anticipated that they will.

You recognize that if either is selected, he or she would be in a position to affect the promotion or discipline of the spouse. You have looked into various options for permitting the COS II position to abstain from such decisions but find none feasible.

Question

Based on the factual situation, you ask whether a spouse may accept a position with the state whereby

requirements of the position, he or she must participate in promotion or discipline decisions relating to his or her spouse?

Opinion

K.S.A. 46-246a states in pertinent part:

(a) From and after the effective date of this act, no state officer or employee shall advocate or cause the employment, appointment, promotion, transfer or advancement to any office or position of the state, of a member of such officer's or employee's household or a family member.

(b) No state officer or employee shall participate in an action relating to the employment or discipline of a member of the officer's or employee's household or a family member.

As you have correctly noted, this section does not preclude a spouse from being in a position to exercise authority over a co-employee spouse. Rather, the section prohibits the exercise of that discretion in the areas of promotion, transfer, advancement and discipline. Thus, if one in a supervisory capacity could isolate himself or herself from such participation in relationship to the spouse, it might be possible to structure a situation where a spouse serves in a supervisory capacity to his or her spouse. As we understand the factual situation, the COS II cannot be isolated from participating in these decisions. Therefore, if either spouse takes the COS II position, the other must seek another position not under the supervision of his or her spouse.

Advisory Opinion No. 93-38

Written October 21, 1993, to The Honorable Rocky Nichols, State Representative, Topeka.

This opinion is in response to your letter of August 30, 1993, in which you request an opinion from the Kansas Commission on Governmental Standards and Conduct concerning the state conflict of interest law (K.S.A. 46-215 *et seq.*).

Factual Statement

We understand you request this opinion in your capacity as a state legislator. You advise us that you are contemplating introduction of legislation in the next term on issues applying to the Kansas Turnpike Authority (KTA). You are particularly concerned with gifts given by the KTA to Kansas elected officials including lifetime passes to drive on the turnpike and free trips to legislators and their spouses to exotic locations.

Questions

1) Are the board members and employees of the Kansas Turnpike Authority state officers and employees for the purpose of the application of K.S.A. 46-215 *et seq.*?

2) May you as a legislator legally receive gifts from the KTA in excess of \$40 in a calendar year?

(continued)

Opinion

K.S.A. 46-221(a) defines "state officer or employee" as follows:

"State officer or employee" means (1) any individual who is an elected or appointed state officer, (2) any individual who is in the classified service or unclassified service of the Kansas civil service act, (3) all officers and employees of the legislative branch and of the governor's office, irrespective of how compensated or period of employment, and (4) any individual who receives monthly or semimonthly compensation for services from the state or any state agency. State officer or employee does not include any justice or commissioner of the supreme court or judge of the judicial branch or employee or officer of the judicial branch or any member of a board, council or commission who is appointed by the supreme court or who is elected or appointed to exercise duties pertaining to functions of the judicial branch, when such person is engaged in performing a function or duty for the judicial branch. Also, state officer or employee does not include any appointed member of an advisory council, commission or board, who serves without compensation other than amounts for expense allowances or reimbursement of expenses as provided for in subsection (e) of K.S.A. 75-3223 and amendments thereto, when such member is engaged in performing a function or duty for such council, commission or board.

In addition, "state agency" is defined by K.S.A. 46-224(a) as follows:

"State agency" means the legislature, legislators, legislative committees and councils and all executive departments, institutions, offices, officers, commissions, boards and authorities of the state, but does not include municipalities and other political subdivisions.

It is clear under K.S.A. 46-224 that the KTA is an authority of the state and therefore meets the definition of "state agency." Thus, its employees who receive monthly or semimonthly compensation are "state officers and employees" by definition of K.S.A. 46-221(a)(4).

Since members of the board may not receive monthly compensation, whether they are "state officers or employees" depends on whether they are individuals in the "classified service or unclassified service of the Kansas Civil Service Act," as that phrase is used in K.S.A. 46-221(a)(2). Since that Act is outside our jurisdiction, we requested an opinion from the Attorney General on this issue. In Attorney General Opinion No. 93-135, the ruling states that members of the board of the KTA are in the unclassified service and therefore are "state officers or employees" for the purpose of K.S.A. 46-215 *et seq.*

In sum, the answer to your first question is that members of the board of the KTA and its employees are subject to the conflict requirements of K.S.A. 46-215 *et seq.*

Turning to your second question, K.S.A. 46-237(a) and (e) are in point. Those subsections state:

(a) No state officer or employee or candidate for state office shall accept, or agree to accept any economic opportunity, gift, loan, gratuity, special discount, favor, hospitality, or service having an aggregate value of \$40 or more in any calendar year from any one person known to have a special interest, under circumstances where such person knows or should know that a major purpose of the donor is to influence such person in the performance of their official duties or prospective official duties.

(e) Except when a particular course of official action is to be followed as a condition thereon, this section shall not apply to (1) any contribution reported in compliance with the campaign finance act; or (2) a commercially reasonable loan or other commercial transaction in the ordinary course of business.

In addition, K.S.A. 46-228 defines "special interest" to mean:

"Special interest" means an interest of any person as herein defined (1) concerning action or non-action by the legislature on any legislative matter affecting such person as distinct from affect upon the people of the state as a whole, or (2) in the action or non-action of any state agency or state officer or employee upon any matter affecting such person as a distinct from affect upon the people of the state as a whole.

Finally, "person" is defined in K.S.A. 46-223 as follows:

"Person" means an individual, proprietorship, partnership, limited partnership, association, trust, estate, business trust, group, or corporation, whether or not operated for profit, or a governmental agency unit, or subdivision.

We are satisfied that the KTA is a "person" under K.S.A. 46-223 since it is a "governmental agency unit" (see, *Flax v. Kansas Turnpike Authority*, 226 Kan. 1; *Hesterman v. Kansas Turnpike Authority*, 183 Kan. 589 and Attorney General Opinion No. 80-56). It is also clear that the KTA has a "special interest" concerning action or non-action by the legislature. Thus, the gift limitations under K.S.A. 46-237 apply when the state officer or employee "knows or should know that a major purpose of the donor is to influence" the state officer or employee in the performance of official duties.

We have no hesitation in ruling this language applies to all legislators, and none should receive free passes or expensive trips from the KTA in their capacity as legislators.

We must, however, qualify the answer in relationship to any legislator who also serves on the board of the KTA or is an employee thereof.

The above language is more difficult to apply in these situations. For example, assume the situation where a legislator is also a private businessperson and receives a substantial special discount on the purchase

of goods from another businessperson who makes similar discounts to all his customers. Assume further that the person granting the discount has several important issues pending before the legislature. In this case, since the discount was given to all customers, it would be difficult to assert that "a major purpose of the donor was to influence" the state officer or employee in his or her official duties. Rather, it seems apparent in this scenario that the purpose was to influence his decisions as a private businessperson. In fact, this interpretation has been codified in K.S.A. 46-237(e)(2).

In an analogous situation in Opinion No. 91-4, this commission, while recognizing it would be inappropriate for a state agency (WSU) to give free season basketball tickets to all legislators, held that giving the tickets to a legislator who also served on the board of

directors for WSU was not inappropriate when all members of the board received equal treatment. Consistent with this opinion, we are constrained to rule that the acceptance of passes on the turnpike and travel by legislators in their capacity as members of the board of directors is not prohibited by K.S.A. 46-237, so long as all members of the board have historically been treated equally in this manner. We take this position since we cannot then assume that a major purpose is to influence them as a legislator.

In closing, we note legislative enactment will be necessary to cure this situation. We stand ready to provide assistance in drafting appropriate language.
