**Office of the Governor****Executive Order No. 94-168****Authorizing Executive Branch Employees to Participate in Healthcheck '94**

WHEREAS, the State of Kansas Employees Health Care Commission in developing and providing for the implementation of a health benefits program has established HealthQuest, a statewide health promotion program; and

WHEREAS, one of the main components of the HealthQuest program is HealthCheck '94, a health risk appraisal program; and

WHEREAS, health risk appraisals can provide state employees with a means to understand their health status and take positive action in improving their health and fitness; and

WHEREAS, state employees are a valuable asset for the State of Kansas and the state has an interest in aiding in employee health and fitness; and

WHEREAS, HealthCheck '94 provides the opportunity to save state employees and state taxpayers money by reducing future health care costs;

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the authority vested in me as Governor of the State of Kansas, I hereby authorize paid leave under K.A.R. 1-9-9 for executive branch state employees who desire to take advantage of HealthCheck '94, provided that employees obtain approval from their supervisor concerning when the appointment time can be scheduled. I further hereby direct executive branch agencies to reimburse private car mileage pursuant to regulations for employees who travel to obtain authorized HealthCheck '94 services, as follows: mileage reimbursement of 50 miles to 200 miles round trip maximum or 25 to 100 miles one way. Mileage under 50 miles round trip will not be reimbursable for this purpose.

This document shall be filed with the Secretary of State as Executive Order No. 94-168 and shall become effective immediately.

Administrative Regulations**

Four public hearings will be conducted at the dates, times and places set forth below to consider the adoption of proposed change in one existing rule and regulation of the Division of Water Resources and the adoption of 14 new regulations:

- Monday, August 22, 5 p.m., Ramada Inn, 1400 N. Lorraine, Hutchinson
- Tuesday, August 23, 5 p.m., Garden City Community College, Science Lecture Hall, 801 Campus Drive, Garden City
- Wednesday, August 24, 5 p.m., Colby Community College, Rooms 108 and 109, 1255 S. Range, Colby
- Friday, August 26, 1 p.m., Kansas State Historical Society Auditorium, 120 W. 10th, Topeka

This 30-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed rules and regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the Chief Engineer, Division of Water Resources, Kansas State Board of Agriculture, 901 S. Kansas Ave., 2nd Floor, Topeka 66612-1283. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulations during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request each participant to limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

These new and amended regulations are proposed for adoption on a permanent basis. A summary of proposed regulations and their economic impact follows:

Proposed regulations 5-3-9 through 5-3-16 generally adopt the division's current safe yield standard for processing new applications. Proposed regulations 5-5-8 through 5-5-12 generally adopt the division's current policy concerning processing certain change applications. It is anticipated these standards will speed processing time, but will result in more applications being denied or subject to additional conditions. The fiscal impact to those applicants whose applications are denied or conditioned is unknown, but could be significant to some applicants.

**5-3-6a. Sealing or padlocking diversion works.** This amended regulation requires that whenever the chief engineer issues a cease and desist order, the diversion works shall be physically sealed or padlocked and a written notice to that effect placed on the diversion works and sent by restricted mail to the water right owner of record. This should result in a significant reduction of staff time currently used to monitor diversion works that are under cease and desist orders and provide strong evidence as to whether such diversion works have, or have not, been illegally operated. The division has been unable to quantify the costs saved from reduced monitoring. No other significant fiscal impact to

governmental entities is expected to result from this regulation.

**5-3-9. Public interest.** This new regulation sets forth additional factors which the chief engineer shall take into consideration in determining the public interest when approving new applications to appropriate water, including the amount of water necessary to satisfy senior domestic water rights from a stream and the amount of water available in hydraulically connected sources of water supply. This regulation generally implements existing policy and is not expected to result in a significant fiscal impact to governmental entities or to water users.

**5-3-10. Availability of water for appropriation - safe yield.** This new regulation adopts the existing general policy that all new applications to appropriate water outside groundwater management districts and intensive groundwater use control areas shall be processed on a safe yield basis. It further allows a procedure for the chief engineer to set a limit of the amount of water available for appropriation for any stream, stream reach, aquifer or other hydrologic unit. This regulation is not expected to result in a significant fiscal impact to governmental entities or to water users.

**5-3-11. Availability of water for appropriation from unconfined groundwater aquifers.** This new regulation sets forth a procedure for determining safe yield when considering any application to appropriate water from an unconfined aquifer. Generally speaking, the amount of water available for appropriation within a two-mile radius circle is equal to the average annual calculated recharge from precipitation in that same circle. Use of this formula should reduce processing time and provide the public with better information as to which applications can be approved. The reduced cost of processing applications is not known.

**5-3-12. Availability of water for appropriation - safe yield; confined groundwater aquifers.** This new regulation specifies that each application to appropriate water from a confined aquifer shall be processed on a case by case basis so that the safe yield of the source of supply is not exceeded. This regulation, which generally implements existing policy, is not expected to result in a significant fiscal impact to governmental entities or to water users.

**5-3-13. Availability of water for appropriation - safe yield; surface water.** This new regulation adopts existing policy that an application to directly divert the natural flow of the Kansas River, Missouri River, Big Blue River and Spring River and their tributaries shall be processed on a safe yield basis with certain limitations. Applications to divert the surface flow of any other stream in the state of Kansas shall be limited to the period October 1 through June 30, unless either off-stream storage facilities are provided, or the applicant has no need for water during the period July 1 through September 30. This regulation is not expected to result in a significant fiscal impact to governmental entities or to water users.

**5-3-14. Safe yield exemptions.** This new regulation exempts applications to appropriate up to 15 acre feet of groundwater meeting safe yield criteria under certain circumstances in areas located outside groundwater management districts and in areas not closed by a reg-



ulation of the chief engineer or intensive groundwater use control area order issued by the chief engineer. This regulation will allow some additional applications to be filed and approved, but no significant fiscal impact is expected to governmental entities or to water users.

**5-3-15. Safe yield; miscellaneous exemptions.** This new regulation exempts certain applications to appropriate water in areas outside groundwater management districts and intensive groundwater use control areas from meeting safe yield criteria if the use has occurred continuously since prior to the effective date of the regulation and could have reasonably been classified by the Division of Water Resources as a domestic use at the time use began. This regulation will apply only to relatively small users of water and is not expected to result in a significant fiscal impact to governmental entities or to water users.

**5-3-16. Applicants' opportunity to submit additional information.** This new regulation sets forth a procedure that an applicant will be notified by the chief engineer prior to dismissal of an application that safe yield requirements have not been met and give the applicant at least 15 days to request time in which to submit additional information. Staff time to set notices and respond to additional information will be significant but necessary to better process applications. No dollar estimate is available as to additional division staff time necessary. This regulation is not expected to result in any other significant fiscal impact to governmental entities or to water users.

**5-5-8. Standards for approval of an application for a change in the place of use and a change in the use made of water.** This new regulation adopts the basic principle that approval of an application for change cannot materially injure or adversely affect water rights or permits with priorities senior to the date the change application is filed. The regulation defines consumptive use as used in K.A.R. 5-5-3. This regulation is not expected to result in a significant fiscal impact to governmental entities or to water users.

**5-5-9. Criteria for approval of a change application from irrigation to any other type of beneficial use.** This new regulation essentially implements existing policy and limits the amount of water which may be changed to the new type of use to net irrigation requirements for a 50 percent chance rainfall for the county of origin multiplied by the maximum acreage legally irrigated under the authority of that water right in any one calendar year either prior to December 31, 1994, or during the perfection period, depending on when the application is filed. There are provisions for flexibility and exemptions. This regulation is not expected to result in a significant fiscal impact to governmental entities or to water users.

**5-5-10. Partial changes in the use made of water from irrigation to another type of beneficial use.** This new regulation adopts existing policy concerning the procedure for transferring a portion of a water right from irrigation to another type of beneficial use. This regulation is not expected to result in a significant fiscal impact to governmental entities or to water users.

**5-5-11. Applications for change in place of use for irrigation purposes.** This new regulation limits the num-

ber of acres which can be changed from the current irrigation use to another irrigation use to "base acreage." If the perfection period expired on or before December 31, 1994, or the water right is a vested right, the base acreage is the maximum number of acres actually legally irrigated in any one calendar year on or before December 31, 1994. If the perfection period expires after December 31, 1994, but the perfection period has not expired at the time the change application has been filed, the "base acreage" shall be the number of acres authorized by the permit. If the perfection period expires after December 31, 1994, and the perfection period has expired at the time the change application is filed, the "base acreage" shall be maximum acreage legally irrigated in any one calendar year during the perfection period. There are also provisions for expanding the "base acreage" in order to accommodate more efficient irrigation systems or create identical places of use. This generally implements existing policy, but is somewhat less restrictive. This regulation is not expected to result in a significant fiscal impact to governmental entities or to water users.

**5-5-12. Net irrigation requirements.** This new regulation sets forth the net irrigation requirements in each county for the 50 percent chance rainfall and the 80 percent chance rainfall. This regulation is not expected to result in a significant fiscal impact to governmental entities or to water users.

**5-10-6. Procedure for determination of an active vested domestic water right.** This new regulation sets forth the procedure for determining an active vested domestic water right. It is not known how many active vested domestic water rights will be determined each year. This will allow the division to document and better protect these real property rights for the benefit of their owners. The additional administrative costs to the division are not known. This regulation is not expected to result in a significant fiscal impact to other governmental entities or water users.

The formal hearings on these rules and regulations also will be accompanied by informational seminars conducted by Division of Water Resources personnel with more in-depth discussion concerning the proposed regulations and Kansas water law in general. **71-1-16. Definition of certain terms.** (a) "Removal of or addition to the hard or soft tissue of the oral cavity" means:

- (1) A surgical or cutting procedure on hard or soft tissues;
- (2) the grafting of hard or soft tissues;
- (3) the final placement or intraoral adjustment of a fixed crown or fixed bridge; and
- (4) root planing or the smoothing of roughened root surfaces.

(b) "Diagnosis of or prescription for treatment for disease, pain, deformity, deficiency, injury or physical condition of the human teeth or jaws, or adjacent structure" means:

- (1) A comprehensive examination;
- (2) diagnosis and treatment planning; and
- (3) the prescription of a drug, medication; or work authorization.

(c) "Correction of malformation of teeth or of the jaws" means surgery, cutting or any other irreversible procedure.

(d) "General or local anesthesia of any nature in connection with a dental operation" means any general anesthetic and any local anesthetic whether block or infiltration. The term shall not include the administration and monitoring of the analgesic use of nitrous oxide/oxygen. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-1406(l); implementing K.S.A. 65-1423(g); effective May 10, 1993; amended Sept. 6, 1994.)

**71-1-17. Nitrous oxide/oxygen; unlicensed assistant; course of instruction.** (a) A dentist may utilize an assistant not licensed by the Kansas dental board in the administration and monitoring of nitrous oxide/oxygen

if that person has satisfactorily completed a course of instruction in those functions which has been approved by the dental board.

(b) (1) The course of instruction shall include a minimum of six hours of instruction at a teaching institution accredited by the American dental association.

(2) The course of instruction shall include satisfactory completion of courses which offer both didactic and clinical instruction in:

- (A) theory of pain control;
- (B) anatomy;
- (C) medical history;
- (D) pharmacology; and
- (E) emergencies and complications.

(3) Certification in cardiac pulmonary resuscitation shall be required in all cases. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-1406(l); implementing K.S.A. 65-1423(g); effective May 10, 1993; amended Sept. 6, 1994.)

**Article 3.—DENTAL HYGIENISTS**

**71-3-3. Authorized dental hygienist duties; courses of instruction.** (a) In addition to the duties specifically mentioned in the Kansas dental code, any duly licensed and registered dental hygienist may:

(1) give fluoride treatments as a prophylactic measure, all as defined by the United States public health service and as recommended for use in dentistry;

(2) remove overhanging restoration margins and periodontal surgery materials by hand scaling instruments; and

(3) administer local block and infiltration anesthesia and nitrous oxide.

(A) The administration of local anaesthesia shall be performed only under the direct supervision of a licensed dentist at the office of the licensed dentist.

(B) Each dental hygienist who administers local anesthesia shall have completed courses of instruction in local anesthesia and nitrous oxide which have been approved by the board.

(b) (1) The courses of instruction required in paragraph (a)(3)(B) of this regulation shall provide a minimum of 12 hours of instruction at a teaching institution accredited by the American dental association.

(2) The courses of instruction shall include courses which provide both didactic and clinical instruction in:

- (A) theory of pain control;
- (B) anatomy;
- (C) medical history;
- (D) pharmacology; and
- (E) emergencies and complications.

(3) Certification in cardiac pulmonary resuscitation shall be required in all cases. (Authorized by K.S.A. 65-1456 and K.S.A. 74-1406(l); implementing K.S.A. 65-1456; effective Jan. 1, 1966; amended May 24, 1993; amended Sept. 6, 1994.)

AND STANDARDS OF PRACTICE

**60-3-110.** Standards of revocation, suspension, limitation, or denial of nursing licensure. "Unprofessional conduct" shall include the following:

- (a) performing acts beyond the authorized scope of the level of nursing for which the individual is licensed;
- (b) assuming duties and responsibilities within the practice of nursing without adequate preparation or when competency has not been maintained;
- (c) failing to take appropriate action or to follow policies and procedures in the practice situation designed to safeguard the patient;
- (d) inaccurately recording, falsifying, or altering any record of a patient or agency;
- (e) committing any act of verbal or physical abuse of a patient;
- (f) assigning or delegating any unqualified person to perform the functions of a licensed nurse contrary to the Kansas nurse practice act, or to the detriment of patient safety;
- (g) violating the confidentiality of information or knowledge concerning any patient;
- (h) willfully or negligently failing to take appropriate action to safeguard a patient or the public from incompetent practice performed by a registered professional nurse or a licensed practical nurse. "Appropriate action" may include reporting to the board of nursing;
- (i) diverting drugs, supplies, or property of any patient or agency;
- (j) solicitation of professional patronage through the use of fraudulent or false advertisements, or profiting by the acts of those representing themselves to be agents of the licensee;
- (k) advertising professional superiority or the performance of professional services in a superior manner; and
- (l) commission of any act of sexual abuse, sexual misconduct or sexual exploitation related to the licensee's professional practice. (Authorized by K.S.A. 65-1129; implementing K.S.A. 1993 Supp. 65-1120; effective May 1, 1982; amended Sept. 27, 1993; amended Sept. 6, 1994.)

Article 7.—REQUIREMENTS FOR LICENSURE  
AND STANDARDS OF PRACTICE

**60-7-106.** Standards of revocation, suspension, limitation, denial of mental health technician licensure. "Unprofessional conduct," shall include the following:

- (a) performing acts beyond the authorized scope of the level of practice for which the individual is licensed;
- (b) assuming duties and responsibilities within the practice of mental health technology without adequate preparation or when competency has not been maintained;
- (c) failing to take appropriate action or to follow policies and procedures in the practice situation designed to safeguard the patient;

(d) inaccurately recording, falsifying, or altering any record of a patient or agency;

(e) committing any act of verbal or physical abuse of a patient;

(f) assigning or delegating any unqualified person to perform the functions of a licensed mental health technician contrary to the mental health technicians licensure act or to the detriment of patient safety;

(g) violating the confidentiality of information or knowledge concerning any patient;

(h) willfully or negligently failing to take appropriate action to safeguard a patient or the public from incompetent practice performed by a licensed mental health technician. "Appropriate action" may include reporting to the board of nursing;

(i) diverting drugs, supplies or property of any patient or agency;

(j) violating a federal law or regulation relating to controlled substances;

(k) failing to furnish the board of nursing, or its investigators or representatives, any information legally requested by the board of nursing;

(l) receiving a denial, revocation, limitation or suspension of a mental health technician license from a licensing authority of another state, agency of the United States government, territory of the United States or country. A certified copy of the record or order of denial, suspension, limitation, revocation or other disciplinary action issued by the licensing authority of another state, agency of the United States government, territory of the United States or country shall constitute prima facie evidence of such a fact;

(m) failing to report to the board of nursing any adverse action taken against the licensee by another state or licensing jurisdiction, a peer review body, a health care facility, a professional association or society, a governmental agency, a law enforcement agency or a court for acts or conduct similar to acts or conduct which would constitute grounds for disciplinary action under this section;

(n) cheating on or attempting to subvert the validity of the examination for a license; or

(o) committing any act of sexual abuse, sexual misconduct or sexual exploitation related to the licensee's professional practice. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1993 Supp. 65-4203 and 65-4209; implementing K.S.A. 1993 Supp. 65-4209; effective, T-88-48, Dec. 16, 1987; effective Sept. 27, 1993; amended Sept. 6, 1994.)

Article 11.—ADVANCED REGISTERED  
NURSE PRACTITIONERS

**60-11-103.** Qualifications of advanced registered nurse practitioners. (a) To be certified as an advanced registered nurse practitioner in the category of nurse anesthetist or nurse midwife, each applicant shall:

(1) complete a formal, post-basic nursing education program located or offered in Kansas that has been approved by the board and prepares the nurse to function in the expanded role for which application is made;

(2) complete a formal, post-basic nursing education program which is not located or offered in Kansas but which is determined by the board to meet the standards for program approval established by K.A.R. 60-11-108;

(3) have completed a formal, post-basic nursing education program which is no longer in existence but which is determined by the board to meet standards at least as stringent as required for program approval by the board as of the time of graduation;

(4) hold a current certificate of authority to practice as an advanced registered nurse practitioner in the category for which application is made which:

(A) was issued by another board of nursing; and

(B) required completion of a program meeting standards equal to or greater than those established by K.A.R. 60-11-108; or

(5) complete a formal educational program of post-basic study and clinical experience which can be demonstrated by the applicant to have sufficiently prepared the applicant for practice in the category of advanced practice for which application is made. The applicant shall show that the curriculum of the program is consistent with public health and safety policy and that it prepared individuals to perform acts generally recognized by the nursing profession as capable of being performed by persons with post-basic education in nursing.

(b) To be certified as an advanced registered nurse practitioner in the category of nurse clinician or practitioner, each applicant shall:

(1) meet one of the requirements of subsection (a) of this regulation before July 1, 1994; or

(2) if a requirement in subsection (a) of this regulation has not been met prior to July 1, 1994, meet one of the requirements of subsection (a) of this regulation and hold a baccalaureate degree in nursing.

(c) To be certified as an advanced registered nurse practitioner in the category of clinical nurse specialist, each applicant shall hold a master's or higher degree in a nursing clinical area which prepares the nurse to function in the expanded role and meet one of the requirements of subsection (a) of this regulation.

(d) (1) Certification may be granted if an individual has been certified by a national nursing organization whose certifying standards have been approved by the board as equal to or greater than the corresponding standards established by the board for obtaining certification to practice as an advanced registered nurse practitioner. Certification by the board under this section may depend upon independent review by the board regarding whether the individual has fulfilled board requirements.

(2) Board approval of the standards and criteria of national nursing organizations that certify advanced registered nurse practitioners shall expire annually. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 65-1130; effective May 1, 1984; amended, T-85-16, June 5, 1984; amended May 1, 1985; amended, T-60-11-14-90, Nov. 14, 1990; amended, T-60-3-14-91, March 14, 1991; amended Sept. 2, 1991; amended March 9, 1992; amended Sept. 14, 1992; amended April 26, 1993; amended Sept. 6, 1994.)

**60-11-108. Requirements for advanced registered nurse practitioner programs of study.** (a) Each program which prepares registered nurses for advanced nursing practice located or offered within Kansas shall be approved and accredited by the board.

(b) The educational program shall be a minimum of nine months, or one academic year of full-time study or

its equivalent, as defined by the sponsoring academic institution. The program shall contain both didactic and clinical components. The clinical component shall include a preceptorship meeting a minimum of eight hours a week for one academic year, or its substantial equivalent of practice.

(c) The philosophy, purpose, objectives and outcomes of the program shall be clearly defined and available in written form.

(d) The objectives and outcomes reflecting the program philosophy shall be stated in behavioral terms and shall describe the competencies of the graduate.

(e) After July 1, 1995, the faculty shall include a majority of advanced registered nurse practitioners who are currently certified by the board in Kansas.

(f) After July 1, 1995, each faculty member shall have earned a graduate degree.

(g) The content, methods of instruction and learning experience shall be consistent with the philosophy, objectives and outcomes of the program.

(h) Course syllabi shall be available in writing.

(i) The program shall include content relating to role realignment and content related to the area of advanced nursing practice, ethical and legal implications of advanced nursing practice and the health care delivery system.

(j) The program shall provide clinical instruction in the performance of diagnostic procedures and the transmittal of prescriptions for medications that are essential to practice in the area of specialization. Clinical instruction shall be under the supervision of the faculty, an advanced registered nurse practitioner, or a physician preceptor.

(k) Admission criteria shall be clearly stated, available in written form and shall include the requirement of a current license to practice in Kansas as a registered professional nurse.

(l) Policies for withdrawal, dismissal and readmission shall be available in written form.

(m) The student shall receive official evidence indicating successful completion of the program of study.

(n) A written plan for continuing program evaluation shall be developed, adopted and implemented by the faculty. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 65-1133; effective May 1, 1984; amended, T-85-16, June 5, 1984; amended May 1, 1985; amended Aug. 6, 1990; amended Sept. 27, 1993; amended Sept. 6, 1994.)

RegulationsArticle 4.—OCCUPATION AND  
CONCESSIONAIRE LICENSES

**112-4-25. Qualifications for license as a greyhound owner.** Each applicant for a greyhound owner license shall:

- (1) possess a record of a properly registered greyhound, eligible to race, that the applicant intends to race in Kansas;
- (2) have the greyhound in the care of a licensed trainer; and
- (3) have an interest in the greyhound as owner, part owner or lessee, or managing owner of a corporation, syndicate or partnership that is the legal owner of the greyhound. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1993 Supp. 74-8804 and implementing K.S.A. 74-8816; effective Sept. 6, 1994.)

## Article 5.—RACE TRACK OFFICIALS

**112-5-10. The mutuel manager.** (a) For purposes of these regulations, the mutuel manager shall be the individual who is responsible for overseeing the operations of the mutuel department and the money room.

(b) The mutuel manager shall have knowledge of all aspects of the Kansas racing commission rules and regulations pertaining to partimutuel wagering and shall perform the following duties:

- (1) supervise all mutuel employees, including all mutuel tellers;
- (2) be responsible for the training, scheduling and job performance of all mutuel employees;
- (3) maintain efficient customer relations and oversee the services provided to patrons at the mutuel windows on a race by race basis;
- (4) be responsible for working directly with the tote department in order to help oversee the tote operations and to assist in comparing prices and verifying mutuel payoffs; and
- (5) report all pertinent parimutuel activity to the racing judges and stewards. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1993 Supp. 74-8804; implementing K.S.A. 74-8816 and K.S.A. 1993 Supp. 74-8818; effective Sept. 6, 1994.)

## Article 6.—RACE TRACK OFFICIALS

**112-6-1. Racetrack officials.** (a) Unless otherwise ordered by the commission, racetrack officials at a race meet for greyhounds shall be as follows:

- (1) the director of racing;
- (2) the mutuel manager;
- (3) the paddock judge;
- (4) the kennel master;
- (5) the clerk of scales;
- (6) the starter;
- (7) the lure operator;
- (8) the chartwriter; and
- (9) the racing secretary.

(b) An individual or a member of an individual's family included in K.S.A. 1993 Supp. 74-8810(c), who owns

a greyhound or has a financial interest in a greyhound entered at a race meet, shall not serve as a racetrack official at the meet. A lessee or lessor of a greyhound shall be deemed to have a financial interest in the greyhound.

(c) Each racetrack official shall be strictly accountable to the commission for the performance of the official's respective duties and shall promptly report to the commission or the racing judges any violation of the regulations of which the official has knowledge. Each racetrack official who fails to perform the official's duties shall be discharged by the racing judges.

(d) Each employee of the racing and mutuel departments at a racetrack facility shall be an employee of the organization licensee and shall be accountable to the board of directors of the organization licensee. An organization licensee or facility manager licensee shall not, by contract or agreement, diminish the organization licensee's ultimate responsibility to conduct the races and the parimutuel system of wagering. However, any organization licensee may execute a contract or agreement with a facility manager licensee that permits the delegation of day-to-day management of the conduct of races and the parimutuel system of wagering.

(e) Each racetrack official shall be approved by the commission before the official assumes any race meet duties. Each organization licensee shall identify the racetrack officials 30 days before the first day of the race meet for which the racetrack officials are to serve. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1993 Supp. 74-8804; implementing K.S.A. 1993 Supp. 74-8818 and 74-8813; effective, T-112-1-19-89, Jan. 19, 1989; effective April 10, 1989; amended March 25, 1991; amended Sept. 6, 1994.)

**112-6-2. Commission officials, racing judges.** (a) Each licensee and each individual attending greyhounds during a race meet shall conduct activities pursuant to the general authority and supervision of the racing judges. Any of these racing regulations may be interpreted by the racing judges, and any appropriate action not expressly authorized by these racing regulations may be ordered by the racing judges to ensure a fair race and to protect the best interests of racing.

(b) Each race day, any licensee who wishes to consult with the racing judges may do so at the offices of the racetrack facility.

(1) Two of the three racing judges shall be in attendance not later than one-half hour prior to weighing in time.

(2) The third racing judge shall be in attendance at the racetrack facility not later than one-half hour prior to post-time for the first official race.

(3) If all three of the racing judges are present in the judges' stand during a performance, one and only one racing judge may leave the judges' stand to supervise any racing-related matter as official duties may dictate.

(c) If a vacancy occurs among the racetrack officials, a substitute shall be appointed by the organization licensee subject to the approval of the racing judges. The appointment shall be effective until the vacancy is filled in accordance with these racing regulations.

(d) If a vacancy occurs among the racing judges, a substitute may be appointed by the chief judge in an emergency. If the chief judge is absent, the senior associate judge may make the appointment.



(1) Each substitution shall be reported immediately to the commission office.

(2) If a vacancy has occurred among the racing judges, the remaining two judges may conduct the business of the racing judges until the vacancy is filled in accordance with these racing regulations.

(e) The racing judges' jurisdiction over any matter shall commence 72 hours before any entry is taken for the first day of racing at the meet and shall extend until 30 days after the last day of the meet. If a dispute arises during a race meet that is not settled within the racing judges' 30 day jurisdiction, the authority of the racing judges may be extended by the commission until the matter is resolved or until it is referred or appealed to the commission.

(f) Any occupation licensee may be penalized by the racing judges or the commission in accordance with the Kansas parimutuel racing act and the Kansas administrative procedure act. At the direction of the commission, all of the racing judges, or any of them as designated by the commission, may conduct summary adjudicative hearings in accordance with the Kansas administrative procedure act.

(g) Each penalty shall be reported immediately to the commission by the racing judges.

(h) Any greyhound that the racing judges determine is disabled or unfit to run may be excused by the judges.

(i) Any greyhound may be suspended from participating in races for any period of time determined by the racing judges if the greyhound does not meet the requirements of, or has been involved in any violations of these racing regulations or any provisions of the Kansas parimutuel racing act, including but not limited to the following:

(1) medication laws and regulations; or

(2) any suspension or revocation of any occupation license by the racing judges or the commission of any racing jurisdiction recognized by the commission.

(j) Any matter within the jurisdiction of the racing judges may be referred to the commission with or without recommendation.

(1) A detailed written account of each question, dispute, protest, complaint and objection shall be maintained by the racing judges.

(2) A daily report that details each raceday's activities shall be prepared by the racing judges and submitted to the executive director within 72 hours of the race date that is the subject of the report. The report shall include, but not be limited to:

(A) each derogatory comment;

(B) each disciplinary hearing;

(C) each fine;

(D) each suspension;

(E) the conduct of each race;

(F) each interruption and delay; and

(G) the condition of the racetrack facility.

(3) Each greyhound that has entered a race or that has run in a race shall be tested or examined by a qualified person when ordered by the racing judges. Any ownership papers, certificates, documents of eligibility, contracts or leases pertaining to any greyhound at the racetrack facility may be examined by the racing judges.

(k) If the racing judges determine that any race or races cannot be conducted in accordance with the regulations, the racing judges shall cancel that race.

(1) The timing of each race shall be conducted by the racing judges as follows.

(1) The official time of each race shall be declared by the racing judges.

(2) Each race shall be hand-timed by the racing judges using a stopwatch that has been inspected and certified by a competent watchmaker.

(3) Each race shall be timed to 1/100th of a second.

(4) The timing of the race shall commence with the opening of the lids of the starting box.

(5) The time shown on the official timing device shall be declared the official time of the race if the racing judges are satisfied that the timing device is functioning properly. If the racing judges are not satisfied, the time shown on the hand-held stopwatch shall be used.

(m) The official winner and other respective positions in the order of finish shall be determined by the racing judges. Only the relative position of the respective racing muzzles of the greyhounds shall be considered when the racing judges determine each place at the finish.

(n) If a greyhound loses its racing muzzle or finishes with a hanging muzzle, the racing judges shall consider only the relative position of the nose of the greyhound that finishes without its racing muzzle in respect to the racing muzzles of the other greyhounds in the race.

(o) In each race the number of the first three greyhounds in order of their finish shall be displayed promptly by the racing judges. The number of the greyhound finishing fourth shall also be displayed. If the racing judges disagree about the order of finish, the majority shall prevail.

(p) If the racing judges wish to consult a picture from the photo finish camera, the placements they have agreed upon may be posted without waiting for a picture and, after consulting the picture, any changes in placement may be posted by the racing judges. However, the race shall not be declared official until the racing judges have determined which greyhounds finished first, second and third.

(q) Nothing in these racing regulations shall be construed to prevent the racing judges from correcting an error before the official sign is displayed or from recalling the official sign in the event it has been displayed through error. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1993 Supp. 74-8804; implementing K.S.A. 1993 Supp. 74-8804 and 74-8816(g); effective, T-112-1-19-89, Jan. 19, 1989; effective April 10, 1989; amended March 25, 1991; amended Sept. 6, 1994.)

**112-6-9. The mutuel manager.** For purposes of these regulations, the duties of the mutuel manager shall be defined the same in this article as in 112-5-10. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1993 Supp. 74-8804; implementing K.S.A. 74-8816 and K.S.A. 1993 Supp. 74-8818; effective Sept. 6, 1994.)

**112-6-10. The chartwriter.** (a) For purposes of these regulations, the chartwriter shall be the individual who shall obtain information to be printed in the racing program concerning each racing greyhound.

(b) The chartwriter's duties shall include:

(continued)

(1) viewing the running of each official live race;  
 (2) viewing the tape of each race as many times as necessary to obtain the following information on each racing greyhound:

(A) the running time and order of finish, verified by the photo finish operator whenever possible, for each racing greyhound;

(B) the post positions and position calls during the race for each racing greyhound;

(C) the equivalent win odds for each racing greyhound;

(D) the parimutuel payoffs for each wagering race;

(E) the date, distance, grade, track condition and racing weight for each official race a greyhound competes in; and

(F) a comment referencing each greyhound's performance in each race;

(3) obtaining any other vital information relating to each racing greyhound; and

(4) overseeing the information provided in the racing program for use by the betting public. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1993 Supp. 74-8804; implementing K.S.A. 74-8816 and K.S.A. 1993 Supp. 74-8818; effective Sept. 6, 1994.)

#### Article 7.—RULES FOR RACING

**112-7-24. Safety vests required.** (a) A jockey or apprentice jockey shall not ride in a race unless the jockey or apprentice jockey is wearing a safety vest.

(b) Each safety vest shall provide shock absorbing protection to the upper body with a minimum rating of five, as defined by the British equestrian trade association (BETA).

(c) A safety vest shall weigh no more than two pounds and shall not be included in the jockey's weight when weighing out to race. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1993 Supp. 74-8804; effective, T-112-5-13-94, May 13, 1994; effective Sept. 6, 1994.)

#### Article 8.—RULES OF RACING

**112-8-13. Housing of greyhounds.** (a) All greyhounds entered into an official race shall be housed in kennel facilities located on the premises provided by the organization licensee.

(b) Greyhounds brought to the racetrack for the specific purpose of participating in stakes races, qualifying rounds and schoolings necessary for the stakes race, may be housed off the racetrack facility subject to the terms and conditions specified by the racetrack facility and with the approval of the racing judges. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1993 Supp. 74-8804; effective Sept. 6, 1994.)

#### Article 9.—PARIMUTUEL WAGERING

**112-9-1. Definitions as used in these regulations and the racing act.** (a) "Business day" shall mean the first working day following a performance.

(b) "Working day" shall mean Monday through Friday of the work week excluding holidays. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1993 Supp. 74-8804 and implementing K.S.A. 1993 Supp. 74-8823; effective Sept. 6, 1994.)

#### Article 11.—SECURITY AND SAFETY

**112-11-21. Prohibited acts.** (a) When on the grounds of a racetrack facility, a person shall not:

(1) violate a federal, state or local criminal or civil law;

(2) unless authorized by the commission, possess a firearm or other dangerous weapon;

(3) damage or destroy property of the racetrack facility or adjoining facilities;

(4) smoke in nonsmoking areas designated by the commission;

(5) unless authorized by the stewards or racing judges, communicate or attempt to communicate with a jockey or driver during racing hours, or attempt to gain entrance to the jockeys' and drivers' quarters at any time;

(6) fail to secure an occupation license if required for performance of duties at the racetrack facility;

(7) employ unlicensed personnel;

(8) alter or forge a prescription for medication for a racing animal;

(9) mar or alter any identification mark on any racing animal;

(10) unless authorized by the stewards or racing judges, use any radio transmitter or other transmitting device at a racetrack facility during a race meet;

(11) unless authorized by the commission, transmit or receive or attempt to transmit or receive wagering information through the use of a communication device; or

(12) participate in a race meet while suspended by the official racing body of any racing jurisdiction.

(b) When on the grounds of any racetrack facility where the licensee is employed, the following occupation licensees shall not wager or cause anyone to wager on their behalf at any time:

(1) general manager;

(2) executive director;

(3) director of mutuels;

(4) director of racing;

(5) racing secretary;

(6) lead out;

(7) starter;

(8) paddock judge;

(9) clerk of scales;

(10) clocker;

(11) photo finish operator;

(12) identifier;

(13) lure operator;

(14) brakeman;

(15) horsemen's bookkeeper;

(16) chartwriter;

(17) placing judge;

(18) kennel master;

(19) patrol judge; and

(20) assistants to any of these positions.

(c) When on the grounds of any racetrack facility where the licensee is employed, the following occupation licensees shall not wager or cause anyone to wager on their behalf while on duty:

(1) jockey;

(2) jockey room attendant;

(3) mutuel employee;



- (4) outrider;
- (5) pony person;
- (6) track superintendent;
- (7) testing technician; and
- (8) assistants to any of these positions.

(d) An occupation licensee shall not display the occupation license while wagering at any racetrack facility. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1993 Supp. 74-8804; implementing K.S.A. 1993 Supp. 74-8804 and 74-8810; effective, T-112-2-23-89, Feb. 23, 1989; effective June 19, 1989; amended, T-112-2-15-91, Feb. 15, 1991; amended June 10, 1991; amended Sept. 6, 1994.)

#### Article 12.—KANSAS HORSE BREEDING DEVELOPMENT FUND

**112-12-14. Registration of Arabian, Appaloosa, Paint and Standardbred horses.** (a) Arabian, Appaloosa, Paint and Standardbred horses may be registered into the Kansas-bred program if the horse is:

- (1) registered with a national breed association; and
- (2) owned wholly or in part by a resident of Kansas as defined by these racing regulations, or leased by a resident of Kansas as defined by these racing regulations, and the lease is effective throughout the time the horse is registered as a Kansas-bred horse. Horses leased from nonresident owners shall not be eligible to race for funds to be paid out of the Kansas horse breeding development fund.

(b) Each person who intends to register a horse under this regulation shall:

(1) file an application for registration with the official registering agency on or before December 31, 1994, on forms approved by the commission;

(2) file with the official registering agency evidence of ownership including:

- (A) bills of sale;
- (B) the official breed registration certificate issued by the national breed association; and

(C) contracts or other documents that demonstrate proof of ownership and reflect all agreements concerning breeding rights, repurchase and any other terms and conditions;

(3) pay the \$50.00 fee for registering each horse under this regulation; and

(4) make each horse registered under this regulation available at any reasonable time for inspection by representatives of the official registering agency. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1993 Supp. 74-8804 and implementing K.S.A. 74-8830; effective Sept. 6, 1994.)

#### Article 15.—AWARD OF RESEARCH GRANTS

**112-15-2. Application deadlines.** (a) Grant proposals from interested applicants shall be solicited by the commission during the end of the preceding calendar year by publishing notice of the application deadlines and procedures in the Kansas register 60 days prior to receipt of the funds.

(b) Applications for grants shall be submitted to the executive director on or before January 15 following the end of each calendar year. Applicants demonstrating need to the satisfaction of the grant committee may be granted emergency funding at any time during the year provided funds are available.

(c) After the auditors determine the amount of the funds generated for the breed development funds allocated for research, the grant committee shall meet as necessary between January 15 and March 15 of the year following the year in which the funds were generated.

(1) The committee shall select the most worthy research projects for submission to the commission.

(2) The commission shall choose the projects to be funded on or before April 15 of the same year. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1993 Supp. 74-8804; implementing K.S.A. 74-8829, as amended by 1994 HB 3097, Sec. 3, and 74-8831; effective Oct. 22, 1990; amended Sept. 6, 1994.)

**112-15-3. Application requirements.** (a) Each grant application shall include:

- (1) a summary cover page;
- (2) a program narrative;
- (3) a budget narrative;
- (4) certified assurances;
- (5) an audit schedule; and
- (6) a designation of the applicant's EEO contact.

(b) Each summary cover page shall provide quick reference to important elements of the grant application.

(c) Each program narrative shall address:

- (1) needs assessment and documentation;
- (2) program expectations;
- (3) program methodology;
- (4) program monitoring and evaluations;
- (5) audit concerns; and
- (6) staffing patterns.

(d) Each grant application shall relate to research conducted within the state of Kansas:

(1) for horses, through institutions of higher education under the state board of regents; and

(2) for greyhounds, preferably through institutions of higher education under the state board of regents or in association with those institutions. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1993 Supp. 74-8804; implementing K.S.A. 74-8829, as amended by 1994 HB 3097, Sec. 3, and 74-8831; effective Oct. 22, 1990; amended Sept. 6, 1994.)

**112-15-5. Notification of decision.** Each applicant applying for grant funds shall be notified in writing of the grant decision not later than 60 days after the date on which the application is reviewed, except that applicants applying for grant funds pursuant to subsection (b) of K.A.R. 112-15-2 shall be notified not later than 15 days after the date on which the application is reviewed. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1993 Supp. 74-8804; implementing K.S.A. 74-8829, as amended by 1994 HB 3097, Sec. 3, and 74-8831; effective Oct. 22, 1990; amended Sept. 6, 1994.)

**112-15-6. Reporting requirements.** (a) Each grant recipient shall submit to the executive director:

(1) bi-annual expenditure reports providing information on expenditures during the previous six-month period; and

(2) a program narrative report providing a narrative description of program activities during the program period.

(b) Each grant recipient shall submit a bi-annual expenditure report within 30 days after the close of each six month period, on June 30 and December 31.

(continued)

(c) Each grant recipient shall submit a program narrative report within 30 days after the close of the calendar year.

(d) Each grant recipient shall submit to the executive director a sound research paper summarizing the research program and the results within 90 days after the close of the program period. Each research paper shall be prepared in a form suitable for publication.

(e) Each grant recipient shall submit to the executive director, at least 30 days before actual need, cash draw down reports to request advancement of approved grant funds.

(f) Each grant recipient shall maintain program receipts for a period of three years after the close of the program period. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1993 Supp. 74-8804; implementing K.S.A. 74-8829, as amended by 1994 HB 3097, Sec. 3, and 74-8831; effective Oct. 22, 1990; amended Sept. 6, 1994.)

#### Article 18.—SIMULCASTING LICENSES

**112-18-9. Duties of receiving facility.** (a) A simulcasting licensee that conducts parimutuel wagering on a simulcast race or program shall act as a receiving facility on those dates. Each receiving facility shall provide:

(1) communication facilities, which include all wire, radio, optical, satellite or other electromagnetic systems used to receive audio and visual transmissions between the sending racetrack, host facility and the receiving facility; and

(2) two voice communication systems between the receiving facility and the sending racetrack or host facility providing timely voice contact between the stewards, racing judges or simulcast official and the mutuel departments at each racetrack or facility.

(b) Before the beginning of the transmission of the first simulcast race or program of each day, each receiving facility shall initiate a test program of its receiver, decoder and data communication to ensure proper operation of the system. If a test program run under this subsection is unsuccessful or indicates a malfunction of any component of the receiving system, the licensee shall not conduct parimutuel wagering on a simulcast race or program until a successful test program is completed.

(c) After each simulcast race or program, each receiving facility shall provide the reports of its parimutuel operations as required by K.A.R. 112-9-8 for both simulcast and live races. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1993 Supp. 74-8804; effective, T-112-4-27-92, April 27, 1992; effective, T-112-9-10-92, Sept. 10, 1992; effective Nov. 23, 1992; amended Sept. 6, 1994.)

**112-18-11. Emergency procedures.** (a) A simulcasting licensee shall not accept wagers on a simulcast race until the simulcasting licensee is receiving the video signal from the sending racetrack. If the audio signal is not received, the simulcasting licensee shall establish a telephone linkup with the sending racetrack's stewards, racing judges or simulcast official and shall announce to the patrons all pertinent information.

(b) If the simulcasting licensee loses the audio or video signal from the sending racetrack, the simulcasting

licensee shall immediately notify the sending racetrack of the lost signal.

(c) If the audio or video signal is lost, after wagering has commenced, the simulcasting licensee shall establish a telephone linkup between the sending racetrack's stewards, racing judges or simulcast official and shall announce to the patrons all pertinent information. The licensee may continue to accept wagers with the telephone linkup while attempting to reestablish the audio or video signal, or may elect to refund all wagers prior to post time for the simulcast race.

(d) If the audio or video signals are lost and the telephone linkup cannot be established, the simulcasting licensee shall cease accepting wagers and immediately order a refund of all monies wagered into the pools prior to post time for the simulcast race.

(e) If the licensee loses the audio or video signal as described in 112-18-11(c) or (d), the licensee shall file a written report with the inspector of parimutuels.

(f) Wagers that encompass more than one race shall be unaffected by signal problems encountered in any race of the sequence other than the first. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1993 Supp. 74-8804; implementing K.S.A. 74-8836, as amended by 1994 HB 3097, Sec. 4; effective, T-112-4-27-92, April 27, 1992; effective, T-112-9-10-92, Sept. 10, 1992; effective Nov. 23, 1992; amended Sept. 6, 1994.)

**112-18-17. Manual merge.** (a) If the guest facility's computer system fails to adequately transmit wagering data to the host facility, and a manual merge will not endanger the pools at the host facility, the host facility may manually merge the pools.

(1) To merge the pools manually, each guest facility's parimutuel representative shall notify the host facility via telecopy or facsimile machine of:

(A) the total amount in the pool;

(B) the total dollars on winning wagers;

(C) the total dollars on the losing wagers in the pool.

(2) For purposes of declaring the race official, the following individuals shall be notified when the procedure is complete:

(A) the stewards, racing judges or simulcast official at the sending racetrack; and

(B) the stewards, racing judges or simulcast official at both the host facility, if different from the sending racetrack, and guest facility. **112-18-18. Failure to merge.** (a) Except as otherwise provided by this regulation, if it becomes impossible to successfully merge a guest facility's wagers in the combined wagering pool, the simulcasting licensee shall calculate the pool as a separate pool to be distributed in accordance with the Kansas parimutuel racing act, including takeout; except that a pool containing a carry-over feature or a type of wager not available in Kansas shall be refunded.

(1) As soon as failure to merge is acknowledged, a parimutuel representative at the guest facility shall notify the simulcast coordinator.

(2) The simulcast coordinator shall immediately make an announcement to the patrons via intercom or TV monitors, explaining the circumstances.

(b) Each simulcast licensee shall be required to advise patrons of its failure to merge policy by prominently displaying notice in the wagering areas, other special patron areas, and in the official racing program.

(c) Each contract for combined wagering pools entered into by a simulcasting licensee shall contain a provision stating that the simulcasting licensee shall not be liable for any measures taken which may result in a guest facility's wagers not being accepted into a combined wagering pool formed by the licensee if for any reason:

- (1) it becomes impossible to successfully merge the wagers placed in another state in the combined wagering pool formed by the simulcasting licensee; or
- (2) the commission's or simulcasting licensee's representative determines that attempting to transfer pool

data from the guest facility will endanger the simulcasting licensee's wagering pool. **112-18-20. Accuracy of payoffs.** The simulcast licensee may delay paying mutuel tickets until the accuracy of the payoffs is confirmed. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1993 Supp. 74-8804; effective Sept. 6, 1994.)
