Notice of Hearing on Proposed  
Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted at 10 a.m. Wednesday, March 1, at the office of the Kansas State Board of Healing Arts, 235 S. Topeka Blvd., Topeka, to consider the adoption of proposed permanent changes to K.A.R. 100-38-1, 100-54-7 and 100-55-7.

This 30-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulations. All interested parties may submit comments prior to the hearing to the address above. All interested parties also will be given a reasonable opportunity at the hearing to present their views, orally or in writing, concerning the adoption of the proposed regulations. In order to give all persons an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to limit oral presentations to five minutes. Following the hearing, all written and oral comments submitted by interested parties will be considered in making changes to the proposed regulations.

The following is a brief summary of the purpose of the proposed changes to the regulations and the anticipated fiscal impact of each proposed change:

**K.A.R. 100-38-1. Physical therapy fees.** The proposed change would increase the examination fee from \$150 to \$250 per examination. However, this regulation would not increase the revenue of this agency since the cost of purchasing and administering the examination has increased by \$100. The economic impact to the applicants for registration as physical therapists and physical therapist assistants would be an additional \$100 each for an estimated 150 applicants taking the examination each fiscal year. Other governmental agencies, private citizens and consumers will not be affected by this change.

**K.A.R. 100-54-7** is being amended to modify continuing education requirements for annual renewal of registrations for occupational therapists and occupational therapy assistants.

**K.A.R. 100-55-7** is being amended to modify continuing education requirements for annual renewal of registrations for respiratory therapists.

Consumer Credit Commissioner

Administrative Interpretation No. 1005

**Re: The Sale of Credit Insurance After the Consummation of a Closed-End Consumer Credit Transaction or Open-End Consumer Line of Credit**

The question has arisen whether written authorization by the consumer is required on the post-loan sale of credit insurance on consumer credit transactions. The requirement to obtain specific affirmative written indication of the consumer's desire to purchase such insurance as required in K.S.A. 16a-2-501(2)(b) is intended if the insurance is written in connection with the extension of credit. The term "extension of credit" is not a defined term in the Kansas Uniform Consumer Credit Code, so it is the interpretation by the commissioner that it specifically relates to the period of time when the loan is contemplated and approved by the creditor and ends upon the consummation or opening of a consumer credit transaction. The Official Staff Commentary on Regulation Z, Truth-in-Lending in sections 226.4 (b)(7) and (8) 2 states, "Insurance written in connection with a transaction. Insurance sold after consummation in closed-end credit transactions or after the opening of a plan in open-end credit transactions is not 'written in connection with' the credit transaction if the insurance is written because of the consumer's default (for example, by failing to obtain or maintain required property insurance) or because the consumer requests insurance after consummation or the opening of a plan (although credit-sale disclosures may be required for the insurance sold after consummation if it is financed)."

Although disclosures are required by Regulation Z if the premium is financed in an open-end credit transaction by adding the monthly premium to the balance on which a finance charge is assessed, the written authorization by the consumer is a separate action from disclosure by the creditor and not required in this instance.

Conclusion: Written authorization by the consumer on the sale of credit insurance after consummation of a closed-end or opening of an open-end consumer credit transaction is not required if it fits the circumstances set forth above. Disclosure of finance charges in connection with the financing of the credit insurance premium is required.

The Behavioral Sciences Regulatory Board will conduct a public hearing from 10 to 11 a.m. Monday, February 20, in the board conference room at 712 S. Kansas Ave., Topeka, to consider adopting proposed amendments in existing rules and regulations for licensed psychologists and registered master level psychologists.

This 30-day notice of the public hearing constitutes a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed amendments. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the executive director, Behavioral Sciences Regulatory Board, 712 S. Kansas Ave., Topeka, 66603-3817. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request each participant to limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

A summary of proposed amended regulations follows. The board does not have a less costly or intrusive method for achieving the stated purpose of each regulation. There should be minimal or no fiscal impact to the agency, licensee, registrant or general public.

**K.A.R. 102-1-4. Examinations.** The proposed amendment lowers the licensed psychology examination cutoff score from 75 percent correct to 70 percent correct. This change is proposed to enable the board to move toward uniform national requirements to facilitate reciprocity for applicants.

**K.A.R. 102-1-5. Professional endorsements and supervision.** The proposed amendments will permit a li-

censed psychology applicant to count a maximum of one year of the applicant's internship or residency pre-doctoral, supervised experience toward satisfying the two-year, supervised experience requirement. This change is proposed to enable the board to move toward uniform national requirements to facilitate reciprocity for applicants.

**K.A.R. 102-4-1. Definitions.** The proposed amendments remove some RMLP terms currently defined in this regulation, which are now being proposed for inclusion in regulations specific to term definitions. New definitions are proposed to address changes that are proposed in the regulation on supervision. Some of the amendments are not substantive, but are grammatical and are proposed at the request of the Department of Administration.

**K.A.R. 102-4-4. Application for registration.** The proposed amendments (1) remove the requirement that RMLP applicants provide a copy of the applicant's undergraduate transcript; (2) remove the requirement that an applicant obtain three written references; and (3) remove the requirement that persons who have been issued a temporary registration and who apply to renew their temporary permit provide verification of the person's employment.

**K.A.R. 102-4-5. Unprofessional conduct.** The majority of the proposed amendments are substantive and are intended to conform to comparable language in the regulations of other credentialed professional groups under the board's jurisdiction. Additional proposed amendments are not substantive, but are grammatical and are proposed at the request of the Department of Administration.

**K.A.R. 102-4-6. Verification of academically supervised practicum or postgraduate supervised work experience.** This regulation has been rewritten for clarity and incorporates the supervisory definitions that are proposed for deletion in K.A.R. 102-4-1.

**K.A.R. 102-4-7. Registration action by the board.** This regulation is proposed for revocation at the request of the Attorney General's office, who believes it to be unnecessary due to the Kansas Administrative Procedures Act.

**K.A.R. 102-4-10. Continuing education.** The proposed amendment in subsection (c)(1)(D) expands the number and type of credentialed persons who can provide psychotherapy for purposes of continuing education credit. The proposed amendment will permit RMLPs to count as continuing education credit the personal psychotherapy that is also provided by registered, as well as licensed and certified, mental health providers. Additional grammatical amendments are proposed at the request of the Department of Administration.

The Kansas State Treasurer shall serve as the bond registrar and paying agent for the bonds, and the principal of the bonds shall be payable upon surrender at the paying agent's principal offices in the city of Topeka, Kansas. **Procedure, Civil—Rules of Civil Procedure—Subpoenas; For Attendance of a Witness; Contempt.** Larry Welch, Director, Kansas Bureau of Investigation, Topeka, December 28, 1994.

If a witness is subpoenaed to appear in two separate courts on the same day and appearance in both courts is thereby made impractical or impossible, the witness may choose which subpoena to honor. There is no established priority between subpoenas that would give one preference over the other based either on jurisdiction or the time or method of service. Although the primary intent of the aggregate tax levy limitation, K.S.A. 1993 Supp. 79-5021 *et seq.*, was to prevent significant increases in property taxes, the statutes also contain provisions which allow counties to exempt themselves from the lid. Consequently, if it does so properly, a county may exempt an entire portion of the budget (e.g., the sheriff's budget) from the restrictions of the tax lid, and may fund the exempted portion of the budget solely by levy of property taxes. In lieu of abandonment, the ICC may approve the railroad right of way as an interim trail if the request is made before abandonment of the line has been consummated and if the trail use group reaches an agreement with the railroad company. If no agreement is reached and the ICC approves the abandonment, state law governs the disposition of the abandoned railroad property. 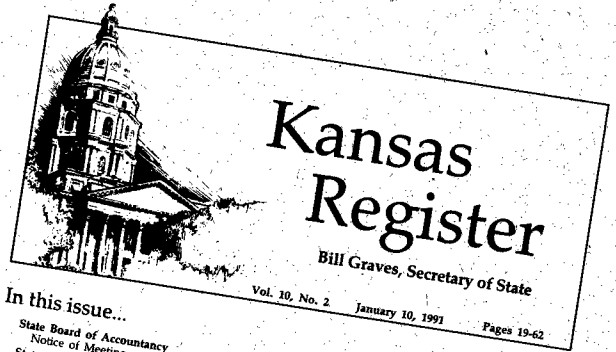
