Negotiations for Engineering Services

Notice is hereby given of the commencement of negotiations for engineering services to investigate the structural integrity of the Ad Astra sculpture proposed to be placed on the dome of the Kansas Statehouse.

Services shall include the following items:

- 1) An evaluation of the chemical composition and physical characteristics of the bronze base metal used for castings and welding wire metal used to join cast pieces and their compatibility.
- 2) Perform tensile, elongation and bending tests of weld material and bronze metal. Determine the minimal thickness of bronze metal castings using stress and fatigue analysis.
- 3) Prepare welding specifications, train and certify artist on welding procedures.
- 4) Determine highest stress points of wind, ice, snow and fatigue as prescribed by building code loadings and evaluate wind shears at wind velocity of 125 miles per hour. Make recommendations for stress reinforcement.
- 5) Calculate sculpture loads, including weight, wind shear and movements.
- 6) Make recommendations for sculpture load testing and for the best installation procedure.
- 7) Work with state agencies, including the State Historical Society, to devise and design methods for waterproofing, connecting and detailing the installation of the sculpture on the dome.

If interested, an original and six copies of the SF 255 form (plus relevant attachments of information regarding similar projects) should be submitted. These submittals should be concise, relevant to the project and follow the State Building Advisory Commission guidelines for submittal. The Kansas Arts Commission has scheduled a quarterly business meeting from 9 a.m. to 3:45 p.m. Friday, February 24, at the International House on the Washburn University campus, 17th and Jewell, Topeka.

During the business session, the commissioners will review the current fiscal year 1995 budget and the agency's proposed budget for fiscal year 1996.

The commissioners are scheduled to formally adopt a new five-year plan and to act upon the recommendations of the advisory panel that evaluated applications for 1995 salary assistance grants for arts organizations.

Notice of Hearing on Proposed  
Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted at 9 a.m. Friday, April 14, in the Kansas Racing Commission's conference room, 3400 Van Buren, Topeka, to consider the adoption of proposed permanent regulations of the Kansas Racing Commission. This 30-day notice constitutes a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulations.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulations and economic impact statement in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contacting Damien Baker at the Kansas Racing Commission, 3400 Van Buren, Topeka, 66611-2228, (913) 296-5800.

A copy of the full text of the regulations and the economic impact statement may be reviewed or obtained at the commission office. The following is a summary of the proposed amendments:

**K.A.R. 112-9-1. Definitions.** The Joint Committee on Administrative Rules and Regulations suggested amending this regulation to use "business day" as defined in the Open Records Act (K.S.A. 45-217a) in lieu of "working day." The amendments reflect the suggested change.

**Economic Impact:** There are no additional costs anticipated to this agency or any other governmental agency or unit as a result of the changes.

**K.A.R. 112-3-16. Organization license application forms and fees for fair associations and the state of Kansas.** This regulation requires that fair associations and the state of Kansas, when applying for organizational licenses, must complete application forms provided and approved by the commission, and further sets out fees to be paid for racing. The 1994 Legislature, in HB 3097, redefined "race meeting" to exclude language allowing for races at which parimutuel wagering is not conducted. This regulation was amended to reflect that change.

**K.A.R. 112-9-21a. Pick three pools.** The regulation establishes procedures for placing wagers, monitoring, reporting and paying out winnings for pick three pools. The 1994 legislation in HB 3097 eliminated the license category for "totalisator" and added a definition for a new type of licensee. This regulation was affected by that change and has been amended accordingly.

**K.A.R. 112-17-1. Application procedure, fair association and horsemen's nonprofit organization applicant.** This regulation requires that fair associations and horsemen's nonprofit groups, when applying for organization licenses, must complete application forms provided by and approved by the Racing Commission, and sets out the fees to be paid for racing. The 1994 Legislature, in HB 3097, made three changes which affected this regulation: 1) redefined "racing meeting" to exclude language allowing for races at which parimutuel wagering is not conducted; 2) redefined "horsemen's association" to broaden it to include any association or corporation which is ap-

plying for or has been issued a license authorizing ownership of Anthony Downs or a racetrack facility on or adjacent to premises used by a fair association to conduct fair activities; and 3) renamed the "county fair association" to "fair association." This regulation has been amended to reflect the above changes.

**K.A.R. 112-17-2. Application form, fair association and horsemen's nonprofit organization applicant.** This regulation sets out the specific information requested in the organization licensee application used by fair associations and horsemen's nonprofit organizations when applying for an organization license. The term "county fair association" as used in this regulation was renamed by the 1994 Legislature in HB 3097. The regulation has been amended to conform to the statutory change.

**K.A.R. 112-17-3. Site and physical plant, fair association and horsemen's nonprofit organization applicant.** When applying for an organization license, the horsemen's nonprofit organization and fair associations must provide the information set out in this regulation regarding the site and physical plant at the racetrack facility. The term "county fair association" as used in this regulation was renamed by the 1994 Legislature in HB 3097. The regulation has been amended to conform to the statutory change.

**K.A.R. 112-17-4. Financial resources, fair associations and horsemen's nonprofit organization applicant.** When applying for an organization license, the horsemen's nonprofit groups and fair associations must provide the information set out in this regulation regarding the applicant's financial resources. The term "county fair association" as used in this regulation was renamed by the 1994 Legislature in HB 3097. The regulation has been amended to conform to the statutory change.

**K.A.R. 112-17-5. Financial plan, county fair association and horsemen's nonprofit applicant.** When applying for an organization license, the horsemen's nonprofit groups and fair associations must provide the information set out in the regulation regarding the applicant's financial plan. The term "county fair association" as used in the regulation was renamed by the 1994 Legislature in HB 3097. The regulation has been amended to conform to the statutory change.

**K.A.R. 112-17-6. Governmental actions, fair association and horsemen's nonprofit organization applicant.** When applying for an organization license, the horsemen's nonprofit groups and fair associations must provide the information set out in this regulation regarding the applicant's governmental actions. The term "county fair association" as used in this regulation, was renamed by the 1994 Legislature in HB 3097. The regulation has been amended to conform with the statutory change.

**K.A.R. 112-17-7. Development process, fair association and horsemen's nonprofit organization applicant.** When applying for an organization license, the horsemen's nonprofit groups and fair associations must provide the information set out in this regulation regarding the applicant's development process. The term "county fair association" as used in this regulation was renamed by the 1994 Legislature in HB 3097. The regulation was amended to conform to the statutory change.

**K.A.R. 112-17-8. Management of racetrack facility, fair association and horsemen's nonprofit organization applicant.** Fair associations and horsemen's nonprofit associations applying for an organization license must provide the information set out in this regulation regarding the applicant's management plan. The term "county fair association" as used in this regulation was renamed by the 1994 Legislature in HB 3097. The regulation has been amended to conform to the statutory change.

**K.A.R. 112-17-9. Background investigations, fair association and horsemen's nonprofit organization applicants or licensees.** This regulation allows for background investigations to be conducted on fair association and horsemen's non-profit organization applicants or licensees as defined by the commission. The regulation has been amended to conform to the changes brought about by the 1994 Legislature, specifically HB 3097, wherein the term "county fair association" was changed to "fair association."

**K.A.R. 112-17-10. Additional information, fair association and horsemen's nonprofit organization applicant or licensee.** Fair association and horsemen's nonprofit associations applying for an organization license must provide additional information to facilitate the review of the initial license or any subsequent license as requested by the commission. The regulation was amended pursuant to changes by the 1994 Legislature, specifically HB 3097, wherein the term "county fair association" was changed to "fair association."

**K.A.R. 112-17-11. Financial audit, fair association and horsemen's nonprofit organization licensee.** Fair associations and non-profit associations applying for an organization license must provide a financial audit in accordance with commission direction. This regulation was amended in accordance with 1994 legislative changes, specifically HB 3097, wherein the term "county fair association" was renamed "fair association."

**K.A.R. 112-17-12. Licensee file, fair association and horsemen's nonprofit organization licensee.** The commission shall provide and maintain a license file on any fair association or horsemen's nonprofit organization granted an organization license, which shall contain each exhibit, statement, report or any other documentation submitted in support of the application. The regulation was amended pursuant to changes by the 1994 Legislature, specifically HB 3097, wherein the term "county fair association" was changed to "fair association."

**K.A.R. 112-17-13. Testing for controlled substance, fair association and horsemen's nonprofit organization licensees.** This regulation allows for fair association and horsemen's nonprofit organization licensees to be required to submit to tests to determine whether they are users of any controlled substances. This regulation was changed to comply with 1994 legislative changes in HB 3097, wherein the term "county fair association" was changed to "fair association."

**K.A.R. 112-17-15. Distribution of monies, from horse fair racing benefit fund.** This regulation establishes a procedure for distribution of monies from the horse fair racing benefit fund. The amendment in this regulation conforms to 1994 legislative changes, specifically HB 2577, wherein the term "County Fair Horse Racing Ben-

efit" is renamed the "Horse Fair Racing Benefit Fund." The amendments in this regulation reflect the change.

**Economic Impact:** The changes in the above regulations are a result of amendments to the Kansas Parimutuel Racing Act made during the 1994 legislative session. There are no additional costs anticipated to the agency or any other governmental agency as a result of the changes.

### Notice of Hearing on Proposed Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted at 10 a.m. Saturday, March 18, at the alumni conference room on the fourth floor of VMT, Kansas State University, College of Veterinary Medicine, Manhattan, to consider proposed changes to K.A.R. 70-5-1, amount of fees.

This 30-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the executive director, Board of Veterinary Medical Examiners, 10475 Purple Sage Road, Wamego, 66547. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulations during the hearing.

The purpose of this regulation change is to bring current fees for NBE and CCT testing into line with the increase in the fees being charged by the testing service for these examinations. This change is not mandated by federal law. Students or veterinarians taking the examinations will bear the cost of this increase in fees by the testing service. There is no less costly method for achieving the stated purposes, as the board is increasing its fee to offset the increased fee by the testing service. This change is being requested by the Board of Veterinary Medical Examiners. It is not expected to result in a significant effect on any other governmental agency, business, individual or the state economy.

**Counties and County Officers—County Commissioners—Powers of Board of Commissioners; Designation of Smoking Area in Courthouse.**

**Crimes and Punishments; Kansas Criminal Code; Prohibited Conduct—Crimes Involving Violations of Personal Rights—Smoking in a Public Place.** Robert F. Frey, Haskell County Counselor, Wichita, February 1, 1995.

K.S.A. 21-4010 prohibits smoking in a public place or at a public meeting except in designated smoking areas. The board of county commissioners, as the "proprietor or person in charge" of the county courthouse, has the authority to decide which and whether any areas, other than those used for judicial functions, will be designated as smoking areas. Cited herein: K.S.A. 19-212; K.S.A. 21-4009; 21-4010; 21-4013. NKF

#### Opinion No. 95-16

**Schools—Organization, Powers and Finances of Boards of Education—General Powers of Boards; Use of Property; Community Purposes; Fees.** Representative Kenny A. Wilk, 42nd District, Lansing, February 1, 1995.

The policy of Unified School District No. 458 establishing classifications for assessing fees for use of school facilities is subject to the rational basis test of the equal protection clause, and will not be set aside if any state of facts reasonably may be conceived to justify it. While in our opinion the policy of Unified School District No. 458 does not on its face violate the equal protection clause of the 14th Amendment to the United States Constitution or Section 1 of the Bill of Rights of the Kansas Constitution, a violation could occur depending on actual application of the policy. Cited herein: K.S.A. 72-8212; Kan. Const., bill of rights, § 1; U.S. Const., amend. 14, § 1. RDS

#### Opinion No. 95-17

**Automobiles and Others Vehicles—Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol or Drugs; Related Provisions—Alcohol and Drug Safety Action Program; Presentence**

**Evaluations; Alcohol and Drug Safety Action Assessment.** Michael G. Coash, El Dorado City Attorney, El Dorado, February 6, 1995.

The alcohol and drug safety action fund of the municipal court is the source for payment of presentence evaluations for all persons who are convicted of violating state or municipal laws prohibiting driving under the influence (DUI), or who enter into diversion agreements in lieu of further criminal proceedings on a complaint alleging a violation of state or municipal DUI laws. Furthermore, K.S.A. 8-1008 requires that all individuals who are convicted of violating state or municipal DUI laws or who enter diversion agreements pay an assessment unless the assessment is waived because the court or prosecuting attorney finds that the individual is indigent. Finally, K.S.A. 1994 Supp. 8-1008 mandates the creation of an alcohol and safety action fund. Cited herein: K.S.A. 1994 Supp. 8-1008; 8-1567. MF

#### Opinion No. 95-18

**Constitution of the State of Kansas—Finance and Taxation—System of Taxation; Classification; Recreational Vehicles; Application to Houseboats.** Representative Joann Flower, 47th District, Oskaloosa, February 6, 1995.

While Article 11, Section 1 of the Kansas Constitution allows the legislature to define the class of recreational vehicles entitled to differential tax treatment, any definition adopted by the legislature must bear a reasonable and recognizable similarity to the commonly understood meaning of the term "recreational vehicles" at the time the constitutional provision was adopted. Houseboats do not meet this test and therefore may not be included in a legislative definition of the term "recreational vehicles" for purposes of differential tax treatment. K.S.A. 41-2601; 75-1212; 75-1220; K.S.A. 1994 Supp. 79-5118; Kan. Const., art. 11, § 1; art. 15, § 3a. JLM

#### Opinion No. 95-19

**Taxation—Bingo—Definitions; Call Bingo; Use of Electronic Facilitators.** Representative Tom Bradley, 52nd District, Topeka, February 6, 1995.

FortuNet 2000, as described herein, is a facilitator which serves as an electronic card for use in legal bingo operations. As such, its use is consistent with the definition of "call bingo" in K.S.A. 1994 Supp. 79-4701(b). Furthermore, FortuNet 2000 does not meet the definition of a "gambling device" as used in K.S.A. 1994 Supp. 21-4302. Cited herein: K.S.A. 1994 Supp. 21-4302; 21-4303; 79-4701; Kan. The district does not intend to designate the bonds as "qualified tax-exempt obligations" under Section 265 of the code.

The bonds will be sold subject to the legal opinion of Perry, Hamill & Fillmore, L.C., Overland Park, Kansas, bond counsel, whose approving legal opinion as to the validity of the bonds will be furnished and paid for by the district, printed on the bonds and delivered to the successful bidder when the bonds are delivered. Said opinion will also state that in the opinion of bond counsel, assuming continued compliance by the district with the provisions of the resolution authorizing the issuance of the bonds and the code, under existing law, the interest on the bonds is excludable from federal income taxation. Under present law, interest on the bonds is also excludable from the computation of Kansas adjusted gross income.

### Delivery and Payment

The district will pay for printing the bonds and will deliver the bonds, without cost to the successful bidder, properly prepared, executed and registered, on or about March 22, 1995, at such bank or trust company in the contiguous 48 states of the United States as may be specified by the successful bidder. The successful bidder shall furnish the district by 4 p.m. central time on March 8, 1995, a certificate acceptable to the district's bond counsel to the effect that (i) the successful bidder has made a bona fide public offering of the bonds at the initial reoffering prices, and (ii) a substantial amount of the bonds was sold to the public (excluding brokers and other intermediaries) at such initial reoffering prices. Such certificate shall state that (1) it is made on the best knowledge, information and belief of the successful bidder, and (2) 10 percent or more of the par amount of the bonds of each maturity was sold to the public at or below the initial reoffering prices (such amount being sufficient to establish the sale of a "substantial amount" of the bonds).

### Good Faith Deposit

#### **Date and Delivery of Preliminary and Final Official Statement**

The district has authorized the preparation and disbursement of a preliminary official statement containing information relating to the bonds and the district. The preliminary official statement comprises the final official statement required by Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities and Exchange Commission.

The preliminary official statement, when amended to include the interest rates specified by the underwriter(s) and the price or yield at which the underwriter(s) will reoffer the bonds to the public, together with any other information required by law, will constitute a "Final Official Statement" with respect to the bonds as that term is defined in Rule 15c2-12. No more than seven business days after the date of the sale, the district will provide without cost to the underwriter(s) such reasonable number of copies of the final official statement as such underwriter(s) may request. Further copies, if desired, will be made available at the underwriter's expense. If the sale of the bonds is awarded to a syndicate, the district will designate the senior managing underwriter of the syndicates as its agent for purposes of distributing copies of the final official statement to each participating underwriter. Any underwriter executing and delivering a bid form with respect to the bonds agrees thereby that if the bid is accepted it shall accept such designation and shall enter into a contractual relationship with all participating underwriters for the purpose of assuring the receipt and distribution by each such participating underwriter of the final official statement.

The district will deliver to the underwriters on the date of delivery of the bonds a certificate executed by the president and the district clerk to the effect that the final official statement, as of the date of delivery of the bonds, does not contain any untrue statement of a material fact or omit to state a material fact necessary to make the statements made, in the light of the circumstances in which they are made, not misleading.

#### **Optional Municipal Bond Insurance**

The district has applied to AMBAC Indemnity Corporation (AMBAC), Capital Guaranty Insurance Company (CAPITAL), Financial Guaranty Insurance Company (FGIC) and Municipal Bond Investors Assurance Corporation (MBIA) for a commitment for municipal bond insurance relating to the bonds. A notice as to the issuance of a commitment for municipal bond insurance relating to the bonds from any of the insurers will be provided to prospective bidders prior to the date of sale. If a commitment is issued by an insurer, the bonds may be pur-

chased with or without this insurance at the option of the successful bidder. All expenses associated with the purchase of said insurance (including appropriate rating agency fees) will be the responsibility of the successful bidder. The amount of such premium and rating agency fees may be obtained from AMBAC, CAPITAL, FGIC or MBIA. The insurance policy, if purchased, will insure the timely payment of the principal of and interest on the bonds. Bidders desiring to purchase the optional municipal bond insurance must so indicate on the official bid form. \*

#### **Bond Rating**

The district has not applied for an independent rating on the bonds herein offered for sale. If the successful bidder elects to purchase the bonds with municipal bond insurance, Standard & Poor's Ratings Group and Moody's Investors Service, Inc. will assign their ratings of "AAA" and "Aaa," respectively, to this issue with the understanding that upon delivery of the bonds, a policy insuring the payment when due of the principal of and interest on the bonds will be issued by AMBAC, CAPITAL, FGIC or MBIA.

#### **Secondary Market Disclosure**

The district, pursuant to K.S.A. 75-1122, must have its accounts examined and audited by a licensed municipal public accountant or a certified public accountant at least once a year. Pursuant to the Kansas Open Records Act (K.S.A. 45-215 et seq.), it is the public policy of the state of Kansas that all public records of the district be open for inspection by any person. The financial condition of the district, including assessed values, tax collection effort and revenue and fund balances, are typically the type of information which falls within the area of the information subject to disclosure under the Kansas Open Records Act. Thus, any broker, dealer or other interested person or entity may contact the clerk of the district for any information concerning the district. If copies of documents are requested, upon the district receiving advance payment for the fees and expenses of providing same, such copies will be provided.

The Securities and Exchange Commission has enacted the proposed change to SEC Rule 15c2-12, which requires continuing disclosure through a central repository; the district will covenant to comply with such continuing disclosure to the extent applicable.

#### **Assessed Valuation and Indebtedness**

The total assessed valuation of the taxable tangible property within the district as of November 1, 1994, is \$40,168,716 (this includes motor vehicles' value of \$8,072,628). The total general obligation bonded indebtedness of the district as of the date of the bonds, including the bonds, is \$14,275,000.

Article 4.—OCCUPATION LICENSES

112-4-1. Occupation licenses. (a) Before engaging in the following occupations at a racetrack facility, each person shall pay the required fee and secure the appropriate license or licenses from the commission:

- (1) administration; (2) administrative support; (3) admission or parking attendant; (4) amateur jockey; (5) announcer; (6) apprentice jockey; (7) assistant racing secretary; (8) assistant starter; (9) assistant trainer; (10) authorized agent; (11) blacksmith, plater or farrier; (12) breed registry; (13) brakeman; (14) chart writer; (15) clerk of scales; (16) clocker or assistant clocker; (17) colors attendant; (18) concession employee; (19) concession operator; (20) director of racing; (21) director of security; (22) driver; (23) exercise person; (24) general manager or assistant general manager; (25) groom or hot walker; (26) horseman's bookkeeper; (27) horseman or kennel representative; (28) identifier; (29) jockey;

- (30) jockey agent;
- (31) jockey guild manager or representative;
- (32) jockey room attendant;
- (33) kennel helper;
- (34) kennel master;
- (35) kennel owner;
- (36) lead out;
- (37) lure operator;
- (38) maintenance;
- (39) medical attendant;
- (40) mutuel employee;
- (41) mutuel manager;
- (42) official;
- (43) outrider;
- (44) owner, horse or greyhound;
- (45) owner or assistant trainer;
- (46) owner or trainer;
- (47) owner, trainer or driver;
- (48) owner by open claim;
- (49) paddock attendant;
- (50) paddock judge;
- (51) patrol judge;
- (52) photo finish operator;
- (53) pony person;
- (54) practicing veterinarian;
- (55) practicing veterinarian technician or assistant;

(b) Each applicant for an occupation license shall apply in writing on the application form approved and furnished by the commission.

(c) Each applicant for an occupation license acting as an employer shall submit proof of compliance with the workers compensation act of the state of Kansas, K.S.A. 44-501 *et seq.*

(d) Each person who is appointed by an owner to act as an authorized agent shall secure an occupation license. Each authorized agent agreement form shall be filed with the commission. Each authorized agent shall perform for the owner only the duties that are the subject of the authorized agent agreement form. Each authorized agent shall notify the commission in writing when the authorized agent agreement is terminated.

(e) Each applicant for an occupation license shall not knowingly provide false information on any occupation license application form.

(f) Each applicant for an occupation license shall not fail to disclose any material fact on any occupation license application form.

(g) No person shall alter or attempt to alter any information contained on an occupation license badge.

(h) Each person who loses an occupation license shall immediately:

(1) notify the commission office at the racetrack facility;

(2) secure a duplicate license; and

(3) pay the required fee.

(i) Each required fee shall be paid when the occupation license is issued. Occupation licenses issued by the commission shall be for one-year or three-year periods. Each one-year or annual license shall be valid for a period commencing January 1 and terminating December 31 of the calendar year for which license is issued. Each three-year or triennial license shall be valid for a period commencing January 1 and terminating December 31 of the third year following the calendar year for which the triennial license is issued. For any subsequent year following the first year a three-year license is issued, the licensee shall complete a validation form approved by the commission and shall be issued current validation stickers to be properly displayed on the licensee's badge prior to being admitted to a racetrack facility.

(j) An ARCI computer check shall be run annually on all licensees. ARCI computer checks shall also be run at the time of validation of each three-year license.

(k) Any applicant may be required to submit with the application or validation form at least two complete sets of fingerprint cards approved by the commission. If the fingerprints are not acceptable for processing, each applicant shall be required to resubmit fingerprint cards.

(l) Each applicant for an occupation license must be at least 16 years old. However, this provision shall not preclude dependent children under the age of 16 from working for a parent or guardian when the parent or guardian is licensed as a kennel owner, trainer or assistant trainer and approval has been obtained from the organization licensee. Each licensed trainer at a horse or greyhound racetrack facility or assistant trainer at a horse racetrack facility shall be at least 18 years of age. Each racing official, security employee and mutuel employee shall be at least 18 years of age.

(m) Each employer at a racetrack facility shall ensure that every employee is properly licensed and shall immediately notify the commission office at the racetrack facility and the organization licensee when a licensee's employment status changes or when an employee is terminated. Each employer shall make an effort to secure the employee's occupation license and, if the license is secured, shall deliver the license to the commission office at the racetrack facility. RegulationsArticle 1.—EMBALMING; CONTINUING  
EDUCATION OF EMBALMERS AND  
FUNERAL DIRECTORS

**63-1-3. Registration and apprenticeship.** (a) In order to be granted an embalmer license the following educational requirements shall be met: Each applicant shall enroll in an approved school of mortuary science offering at least an AA degree in mortuary science, while accumulating during this training at least 30 semester hours in mortuary science.

(b) Each person desiring to enter the practice of embalming dead human bodies within the state of Kansas shall apply to the board for a "certificate of registration" in order to take the embalmer's examination. Application forms provided by the board shall be used. Each application form shall be accompanied by:

(1) official transcripts from approved institutions of higher learning showing the applicant has met the educational requirements of K.S.A. 65-1701a, as amended, or their equivalent;

(2) verification that the applicant completed a mortuary science program that results in at least an AA degree in mortuary science and is accredited by the American board of funeral service education; and

(3) the fee as prescribed in K.A.R. 63-4-1.

(c) The applicant may file a "certificate of completion" in lieu of a transcript if a transcript is unavailable at the time of application. A transcript shall be filed with the board prior to beginning the apprenticeship.

(d) Upon passing the examination, each applicant shall be registered under a licensed Kansas embalmer or embalmers or an embalmer who shall be approved by the board for an embalmer apprenticeship. Each licensee under whom an apprentice is registered shall file quarterly reports of progress with the board. Upon successful completion of the apprenticeship and payment of the prorated biennial fee, an embalmer's license shall be issued by the board. An apprentice embalmer shall successfully complete one year of apprenticeship in the practice of embalming dead human bodies in order to be qualified for an embalmer license. In order for an embalmer apprenticeship to be successfully completed:

(1) the apprentice shall file quarterly reports with the board on forms approved by the board concerning the apprentice's progress in the practice of embalming;

(2) the supervising embalmer shall file quarterly reports with the board on forms approved by the board concerning the apprentice's progress in the practice of embalming; and

(3) the progress reports shall indicate acceptable progress of the apprentice's practice of embalming.

(e) If either the apprentice or the supervising embalmer fail to timely submit a quarterly report to the board, that quarter may not be counted toward successful completion of the apprenticeship. Timely submission of

a quarterly report shall be within ten days following the conclusion of the quarter.

(f) At the conclusion of one year of apprenticeship, the apprentice shall be required to appear before the board. If the board determines acceptable progress by the apprentice in the practice of embalming in each quarter of the apprenticeship, the apprentice shall be granted a license to practice embalming. If the board determines the progress of the apprentice is unacceptable in one or more quarters of the apprenticeship, the apprentice shall be required to successfully complete one or more additional quarters of an embalming apprenticeship.

(g) Each transcript and record filed with the board shall become part of the board's permanent files and records.

(h) If the applicant does not pass the examination within two years from the date of first application, that application shall automatically be canceled. Time served in the armed forces shall not be counted in computing this period. If the applicant desires to re-apply, the applicant shall make a new application in accordance with subsection (b).

(i) If an apprentice embalmer fails to complete the apprenticeship within two years following the successful completion of the examination, the apprenticeship shall be canceled. The board may grant an extension of up to one year in cases of illness. Each application for extension shall be submitted on the form provided by the board. Time served in the armed forces shall not be counted in computing this period. If the applicant later desires to complete the apprenticeship, the applicant shall first re-take and pass the embalmer's examination.

(j) Each applicant who passes the examination shall receive credit toward the apprenticeship for time spent in the armed forces if the applicant's primary duties were preparation of, and caring for, dead human bodies under the supervision of a person holding a valid embalmer's license in any state. The supervising licensee shall certify as to the duties of the applicant.

(k) Each embalmer apprentice shall serve full-time. "Full-time" means employed 40 hours per week for 50 weeks per year and available to assist in embalming 24 hours per day. ## Article 2.—FUNERAL DIRECTING

**63-2-3. Responsibilities of funeral director.** (a) A Kansas funeral director shall not have charge of more than one funeral establishment.

(b) Any Kansas licensed funeral director owning or having an interest in more than one Kansas funeral establishment shall employ at all times, for each of these establishments, a Kansas licensed funeral director, who

shall have personal supervision and charge of the establishments.

(c) A funeral, or any portion of it, and all at-need funeral arrangements shall not be conducted without a licensed funeral director or assistant funeral director being present. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-1704; implementing K.S.A. 65-1713a; effective Jan. 1, 1966; amended Jan. 1, 1967; amended May 1, 1978; amended May 1, 1982; amended May 1, 1983; amended May 1, 1987; amended April 3, 1995.)

**63-2-12. Funeral director apprenticeship.** "Funeral director apprentice" means a licensed assistant funeral director who is completing practical experience in funeral directing under the supervision of a licensed funeral director.

(a) An embalmer and funeral director apprenticeship may be served concurrently upon appropriate licensure and registration with the board.

(b) A funeral director apprentice may be licensed as an assistant funeral director and registered under a licensed funeral director only if the apprentice is employed at that funeral director's funeral establishment full-time. "Full-time" means employed 40 hours per week for 50 weeks per year and available to assist in funeral directing 24 hours per day.

(c) Any time served in a funeral director apprenticeship under the direction or supervision by any person other than a Kansas licensed funeral director shall not be credited by the board toward apprenticeship requirements.

(d) Each funeral director apprentice and the supervising licensed funeral director shall notify the board if the apprentice leaves the employ of the funeral director or if the apprenticeship is terminated for any other reason prior to completion. A supervising licensed funeral director who fails or refuses to so notify the board without showing just cause to the board shall not subsequently be considered eligible to supervise a funeral director apprentice.

(e) If the licensed funeral director dies during the apprenticeship, three affidavits from reputable citizens having knowledge of the apprenticeship may be accepted by the board in lieu of the funeral director's verification of apprenticeship. The affidavits shall include the dates of the apprenticeship.

(f) An apprentice funeral director shall successfully complete one year of apprenticeship in the practice of funeral directing in order to be qualified for a funeral director license. In order for the apprenticeship to be successfully completed:

(1) the apprentice shall file quarterly reports with the board on forms approved by the board concerning the practice of funeral directing;

(2) the supervising funeral director shall file quarterly reports with the board on forms approved by the board concerning the apprentice's progress in the practice of funeral directing; and

(3) the progress reports shall indicate acceptable progress of the apprentice's practice of funeral directing.

(g) If either the apprentice or supervising funeral director fail to timely submit a quarterly report to the board,

that quarter may not be counted toward successful completion of the apprenticeship. Timely submission of a quarterly report shall be within ten days following the conclusion of the quarter.

(h) At the conclusion of one year of apprenticeship, the apprentice shall be required to appear before the board. If the board determines the progress of the apprentice is unacceptable in one or more of the quarters of the apprenticeship, the apprentice shall be required to successfully complete one or more additional quarters of a funeral director apprenticeship.

(i) An apprentice funeral director shall successfully complete a funeral director apprenticeship to be considered eligible to take the funeral director examination. (Authorized by K.S.A. 65-1723; implementing K.S.A. 65-1714, 65-1717; effective May 1, 1976; amended May 1, 1980; amended May 1, 1987; amended April 3, 1995.)

#### Article 6.—CONTINUING EDUCATION

**63-6-1. Continuing education requirements.** (a) Except as provided in subsection (e), each licensed embalmer or funeral director in this state shall submit with his or her license renewal application satisfactory proof of completion of a minimum of six clock-hours per year of continuing education credit approved by the board. A licensee filing proof of completion of continuing education credit with the board on forms approved by the board shall file each topic separately. Compliance with this required continuing education requirement shall be a prerequisite for an embalmer or funeral director license renewal.

(b) Continuing education credit may be obtained by attending and participating in continuing education courses or workshops previously approved by the board or which otherwise meet the requirements stated in K.A.R. 63-6-2 and are approved by the board.

(c) Any licensee desiring to obtain credit for completing more than 12 hours of approved continuing education credits during any two licensure years, shall report this carry-over credit to the board on or before the expiration of the license's current licensure renewal. The carry-over credit shall be limited to no more than six clock-hours.

(d) Continuing education requirements for individuals newly licensed shall be waived for the first-time renewal of a license.

(e) No more than six hours shall be granted for any one approved continuing education topic. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 65-1702, 65-1716; effective May 1, 1988; amended Jan. 6, 1992; amended April 3, 1995.)

**63-6-2. Standards for approval.** (a) A continuing education course or workshop shall be qualified for approval if the board determines that it:

(1) Constitutes an organized program of learning, including a symposium, which contributes directly to the professional competency of the licensee;

(2) is related to the profession of mortuary science, funeral directing or embalming;

(3) is conducted by individuals considered experts in the subject matter of the program by reason of education, training or experience; and

(continued)



(4) is accompanied by a paper, manual or written outline which substantially describes the subject matter and length of the program.

(b) Continuing education credit not exceeding three credit-hours of the annual total required hours may be approved by the board for:

- (1) correspondence work;
- (2) video, sound-recorded, or television programs; or
- (3) information transmitted by other similar means as authorized by the board; or

(4) community service programs which are directly related to the profession of mortuary science, funeral directing or embalming.

(c) Continuing education credit for service as a lecturer or discussion leader may be approved by the board to the extent that it contributes to the professional competence of the applicant. Repetitious presentations shall not be counted. Not more than 50 percent of total required hours may be satisfied in this manner.

(d) The maximum number of credit hours which shall be granted for any single continuing education course or workshop single topic is six.

(e) The board shall periodically furnish lists of approved continuing education programs to licensed funeral establishments and to licensees not employed by a licensed Kansas funeral establishment.

(f) A person or organization requesting approval for a continuing education course or a workshop shall make application at least 30 days prior to the date of each proposed course or workshop. Applications filed not meeting this deadline shall be reviewed by the board at their next regularly scheduled meeting. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 65-1702, 65-1716; effective May 1, 1988; amended April 3, 1995.)

**63-6-3. Post approval and review.** (a) Each individual licensed embalmer or funeral director seeking continuing education credit for attendance or participation in a program or activity that has not been approved shall submit to the board, within 30 days after completion of the program or activity, the dates, subject matter, instructors and their qualifications if applicable, description of activity if applicable and number of credit hours requested on forms provided by the board. A complete written outline describing the subject matter or activity and time of the program shall accompany all requests. Within 90 days after receipt of the application, the licensee seeking credit shall be advised by the board, in writing and by mail, whether the activity is approved and the number of credit hours allowed. Any licensee may be denied credit if the licensee fails to comply with the requirements of this subsection.

(b) Review of programs. Any continuing education program already approved by the board may be monitored or reviewed by the board, and upon evidence of significant variation in the program presented from the program approved, all or any part of the program may be disapproved. 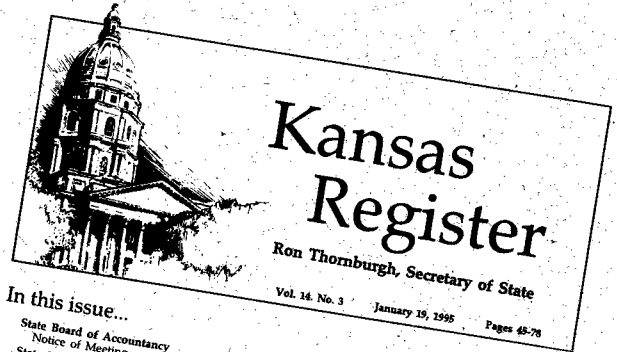
