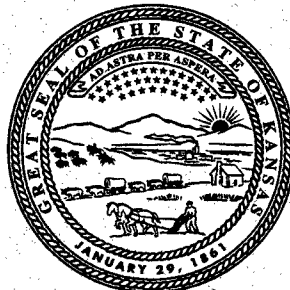

Attorney General**Opinion No. 95-26**

State Departments; Public Officers and Employees—Public Records—State Records Board; Appointment of Records Officer by State Agencies. Patricia Michaelis, Director, Kansas State Historical Society, March 2, 1995.

The applicable definition of "state agency," as used in rules and regulations adopted by the State Records Board pursuant to K.S.A. 75-3504, is set forth in K.S.A. 45-402. Under that definition, and for purposes of appointing a records officer as provided by K.A.R. 53-4-1, the deferred compensation unit of the Department of Administration is a state agency. However, Kansas Advocacy and Protective Services, Inc. is not a state agency for purposes of K.A.R. 53-4-1 and therefore need not appoint a records officer. Opinion No. 95-27

Elections—Registration of Voters—Application for Registration; Form Approved by Secretary of State; Effect of Alteration by Applicant. Ron Thornburgh, Secretary of State, Topeka, March 2, 1995.

An application for registration to vote which has been materially altered by the person submitting the application should be rejected by the county election officer, and the registration pursuant to submission of an incomplete or incorrect application is void. A person who has made material alterations to the application for registration does not meet the qualifications necessary to be a candidate for member of a board of education and such person's name should not appear on the ballot. If such person's name does appear on the ballot, votes cast for such person may not be ignored by the county board of canvassers, but must be counted and declared as part of the results. If a certificate of nomination is issued to a person who does not meet the qualifications necessary to be a candidate for member of a board of education, objection to the person's nomination may be filed in accordance with K.S.A. 25-308. The objection will then be considered by the county election officer, clerk of the district court

Opinion No. 95-28

Elections—Sufficiency of Petitions—Determination of Sufficiency of Petitions; Question to Be Submitted Filed With County or District Attorney Prior to Circulation. Larry K. King, Chautauqua County Counselor, Sedan, March 2, 1995.

The requirement that a petition be filed in the office of the county or district attorney for an opinion regarding the legality of the form of the question is mandatory, and those signatures collected prior to meeting this requirement are invalid. Those signatures added to the petition after the petition was filed in the office of the county or district attorney pursuant to K.S.A. 25-3601 are not invalidated. Opinion No. 95-29

Public Health—Regulation of Dentists and Dental Hygienists—Act Inapplicable to Certain Practices, Acts and Operations. Senator Sandy Praeger, 2nd District, Lawrence, March 3, 1995.

The dental act is not applicable to unlicensed individuals who, under the supervision of and in the office of a licensed dentist, perform dental services, so long as such persons do not perform any of five dental procedures, including a prophylaxis (K.S.A. 1994 Supp. 65-1423(h)). The term prophylaxis is not defined by the act, but has a commonly accepted definition among dental authorities. Because the legislature clearly intended that unlicensed individuals not perform this procedure, only licensed individuals may perform component parts of a prophylaxis as the term is commonly accepted in the dental profession. Opinion No. 95-30

Counties and County Officers—General Provisions—Home Rule Powers; Charter Resolutions; Severance Tax. Keith D. Hoffman, Dickinson County Counselor, Abilene, March 3, 1995.

It is our opinion that county home rule authority may be utilized to impose a severance tax on rock removed from land located in a county. We do not find any uniformly applicable law preempting local legislation of this type; it is therefore our opinion that K.S.A. 1994 Supp. 19-101a allows the county to impose such a tax. Behavioral Sciences Regulatory Board**Notice of Hearing on Proposed
Administrative Regulations**

The Behavioral Sciences Regulatory Board will conduct a public hearing from 10 to 10:30 a.m. Monday, April 17, in the board conference room at 712 S. Kansas Ave., Topeka, to consider adopting a proposed amendment to increase the examination fee in the existing regulation on social work licensure fees.

This 30-day notice of the public hearing constitutes a public comment period for purposes of receiving written public comments on the proposed amendment. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the executive director, Behavioral Sciences Regulatory Board, 712 S. Kansas Ave., Topeka, 66603-3817. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request each participant to limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

K.A.R. 102-2-3(c) is proposed for amendment to increase the social work examination fee from \$125 to \$150. The board's cost to purchase the national examination has increased from \$90 to \$110. The current fee is not sufficient to cover this cost increase. The proposed increased fee will allow the board to continue to use the national exam and will provide \$10 per applicant to cover administrative costs (\$150 - 20 percent state general fund - \$110 exam cost = \$10).

The board considered other alternatives; however, the social work licensure act requires each applicant to pass an examination approved by the board. Several years ago the board selected, and continues to use, the national social work licensure examination. This exam is used by all states that require examination for credentialing purposes. The continued use of this examination facilitates reciprocity to both incoming applicants from other states and to those Kansas licensees who seek credentialing elsewhere.

There should be minimal or no fiscal impact to the agency because the fee derived by the board is offset by the administrative costs and the cost to purchase the examination. There should be no fiscal impact to the consumer of social work services or to the general public.

Each social work licensure applicant who is required to pass the examination will incur a \$25 increase in the examination fee. Any governmental agency that pays the examination fee for any of its employees will experience a \$25 increase per person.

The Job Training Partnership Act (JTPA) provides federal funds to states to establish programs to prepare youth and adults for entry into the labor force. Under the JTPA, each state is divided into Service Delivery Areas (SDA). Within each SDA private and public sector representatives are appointed to a Private Industry Council (PIC), which is responsible for policy, program development and oversight of programs operated within the SDA. The SDA IV PIC is accepting proposals for oversight services for its administrators/grant recipients, the City of Wichita for Title II programs, and the Kansas Department of Human Resources for Title III programs.

Scope of Work

The PIC and the City of Wichita are seeking an agent qualified to perform oversight activities under JTPA (PL 97-300). Oversight activities include review/analysis of submitted documents, attendance at various meetings, facilitation of the annual PIC planning retreat, and written recommendations to the PIC.

The amount budgeted for this contract is \$19,000. The contract period will be July 1, 1995 through June 30, 1996, with one option to renew the contract under the same terms and conditions for an additional one-year period, by mutual agreement of both parties.

State Conservation Commission**Notice of Hearing on Proposed
Administrative Regulations**

Two public hearings will be conducted to consider the adoption of proposed permanent regulations implementing a Land Reclamation Program. Hearings will be at 1 p.m. Monday, April 17, in the State Conservation Commission conference room, Suite 500, 109 S.W. 9th, Topeka; and at 1 p.m. Tuesday, April 18, in the Fine Arts Building at Barton County Community College, Great Bend. If special accommodations are needed, contact the commission three days in advance of the hearing date.

This 30-day notice period prior to the hearing constitutes a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments to the commission prior to the hearing at the address above.

All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity at the hearing to express their views orally in regard to the adoption of the proposed regulations. A copy of the full text of the regulations and the economic impact statement may be reviewed or obtained at the commission office. The following is a summary of the proposed regulations:

K.A.R. 11-8-1. Definitions. This section defines who is affected by the regulations, that portion of the mine site subject to reclamation and different classes of mine sites.

Economic Impact Summary: No economic impact will occur from this regulation.

K.A.R. 11-8-2. Mining license renewal. This regulation establishes the procedures and fee for renewing a mining license. The fee is based upon the tons of material extracted by each mine operator.

Economic Impact Summary: The commission will realize approximately \$10,000 in revenue from 125 licenses being renewed. Revenue to the commission represents a

cost to private mine operators but no significant impact to the general public.

K.A.R. 11-8-3. Site registration. This regulation requires each mine site to be registered with the commission. Procedures for registration and collection of a registration fee are also established. The fee is based on an operator's acres of affected land and amount of material extracted.

Economic Impact Summary: The first-time registration of approximately 310 sites will generate approximately \$140,000 for the commission to operate the program during its first year. This revenue represents a cost to private mine operators but no significant impact to the general public. After the first year, this fee will be insignificant.

K.A.R. 11-8-4. Site registration renewal. This regulation establishes the renewal fee and procedure to renew site registrations. The fee is the same as the site registration fee established in K.A.R. 11-8-3. The renewal fee is the main source of revenue for funding the program after the first year.

Economic Impact Summary: There will be no impact to the agency or the operator during the first year of the program. In subsequent years, the renewal of approximately 310 sites will generate approximately \$140,000 for the commission at a cost to private mine operators. There will be insignificant impact to the general public.

K.A.R. 11-8-5. Annual report. This regulation requires that a report of mining operations be filed, including any proposed changes to the site reclamation plan or bond.

Economic Impact Summary: The regulation will have an insignificant economic impact.

K.A.R. 11-8-6. Reclamation plan. A reclamation plan is required to be submitted for each registered site. This regulation specifies the items that should be included in a plan, such as a map and description of the post-mining land-use.

Economic Impact Summary: The regulation will have a minor economic impact on the mine operator and no impact on the commission or general public.

K.A.R. 11-8-7. Reclamation requirements. The regulation specifies the technical requirements of reclamation and a time-frame for completion.

Economic Impact Summary: Private operators will bear the cost of reclamation, which will vary from site to site. The public and private benefits of reclamation are estimated to outweigh the costs. The commission and general public are not impacted.

K.A.R. 11-8-8. Bond or other security. The regulation establishes guidelines for estimating the amount of bond or security needed to guarantee reclamation and the financial instruments that may serve as a security.

Economic Impact Summary: There will be no impact to the agency or the general public. The cost of the bond will vary with the type and size of mine. The minimum annual cost per operator for a bond is estimated to be approximately \$50 per site. If the operator submits cash securities, the cost will be insignificant. Entities that sell bonds may receive revenue from this regulation.

Notice of Hearing on Proposed Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted at 10 a.m. Monday, April 17, at the Kansas Insurance Department, 420 S.W. 9th, Topeka, to consider the adoption of new rules and regulations for utilization review organizations.

This 30-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed rules and regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the Commissioner of Insurance, Kansas Insurance Department, 420 S.W. 9th, Topeka, 66612. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulations during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request each participant to limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

The regulations are proposed for adoption on a temporary and a permanent basis. A summary of proposed regulations and their economic impact follows:

K.A.R. 40-4-41. Utilization review organizations; application; definitions. This regulation establishes definitions and criteria applicable to those utilization review organizations which are required to apply for certification with the Kansas Department of Insurance pursuant to K.S.A. 1994 Supp. 40-22a01 et seq.

K.A.R. 40-4-41a. Utilization review organizations; responsibility for requesting certification. This regulation requires the insured individual to initiate the request for utilization review per plan specifications.

K.A.R. 40-4-41b. Utilization review organizations; requirements for collecting information. This regulation requires utilization review organizations to collect only that information necessary to certify the admission, procedure, treatment, or length of stay at issue in the review.

K.A.R. 40-4-41c. Utilization review organizations; written procedures. This regulation requires utilization review organizations to maintain written policies pertaining to timeliness of reviews; procedures for notifications of determinations made concerning all forms of certifi-

cation; and procedures to address the failure of a health care provider, patient, or other representative to provide the necessary information for review.

K.A.R. 40-4-41d. Utilization review organizations; appeal procedures. This regulation requires utilization review organizations to have procedures in place for appeals of a determination made to deny certification for an admission, procedure service or extension of stay.

K.A.R. 40-4-41e. Utilization review organizations; staff requirements. This regulation requires utilization review organizations to have properly trained, qualified and supervised staff.

K.A.R. 40-4-41f. Utilization review organizations; review requirements. This regulation requires utilization review organizations to use clinically substantiated criteria when screening for certification, to use health care provider consultants, and to maintain written documentation of a quality assessment program.

K.A.R. 40-4-41g. Utilization review organizations; access to review staff. This regulation establishes the criteria for assuring access to utilization review staff.

Any entity which conducts utilization review in this state and is now required by K.S.A. 1994 Supp. 40-22a01 et seq. to obtain a certificate from the Commissioner of Insurance may be affected by the above listed regulations.

These regulations may impose new duties on those who are covered by the regulation. There are no additional costs anticipated by implementation of these regulations for those entities regulated.

HOUSE BILL No. 2100

AN ACT concerning public utilities and common carriers under the jurisdiction of the state corporation commission; amending K.S.A. 66-101c, 66-117, 66-151, 66-1,190 and 66-1,203 and repealing the existing sections; also repealing K.S.A. 66-101c, as amended by section 2 of 1995 House Bill No. 2045 and 66-1,203, as amended by section 7 of 1995 House Bill No. 2045.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. K.S.A. 66-101c is hereby amended to read as follows: 66-101c. Every electric public utility doing business in Kansas over which the commission has control shall publish and file with the commission copies of all schedules of rates, joint rates, tolls, charges, classifications and divisions of rates affecting Kansas traffic, either state or interstate, and shall furnish the commission copies of all rules, and regulations and contracts between electric public utilities pertaining to any and all jurisdictional services to be rendered by such electric public utilities. The commission shall have power to prescribe reasonable rules and regulations regarding the printing form and filing of all schedules, tariffs and classifications of all rates, joint rates, tolls, charges of rates and all rules and regulations of such electric public utilities, including such protection of confidentiality as requested by the electric public utility, and the utility's suppliers and customers, for contracts entered into by them, and as the commission determines reasonable and appropriate.

Sec. 2. K.S.A. 66-117 is hereby amended to read as follows: 66-117 (a) Unless the state corporation commission otherwise orders, no common carrier or public utility over which the commission has control shall make effective any changed rate, joint rate, toll, charge or classification

or schedule of charges, or any rule or regulation or practice pertaining to the service or rates of such public utility or common carrier except by filing the same with the commission at least 30 days prior to the proposed effective date. The commission, for good cause, may allow such changed rate, joint rate, toll, charge or classification or schedule of charges, or rule or regulation or practice pertaining to the service or rates of any such public utility or common carrier to become effective on less than 30 days' notice. *If the commission allows a change to become effective on less than 30 days' notice, the effective date of the allowed change shall be the date established in the commission order approving such change, or the date of the order if no effective date is otherwise established.* Any such proposed change shall be shown by filing with the state corporation commission a schedule showing the changes, and such changes shall be plainly indicated by proper reference marks in amendments or supplements to existing tariffs, schedules or classifications, or in new issues thereof.

(b) Whenever any common carrier or public utility governed by the provisions of this act files with the state corporation commission a schedule showing the changes desired to be made and put in force by such public utility or common carrier, the commission either upon complaint or upon its own motion, may give notice and hold a hearing upon such proposed changes. Pending such hearing, the commission may suspend the operation of such schedule and defer the effective date of such change in rate, joint rate, toll, charge or classification or schedule of charges, or any rule or regulation or practice pertaining to the service or rates of any such public utility or common carrier by delivering to such public utility or common carrier a statement in writing of its reasons for such suspension. The commission shall not delay the effective date of the proposed change in rate, joint rate, toll, charge or classification or schedule of charges, or in any rule or regulation or practice pertaining to the service or rates of any such public utility or common carrier, more than 240 days beyond the date the public utility or common carrier filed its application requesting the proposed change. If the commission does not suspend the proposed schedule within 30 days of the date the same is filed by the public utility or common carrier, such proposed schedule shall be deemed approved by the commission and shall take effect on the proposed effective date. If the commission has not issued a final order on the proposed change in any rate, joint rate, toll, charge or classification or schedule of charges, or any rule or regulation or practice pertaining to the service or rates of any such public utility or common carrier, within 240 days after the carrier or utility files its application requesting the proposed change, then the schedule shall be deemed approved by the commission and the proposed change shall be effective immediately, except that (1) for purposes of the foregoing provisions regarding the period of time within which the commission shall act on an application, any amendment to an application for a proposed change in any rate, which increases the amount sought by the public utility or common carrier or substantially alters the facts used as a basis for such requested change of rate, shall, at the option of the commission, be deemed a new application and the 240-day period shall begin again from the date of the filing of the amendment, and (2) if hearings are in process before the commission on a proposed change requested by the public utility or common carrier on the last day of such 240-day period, such period shall be extended to the end of such hearings plus 20 days to allow the commission to prepare and issue its final order.

(c) Except as provided in subsection (b), no change shall be made in any rate, toll, charge or classification or schedule of charges, or joint rates, or in any rule or regulation or practice pertaining to the service or rates of any such public utility or common carrier, without the consent of the commission; and within 30 days after such changes have been authorized by the state corporation commission or become effective as provided in subsection (b), copies of all tariffs, schedules, and classifications, and all rules and regulations, *except those determined to be confidential under rules and regulations adopted by the commission*, shall be filed in every station, office or depot of every such public utility and every common carrier in this state, for public inspection.

(d) Upon a showing by a public utility before the state corporation commission at a public hearing and a finding by the commission that such utility has invested in projects or systems that can be reasonably expected (1) to produce energy from a renewable resource other than nuclear for the use of its customers, (2) to cause the conservation of energy used by its customers, or (3) to bring about the more efficient use of energy by its customers, the commission may allow a return on such investment equal to an increment of from 1/2% to 2% plus an amount equal to the rate of return fixed for the utility's other investment in property found by the commission to be used or required to be used in its services to the

public. The commission may also allow such higher rate of return on investments by a public utility in experimental projects, such as load management devices, which it determines after public hearing to be reasonably designed to cause more efficient utilization of energy and in energy conservation programs or measures which it determines after public hearing provides a reduction in energy usage by its customers in a cost-effective manner.

(e) Except as to the time limits prescribed in subsection (b), proceedings under this section shall be conducted in accordance with the provisions of the Kansas administrative procedure act.

Sec. 3. K.S.A. 66-151 is hereby amended to read as follows: 66-151. *Subject to the provisions of K.S.A. 66-1220a and amendments thereto and rules and regulations regarding protection of confidentiality adopted by the commission pursuant to K.S.A. 66-101c, 66-1,190 and 66-1,203, and amendments thereto*, upon application of any person, the commission shall furnish, free, certified copies of any classification, rates, rules, regulations, or orders; and such certified copies, or printed copies published by authority of the corporation commission, shall be admissible in evidence in any suit, and sufficient to establish the fact that in any charge, rate, rule, order or classification therein contained, and which may be in issue in the trial, is the official act of the corporation commission; and such determinations and orders of the commission shall be prima facie evidence, in any action in which they are offered, of the reasonableness and justness of the classifications, rates and charges involved therein and of all other matters therein found and determined; and after the lapse of thirty days from the time such determination and orders shall be made, no suit then pending to set the same aside, and they remaining in full force and effect, such determinations and orders shall be held to be conclusive as to the matters involved therein. A substantial compliance with the requirements of this act shall be sufficient to give effect to all determinations and orders made and established by the commission.

Sec. 4. K.S.A. 66-1,190 is hereby amended to read as follows: 66-1,190. Every telecommunications public utility doing business in Kansas over which the commission has control shall publish and file with the commission copies of all schedules of rates, joint rates, tolls, charges, classifications and divisions of rates affecting Kansas traffic, either state or interstate, and shall furnish the commission copies of all rules, and regulations and contracts between such telecommunications public utilities pertaining to any and all *jurisdictional* services to be rendered by such telecommunications public utilities. The commission shall have power to prescribe reasonable rules and regulations regarding the *printing form* and filing of all schedules, tariffs and classifications of all rates, joint rates, tolls, and charges and all rules and regulations of such telecommunications public utilities, *including such protection of confidentiality as requested by the telecommunications public utility, and the utility's suppliers and customers, for contracts entered into by them, and as the commission determines reasonable and appropriate.*

Sec. 5. K.S.A. 66-1,203 is hereby amended to read as follows: 66-1,203. Every natural gas public utility doing business in Kansas over which the commission has control shall publish and file with the commission copies of all schedules of rates, joint rates, tolls, charges, classifications and divisions of rates affecting Kansas traffic, either state or interstate, and shall furnish the commission copies of all rules, and regulations and contracts between natural gas public utilities pertaining to any and all *jurisdictional* services to be rendered by such natural gas public utilities. The commission shall have power to prescribe reasonable rules and regulations regarding the *printing form* and filing of all schedules, tariffs and classifications of all rates, joint rates, tolls, charges of rates and all rules and regulations of such natural gas public utility, *including such protection of confidentiality as requested by the natural gas public utility, and the utility's suppliers and customers, for contracts entered into by them, and as the commission determines reasonable and appropriate.*

Sec. 6. K.S.A. 66-101c, 66-117, 66-151, 66-1,190 and 66-1,203 are hereby repealed.

Sec. 7. On and after July 1, 1995, K.S.A. 66-101c, as amended by section 2 of 1995 House Bill No. 2045 and 66-1,203, as amended by section 7 of 1995 House Bill No. 2045 are hereby repealed.

Sec. 8. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the Kansas register.
