Public Notice

The change in the payment methods and standards for setting Medicaid nursing facilities (NFs) and NFs-mental health (NFs-MH) payment rates for services beginning July 1, 1995, involves the percentage of the median for setting the upper payment limit for the administration cost center. The administration cost center limit shall be set at 115 percent of the median. With this exception, all other features of the payment system shall remain.

The expected estimated annual aggregate decrease in expenditures for state fiscal year 1996, due to the change in upper payment limit for the administration cost center, is \$592,000.

The agency is changing its methods and standards to continue to assure that payment rates are reasonable and adequate to meet the costs which must be incurred by efficiently and economically operated facilities to provide services in conformity with applicable state and federal laws, regulations, and quality and safety standards.

Attorney General**Opinion No. 95-53**

Corporations—Merger or Consolidation—Merger or Consolidation of Domestic Nonstock Corporations; Credit Unions. John Smith, Administrator, Kansas State Department of Credit Unions, Topeka, May 26, 1995.

A nonprofit nonstock corporation such as a credit union may merge or consolidate with another type of financial institution, whether that institution is for profit or not. However, a credit union is not authorized to convert into another type of financial institution. Cited herein: K.S.A. 17-2201; 17-6101; K.S.A. 1994 Supp. 17-6705; 17-6707; K.S.A. 17-6801. CN

Procedure, Civil—Rules of Evidence; General Provisions—Definitions; Burden of Proof; Professional License or Registration Disciplinary Proceedings. Mary Ann Gabel, Executive Director, Behavioral Sciences Regulatory Board, Topeka, May 26, 1995.

Clear and convincing evidence is not a quantum of proof, but rather a quality of proof. In a professional license or registration disciplinary proceeding, an agency should establish its claim by a preponderance of the evidence which is clear and convincing in nature. Evidence is clear if it is certain, unambiguous, and plain to the understanding. It is convincing if it is reasonable and persuasive enough to cause the trier of facts to believe it. Taxation—Sale of Personal Property for Taxes—Collection of Delinquent Taxes; Tax Lien; Time of Attachment. Representative Tom Bradley, 52nd District, Topeka, June 2, 1995.

The judgment and lien created by K.S.A. 1994 Supp. 79-2017 and 79-2101 become effective as between the parties upon filing the abstract of taxes with the clerk of the district court. The clerk's failure to enter the amount of taxes in the appearance docket or note such in the general index is of no consequence, except potentially as to third parties searching the records. Opinion No. 95-56

Counties and County Officers—Fire Protection; Districts in More Than One County—Fire Districts in Two or More Counties; Detachment of Territory. Glenn A. Richards, Trustee, Lincoln Township Board, Abilene, June 2, 1995.

When a township detaches from a benefit fire district organized pursuant to K.S.A. 19-3624, the township is liable for its proportional share of all outstanding indebtedness of the district on the date the detachment resolution is passed by the governing board of the district. The distribution of the holdings of such fire district is within the authority and control of the governing body of the

district. All tax revenue, including delinquent taxes, generated in order to carry out the purposes of the benefit district must be distributed to the governing body of the district. Cited herein: K.S.A. 1994 Supp. 19-3601a; K.S.A. 19-3611; 19-3624; 19-3625; 19-3626; 19-3627; 19-3631; 19-3631a. CN

Opinion No. 95-57

Intoxicating Liquors and Beverages—Licensing and Related Provisions; City Option—Qualifications for Licensure; Residency Requirement for Corporations Seeking Microbrewery License. Senator Robert J. Vancrum, 11th District, Overland Park, June 2, 1995.

Legislative acts are presumed valid, particularly those enacted under the state's 21st amendment authority to regulate the traffic of liquor. Thus, while the justification for the corporate residency requirement for obtaining a microbrewery license is not apparent on the face of the statute, we cannot conclude that it is unconstitutional. Public Health—Maternity Centers and Child Care Facilities—Definitions Relating to Child Care Facilities; Shawnee County Youth Center. Sandra L. Jacquot, Shawnee County Counselor, Topeka, June 6, 1995.

The Shawnee County Youth Center is a "child care facility" subject to licensure and regulation by the Kansas Department of Health and Environment. Consequently, persons who have been convicted of certain misdemeanors are prohibited from working there. Cited herein: K.S.A. 1994 Supp. 38-1602; 65-501; 65-503; 65-516; K.A.R. 28-4-350. MF

Cities and Municipalities—Public Improvements; Sewage and Drainage—Sewage Service Charges by Cities; Liens on Rental Property.

Cities and Municipalities—Franchises—Franchise Provision for Billing and Collection of Sewer Service Charges by Water Company. Representative Don Myers, 82nd District, Derby, June 7, 1995.

Pursuant to K.S.A. 12-631g and 12-631k, a city has the authority to establish sewer service charges and impose liens on real property if such charges are not paid regardless whether the collecting agent is a private company operating under a franchise agreement with the city, or the city itself. Furthermore, a city may impose a lien on a landlord's property for unpaid utility charges even if it was the tenant who incurred the charges. Cited herein: K.S.A. 12-631g; 12-631k; 12-2003. MF

Jackson, Topeka, to adopt K.A.R. 28-29-84 and 28-29-85 concerning solid waste permit fees and solid waste tonnage fees.

K.A.R. 28-29-84 is being amended to implement the 1994 legislative changes to K.S.A. 65-3407(e). The legislative changes mandate a differential fee schedule for construction and demolition landfills based upon the volume of waste to be received. Presently, K.A.R. 28-29-84 provides for an initial permit fee of \$1,000 and an annual renewal fee of \$500.

The proposed amendment provides for fees based on three categories of waste to be received at the facility. The categories are divided into facilities receiving more than 10,000 tons annually, facilities receiving 1,000 to 10,000 tons annually, and facilities receiving under 1,000 tons annually. Initial permit fees are \$1,000, \$500 and \$250 respectively. Renewal fees are \$500, \$250 and \$125. The amendment to the regulation will reduce both the initial permit fee and the annual renewal fee, with a cost savings to the regulated community.

K.A.R. 28-29-85 is being amended to allow operators of solid waste disposal facilities an additional period of time to submit their solid waste tonnage reports and fees to the state. Facilities receiving more than 50,000 tons annually would file their tonnage reports and pay their fees on or before the last day of the month. Facilities receiving less than 50,000 tons annually would file their reports and submit their fees on or before the last day of April, July, October and January. In both cases, this will result in a two week extension of the time that facilities currently have to submit their fees. The amendment to the regulation will reduce the possibility of the regulated community being subject to the late processing fee.

A public hearing was conducted January 26, 1995, on the regulations. No representatives of the public attended the hearing, and one written comment was received in support of the regulations.

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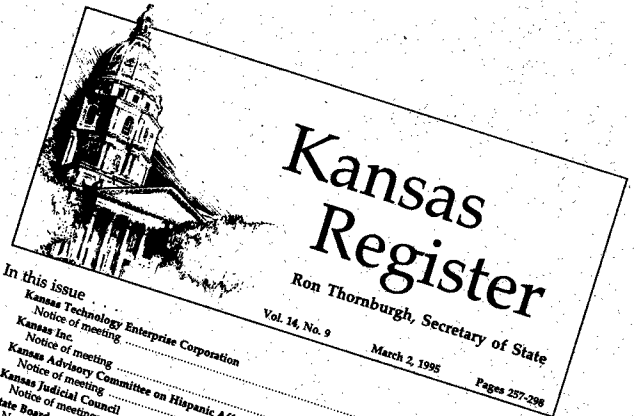
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
