Notice of Hearing on Proposed
Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted by the Wildlife and Parks Commission at 7 p.m. Thursday, August 24, at the Wichita Airport Hilton, 2098 Airport Road, Wichita, to consider the approval and adoption of one department regulation and to establish the 1995-1996 waterfowl seasons. There will be a public comment period at the beginning of the evening meeting for any issues not on the agenda and additional comment periods will be available during the meeting on agenda items.

A workshop meeting on business of the Wildlife and Parks Commission will begin at 1:30 p.m. August 24 at the location listed above. The public also will be given the opportunity to comment on any nonagenda items at the beginning of the meeting, and on agenda items during the meeting. The meeting will recess at 5 p.m., then resume at 7 p.m. at the same location for the regulatory hearing. Old and new business may also be discussed at this time. If necessary to complete the hearing or other business matters, the commission will reconvene at 9 a.m. August 25 at the location listed above.

If notified in advance, the department will have an interpreter available for the hard of hearing. To contact the department for this or any other reason, members of the public with a hearing impairment may call the TDD service at 1-800-766-3777. All public meeting areas are accessible to those who are physically disabled.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and

may request the proposed regulation and economic impact statement in an accessible format. Requests for accommodations should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contacting Brenda Dean at (316) 672-5911.

This 60-day notice period prior to the hearing constitutes a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulation.

All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the chairman of the commission, Kansas Department of Wildlife and Parks, Suite 502, Landon State Office Building, 900 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, 66612. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity at the hearing to express their views orally in regard to the adoption of the proposed regulation. During the hearing, all written and oral comments submitted by interested parties will be considered by the commission as a basis for approving, amending and approving, or rejecting the proposed regulation.

The regulation to be heard during the regulatory hearing portion of the meeting is as follows:

K.A.R. 115-18-14. Non-toxic shot; statewide. This permanent regulation is proposed for amendment. The amendment would add bismuth-tin shot to the list of shot materials authorized for the hunting of waterfowl.

Economic Impact Summary: The amendment will not have an economic impact. It does not require the use of bismuth-tin shot, but provides another option for waterfowl hunters. Bismuth-tin shot is more expensive than the other authorized shot materials.

Article 9.—CLIENT ASSESSMENT, REFERRAL, AND EVALUATION PROGRAM

26-9-1. Client assessment, referral, and evaluation (CARE) for nursing facilities. (a) Each individual seeking admission to a nursing facility or nursing facility for mental health shall, prior to admission, receive and complete a preadmission assessment, evaluation, and referral to all available community resources, including nursing facilities, with the following exceptions:

- (1) an individual who has entered an acute care facility from a nursing facility and is returning to a nursing facility;
(2) an individual transferred from a nursing facility to another nursing facility;
(3) an individual entering a nursing facility conducted by and for the adherents of a recognized church or religious denomination for the purpose of providing care and

services for those who depend upon spiritual means, through prayer alone, for healing; or

(4) an individual, entering a nursing facility from a hospital and whose length of stay is expected to be 30 or fewer days based on a physician's certification.

(b) An individual entering a nursing facility from the community, and whose stay is expected to be 30 days or fewer, based on a physician's certification, shall be exempt from Sections III through VI of the CARE assessment, as adopted in K.A.R. 120-1-1, but shall have Sections I & II of the CARE assessment completed prior to admission.

(c) Unless in the judgment of a qualified assessor, the person's physical, emotional, social or cognitive status has changed to the extent that another assessment is warranted, the preadmission assessment shall be valid for one year from the date of the initial assessment and reimbursement for the assessment shall be limited to one annual assessment per individual. 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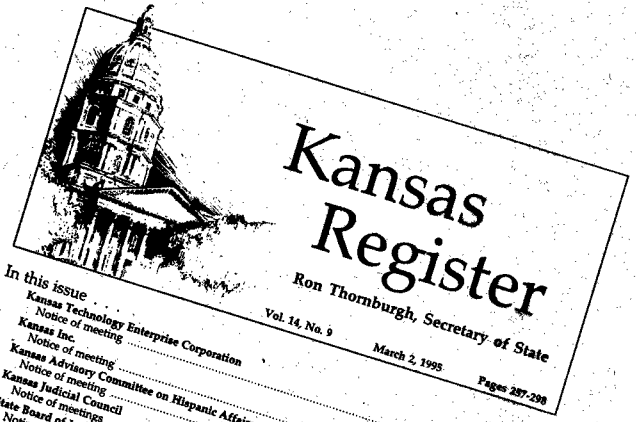
